Methodology: Advanced Prices and Pricing Factors

Data: The Advanced Prices and Pricing Factors are calculated using the most recent two weeks of data from the latest National Dairy Products Sales Report.

Reliability: National Dairy Products Sales Reports are subject to revision for four weeks following the initial weekly report. For enforcement purposes, the information in the National Dairy Products Sales Report is subject to verification for up to two years from the time of submission. The AMS audit staff periodically reviews a company's sales records to ensure accurate reports during onsite verifications. Note that the monthly Announcements of Advanced Prices and Pricing Factors are not subject to revision.

Terms and Definitions: Announced milk prices are per 100 pounds or cwt, rounded to the nearest cent. Component prices are per pound, rounded to nearest one-hundredth cent. Announced product prices and pricing factors are per pound, rounded to the nearest one-hundredth cent. The diesel fuel price is per gallon, rounded to the nearest one-tenth cent. The mileage rate factor is per hundredweight per mile, rounded to the nearest one-thousandth cent.

The National Dairy Products Sales Report provides current wholesale market prices for basic dairy commodities. These commodity prices for the previous two weeks are used in the following formulas to calculate the USDA's Advanced Prices and Pricing Factors used in the Federal milk marketing order program.

For the product price averages below, j corresponds to the number of previous weeks. For example, where $j=1$, this corresponds to the week ending the Saturday prior to the date of the Announcement; where $j=2$, this corresponds to the week ending the Saturday before that. The summation sign (\sum) indicates that terms are added corresponding to the previous 2 weeks.

- Butter Price =
$$\frac{\sum_{j=1}^2((\text{Weekly Butter Price})_j \times (\text{Weekly Butter Sales})_j)}{\sum_{j=1}^2(\text{Weekly Butter Sales})_j}$$
- Nonfat Dry Milk (NFDM) Price =
$$\frac{\sum_{j=1}^2((\text{Weekly NFDM Price})_j \times (\text{Weekly NFDM Sales})_j)}{\sum_{j=1}^2(\text{Weekly NFDM Sales})_j}$$
- Cheese Price =
$$\frac{\sum_{j=1}^2(((\text{Barrel Price} + 0.03)_j \times (\text{Barrel Sales})_j) + ((\text{Block Price})_j \times (\text{Block Sales})_j))}{\sum_{j=1}^2((\text{Barrel Sales})_j + (\text{Block Sales})_j)}$$
- Dry Whey Price =
$$\frac{\sum_{j=1}^2((\text{Weekly Dry Whey Price})_j \times (\text{Weekly Dry Whey Sales})_j)}{\sum_{j=1}^2(\text{Weekly Dry Whey Sales})_j}$$
- Base Class I Price = (Base Skim Milk Price for Class I x 0.965) + (Advanced Butterfat Pricing Factor x 3.5)
- Base Skim Milk Price for Class I = Higher of Advanced Class III or IV Skim Milk Pricing Factors
- Advanced Class III Skim Milk Pricing Factor = (Protein Price x 3.1) + (Other Solids Price x 5.9)
 - Protein Price = $((\text{Cheese Price} - 0.2003) \times 1.383) + (((\text{Cheese Price} - 0.2003) \times 1.572) - \text{Advanced Butterfat Pricing Factor} \times 0.9) \times 1.17$
 - Other Solids Price = $(\text{Dry Whey Price} - 0.1991) \times 1.03$
- Advanced Class IV Skim Milk Pricing Factor = Nonfat Solids Price x 9
 - Nonfat Solids Price = $(\text{Nonfat Dry Milk Price} - 0.1678) \times 0.99$
- Advanced Butterfat Pricing Factor = $(\text{Butter Price} - 0.1715) \times 1.211$
- Class II Skim Milk Price = Advanced Class IV Skim Milk Pricing Factor + 0.70
- Class II Nonfat Solids Price = Class II Skim Milk Price / 9

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**Additional Notes: All product prices used in this report are weighted by sales volume. Commodity prices used for Federal order formulas for Advanced Prices are weighted averages for the previous two weeks. To weight the product price average, it must be multiplied by each week's respective sales volume in pounds; each resulting total weekly sales dollars are combined to calculate the weighted product price average. The Cheddar cheese barrel price is adjusted to 38 percent moisture content. The Class I Base Price is shown for informational purposes only; it is not defined in Section 1000.50 of the order. The Class I skim milk price equals the Base Skim Milk Price plus the applicable Class I differential. The Class I Butterfat Price equals Advanced Butterfat Pricing Factor plus the (applicable Class I differential divided by 100).*
