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Foreign Cotton Mill Use Continues Growth

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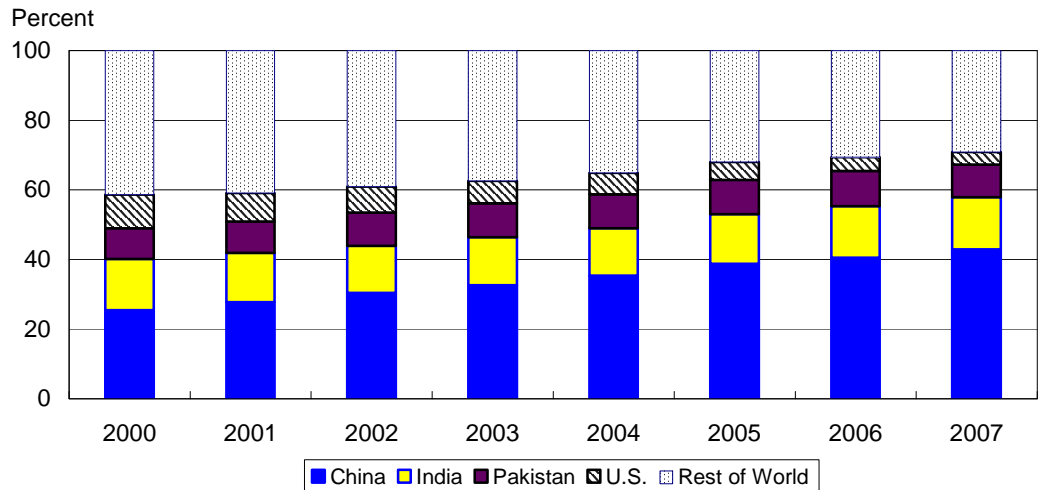

The latest U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) cotton forecasts for 2007/08 indicate that foreign cotton mill use is projected to expand to 123.7 million bales, a record. World mill use also is expected to reach new heights in 2007/08, at 128.3 million bales.

With the recent robust expansion of the global economy, cotton mill use in a number of countries—such as China, India, and Pakistan—has risen significantly. Meanwhile, the United States continues its decade-long trend to a lower level. In 2000/01, China, India, and Pakistan accounted for nearly half of the world's cotton mill use (fig. 1). China's share, in particular, has grown since 2000/01 as mill use there continues to expand. In 2007/08, China, India, and Pakistan are projected to account for more than two-thirds of global cotton mill use. Moreover, China's share alone is expected at nearly 43 percent in 2007/08, up from 22 percent just a decade earlier.

Domestic Outlook

Cotton Production Forecast Higher in December

The USDA December forecast of 2007 cotton production increased slightly to 19.0 million bales, 12 percent below 2006. The national yield improved to a record 864 pounds per harvested acre, 50 pounds above last season. Upland production is projected at nearly 18.2 million bales in 2007, the lowest in 4 years. Meanwhile, the extra-long staple (ELS) crop is forecast at a record 832,000 bales as the average yield reached 1,381 pounds per harvested acre, the second highest.

Compared with last month, the December crop estimate rose in the Southeast but was about unchanged in the other Cotton Belt regions. Production in the Southeast increased to about 3.2 million bales, 2 percent above the November level. The Delta is expected to produce 5.3 million bales this season, the Southwest nearly 8.5 million, and the West about 1.3 million (fig. 2). Also, the Southwest is projected to produce a record yield of 826 pounds per harvested acre in 2007.

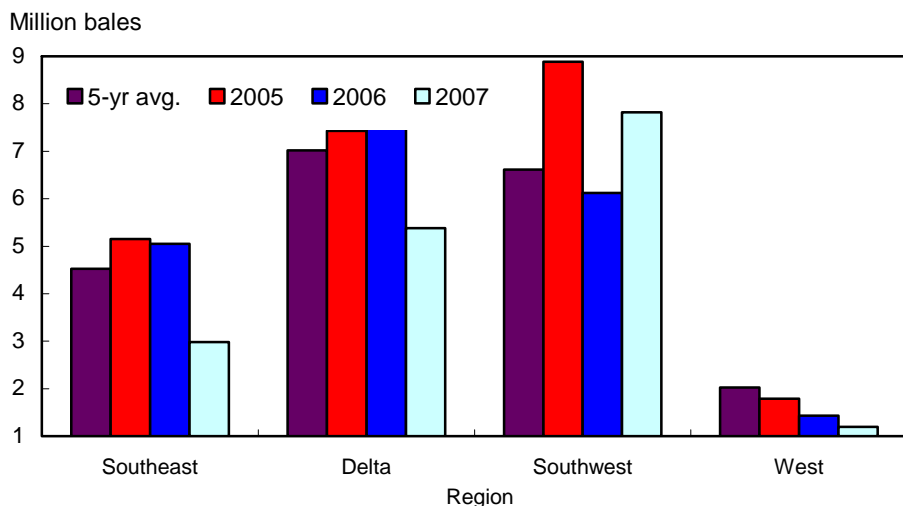
Demand Estimates Unchanged; Stocks Rise Slightly

The 2007/08 U.S. cotton demand estimates were unchanged in December, with exports forecast at 16.2 million bales and mill use at 4.6 million. U.S. mill use continues its trend lower as imported cotton products displace domestic mill use. At the current estimate, U.S. mill use would be at its lowest level since 1910/11. Meanwhile, U.S. cotton exports are rebounding from 2006/07 as rising foreign mill use exceeds foreign production. As a result, foreign imports are rising 12 percent this season and supporting demand for U.S. cotton.

With U.S. cotton demand forecast to exceed production in 2007/08, stocks are projected to decline to 7.7 million bales by season's end, nearly 2 million below the beginning level. As a result, the stocks-to-use ratio is estimated at 37 percent in 2007/08, above average but down considerably from 53 percent in 2006/07.

U.S. Textile Trade Deficit Rises

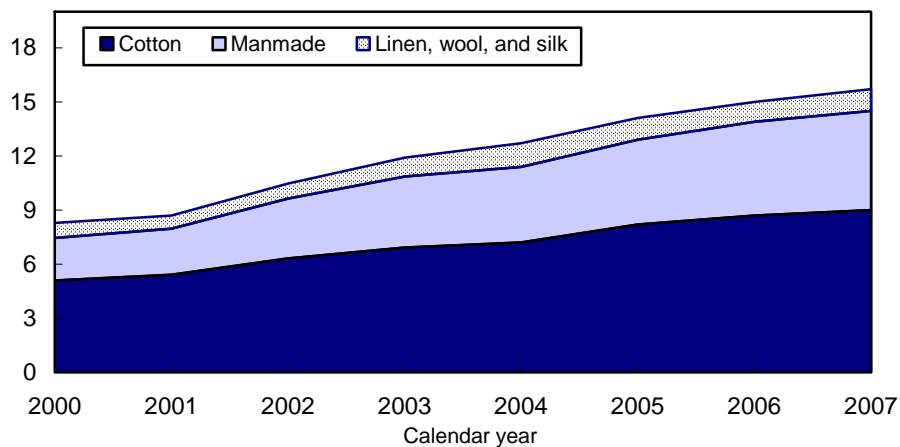
Textile imports declined in September 2007, to 1.8 billion (raw-fiber equivalent) pounds, 7 percent below record shipments in August and 3 percent below September 2006. Reduced imports of all major fibers and all major end-use categories occurred in September, compared with a month earlier. Cotton textile imports, at 982 million pounds, were down 10 percent from August and 4 percent below a year ago. Regionally, most of the September decline in imports occurred in Asia (primarily India, China, and Bangladesh) and North America (primarily Mexico and Honduras).

Textile exports, at 333 million pounds, declined for the second consecutive month and were the lowest shipments since February. September textile exports were down 6 percent from the previous month and 14 percent below September 2006. Exports of all major fibers, except linen, and all major end-use categories, except floor coverings, were below August shipments. Cotton textile exports, at 161 million pounds in September, were 7 percent below a month earlier and 16 percent below September 2006. Regionally, the majority of the September decline occurred in North America, with lower shipments primarily to Mexico.

The cumulative January-September 2007 trade deficit reached 11.7 billion pounds, compared with 11.2 billion for the corresponding 2006 period. Total imports, at 14.9 billion pounds, were slightly above last year while exports decreased 13 percent (457 million pounds) from 2006. The 9-month cotton textile trade deficit, at 6.8 billion pounds, was 4 percent above 2006. Although cotton and total textile imports have not increased as in past years, lower exports will likely result in the textile trade deficit rising to another record in 2007 (fig. 3).

World Trade and U.S. Cotton Exports Higher in 2007/08

U.S. cotton exports are forecast at 16.2 million bales in 2007/08, 3.2 million bales higher than in 2006/07. World trade is also forecast higher, up 3.8 million bales, and the U.S. share of world trade is expected to rebound back to an average level (39 percent) after dipping to a 6-year low in 2006/07 (fig.4). The outlook is mixed for U.S. competitors, with little change expected in shipments by the next largest exporters, India and Uzbekistan. Shipment declines are expected in Australia and the Franc Zone following smaller crops, and a large increase is foreseen in Brazil.

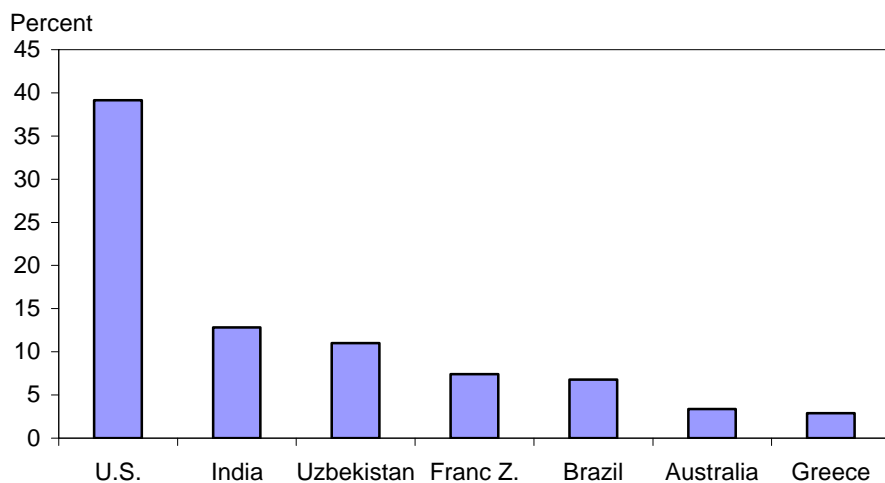
World production in 2007/08 is forecast at 119 million bales, down 3 million bales from the year before. New supplies of cotton (production plus unaccounted) in 2007/08 are forecast at 122 million bales, down 2 million bales. World consumption in 2007/08 is forecast nearly 6 million bales higher, climbing 4 percent to 128 million bales. As a result, world ending stocks are expected to fall 5.5 million bales, to 55 million. If China's stocks are excluded, stocks as a share of world consumption are forecast at 30 percent, down from 34 percent in 2006/07 and the lowest since 2003/04.

Changes in World Trade

In 2007/08, world trade is forecast to rise due to increased imports by China. China's imports are expected to rise by 4 million bales, to 14.5 million. China's imports are expected to account for 35 percent of world trade, above the 28-percent average of the previous 5 years, but substantially below the 43-percent share reached in 2005/06. India was a minor cotton exporter in 2004/05, but surpassed Uzbekistan to become the largest U.S. competitor in 2006/07. India exported 5 million bales in 2006/07, and is expected to export 5.3 million bales in 2007/08.
