

# **Sugar Monthly Import and Re-Exports**

## **Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Report**

### **April 2017**

The April WASDE report shows FY 2017 WTO raw sugar tariff-rate quota (TRQ) shortfall projected at 99,208 short tons raw value (STRV), unchanged from last month. No information available about specific countries.

The additional tranche (3A) of the FY 2017 specialty sugar TRQ filled on opening day (3/1/2017). The fourth tranche of 30,000 MTRV opened on April 7, 2017. A valid specialty sugar certificate must accompany the imported sugar.
