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## PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 3 POINTS PRICES PAID INDEX UP 1 POINT

The June Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (1 percent) to 243 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the decrease since May were lower prices for cattle, hogs, broilers, calves, and hay. Higher prices for wheat, corn, soybeans, and oranges were partially offsetting. The index was 26 points (12 percent) above June 1978.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates for June 15 was 249, up 1 point (1/2 percent) from mid-May. Sharply lower prices for feeder livestock were more than offset by higher prices for fuels and energy, tractors and self-propelled machinery, feed, and family living items. The June index was 29 points (13 percent) above a year ago.

## PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (1 percent) from the previous month to 243 percent of its 1967 average. Compared with a year earlier the index was up 26 points (12 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 7, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: The mid-June index of prices received for meat animals at 280 was down 21 points (7 percent) from a month earlier. Beef cattle prices at mid-June averaged \$66.90 per cwt, a decrease of \$4.60 from the previous month, while hog prices dropped to \$39.70, off \$3.90 per cwt. Calf prices declined an average of \$6.50 per cwt from mid-May, sheep were off \$1.80, and lambs dropped \$3.10. The index was 45 points (19 percent) above the previous year.

FOOD GRAINS: The index of prices received by farmers for food grains increased 31 points (15 percent) to 241 percent of its 1967 average from the previous month. Wheat averaged \$3.73 per bushel at mid-June, up 53 cents from May. Rice was 12 cents higher at \$8.83 per cwt. The index was 50 points (26 percent) above June 1978.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The mid-June index of prices received by farmers for feed grains and hay at 215 was 7 points (3 percent) above May. All commodities except hay were higher. Corn, at \$2.47 per bushel for mid-June was 12 cents above the May average while grain sorghum increased 25 cents per cwt to \$3.91. Barley averaged 22 cents higher than the previous month at \$2.29 per bushel. Oats increased 9 cents to \$1.38 per bushel. All hay averaged \$58.00 per ton, down \$7.10 per ton from mid-May. The index was 18 points (9 percent) above a year earlier.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The index of prices received for poultry and eggs decreased 11 points (6 percent) from May to 188. Broilers at 26.4 cents per pound and turkeys at 40.0 cents per pound were off 2.6 and 2.2 cents per pound, respectively, from May. Eggs at 55.6 cents per dozen were down 1.1 cents per dozen. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 6 points (3 percent).

OIL-BEARING CROPS: At 265, the index for oil-bearing crops was 10 points (4 percent) above the previous month. Soybeans at mid-June brought \$7.38 per bushel, 32 cents above the average for May, but flaxseed was 3 cents lower at \$7.34 per bushel. The index was 28 points (12 percent) above June 1978.

FRUIT: The index of prices received by growers for fruit at 250 increased 10 points (4 percent) from the previous month. Price increases for oranges, lemons, strawberries, and pears were only partially offset by lower prices for apples and grapefruit. The index was 11 points (4 percent) below June 1978.

**PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)**

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for June 15 was 249, up 1 point (1/2 percent) from mid-May and 29 points (13 percent) above June 1978.

**PRODUCTION INDEX HIGHER**

The mid-June index of prices paid for production goods and services, at 248, was up 1 point (1/2 percent) from a month earlier. Sharply lower prices for feeder livestock were more than offset by higher prices for fuels and energy, tractors and self-propelled machinery, and feed. The index was 30 points (14 percent) above a year ago.

**FEEDER LIVESTOCK:** At 292, the index of prices paid for feeder livestock was down 6 percent from last month. Feeder cattle and calves accounted for most of the index decline. Prices for feeder pigs, broiler chicks and egg-type chicks were also below May. Compared with last year the index was up 31 percent.

**FUELS AND ENERGY:** The June 15 index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy, at 271, was 5 percent above a month earlier. The sharp increase was largely due to higher gasoline and diesel fuel prices. Compared with June 1978, the index was up 28 percent.

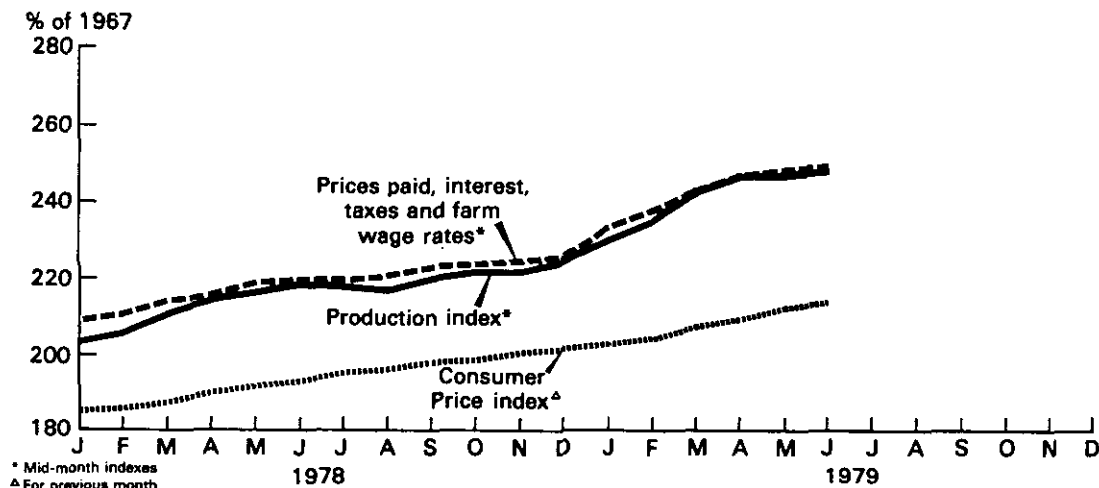
**TRACTORS AND SELF-PROPELLED MACHINERY:** The mid-June index of prices paid for tractors and self-propelled machinery was 293, 5 percent above the previous survey in mid-March. Prices were higher for all items surveyed. The index was up 13 percent compared with a year earlier.

**FEED:** The index of prices paid for feed was 205, up 1 1/2 percent from mid-May. Lower prices for alfalfa and other hay only partially offset higher prices for virtually all other feed items. Feed grains contributed most to the increase. The index was 9 percent above June 1978.

**CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI-U)**

The unadjusted May 1979 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers increased 1.2 percent from a month earlier to 214.1. The CPI-U was 10.8 percent above May 1978. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 1.1 percent, the fifth consecutive monthly increase of approximately 1.0 percent. The transportation component advanced sharply for the seventh consecutive month, increasing 1.8 percent, largely due to gasoline and new cars. Gasoline prices increased 5.0 percent in May, bringing the increase so far this year to an annual rate of 55.1 percent. The index for housing, up 1.2 percent, continued to increase rapidly. The 0.7 percent increase for food and beverages was much less than earlier this year. Apparel and upkeep averaged unchanged, while medical care increased 0.6 percent, entertainment 0.5 percent and other goods and services 0.5 percent.

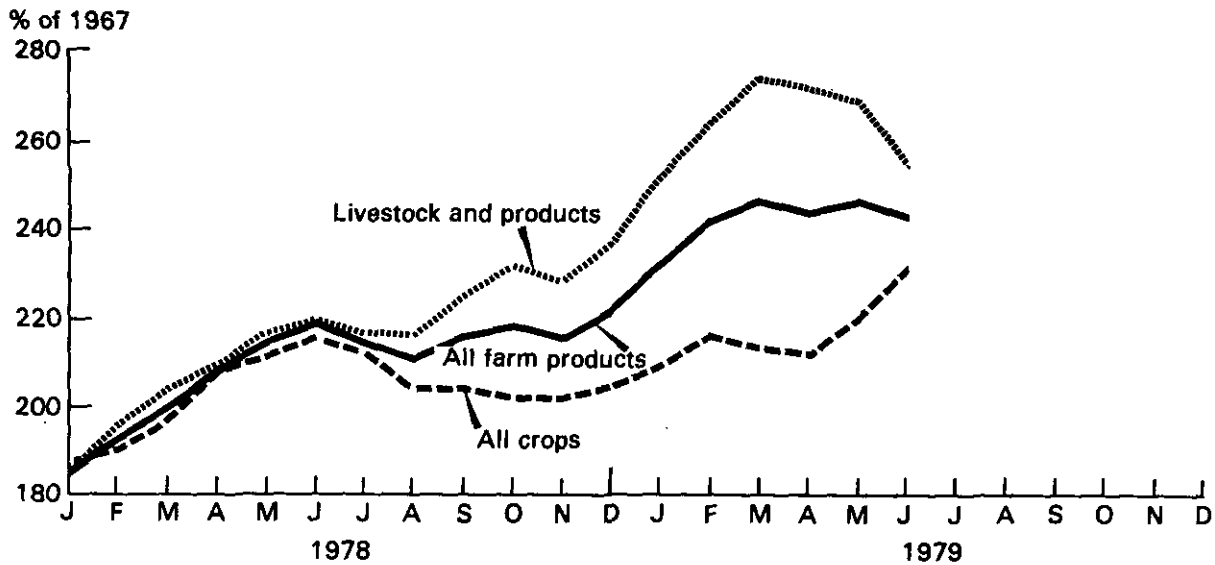

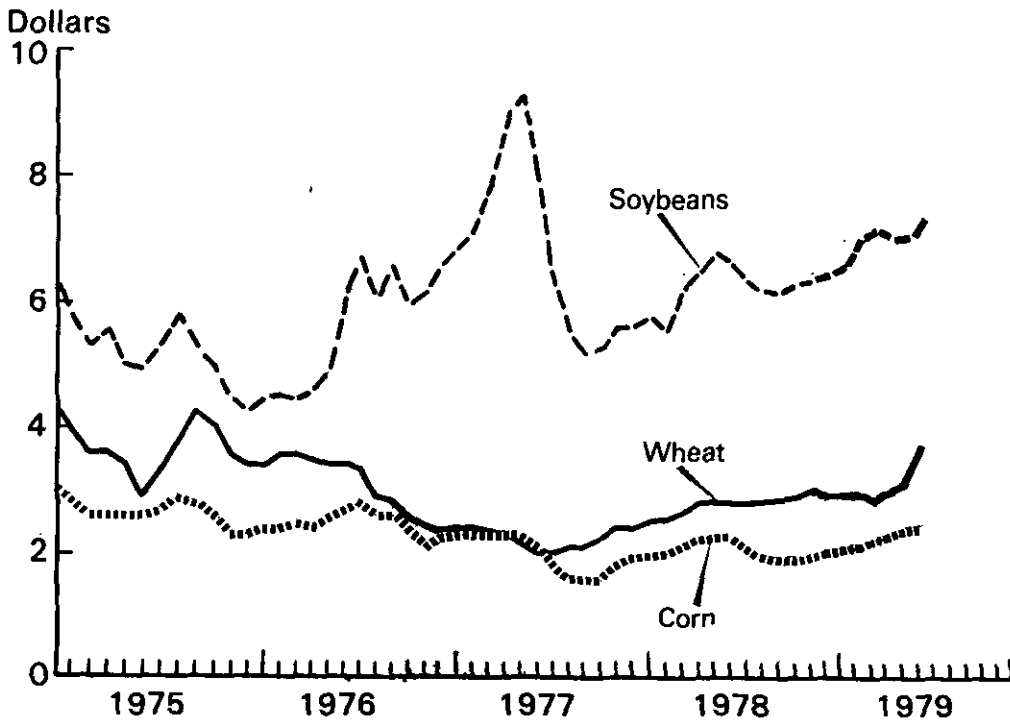
