

# AGRICULTURAL PRICES



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## PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 1 POINT PRICES PAID INDEX UNCHANGED

The November Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 1 point (1/2 percent) to 237 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since October were higher prices for broilers, eggs, oranges, tomatoes and milk. Lower prices for cattle, corn, grapefruit, lemons and wheat were partially offsetting. The index was 21 points (10 percent) above a year ago.

The mid-month Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was unchanged from October at 256. Lower prices for livestock feeds were offset by higher prices for other production items and the family living component. The index was 31 points (14 percent) above a year earlier.

## PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 1 point (1/2 percent) from the previous month to 237 percent of its 1967 average. Compared with a year earlier the index was up 21 points (10 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 7, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The index of prices received for poultry and eggs increased 22 points (13 percent) to 189 from October. All components of the index exhibited price increases from the previous month. Turkeys at 45.8 cents per pound were up 5.7 cents while broilers were up 3.5 cents per pound. Eggs at 57.4 cents per dozen were up 5.2 cents. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 2 points (1 percent).

MEAT ANIMALS: The mid-November index of prices received for meat animals at 263 was down 3 points (1 percent) from a month ago. Beef cattle prices at mid-November averaged \$64.20 per cwt., a decrease of 90 cents from the previous month. Calves declined \$1.60 to average \$85.10 per cwt. Hog prices increased 40 cents from a month earlier to \$34.40. The meat animal index was 24 points (10 percent) above November 1978.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The index of prices received by farmers in mid-November for feed grains and hay at 207 was 6 points (3 percent) below the previous month. Corn, at \$2.31 per bushel, was down 10 cents from its October average while sorghum grain was up 7 cents at \$3.97 per cwt. Barley averaged 3 cents lower at \$2.29 per bushel. Oats brought \$1.32 per bushel, up 1 cent from October. Baled hay averaged \$59.90 per ton, 60 cents less than the previous month. The index was 29 points (16 percent) above a year earlier.

VEGETABLES: The index of prices received by farmers for commercial vegetables for the first half of November at 192 was 16 points (9 percent) above the index for October. Higher prices for tomatoes, watermelons and green peppers were only partially offset by lower prices for onions and carrots. The index was 21 points (12 percent) above a year ago.

DAIRY PRODUCTS: The November index of prices received by farmers for dairy products at 254 increased 4 points (1 1/2 percent) from October. The average price of all milk sold to plants and dealers increased 20 cents per cwt. to \$12.80. The index was 24 points (10 percent) above November 1978.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received by farmers for oil-bearing crops at 230 was 3 points (1 1/2 percent) below October. Prices for all commodities were lower than the previous month. Soybeans at \$6.26 per bushel were down 9 cents. Peanuts brought 20.5 cents per pound, 0.5 cent lower than October. Cottonseed was \$3.00 lower at \$122.00 per ton. Flaxseed at \$5.16 per bushel was 40 cents below the previous month. The index was 5 points (2 percent) below a year earlier.

#### PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The mid-November Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was unchanged from October at 256 percent of its 1967 average, 31 points (14 percent) higher than last year at this time.

#### PRODUCTION INDEX UNCHANGED

The index of prices paid for production goods and services at 255 percent is unchanged from October but 33 points (15 percent) above a year earlier. The decline in average prices paid for livestock feed from October was offset by increases in prices for motor vehicles, fuels, feeder livestock, farm and motor supplies and building and fencing materials.

FEED: The index of prices paid for feed was 208 in mid-November, down 1½ percent from last month. Higher prices for oats, grain sorghum, other hay, middlings, salt and molasses were more than offset by lower prices for all other items. The index was 13 percent above November 1978.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The mid-November index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy was 318, up 1½ percent from a month earlier. Prices were higher for gasoline, diesel fuel and L.P. gas, but the monthly increase was the smallest since November 1978. The index was 47 percent above a year ago.

AUTOS AND TRUCKS: Prices paid by farmers for autos and trucks in mid-November averaged 3/4 percent above May when prices were last surveyed. Higher prices for new autos and trucks were partially offset by lower prices for used vehicles. The index, at 281, was 8 percent above November 1978.

FEEDER LIVESTOCK: At 289 the mid-month index of prices paid for feeder livestock was 1/3 percent above previous month. Higher prices for feeder pigs and dairy cows accounted for the increase. The index was up 20 percent from a year earlier.


FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: The November 15 index of prices paid for farm and motor supplies at 199 was ½ percent above mid-October. Prices averaged higher for nearly all farm supply items surveyed. Compared with November last year, the index was up 13 percent.

#### CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI-U)

The unadjusted October 1979 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers increased 0.9 percent from a month earlier to 225.4. The CPI-U was 12.2 percent higher than in October 1978. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 1.0 percent in October, the tenth consecutive monthly increase of about 1.0 percent. About two-thirds of the increase in the October CPI was accounted for by the 1.5 percent rise in the housing index which was due to higher interest rates and house prices. The index for medical care increased 1.0 percent, the largest since January, while entertainment costs rose 0.6 percent. The transportation index rose 0.5 percent in October which was the smallest increase in 12 months. The October increase of 0.7 percent for food and beverages was somewhat less than in September.




