PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 3 POINTS  
PRICES PAID INDEX UP 2 POINT

The June Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 3 points (1.3 percent) to 230 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since May were higher prices for hogs, apples, cattle, peaches, tomatoes, and cabbage. Lower prices for lettuce, wheat, grapefruit, hay, cotton, and milk were partially offsetting. The index was 14 points (5.7 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for mid-June was 277, up 2 points (.7 percent) from May. The major contributors to the increase were: (1) the feeder livestock index, (2) the farm machinery indexes and (3) family living items. Compared with June 1979, the index was up 28 points (11 percent).

## PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The June Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 3 points (1.3 percent) from the previous month to 230 percent of its 1967 average. Compared with a year earlier the index was down 14 points (5.7 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 249, the mid-June index of prices received for meat animals, was up 7 points (2.9 percent) from a month ago. Hog prices at mid-June averaged \$32.40 per cwt, an increase of \$3.80 from the May average. Calf prices were up \$1.70 to \$76.20 per cwt, while beef cattle prices increased 60 cents per cwt to \$61.20. The meat animal index was 31 points (11 percent) below June 1979.

FRUIT: The June index of prices received by growers for all fruit at 233 was 18 points (8.4 percent) above May. Increased prices for oranges, lemons, apples, and strawberries plus new-crop peaches moving to market, more than offset lower prices for grapefruit and pears. The index was 31 points (12 percent) below a year earlier.

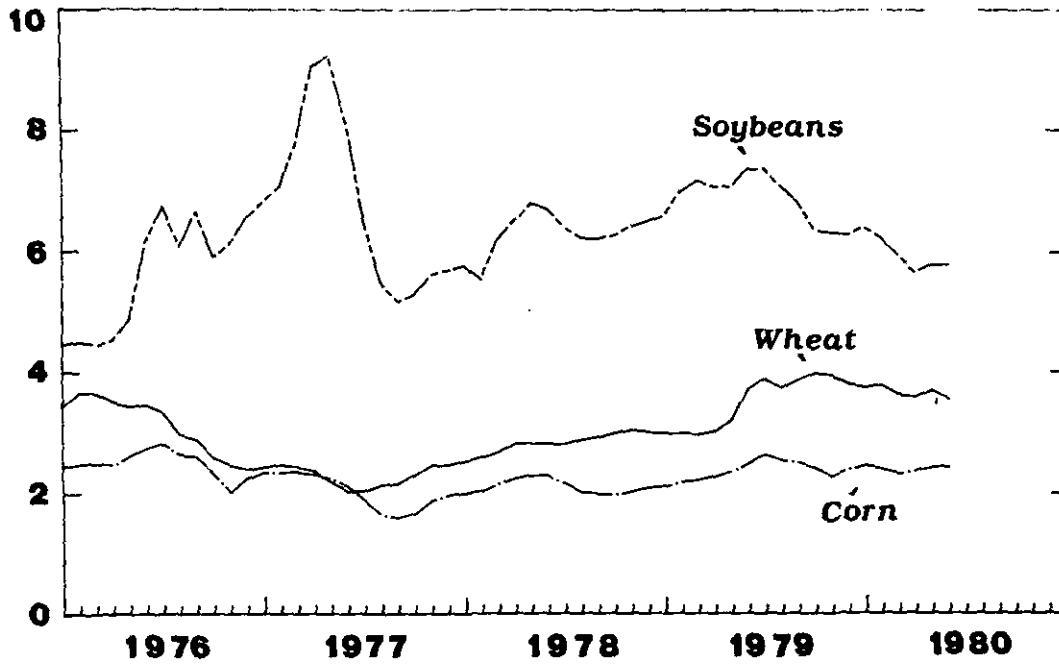
FOOD GRAINS: The mid-June index of prices received by farmers for food grains at 238 was 9 points (3.6 percent) below the previous month. Wheat at \$3.55 per bushel was 14 cents less than May while rice averaged \$11.10 per cwt, down 20 cents. The index was 2 points (.8 percent) less than a year earlier.

POULTRY AND EGGS: At 166, the index for poultry and eggs increased 5 points (3.1 percent) from May. Eggs, at 48.4 cents per dozen, were up 1.4 cents from last month. Turkeys and broilers were each up .8 cent per pound at 32.0 cents and 24.4 cents, respectively. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 25 points (13 percent).

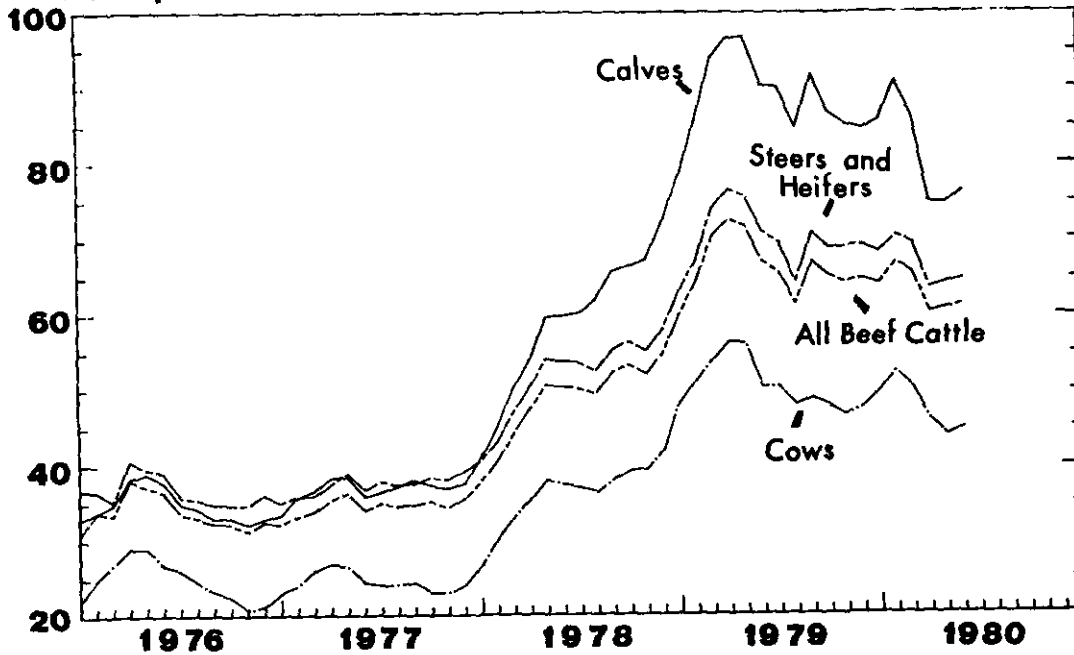
COTTON: The index of prices received by farmers for cotton decreased 9 points (3.4 percent) from the previous month to 256. Upland cotton brought 57.7 cents per pound, down 1.9 cents from May. The index was 6 points (2.3 percent) below June 1979.

### PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The mid-June Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 277, up 2 points (.7 percent) from May. The June index was 28 points (11 percent) above a year earlier.

### PRODUCTION INDEX UP

The index of prices paid for farm production goods and services for June was 270, up 2 points (.7 percent) from a month earlier. Higher mid-June prices for feeder cattle and price increases in farm machinery were major contributors to the rise in the index. The index was 22 points (8.9 percent) above a year earlier.

FEEDER LIVESTOCK: The index of prices paid for feeder livestock at 267, was up 7 points (2.7 percent) from a month ago. Higher prices for cattle and calves more than offset slightly lower feeder pig prices. The index was 8.6 percent below June 1979.

FEED: The mid-June index of prices paid for feed at 213 was down 1 point (.5 percent) from the previous month. Lower prices for hays and hog feeds contributed most to the decline. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 3.9 percent.

TRACTORS AND SELF-PROPELLED MACHINERY: At 325, the June 15 index of prices paid for tractors and self-propelled farm machinery was 2.5 percent above the March survey. Prices were higher for all items surveyed. The index was 11 percent above a year earlier.

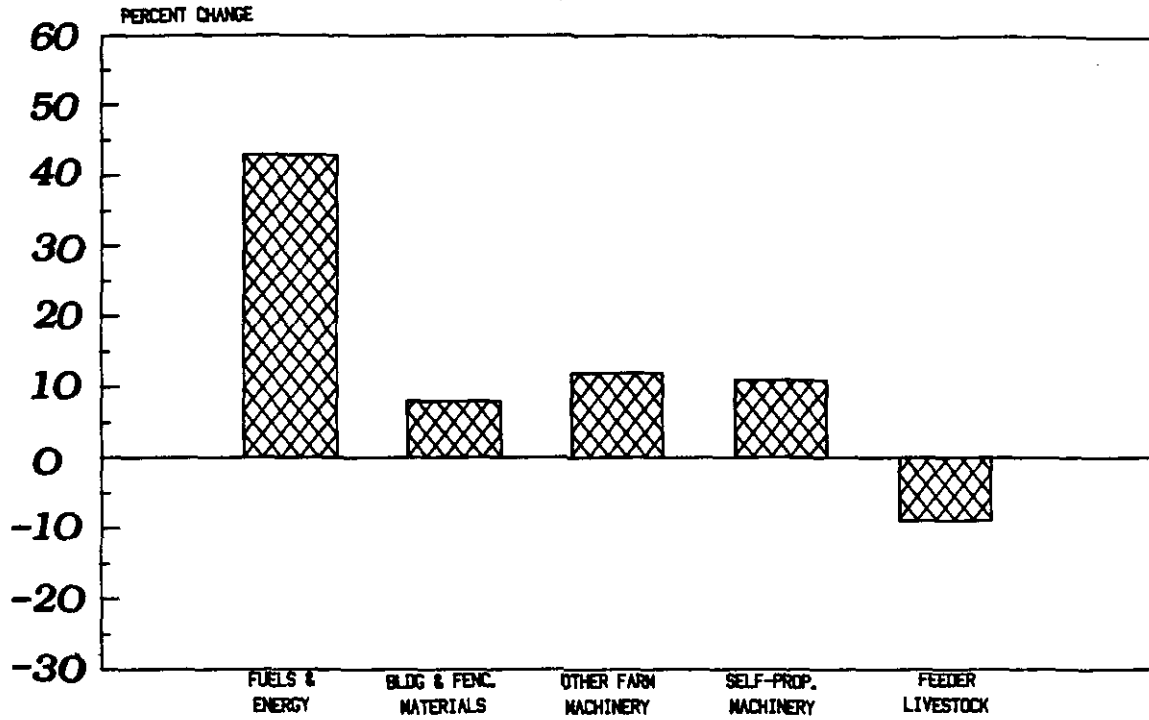
OTHER MACHINERY: The mid-June index of prices paid for other farm machinery was 332. Prices were higher for all items surveyed. Many of the items were last priced in September or June 1979. The index was up 12 percent from June last year.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The mid-June index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy was 387, up .5 percent from a month earlier. The increase was largely caused by higher gasoline prices. Compared with June 1979, the index was up 43 percent.

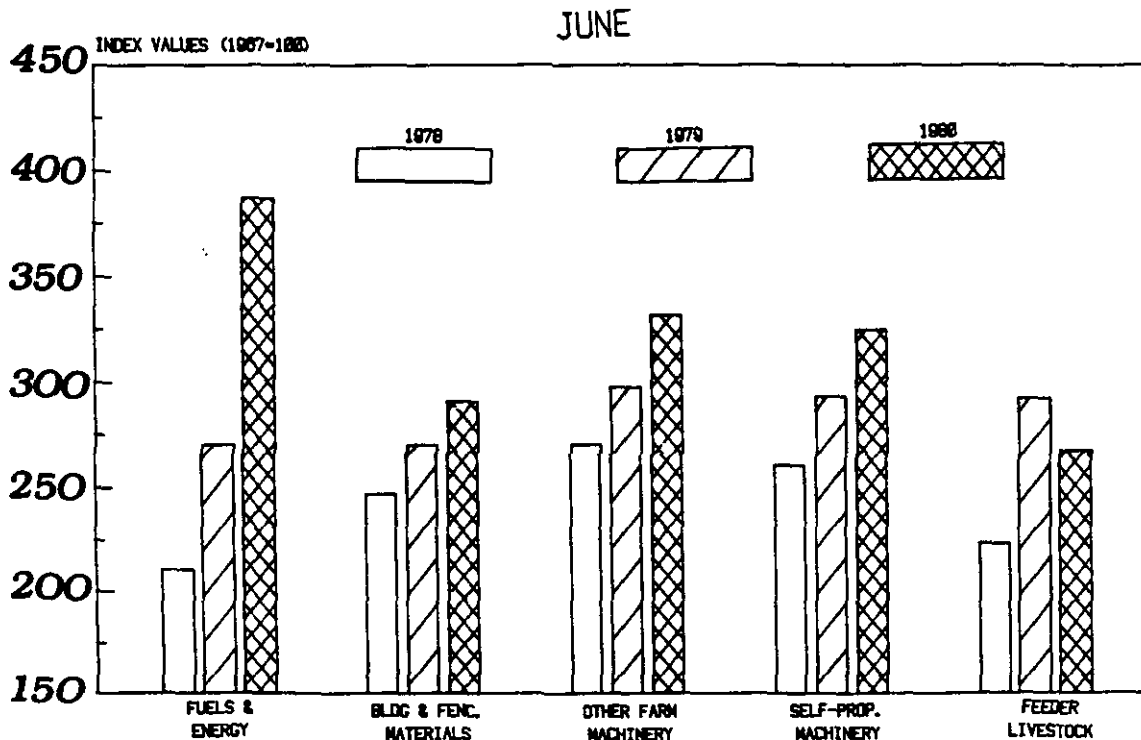
### CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - (CPI-U)

The unadjusted May 1980 Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers at 244.9 was up 1.0 percent above a month earlier and 14 percent higher than in May 1979. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose .9 percent in May, the same as in April. The housing component (up 1.5 percent) accounted for over three-fourths of the May increase. The transportation index rose .3 percent in May, the smallest increase since April 1978. The food and beverage index increase .3 percent, medical care .5 percent, entertainment .6 percent, and other goods and services .8 percent. Apparel and upkeep declined .2 percent from April.

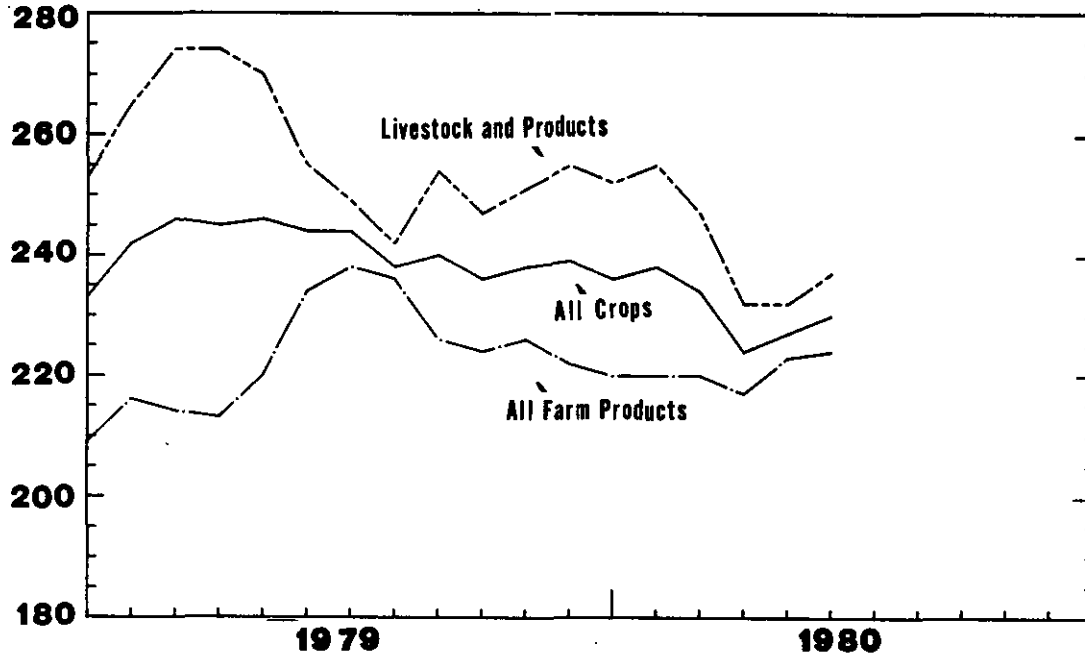

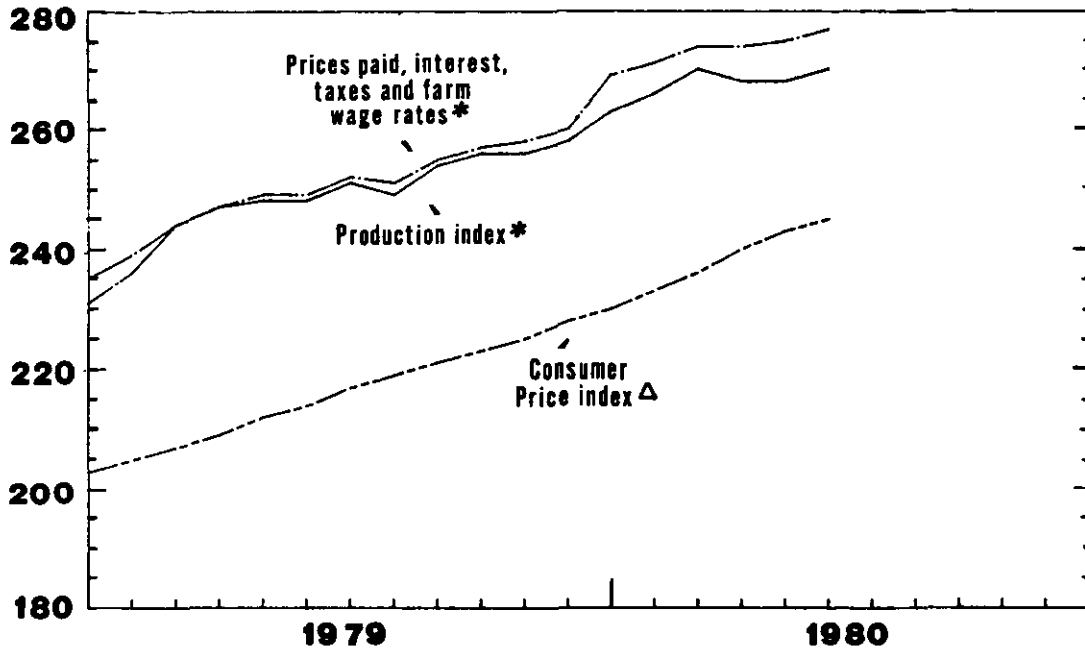
## Index of Prices Received by Farmers

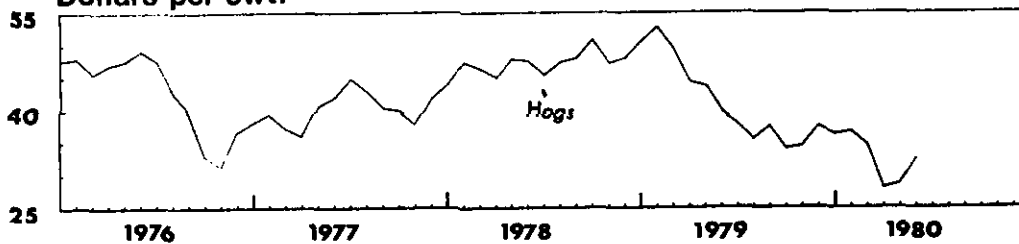

CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW INDEX OF PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS,  
FOR FARM FOOD COMMODITIES

In this month's issue of Agricultural Prices, a new index of prices received by farmers for farm food commodities (PRFFC) is presented. This index is similar to the index of prices received by farmers for all farm commodities except the non-food items have been removed. For example, cotton and tobacco prices, which are included in the all farm products index, are not included in PRFFC. The remaining food item components are aggregated using new relative weights derived from appropriately adjusting the original set of weights. Because the new index is composed of commodities which are homogeneous in terms of intended final use, it has value as a separate measure of the movement of prices of farm food commodities.

The new PRFFC Index is an aggregate of eight farm level commodity price indices. It is constructed using weights based on cash receipts data for 1971 to 1973, the same data used for the derivation of the weights for the index of all prices received by farmers. The commodities included in the new index are shown in the table below, along with the weights used in constructing the Prices Received for All Farm Commodities index and the weights used in constructing the new index.

Weights in PRFFC, except for the weight for Oil Crops have been obtained directly from the weights in the All Commodities index. The weight for Oil Crops in the new index has been adjusted to include only that portion of Oil Crops used in food. The portion of total receipts derived from non-food meal, seed, feed, and residual, has been subtracted.

Indexes for 1975 to date are shown on page 6. The PRFFC index will be published monthly as part of the indexes of prices received by farmers table.
