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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 12 POINTS
PRICES PAID INDEX UP 2 POINTS

The July Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 12 points (5.2 percent) to 244 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since June were higher prices for hogs, soybeans, corn, broilers, potatoes and cattle. The index was unchanged from a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for July 15 was 280, up 2 points (.7 percent) from mid-June. The major contributors to the increase were higher prices for: (1) feed, (2) family living items and (3) feeder livestock. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 28 points (11 percent).

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 12 points (5.2 percent) from the previous month to 244 percent of its 1967 average. The index was unchanged from the July 1979 level. Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 265, the mid-July index of prices received for meat animals, was up 15 points (6.0 percent) from a month ago. Mid-July hog prices averaged \$41.00 per cwt, an increase of \$7.90 from the June average. Beef cattle prices were up \$1.30 to \$62.60 per cwt, but calf prices declined \$.30 to \$75.60. The meat animal index was 8 points (2.9 percent) less than July 1979.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received by farmers for oil-bearing crops at mid-July was 251, an increase of 33 points (15 percent) from the previous month. Soybeans, at \$6.97 per bushel, were up \$1.06 from June's average while flaxseed increased 58 cents to \$6.46 per bushel. The index was 14 points (5.3 percent) below a year earlier.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The mid-July index of prices received by farmers for feed grains and hay was 244, up 19 points (8.4 percent) from the previous month. All commodities showed price increases compared with June. Corn averaged \$2.73 per bushel, up 24 cents, and grain sorghum increased 34 cents to \$4.92 per cwt. Barley averaged \$2.61 per bushel, up 25 cents, while oats at mid-July brought \$1.59 per bushel, 11 cents higher. Hay at \$66.50 was up \$1.90 per ton. The index was 18 points (8.0 percent) above July 1979.

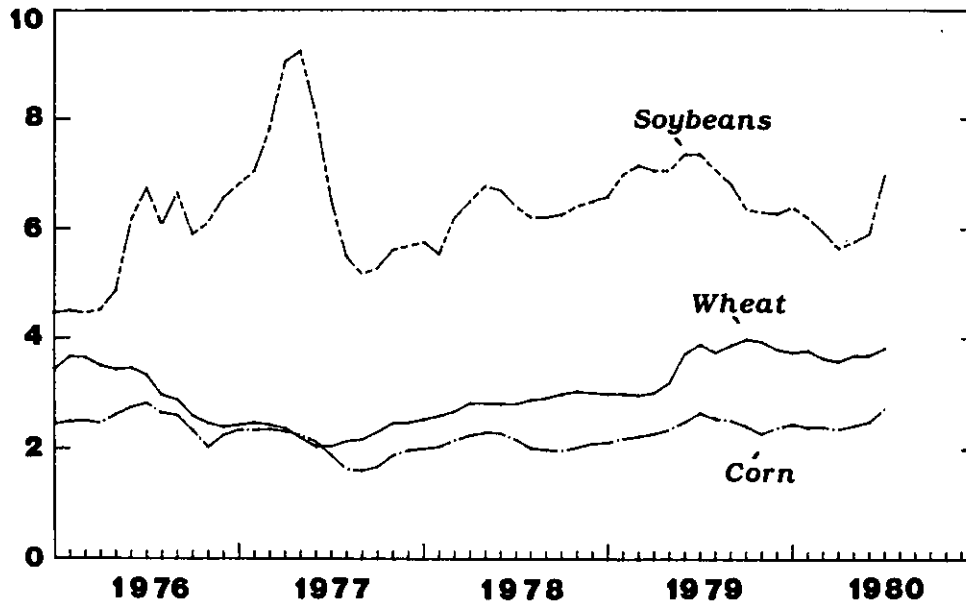
POULTRY AND EGGS: At 195, the index for poultry and eggs increased 29 points (17 percent) from June. Broilers, at 31.7 cents per pound, were up 7.3 cents. Turkey prices averaged 36.8 cents, up 4.8 cents from last month. Eggs, at 50.7 cents per dozen, were up 2.3 cents. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 16 points (8.9 percent).

POTATOES, SWEETPOTATOES, AND DRY BEANS: The July index of prices received for potatoes, sweetpotatoes, and dry beans at 314 was up 98 points (45 percent) from last month. Potato prices averaged \$6.49 per cwt, up \$2.57 from last month largely because of higher priced new crop potatoes being harvested. Prices for sales from the 1979 fall crop were also stronger. Sweetpotato prices were down \$.10 to \$13.10 per cwt, but dry bean prices increased \$2.00 to \$25.60. The index was 110 points (54 percent) above a year ago.

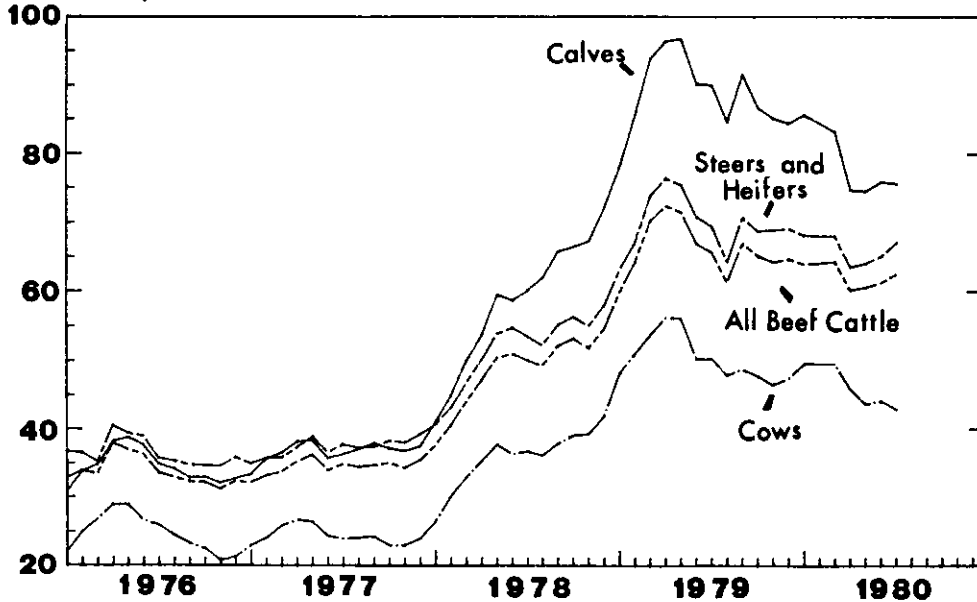
FRUIT: The July index of prices received by growers for all fruit at 209 was 24 points (10 percent) less than June. Decreased prices for oranges and peaches contributed most to the decline. Higher apple prices were partially offsetting. The index was 61 points (23 percent) below a year earlier.

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The mid-July Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 280, up 2 points (.7 percent) from June. The index was 28 points (11 percent) above a year earlier.

PRODUCTION INDEX UP

The index of prices paid for farm production goods and services for July was 273, up 3 points (1.1 percent) from a month earlier. Higher mid-month prices for feed, feeder livestock and motor supplies were the main contributors to the rise in the index. Compared to July 1979, the index was up 22 points (8.8 percent).

FEED: The mid-July index of prices paid for feed at 223 was up 9 points (4.2 percent) from the previous month. Prices were higher for all items with the feed grains and mixed hog feeds contributing most to the increase. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 3.2 percent.

FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: At 226, the mid-July index of prices paid for farm and motor supplies was 2.7 percent greater than a month earlier. Prices were higher for most motor supply items surveyed. The index was up 18 percent from July 1979.

FEEDER LIVESTOCK: The index of prices paid for feeder livestock at 270 was up 3 points (1.1 percent) from a month ago. The prices for all items increased from a month earlier with cattle and calves and feeder pigs contributing most to the increase. The index was 6.3 percent below July 1979.

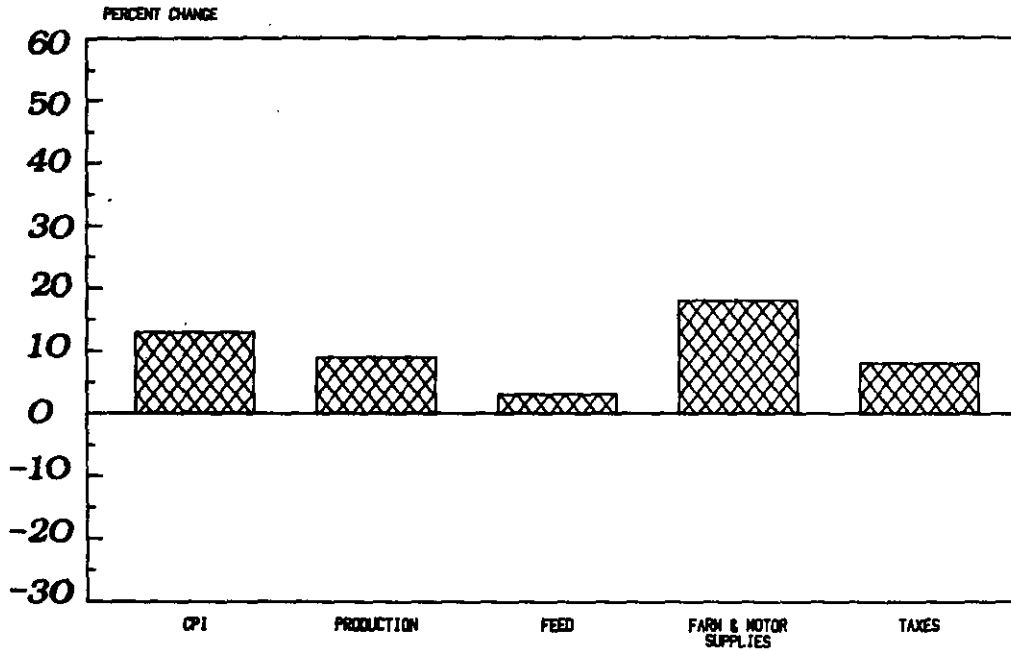
FUELS AND ENERGY: The July 15 index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy at 388, was .3 percent higher than mid-June. This was the third consecutive monthly increase of .5 percent or less. Higher diesel fuel prices accounted for the July advance. Gasoline prices held steady and L.P. gas declined slightly. The index was 36 percent above a year earlier.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX - (CPI-U)

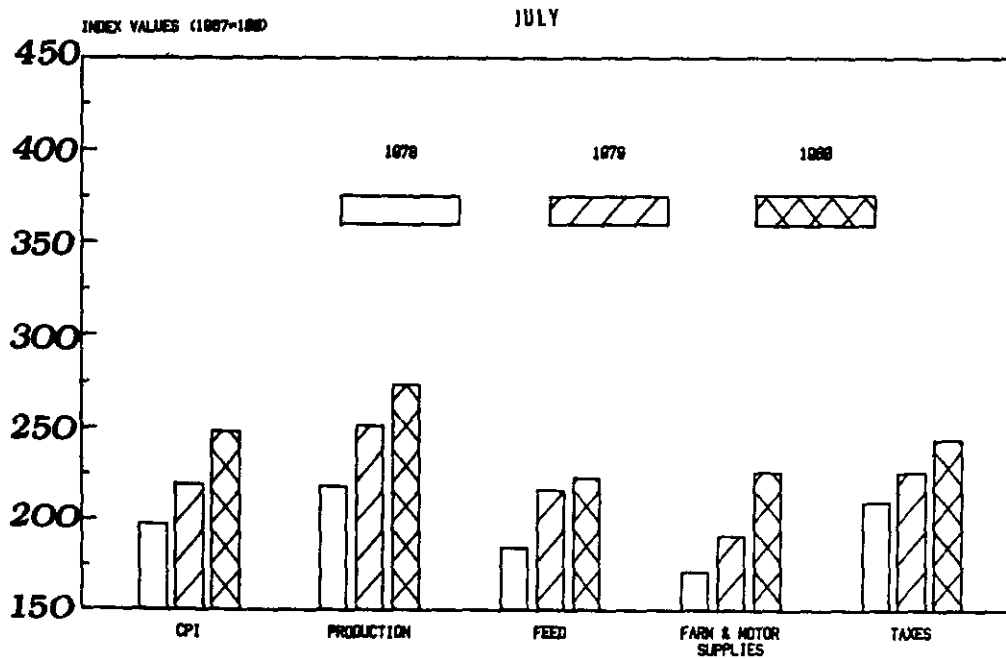
The June unadjusted Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers at 247.6, rose 1.1 percent from May, and was 14 percent above a year earlier. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 1.0 percent in June. This was more than the .9 percent increase in each of the 2 preceding months. The housing component, accounting for over four-fifths of the June increase, rose 1.8 percent. The transportation index declined .2 percent in June, following 2 months of moderate increases. Food and beverage prices increased at a slightly faster rate of .5 percent. Medical care was up .5 percent, entertainment .6 percent and other goods and services .8 percent. Apparel and upkeep was unchanged from a month earlier.

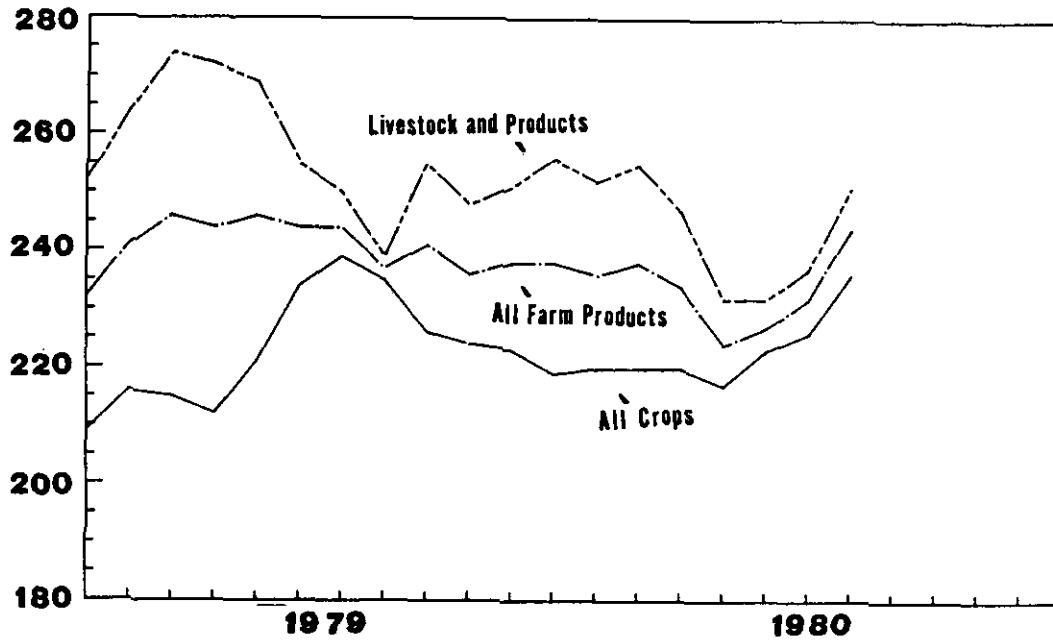

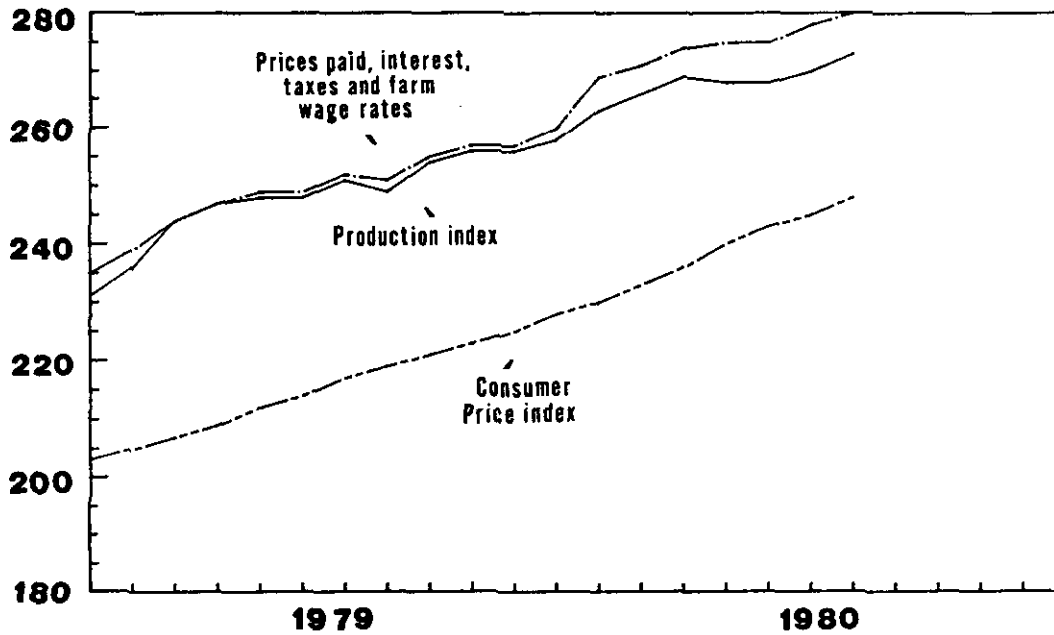
Index of Prices Received by Farmers

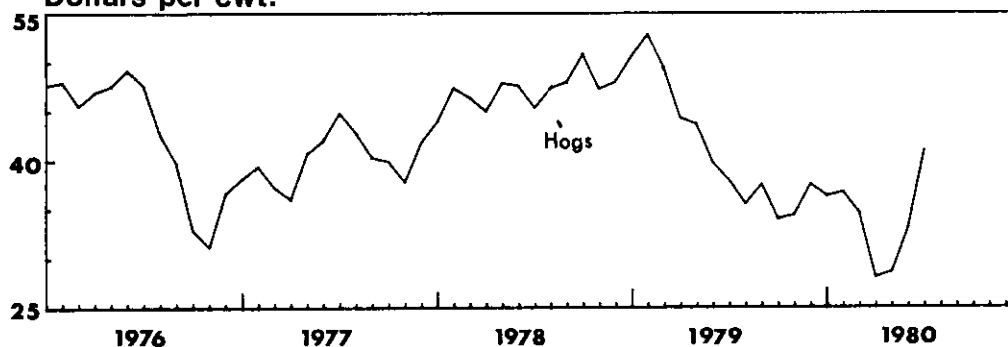

PARITY AND AVERAGE PRICE RECEIVED BY FARMERS
FOR AGRICULTURAL COMMODITIES

Parity prices based on data for July 1980 for all commodities for which computed, together with base price data, are presented in the tables on pages 24-27. Average prices for 1978 and 1979 and averages for 1970-79 for use in parity computations are also shown on these pages.

Parity prices shown on the following pages are computed under the provisions of Title III, Subtitle A, Section 301 (a) of the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1938 as amended by the Agricultural Acts of 1948, 1949, 1954, and 1956.

The major provisions of the amended Act relating to the calculation of parity prices are as follows:

"(1) (A) The 'parity price' for any agricultural commodity, as of any date, shall be determined by multiplying the adjusted base price of such commodity as of such date by the parity index as of such date.

"(B) The 'adjusted base-price' of any agricultural commodity, as of any date, shall be (i) the average of the prices received by farmers for such commodity, as such time as the Secretary may select during each year of the ten-year period ending on the 31st of December last before such date, or during each marketing season beginning in such period if the Secretary determines use of a calendar year basis to be impracticable, divided by (ii) the ratio of the general level of prices received by farmers for agricultural commodities during the period January 1910 to December 1914, inclusive. As used in this subparagraph, the term 'prices' shall include wartime subsidy payments made to producers under programs designed to maintain maximum prices established under the Emergency Price Control Act of 1942.

"(C) The 'parity index', as of any date, shall be the ratio of (i) the general level of prices for articles and services that farmers buy, wages paid hired farm labor, interest on farm indebtedness secured by farm real estate, and taxes on farm real estate, for the calendar month ending last before such date to (ii) the general level of such prices, wages, rates, and taxes during the period 1910 to December 1914, inclusive.

"(D) The prices and indices provided for herein, and the data used in computing them shall be determined by the Secretary, whose determination shall be final."

Section 301 (a) (1) (F) outlines authority for the Secretary of Agriculture to make special adjustments in the method of computing parity prices for particular commodities if the method outlined in the Act results in parity prices seriously out of line with those of other commodities.

The parity prices shown in this report are based on the provisions of the amended Act. Briefly, the actual method of computation is as follow:

- a. The average of prices received by farmers for individual commodities for the 10 preceding years is calculated (for 1980 this is the 1970-79 average). An allowance for unredeemed loans and other supplemental payments resulting from price support operations such as the value of marketing certificates for wheat and support payments for feed grains is included for those commodities for which applicable.
- b. This 10-year average is divided by the average of the Index of Prices Received by Farmers for the same 10 preceding calendar years adjusted to include an allowance for unredeemed loans and other supplemental price support operations, including the value of marketing certificates and support payments, to give an "adjusted base price".

- c. Parity prices are computed by multiplying the "adjusted base prices" by the current Parity Index (the Index of Prices Paid by Farmers, including Interest, Taxes, and Wage Rates, with 1910-14=100).

Parity prices are calculated in terms of prices received by farmers in the local markets in which they ordinarily sell. This means that parity prices apply to the average of all classes and grades of the commodity as sold by all farmers in the United States, except as otherwise specified. Fruits and vegetables for fresh use and for processing categories are calculated for many of the crops. The Agricultural Marketing Agreement Act of 1937 provided for parity prices in certain areas for certain commodities covered by a marketing agreement or order program. Under present legislation, U.S. parity prices with appropriate adjustments where needed may be used for the purpose of this Act.

Whenever it is necessary for a particular program, average or normal differentials for different varieties, classes, or grades of a commodity and average or normal spreads between different markets, methods of sales, or locations are calculated and applied to the national average support level or to the parity price. Differentials may also be established for seasonal differences, especially where there is a reasonably regular and well-defined seasonal movement. Such spreads or differentials, of course, need adjusting or recalculating from time to time due to changes in methods of processing, in marketing and transportation costs, and in the distribution of supplies relative to demand.

The indexes used in the computation of parity prices are published currently in AGRICULTURAL PRICES.

For the purpose of illustrating the computation of parity prices, the calculation of the parity price for corn based on data for July 1980 is given below.

The 120-month, January 1970-December 1979 average of prices received by farmers for corn was \$2.10 per bushel, adjusted to allow for unredeemed loans and other supplemental payments resulting from price support operations. The 120-month average of the Index of Prices Received by Farmers, adjusted to include an allowance for unredeemed loans, etc., was 439 (1910-14=100). Dividing \$2.10 by 4.39 gives \$0.478 per bushel, the adjusted base price. The adjusted base price is multiplied by 952 percent, the Parity Index (1910-14=100), based on data for July 1980. This gives \$4.55 per bushel, the parity price of corn during August 1980.

Beginning with 1964, season average prices for the processed portion of deciduous fruit and vegetables are estimated as equivalent returns at the processing plant door. This results in little or no change in the price level for commodities in most States. Most notable exceptions are deciduous fruits and vegetables processed in California where the former price level was the first delivery point, and some vegetables processed in Texas.

Base prices used in calculating parity prices are averages of prices received by farmers during several years; therefore, any seasonal variation is largely averaged out. To facilitate comparisons with parity prices, monthly prices for eggs and milk are adjusted for seasonal variation.

The table below presents the adjustment factors which will be used the next 12 months to adjust monthly prices for eggs and milk. The adjusted price is calculated by dividing the monthly price by the adjustment factor.

The factors for eggs are averages of factors for the years 1975-79 (July-December) and 1976-80 (January-June). The factors for milk, changed every 3-5 years, are the averages of factors for 1968-77.
