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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 1 POINT PRICES PAID INDEX UP 2 POINTS

The October Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 1 point (.4 percent) to 262 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since September were higher prices for milk, oranges, wheat, hogs, soybeans and grapefruit. Lower prices for potatoes, cotton, apples, eggs, lettuce and tobacco were partially offsetting. The index was 26 points (11 percent) above a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Wage Rates for October 15 was 288, up 2 points (.7 percent) from mid-September. Higher prices for replacement livestock, feed, and family living items were the major contributors to the increase. The index for October was 31 points (12 percent) higher than a year earlier.

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers for October increased 1 point (.4 percent) from the previous month to 262 percent of its 1967 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was up 26 points (11 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

POTATOES, SWEETPOTATOES, AND DRY BEANS: The October index of prices received for potatoes, sweetpotatoes, and dry edible beans decreased 77 points (24 percent) from the previous month to 241 percent of its 1967 average. Potatoes, at \$4.62 per cwt, declined \$2.21 from the September price. Minimizing the index decline, sweetpotatoes at \$9.76 increased \$1.49 per cwt and dry edible beans at \$25.30 increased 80 cents per cwt. The index was up 70 points (41 percent) from a year earlier.

DAIRY PRODUCTS: The index for dairy products at 270 increased 8 points (3.1 percent) from September. The average price of all milk sold to plants and dealers, at \$13.60 per cwt, was up 40 cents from a month earlier. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 20 points (8.0 percent).

FOOD GRAINS: At 273, the food grains index at mid-October was up 13 points (5.0 percent) from the previous month. Wheat averaged \$4.19 per bushel, an increase of 20 cents from September, and rice increased 50 cents to \$10.70 per cwt. The index was also 13 points (5.0 percent) above a year earlier.

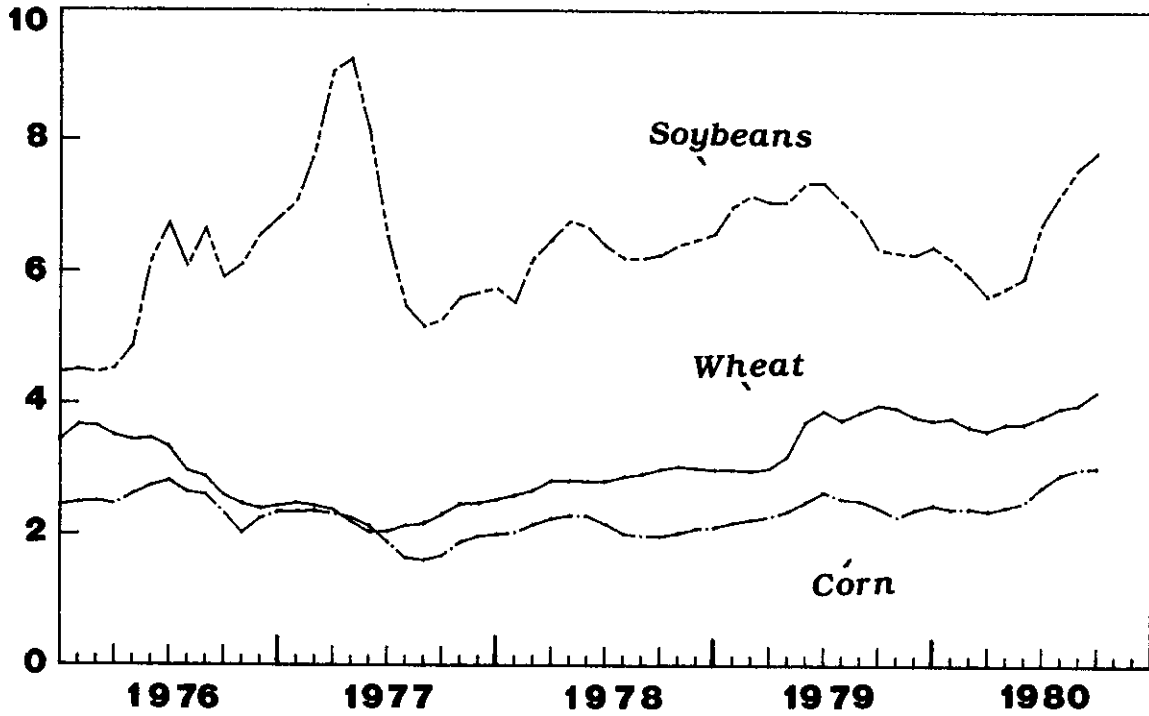
COTTON: The index of prices received by farmers for cotton at 339 was 27 points (7.4 percent) below September. Upland cotton deliveries in early to mid-October averaged 76.4 cents per pound, 5.9 cents below September. The index was 66 points (24 percent) above a year ago.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The mid-October feed grains and hay index increased 6 points (2.3 percent) to 269. All commodity prices were higher than the previous month. Mid-October sorghum brought \$5.35 per cwt, up 23 cents, and corn at \$3.03 per bushel was up 2 cents. Barley averaged \$2.81 per bushel, up 16 cents, and oats at \$1.68 was up 5 cents per bushel. Hay averaged \$74.60 per ton, \$4.10 above the previous month. Compared to October 1979, the index was up 56 points (26 percent).

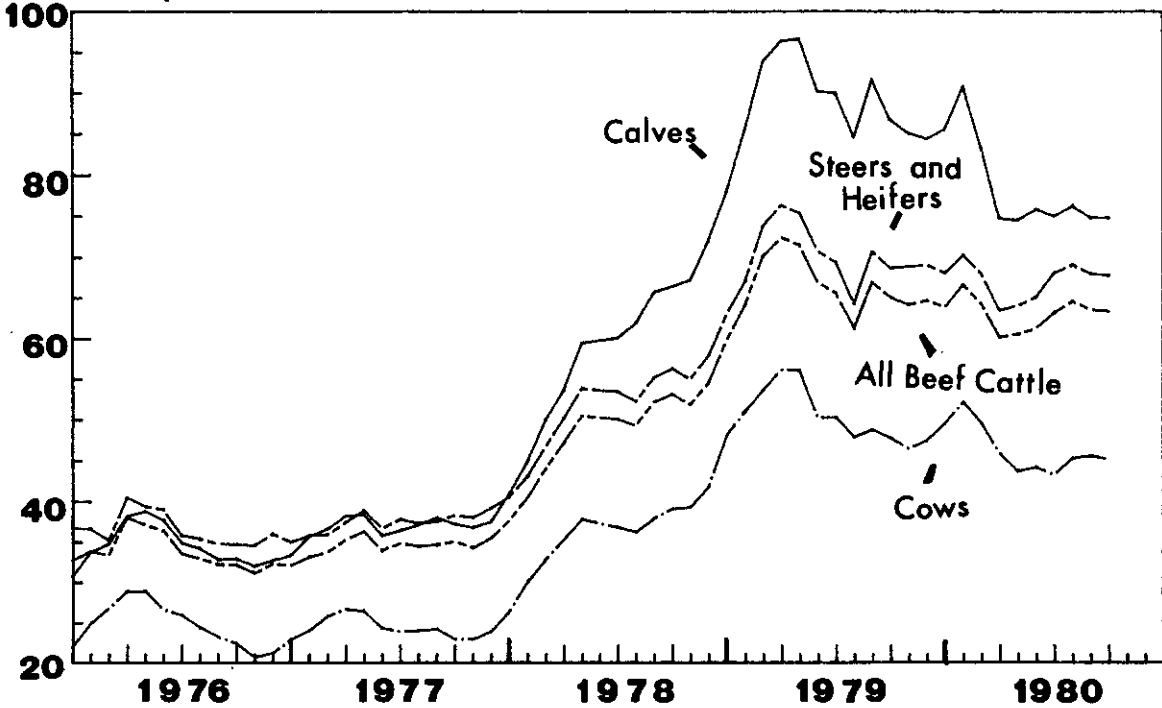
OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received for oil-bearing crops at 280 increased 9 points (3.3 percent) from the previous month. Soybeans at \$7.82 per bushel were up 23 cents. Cottonseed brought \$124.00 per ton, up \$9.00 from September and peanuts increased .7 cent to 21.4 cents per pound. Flaxseed was down 9 cents at \$7.08 per bushel. The index was up 47 points (20 percent) from October 1979.

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Wage Rates for mid-October was 288, up 2 points (.7 percent) from September. The index was 31 points (12 percent) above the index for the same month last year.

PRODUCTION INDEX UP

The index of prices paid for farm production goods and services for October was 284, up 2 points (.7 percent) from a month earlier. Higher prices for replacement livestock and feed were the major contributors to the increase. The production index was 28 points (11 percent) higher than a year earlier.

FEEDER LIVESTOCK: The index of prices paid for feeder livestock at 289 was 7 points (2.5 percent) higher than a month ago. The mid-October feeder pig prices were up \$8.50 per cwt. while feeder cattle and calf prices were \$1.50 per cwt. higher than a month earlier. The index was .3 percent above the same month a year earlier.

FEED: At 253, the index of prices paid for feed was up 6 points (2.4 percent) from the previous month. Compared to a year ago the index was up 20 percent.

FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: At 230, the index of prices paid for farm and motor supplies was 3 points (1.3 percent) above August 1980. Prices were higher for all motor supply items surveyed, except storage batteries. The index was up 16 percent from October 1979.

BUILDING AND FENCING MATERIALS: The October 15 index of prices paid for building and fencing materials at 299 was unchanged from mid-August. Lower prices for 2 x 4's and plywood offset increased prices for wooden posts and galvanized steel roofing. The index was 6.4 percent above a year ago.

FERTILIZER: The index of prices paid for fertilizer was 246, down 2 points (.8 percent) from May 1980. Nitrogen-phosphorous mixtures and nitrogen materials contributed most to the decrease. The index was 17 percent above a year earlier.

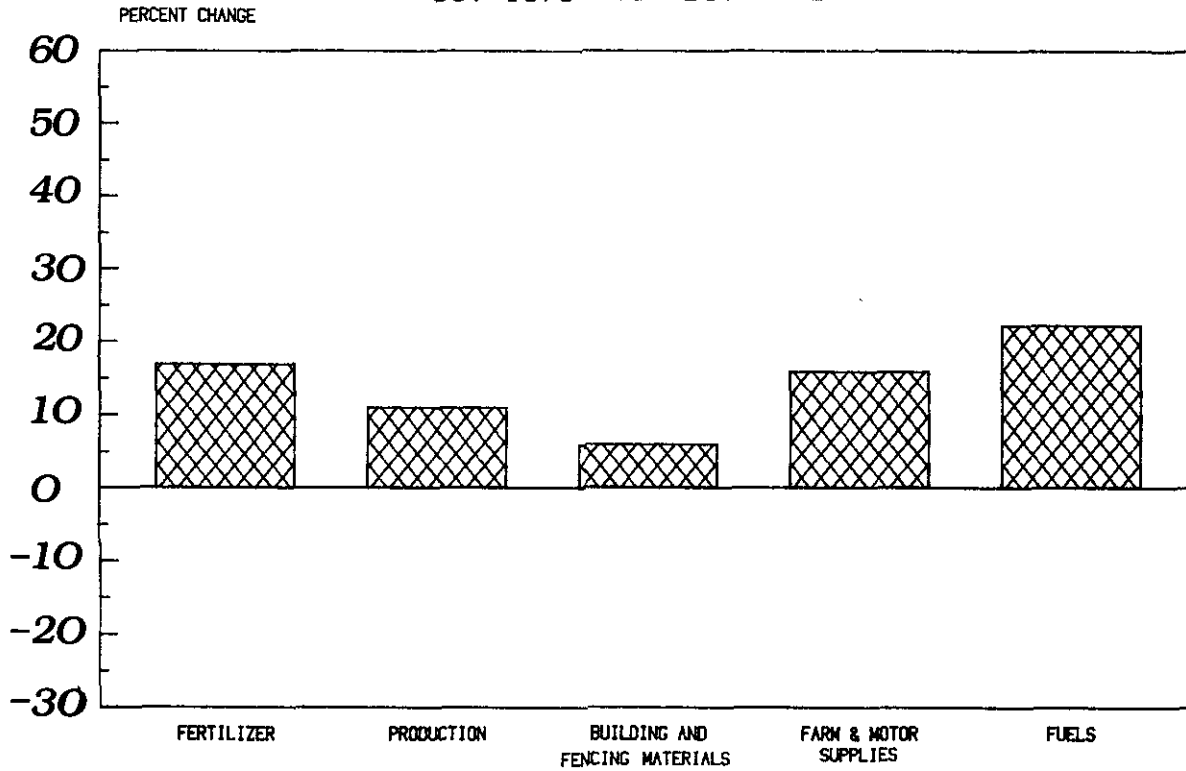
FUELS AND ENERGY: The mid-October index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy was 383, down 2 points (.5 percent) from a month earlier. The price paid for gasoline was down 1 cent per gallon, while diesel fuel prices were up .3 cent per gallon from the previous month. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 22 percent.

THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI-U)

At 251.7, the September unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers was .9 percent above the CPI-U for August and 13 percent above September 1979. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U was up 1.0 percent. The index for food and beverages rose 1.6 percent, the second consecutive large monthly increase. Prices for food from the grocery stores jumped 1.9 percent as beef, pork and poultry advanced sharply for the third consecutive month. The apparel and upkeep index rose 1.3 percent. Large increases in airline and intercity bus fares and used car prices pushed the transportation component up 1.2 percent. The entertainment index was up 1.0 percent while medical care advanced .8 percent. The housing component, which had been the major moderating influence on the CPI during the two previous months, rose .7 percent in September. Increases in house prices, property insurance and household maintenance and repair more than offset the effect of lower interest rates.

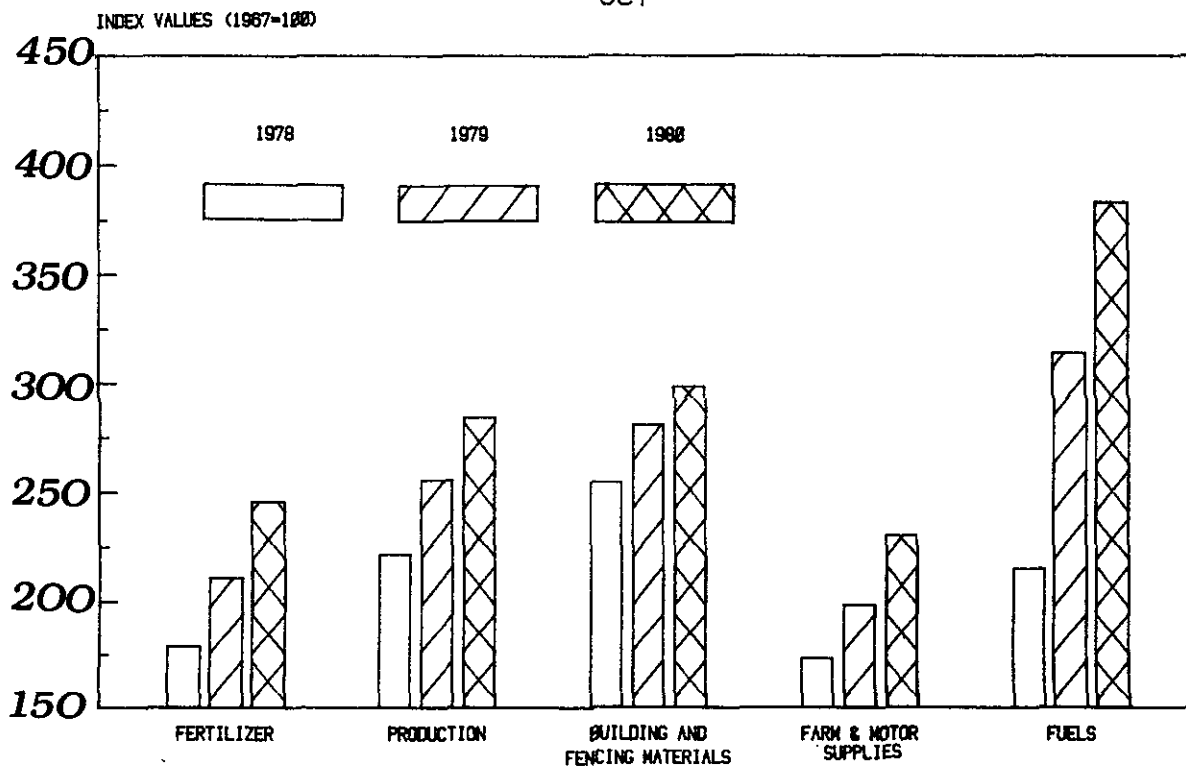
PERCENT CHANGE IN PRICES PAID COMMODITY INDEX

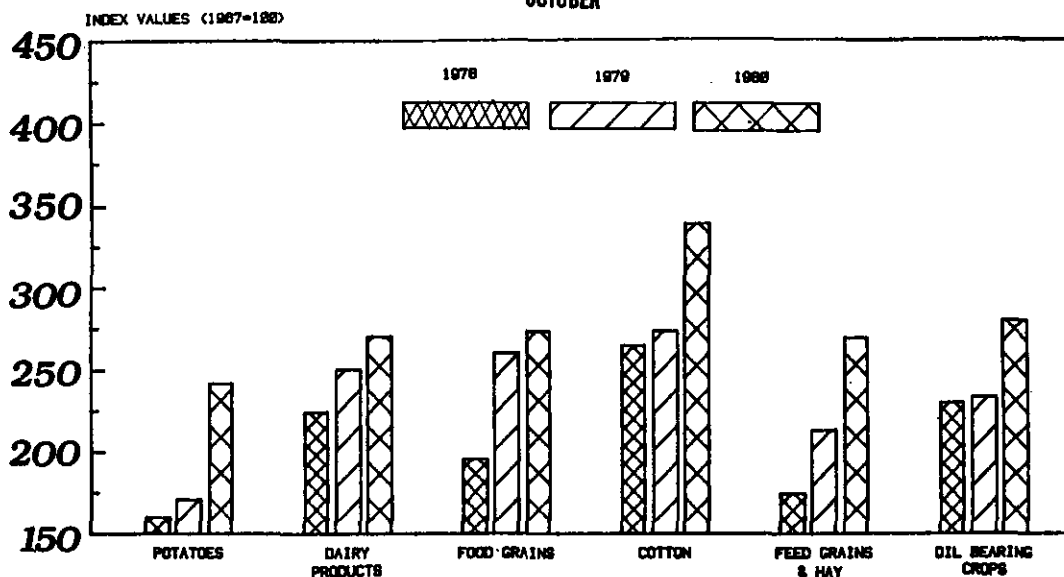

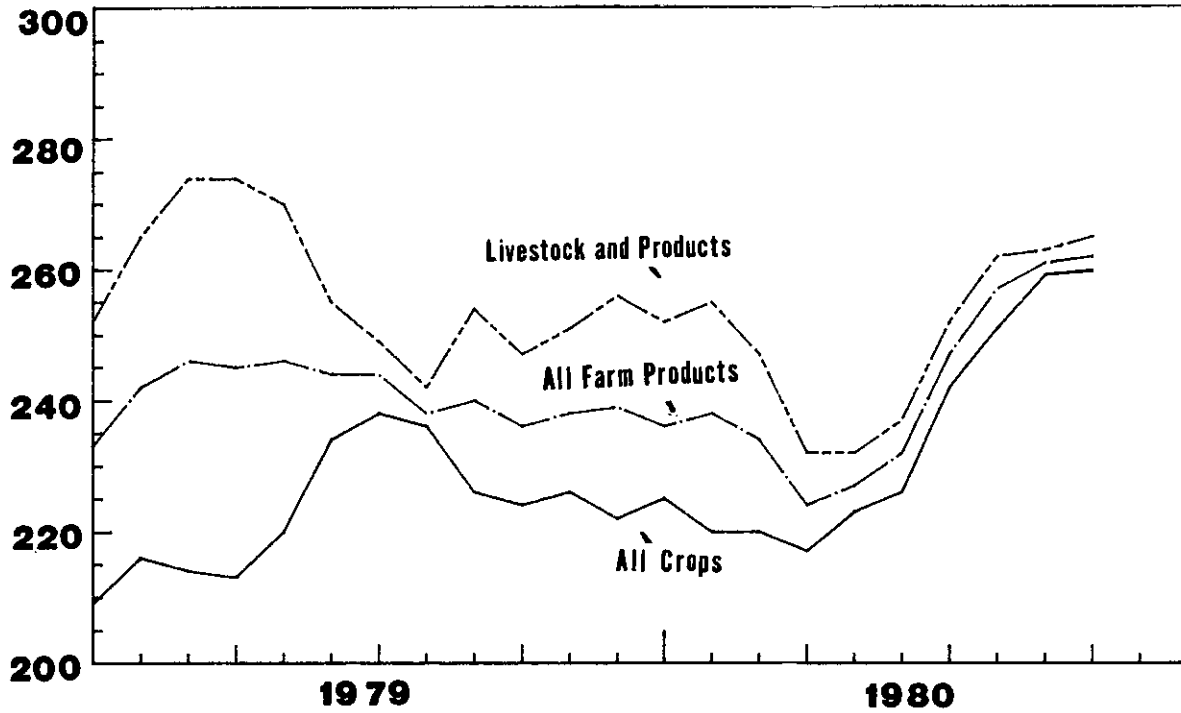

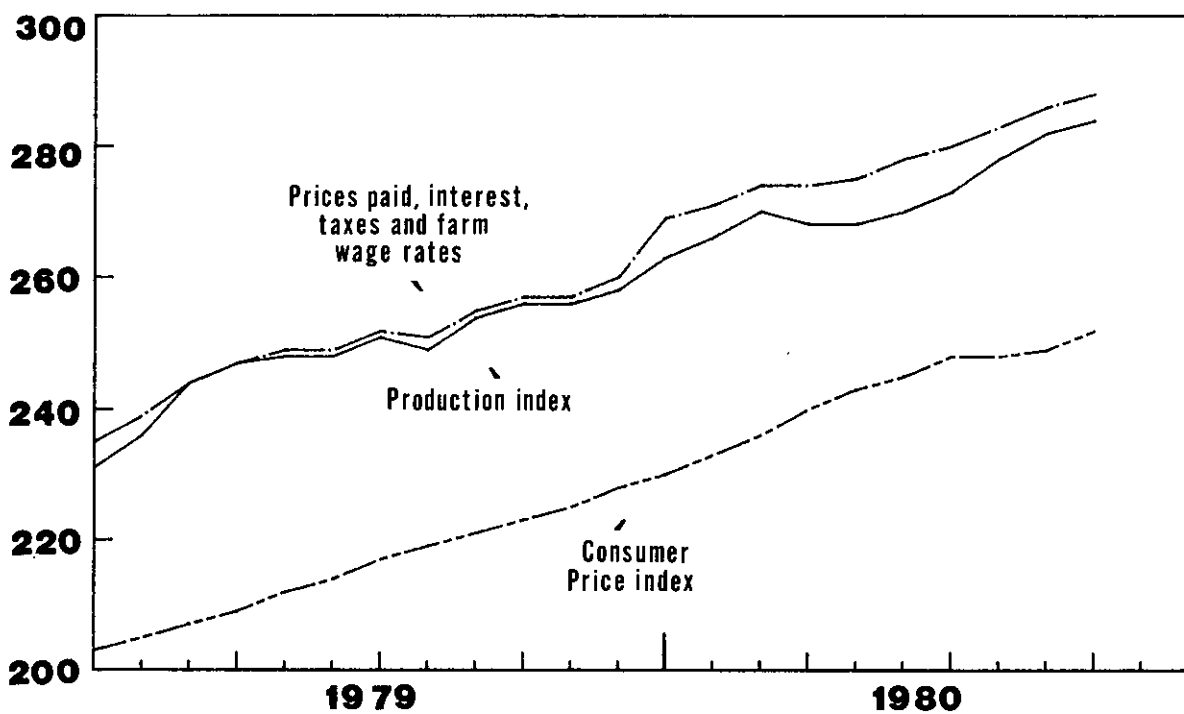
Index of Prices Received by Farmers

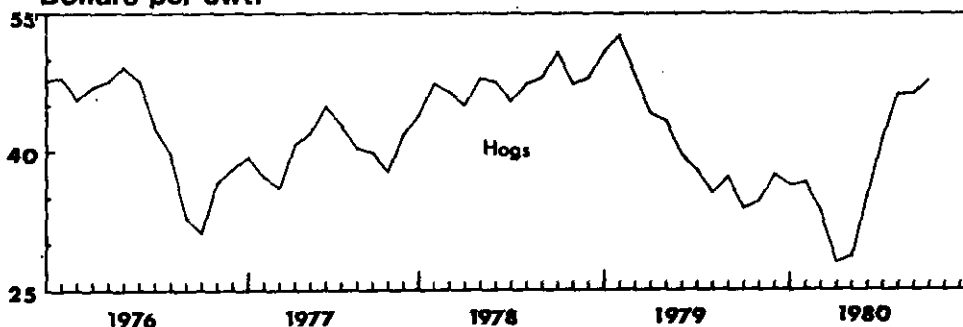

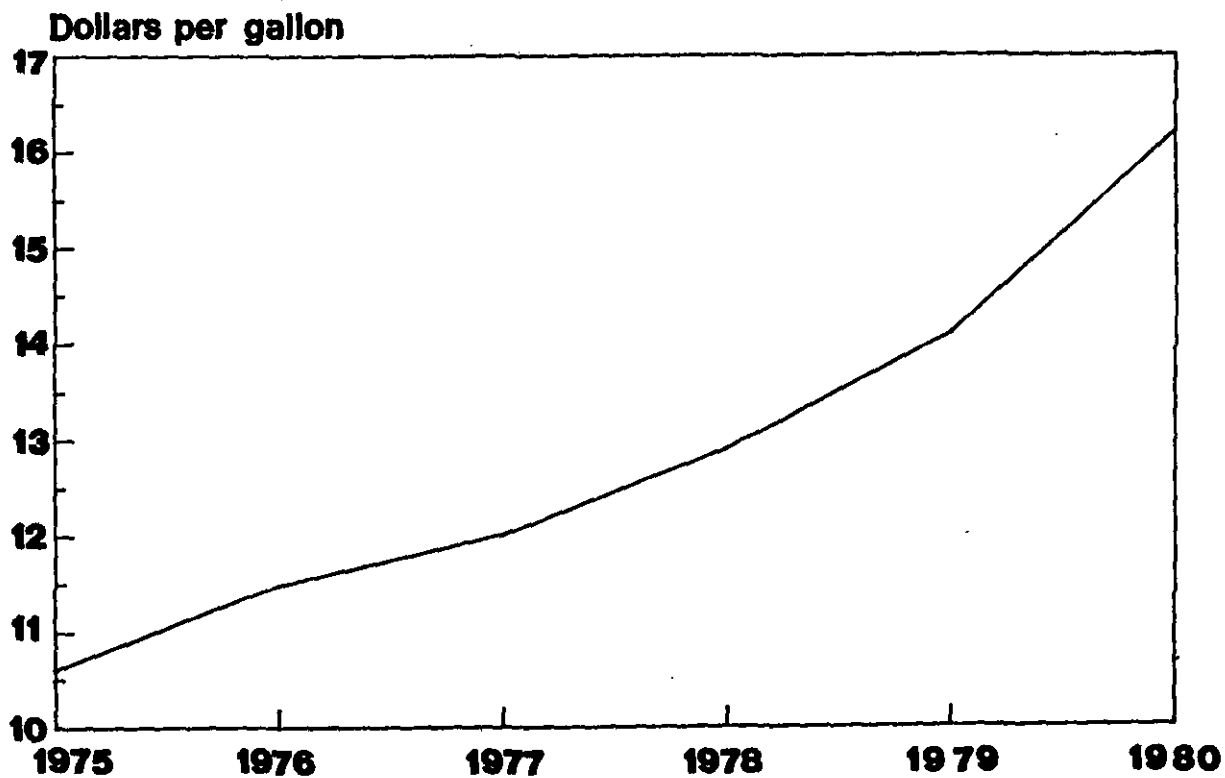

FARM TELEPHONE BILL UP 3 PERCENT

The total monthly telephone bill for farmers averaged \$26.90 per month for the U.S. during the summer of 1980, up 3 percent from the 1979 bill of \$26.20. The monthly telephone bill includes charges for local service, long distance calls and extension phones. The cost of local telephone service to farmers averaged \$10.80 per month for the U.S., up 2 percent from the 1979 bill of \$10.60.

FARM ELECTRIC BILL UP 12 PERCENT

Farm electric bills averaged \$61.90 per month during mid 1980, 12 percent above the 1979 average of \$55.10. The large increase was due almost entirely to an 11 percent increase in the average cost per kilowatt-hour (KWH) over 1979. The 1980 average of 4.72 cents per KWH compares to 4.24 cents in 1979. Electricity usage averaged 1313 KWH per farm in 1980, up 1 percent from a year earlier.

The cost of electricity per KWH was higher in all areas of the U.S. in 1980. A rate jump of 25 percent or more was experienced by farmers in most Mountain and Western States as the costs for the construction of additional generating facilities were being incorporated into the rate structures. The cost of electrical power in the Northeast was almost 20 percent higher in 1980 than a year earlier. Rate increases for the rest of the nation were generally 8 to 10 percent except in the Southeastern Region where the rates were up 7 percent or less.

SURVEY PROCEDURES

The expenditures by farm families for telephone and electric service are obtained through sample surveys in each State. The State averages are weighted to a National average cost by the number of farms in each State that have telephone or electric service. The cost of the electricity includes the tax and fuel adjustment charges included in the monthly bills.

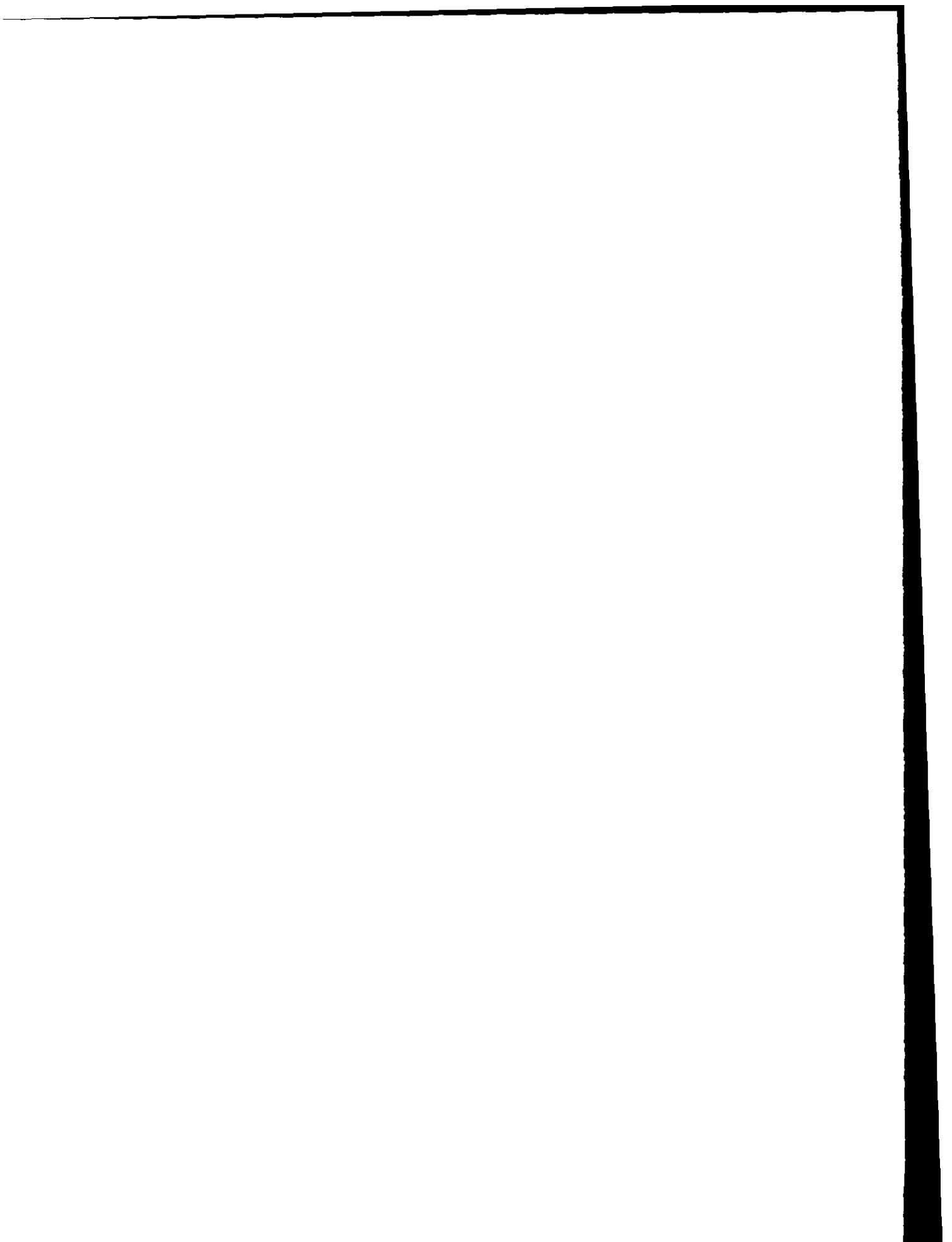
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
