

AGRICULTURAL PRICES

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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 5 POINTS PRICES PAID INDEX UP 2 POINTS

The November Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 5 points (1.9 percent) to 265 percent of its January-December 1967 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since October were higher prices for soybeans, corn, eggs, milk, lettuce and wheat. Lower prices for cattle, hogs, grapefruit, broilers, tomatoes and apples were partially offsetting. The index was 27 points (11 percent) above a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Wage Rates for November 15 was 290, up 2 points (.7 percent) from mid-October. Higher prices for feed, fuels and energy, and family living items were the major contributors to the index rise. Lower prices for replacement cattle and calves moderated the increase. The index was 32 points (12 percent) above a year earlier.

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers for November 1980 increased 5 points (1.9 percent) from the previous month to 265 percent of its 1967 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was up 27 points (11 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 261, the November index of prices received for meat animals was down 10 points (3.7 percent) from a month earlier. Mid-November beef cattle prices averaged \$59.60 per cwt, a decrease of \$2.20 from the October average for the entire month. Calf prices were off \$1.90 to \$72.90 per cwt. Hog prices, at \$45.30 per cwt, were down \$1.90 from a month ago. The meat animal index was 2 points (.8 percent) below November 1979.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received by farmers for oil-bearing crops at 304 increased 28 points (10 percent) from the previous month. Soybeans at \$8.42 per bushel were up 74 cents and peanuts at 25.8 cents, increased 3.8 cents per pound. Cottonseed prices averaged \$133.00 per ton, an increase of \$9.00 per ton, and flaxseed was 27 cents higher at \$7.37 per bushel. The index was 73 points (32 percent) above a year earlier.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The November index of prices received by farmers for feed grains and hay increased 15 points (5.6 percent) from October to 282 percent of its 1967 average. All commodities except hay increased in price. Corn at \$3.20 per bushel was up 21 cents and sorghum grain was up 26 cents to \$5.62 per cwt. Barley averaged \$3.05 per bushel, up 24 cents from October and oats at \$1.80 per bushel increased 15 cents. Hay brought \$73.60 per ton, down \$1.00 from a month earlier. Compared to November 1979, the index was up 76 points (37 percent).

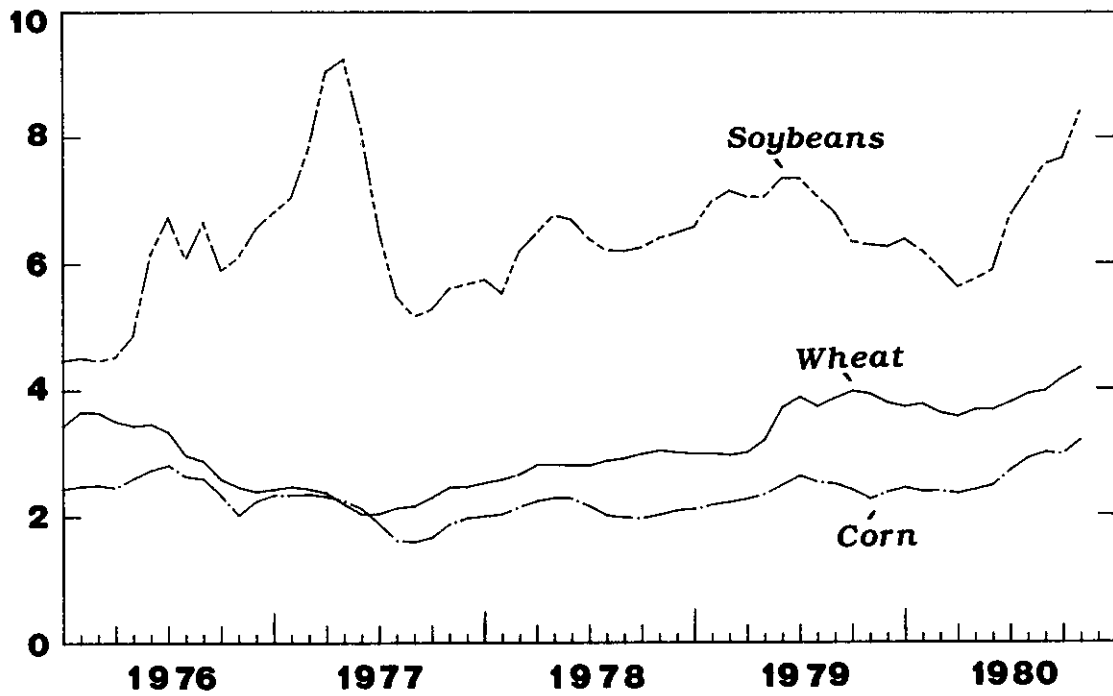
FOOD GRAINS: At 286, the mid-November index of prices received by farmers for food grains increased 12 points (4.4 percent) from the previous month. Wheat averaged \$4.34 per bushel, up 15 cents from October, and rice at \$12.00 per cwt was up \$1.10 from the previous month. The index was 30 points (12 percent) above a year earlier.

VEGETABLES: The November index of prices received for commercial vegetables at 210 was 16 points (8.2 percent) above a month earlier. Lettuce contributed most to the index increase followed by cantaloupes, cabbage and green peppers. Tomatoes, watermelons, sweet corn and snap beans decreased in price. The index was 20 points (11 percent) above November 1979.

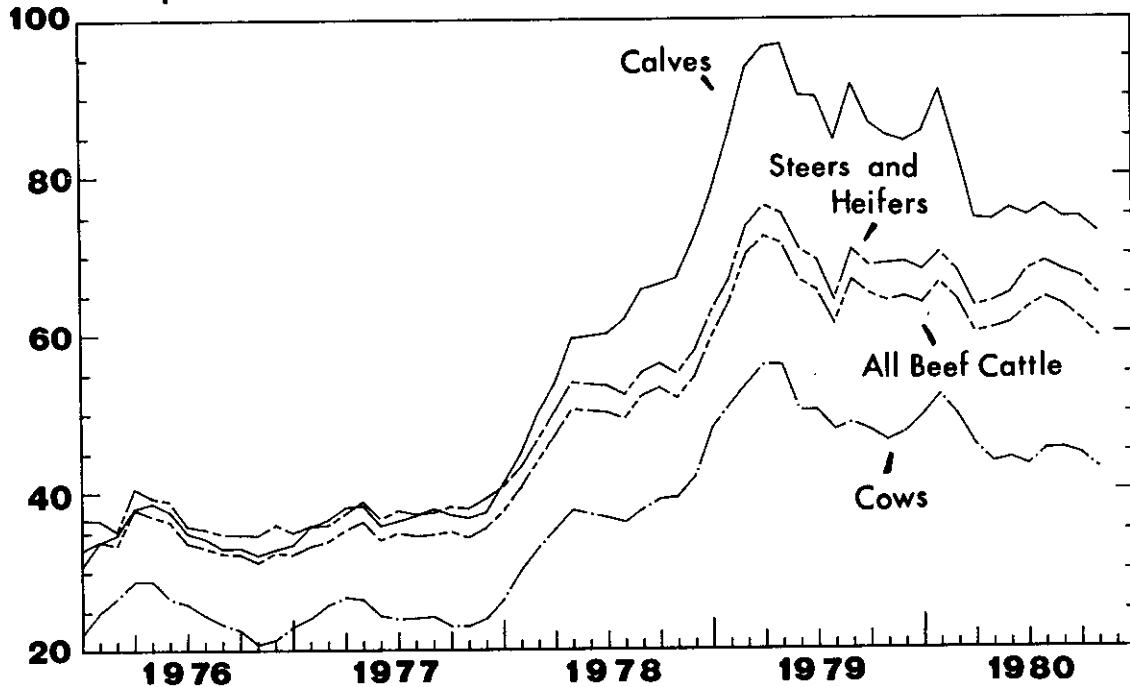
DAIRY PRODUCTS: The November dairy products index at 278 increased 6 points (2.2 percent) from a month earlier. The average price of all milk sold to plants and dealers, at \$14.00 per cwt, was up 30 cents. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 22 points (8.6 percent).

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Wage Rates for mid-November was 290, up 2 points (.7 percent) from October. The index was 32 points (12 percent) higher than a year earlier.

PRODUCTION INDEX UP

The index of prices paid for farm production goods and services for November was 287, up 3 points (1.1 percent) from a month earlier. Major contributors to the increase were the commodity groups of feed, fuels and energy, and new autos and trucks. Partially offsetting the increase was the lower prices for replacement cattle and calves. The production index was 31 points (12 percent) above a year ago.

REPLACEMENT LIVESTOCK: The mid-November index of prices paid for replacement livestock, at 283, was 6 points (2.1 percent) lower than a month ago. Feeder cattle and calf prices declined \$2.50 per cwt, while prices for other replacement livestock were slightly higher. Compared to a year earlier, the index was down 2.1 percent.

FEED: The index of prices paid by farmers for feed jumped 13 points (5.2 percent) from a month earlier to 265. Prices for feed grains and higher protein mixed feeds were sharply higher than a month ago while prices for roughage feeds were slightly lower. The index was 28 percent above November a year ago.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The mid-November index of prices paid by farmers for fuels and energy was 386, up 3 points (.8 percent) from a month earlier. The price paid for gasoline was up 1 cent per gallon, while diesel fuel prices were up 1.4 cents per gallon. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 21 percent.

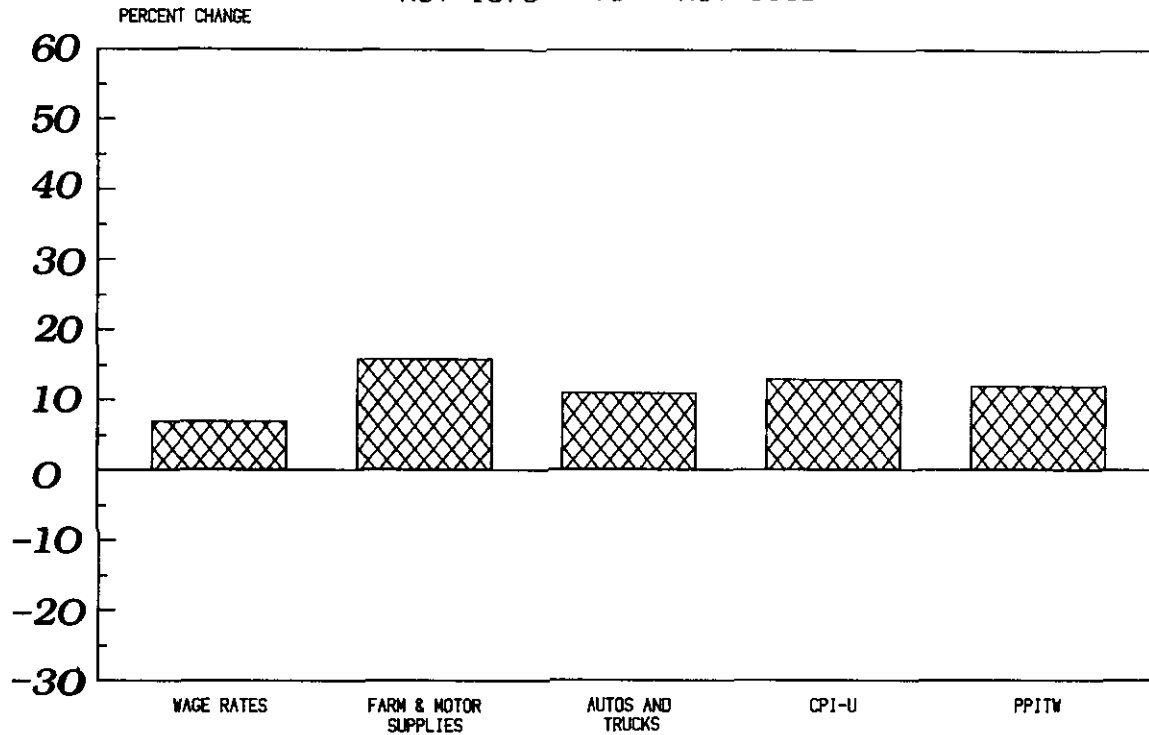
AUTOS AND TRUCKS: The index of prices paid for autos and trucks increased 24 points (8.4 percent). This was the first time that new motor vehicles were surveyed since the introduction of the 1981 models. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 11 percent.

THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI-U)

The unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers in October was 253.9, up .9 percent from September and 12.6 percent above a year earlier. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 1.0 percent. The housing component of the index rose 1.3 percent as interest rates on home mortgages and house prices turned sharply higher. The transportation and medical care indexes were .8 percent higher than a month earlier. The food and beverage index was up .7 percent, substantially below the increases of the past 3 months. The apparel and upkeep, as well as the entertainment index, each rose .5 percent while the other goods and services component was .3 percent higher.

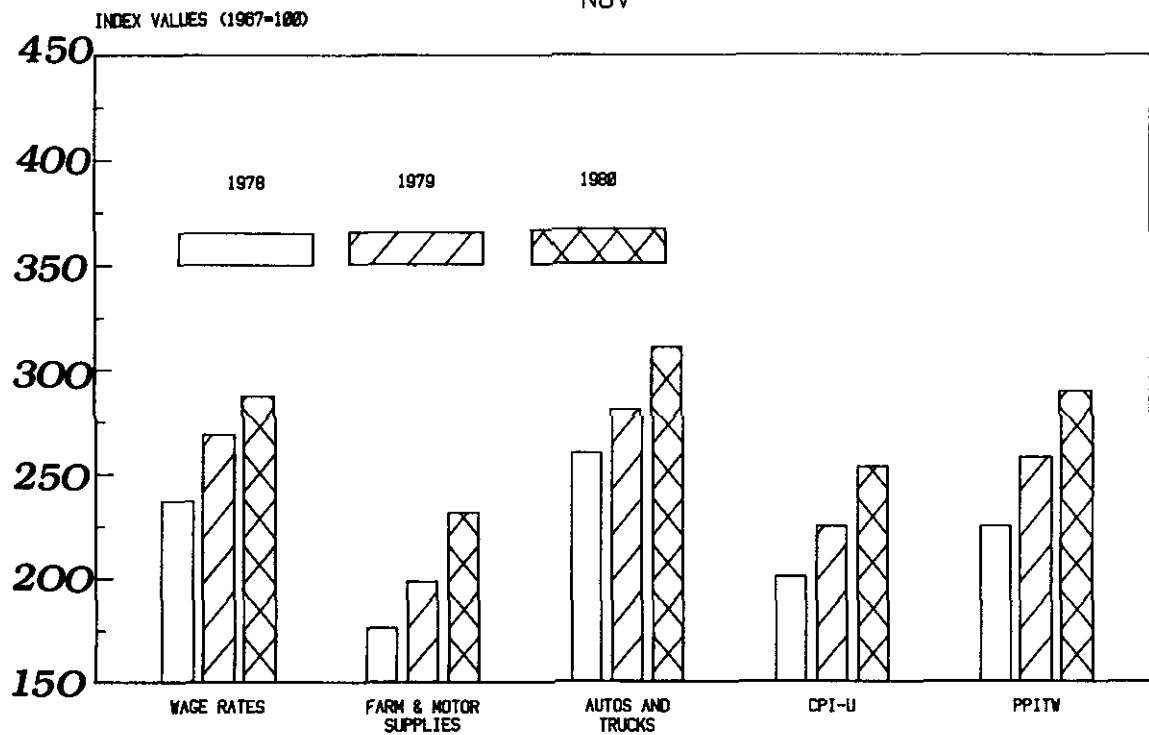
PERCENT CHANGE IN PRICES PAID COMMODITY INDEX

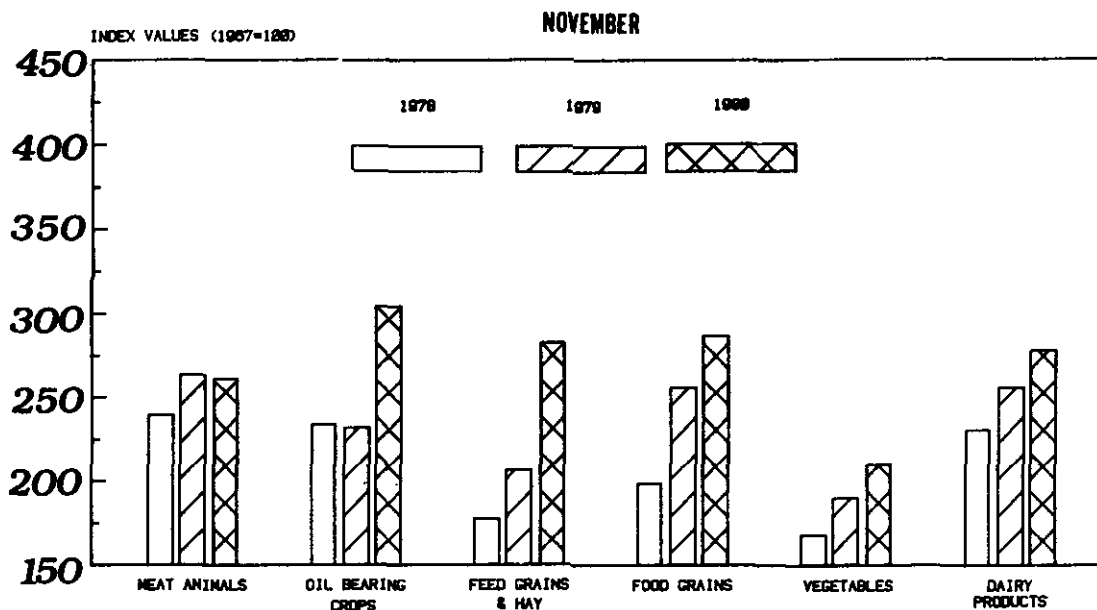

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX COMPARISONS



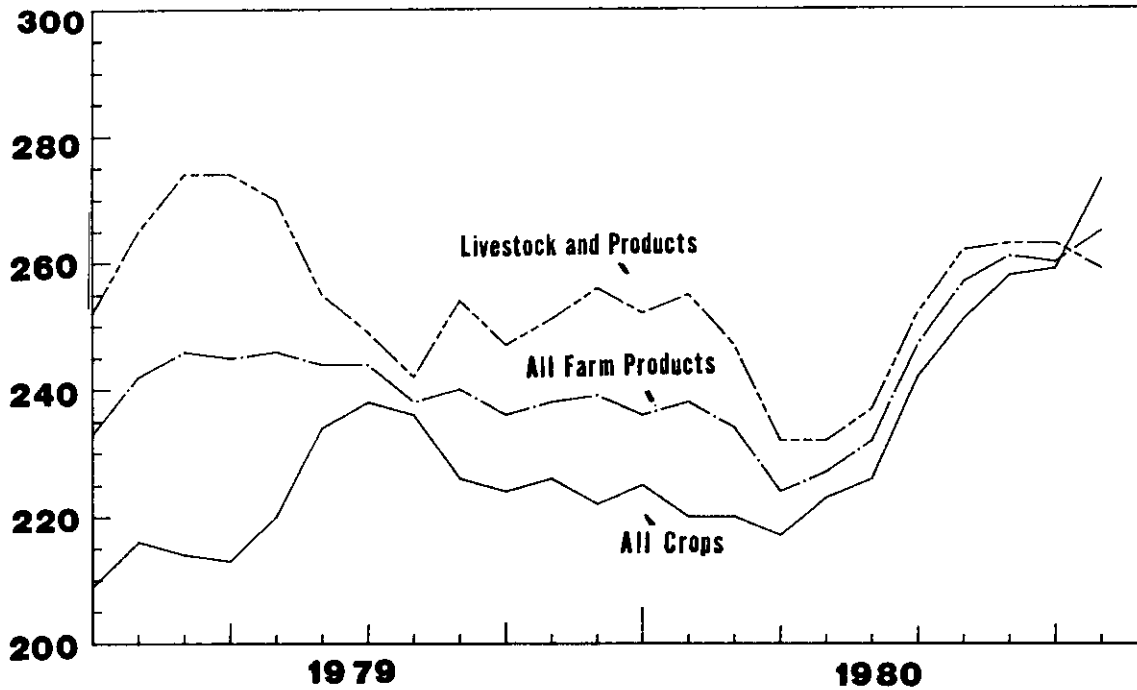

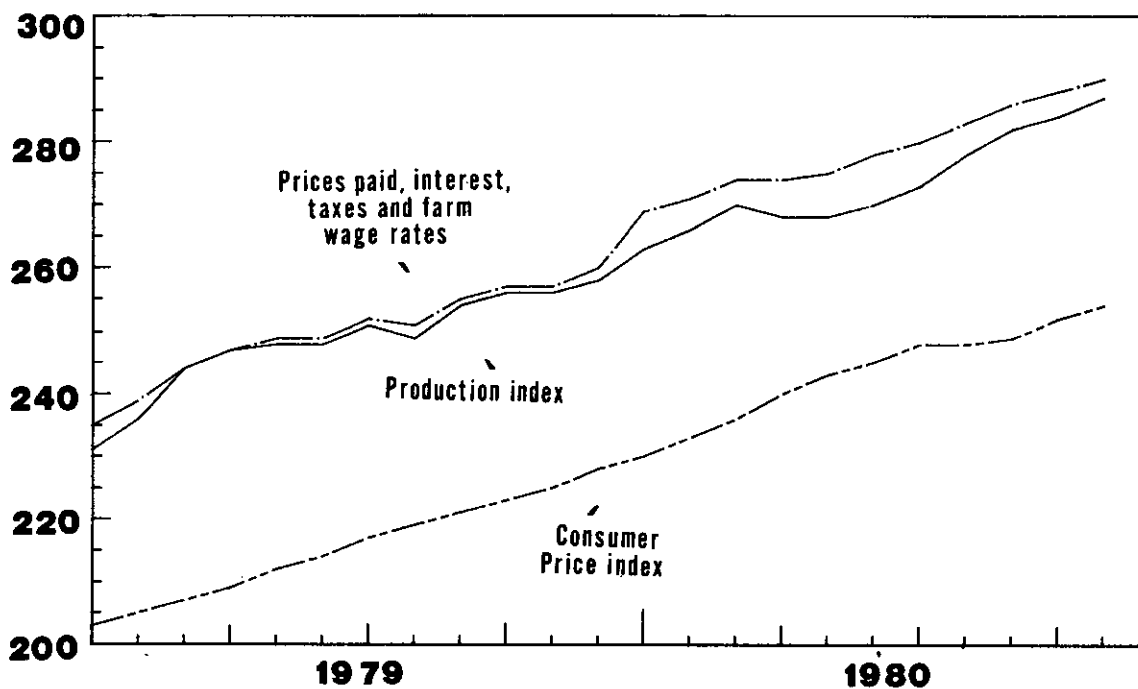
Index of Prices Received by Farmers

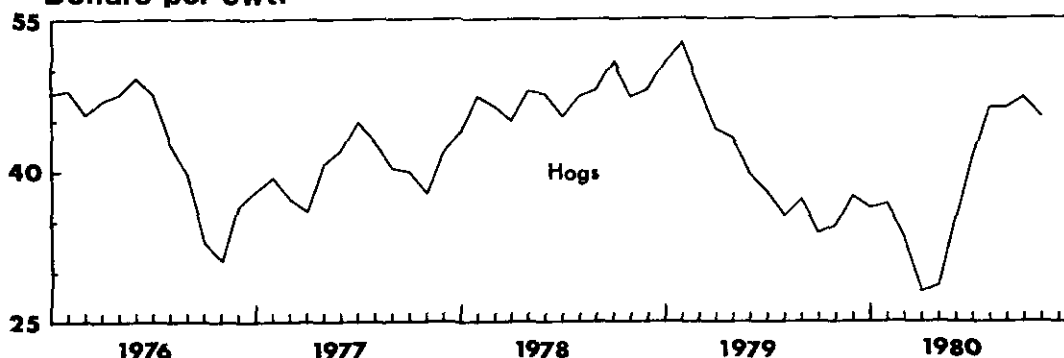
