PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 5 POINTS PRICES PAID INDEX UNCHANGED

The October Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 5 points (3.7 percent) from September to 129 percent of its January - December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the decrease since September were lower prices for cattle, hogs, potatoes, corn and oranges. Higher prices for cotton, milk and grapefruit were partially offsetting. The index was 13 points (9.2 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for October was unchanged from September at 151 percent of its 1977 base. Lower prices for replacement livestock, feed and fertilizers were offset by sharply higher family living costs. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 9 points (6.3 percent).

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers for October decreased 5 points (3.7 percent) from the previous month to 129 percent of its 1977 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was down 13 points (9.2 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 146, the October index for meat animals was down 9 points (5.8 percent) from September. Mid-month cattle prices averaged \$55.80, down \$3.10, hogs at \$44.50 were down \$4.10, and calf prices declined \$1.40 from last month to \$60.40 per cwt. The meat animal index was down 15 points (9.3 percent) from a year ago.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The feed grains and hay index for October was 120, down 4 points (3.2 percent) from the previous month. Corn was 13 cents lower at \$2.42 per bushel and sorghum grain was 8 cents lower at \$3.99 per cwt. Barley averaged \$2.38 per bushel, down 6 cents from September, while oats increased 5 cents to \$1.79 per bushel. Hay averaged \$64.00 per ton, up \$1.10 from the previous month. The index was 27 points (18 percent) below a year earlier.

POTATOES, SWEETPOTATOES, AND DRY BEANS: The October index decreased 30 points, (20 percent) from the previous month to 118 percent of its 1977 average. Potatoes, at \$4.38 per cwt, were down \$1.62 while dry beans increased \$.90 to \$23.80 per cwt. Compared to a year ago, the index was down 1 point (.8 percent).

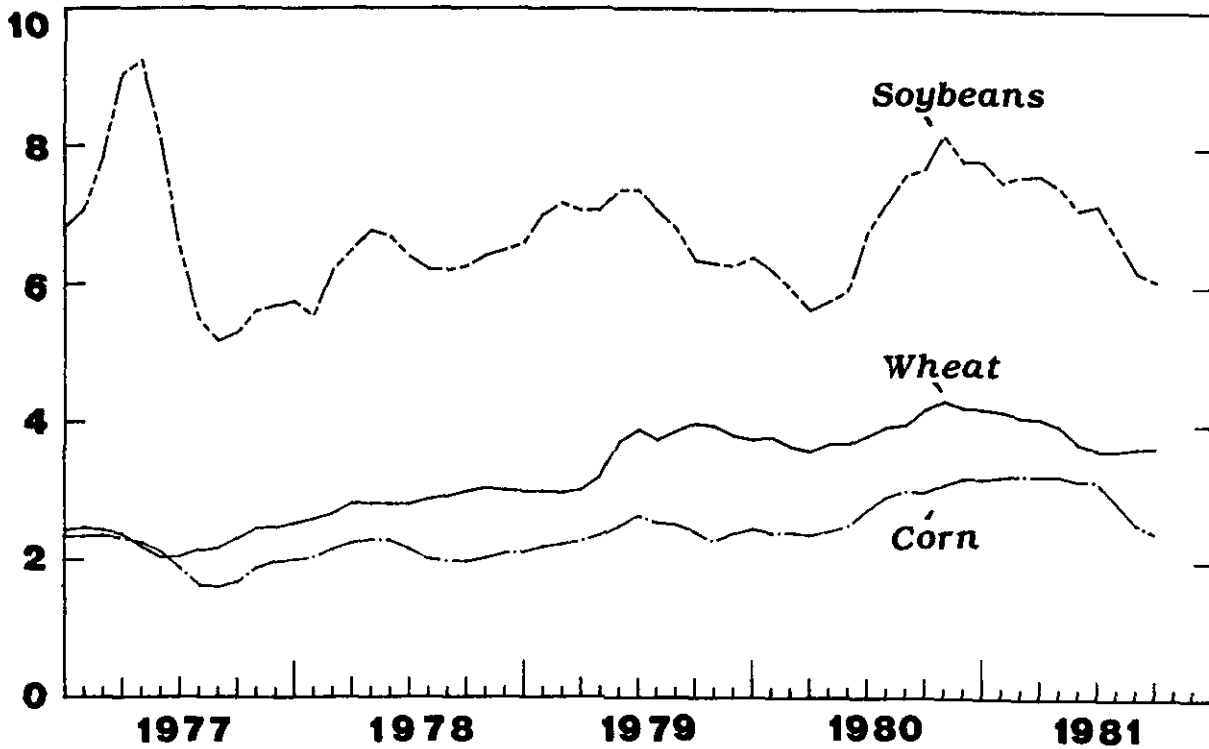
COTTON: At 105, the index of prices received by farmers for cotton was up 9 points (9.4 percent) from September. Upland cotton deliveries in early to mid-October averaged 63.5 cents per pound, 5.5 cents above September. The index was 20 points (16 percent) below a year ago.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received by farmers for oil-bearing crops was 93, down 3 points (3.1 percent) from September. Soybeans at \$6.08 per bushel were 13 cents lower. Peanuts declined 1.6 cents per pound to 27.0 cents. Cottonseed brought \$86.00 per ton, down \$14.00 from September and flaxseed was 21 cents lower at \$6.23 per bushel. The index was 21 points (18 percent) below October 1980.

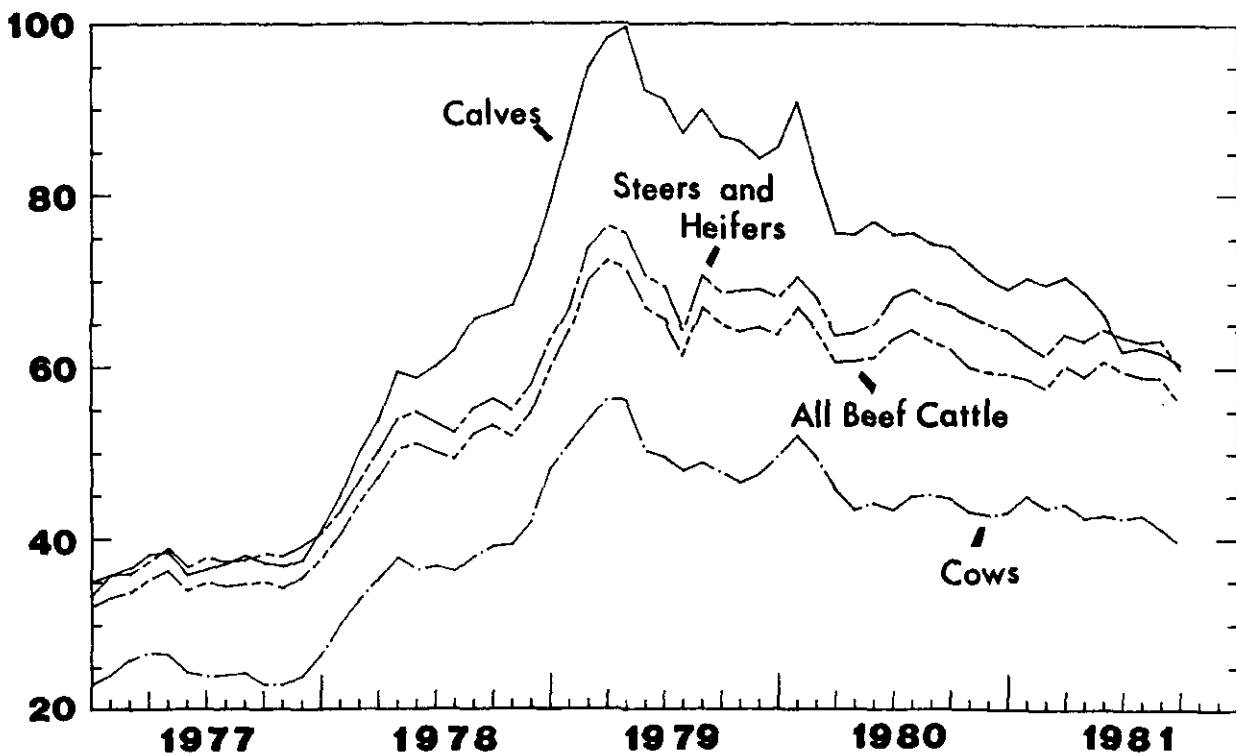
POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and egg index, at 112, was 4 points (3.4 percent) below September. Turkey prices averaged 33.3 cents per pound, down 5.0 cents from last month. Broilers declined 0.9 cent per pound and egg prices declined 0.8 cent per dozen.

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 151 percent of its 1977 base in October. This is the third consecutive month that the index has been at 151. Compared to a year earlier the index was up 9 points (6.3 percent). Lower replacement livestock, feed and fertilizer prices were offset by higher prices for family living items.

PRODUCTION INDEX DOWN

The index of production goods and services was 147 (1977=100) down 2 points (1.3 percent) from September. Lower prices for feed grains, mixed feeds, fertilizers containing phosphates, feeder cattle and feeder pigs accounted for most of the decline. The index was 4 points (2.8 percent) higher than in October 1980.

REPLACEMENT LIVESTOCK: The replacement livestock index at 162 was down 3.6 percent from last month. Feeder cattle and calves were down \$2.00 per cwt. while feeder pigs were \$11.00 per cwt. lower. The index was 11 percent below a year earlier.

FEED: At 123, the mid-October index of prices paid for feed was down 3 points (2.4 percent) from a month earlier. Corn, mixed feeds and concentrates were the major contributors to the decrease. The index was 8.9 percent below a year earlier.

FERTILIZER: At 144, the fertilizer price index was down 3 points (2.0 percent) from May. Lower prices for high phosphorus content fertilizers contributed most to the decrease. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 5.9 percent.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The fuels and energy index, at 214 was unchanged from September. October gasoline and diesel fuel prices averaged the same as the previous month. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 13 percent.

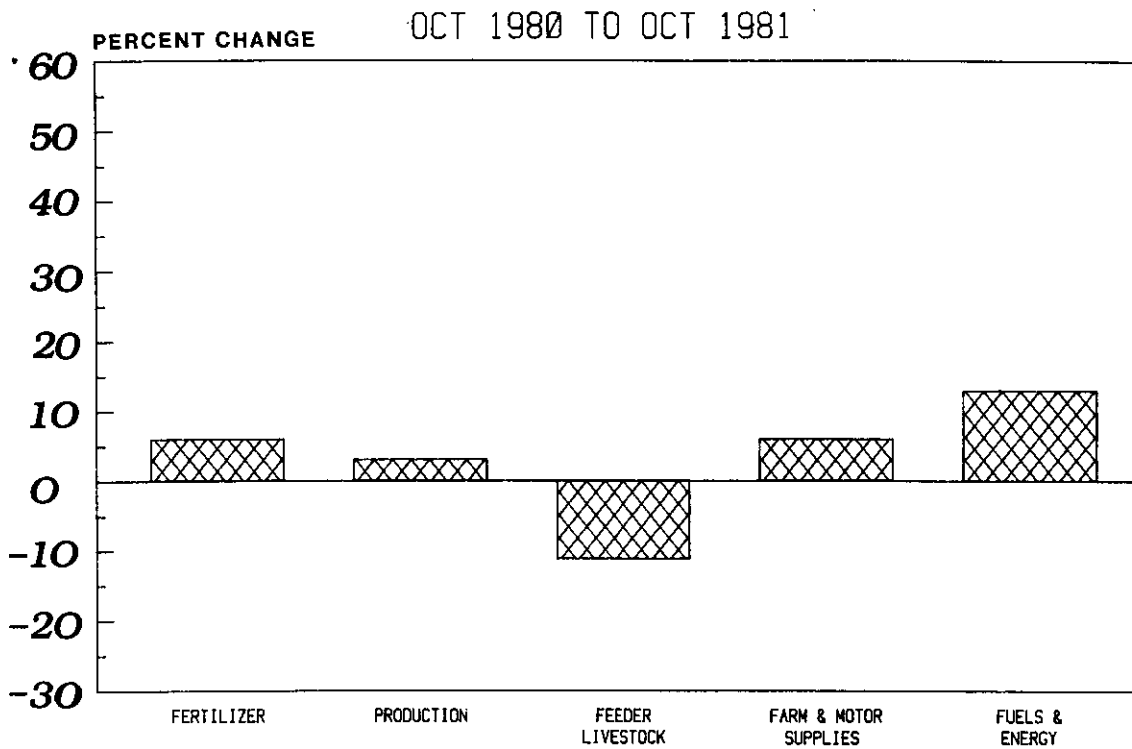
BUILDING AND FENCING MATERIAL: The prices paid index for building and fencing materials was 135, unchanged from August. Price changes for items in this group were mixed. The index was 3.9 percent above a year earlier.

FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: The October 15 index for farm and motor supplies was 149, up 2 points (1.4 percent) from July. Price increases for petroleum products and storage batteries were the major contributors. Compared to October 1980, the index was up 6.4 percent.

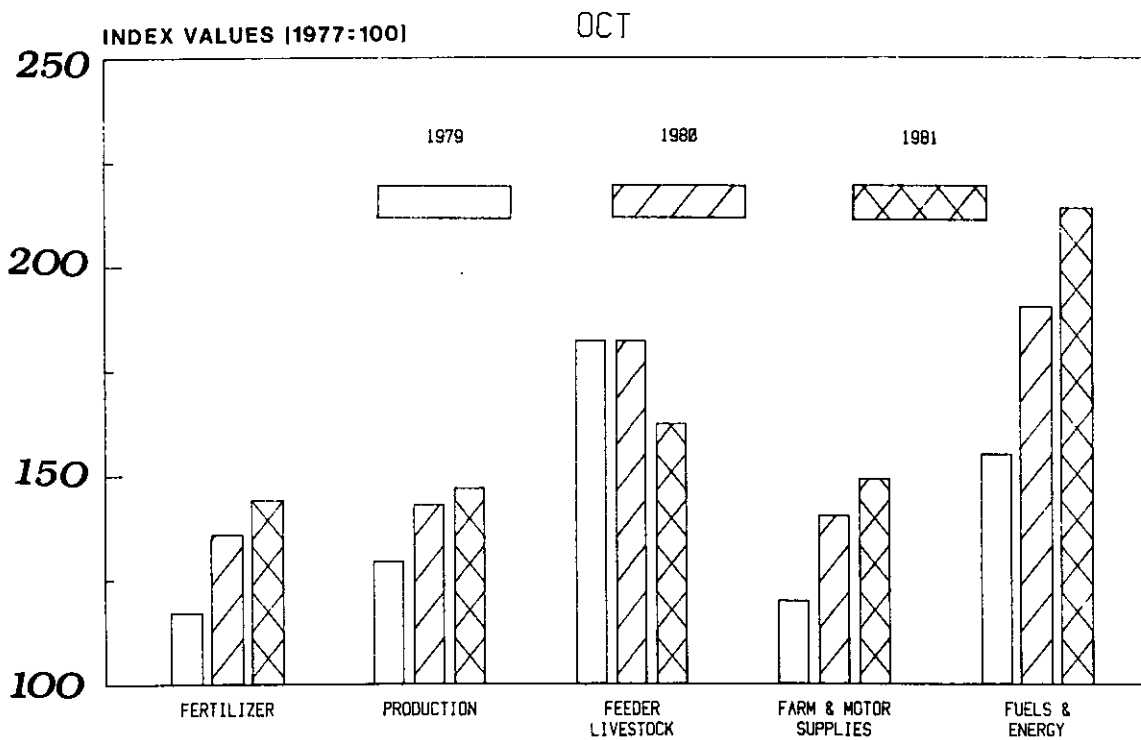
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers was 279.3 (1967=100) for September, up 1.0 percent from August and 11 percent above a year earlier. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose 1.2 percent from August. Major contributors to the September increase were: the other goods and services component, 1.8 percent; housing component, 1.3 percent; transportation, 1.2 percent; food and beverages, 1.0 percent; and medical care component, .9 percent.

PRICES PAID INDEX COMPARISONS

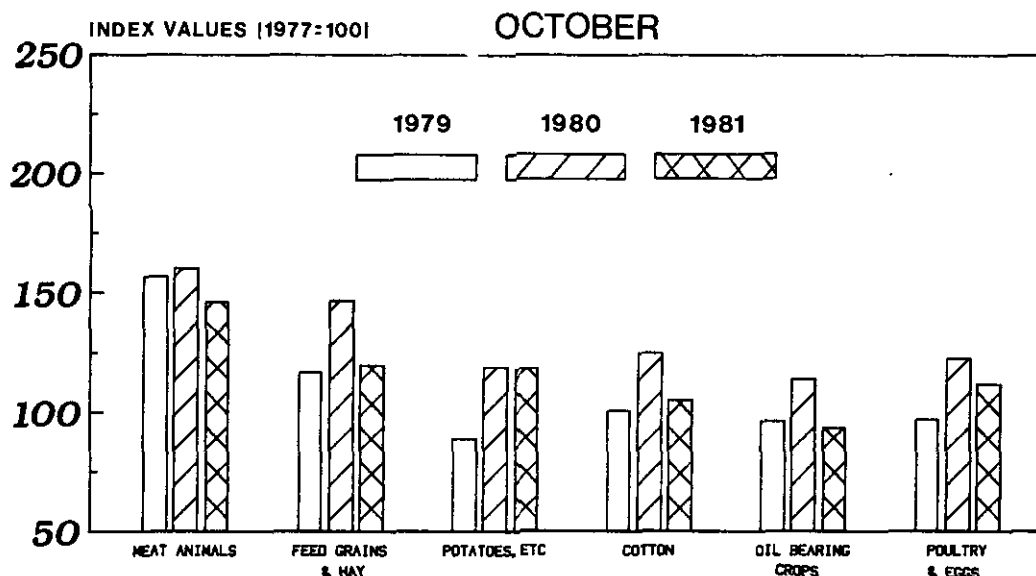

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX COMPARISONS



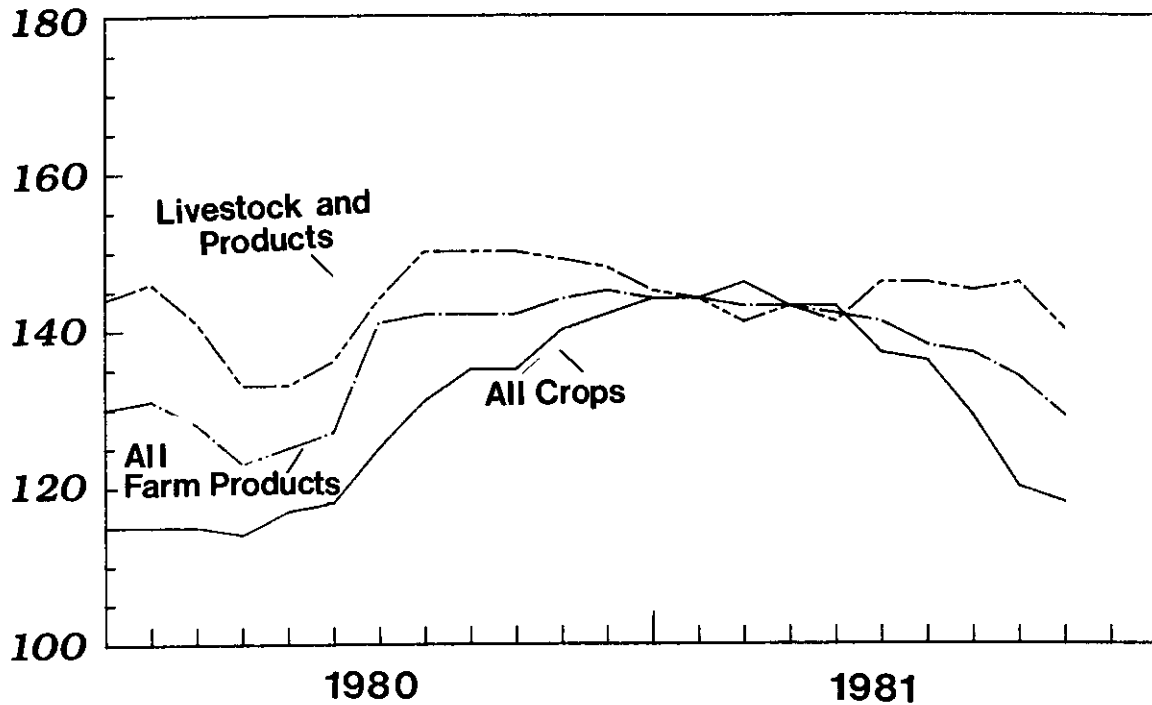

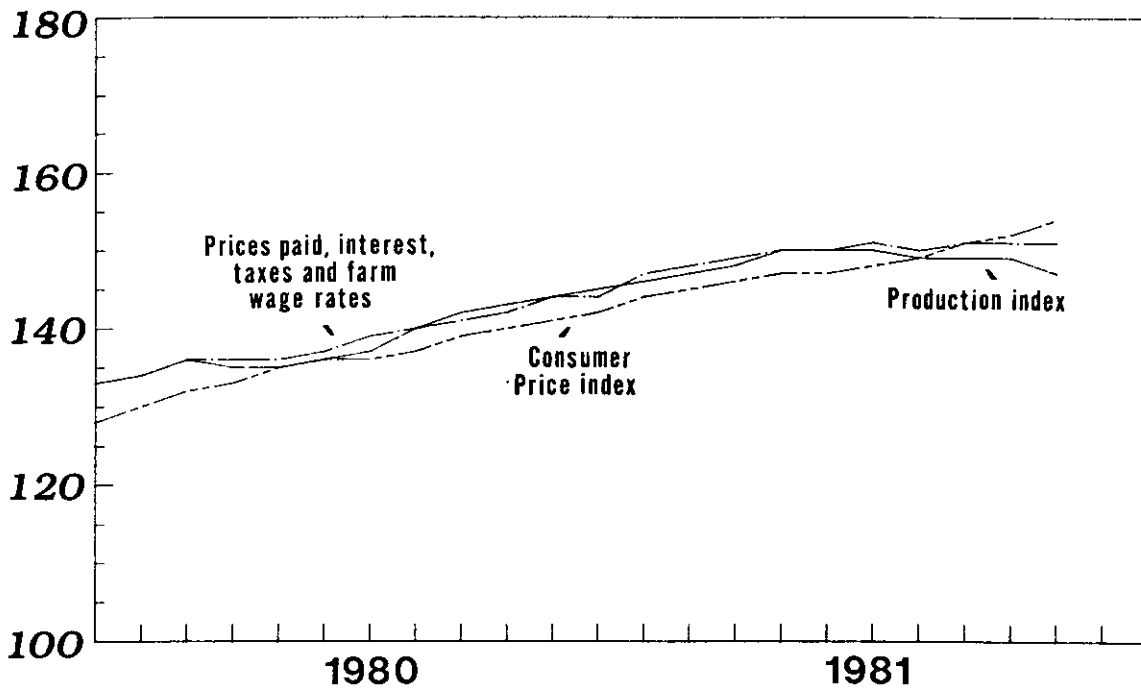
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

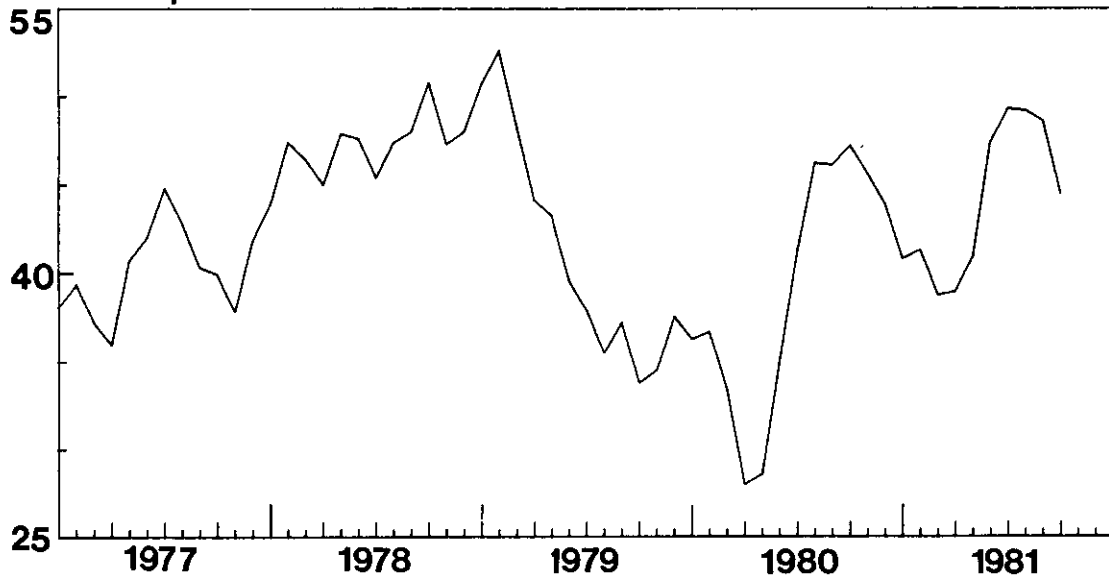

FARM TELEPHONE BILL UP 10 PERCENT

The total monthly telephone bill for farmers averaged \$29.90 per month for the U.S. during the summer of 1981, up 10 percent from the 1980 bill of \$27.10. The monthly telephone bill includes charges for local service, long distance calls and extension phones. The cost of local telephone service to farmers averaged \$11.50 per month for the U.S., up 6 percent from the 1980 bill of \$10.80.

FARM ELECTRIC BILL UP 13 PERCENT

Farm electric bills averaged \$69.80 per month during mid 1981, 13 percent above the 1980 average. The change was due largely to a 13 percent increase in the average cost per kilowatt-hour (KWH) over 1980, while electricity usage averaged 1307 KWH per farm in 1981, down less than 1 percent from a year earlier. The 1981 average of 5.34 cents per KWH compared to 4.72 cents in 1980. The average cost per KWH increased in all States except New Mexico which held steady while moderate declines were noted in California, Idaho, Nevada, and Utah.

SURVEY PROCEDURES

The expenditures by farm families for telephone and electric service are obtained through sample surveys in each State. The State averages are weighted to a National average cost by the number of farms in each State that have telephone or electric service. The tax and fuel adjustment charges that are added to electricity bill are included in the monthly service charges.
