PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 1 POINT
PRICES PAID INDEX UNCHANGED

The November Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 1 point (.8 percent) from October to 129 percent of its January - December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the decrease since October were lower prices for cattle, hogs, corn, grapefruit and lemons. Higher prices for oranges, eggs, strawberries, potatoes and milk were partially offsetting. The index was 15 points (10 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for November was 151 percent of its 1977 base. The index was unchanged from October but 7 points (4.9 percent) above November 1980.

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers for November decreased 1 point (.8 percent) from the previous month to 129 percent of its 1977 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was down 15 points (10 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 140, the November index for meat animals was down 6 points (4.1 percent) from October. Mid-month cattle prices averaged \$53.90 per cwt., down \$1.90, and hogs at \$42.20, declined \$2.80 from last month. The meat animal index was down 16 points (10 percent) from a year ago.

FRUIT: The November fruit index at 145 increased 19 points (15 percent) from October. Prices increased for oranges, strawberries and pears. Partially offsetting were lower prices for grapefruit and lemons. The index was 15 points (12 percent) above a year earlier.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The index of prices received for feed grains and hay was 118, down 3 points (2.5 percent) from October. Corn at \$2.33 per bushel was down 12 cents but other feed grains were higher. Oats increased 13 cents to \$1.91 per bushel and sorghum grain was up 6 cents to \$3.96 per cwt. Barley averaged \$2.41 per bushel, up 3 cents from October. Hay was \$64.10 per ton compared with \$64.00 a month earlier. The index was 34 points (22 percent) below November 1980.

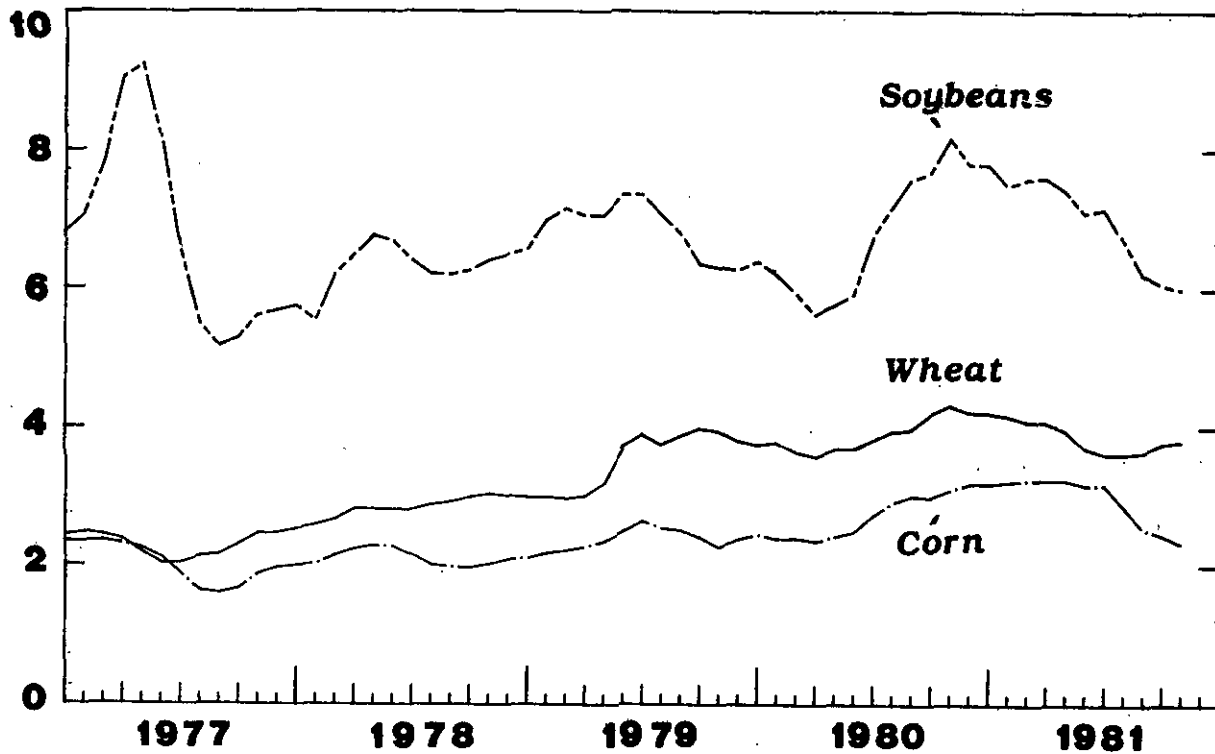
POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and egg index, at 117, was 5 points (4.5 percent) above October. Egg prices averaged 69.5 cents per dozen, up 5.7 cents from last month and turkey prices were up 2.3 cents at 35.6 cents per pound. Broilers declined .7 cents per pound. The index was 10 points (7.9 percent) below a year ago.

POTATOES, SWEETPOTATOES, AND DRY BEANS: The November index increased 10 points, (8.5 percent) from the previous month to 128 percent of its 1977 average. Potatoes, at \$4.81 per cwt, were up 43 cents from October. Sweetpotato and dry bean prices also increased. Compared to a year ago, the index was down 15 points (10 percent).

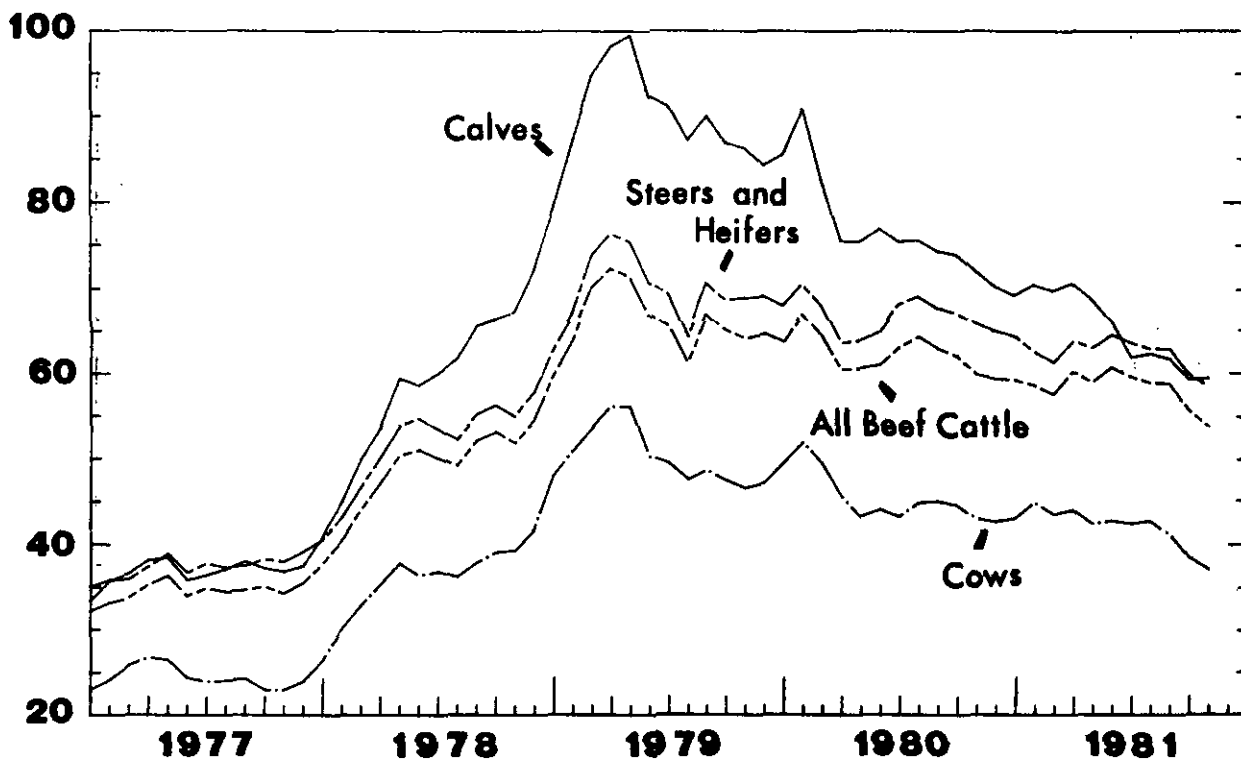
DAIRY PRODUCTS: The index for dairy products, at 145, was 1 point (.7 percent) above last month. The average price of all milk sold to plants and dealers, at \$14.10 per cwt, was up 10 cents from a month earlier. The index was also 1 point above a year ago.

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 151 percent of its 1977 base in November. The index was unchanged from October but 7 points (4.9 percent) above November 1980.

PRODUCTION INDEX UNCHANGED

The index of production goods and services was 147 (1977=100) unchanged from October but 3 points (2.1 percent) higher than a year earlier. Price declines for feed and replacement livestock were offset by price increases associated with the introduction into the index of 1982 model autos and trucks.

REPLACEMENT LIVESTOCK: The replacement livestock index at 160 was down 1.2 percent from last month. Feeder cattle and calves were down \$1.00 per cwt. while feeder pigs were \$4.00 per cwt. lower. The index was 11 percent below a year earlier.

FEED: The mid-November index of prices paid for feed at 122 was down 1 point (.8 percent) from a month earlier. Sharply lower corn prices accounted for more than half of the decrease. The index was 13 percent below a year earlier.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The fuels and energy index at 214 was unchanged for the fifth consecutive month as gasoline and diesel fuel prices remained steady. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 12 percent.

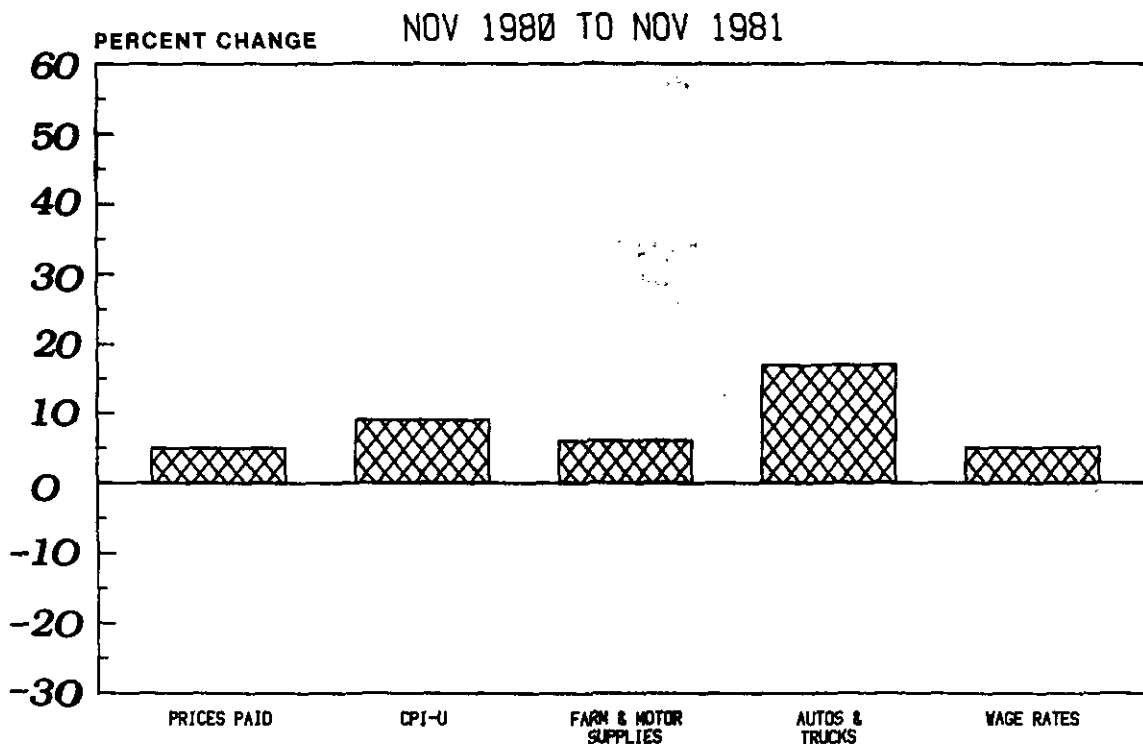
FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: The November index for farm and motor supplies was 149, up 1 point (.7 percent) from August. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 6.4 percent.

AUTOS AND TRUCKS: The November index of prices paid for autos and trucks was 156, 13 points (9.1 percent) above May, when new autos and trucks were last priced. Prices on new motor vehicles are surveyed twice yearly. The index was 17 percent greater than November 1980.

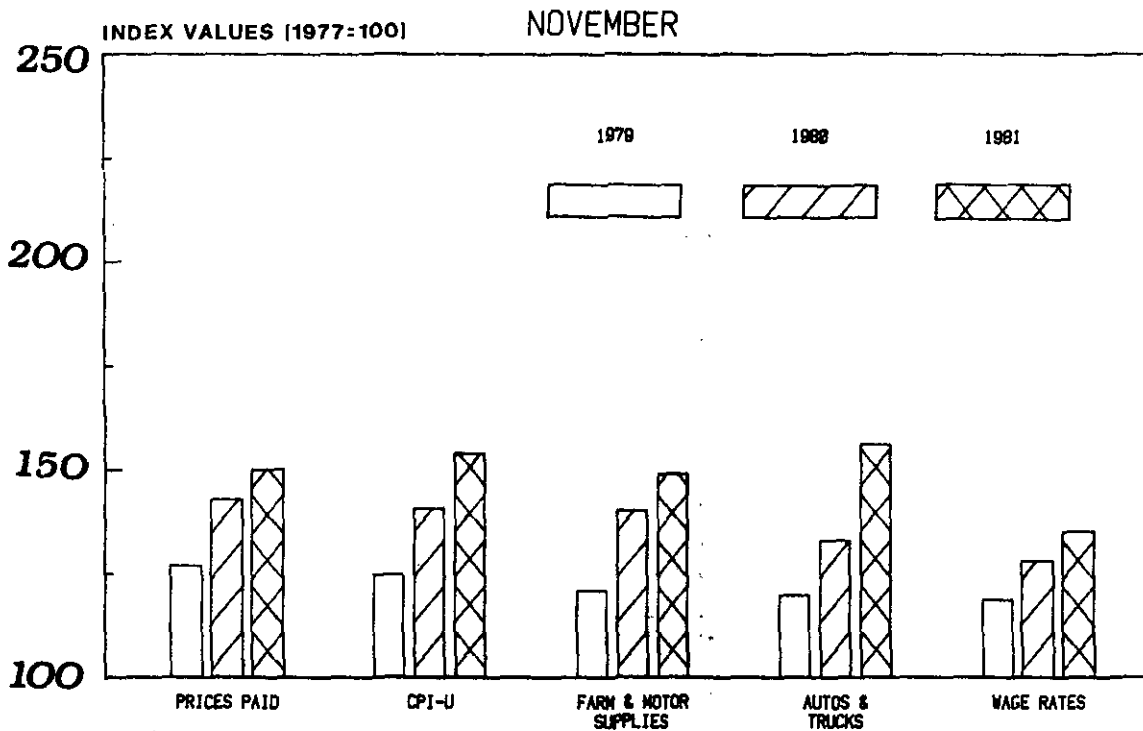
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers was 279.9 (1967=100) for October, up .2 percent from September and 10.2 percent above a year earlier. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U rose .4 percent from September. The major contributor to the moderation of the increase was the housing component which remained unchanged from September. However, major increases were noted in transportation cost, up 1.2 percent, and medical care advanced 1.0 percent. October was the tenth consecutive month in which medical costs increased .9 percent or more. The entertainment and the other goods and services indexes both increased .8 percent. Both the apparel and upkeep index and the food and beverage index increased .2 percent.

PRICES PAID INDEX COMPARISONS

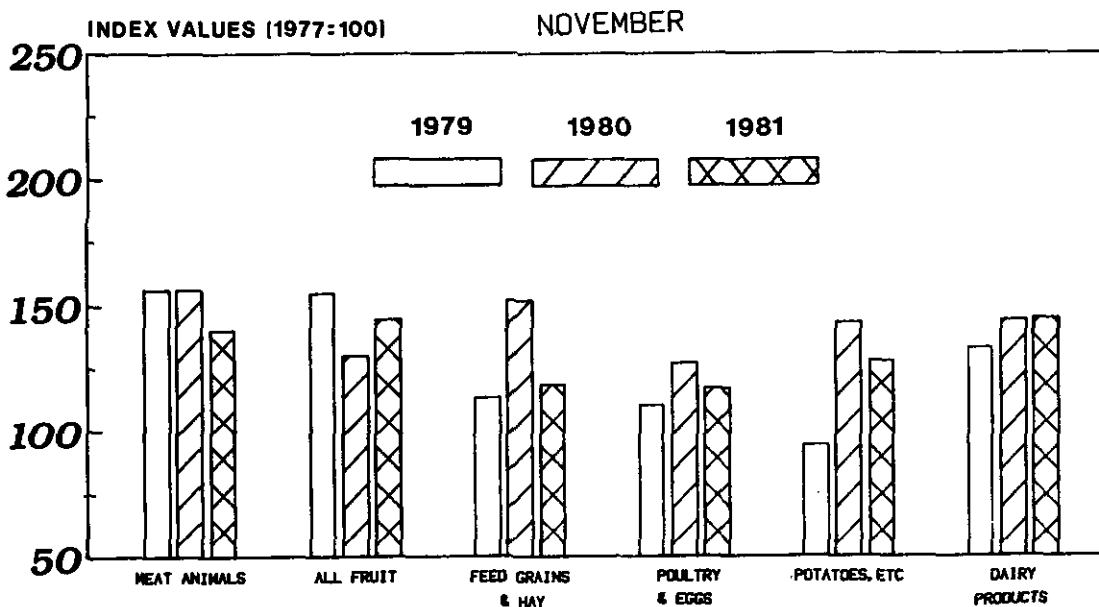

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX COMPARISONS



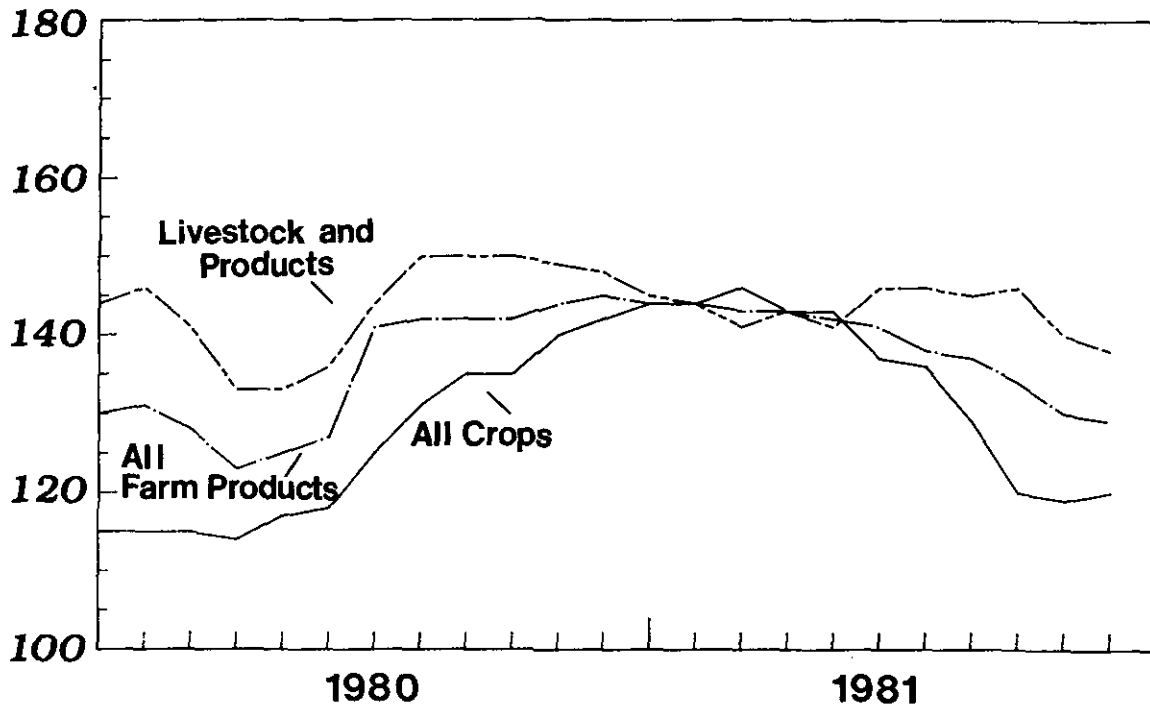

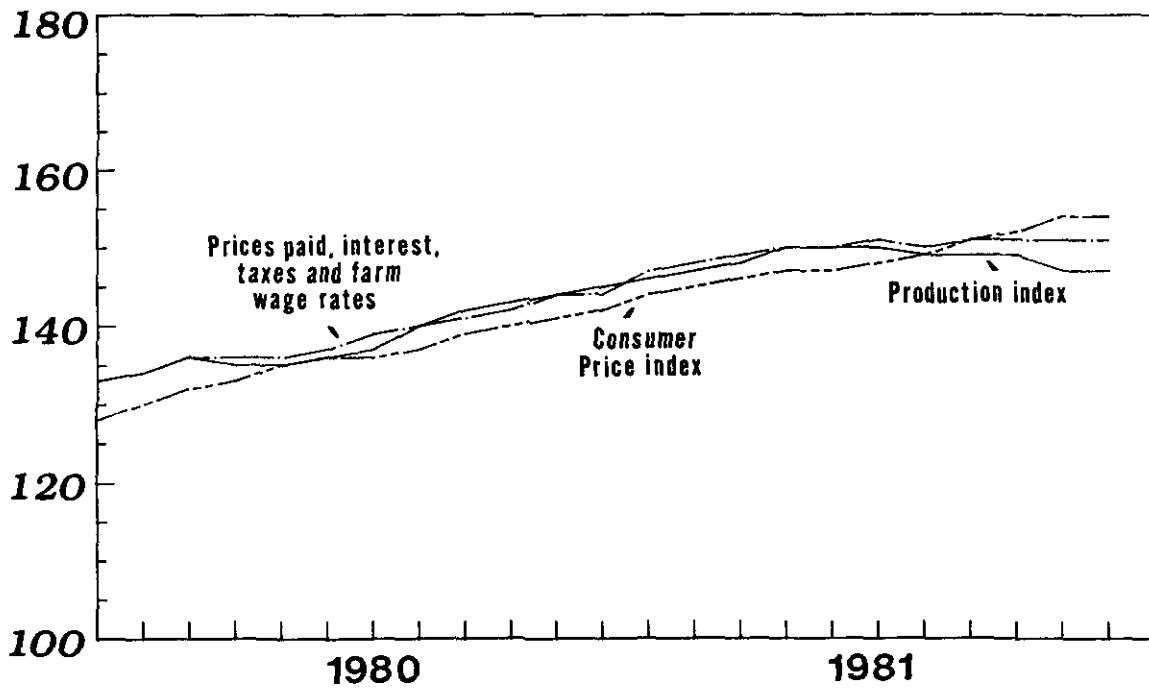
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

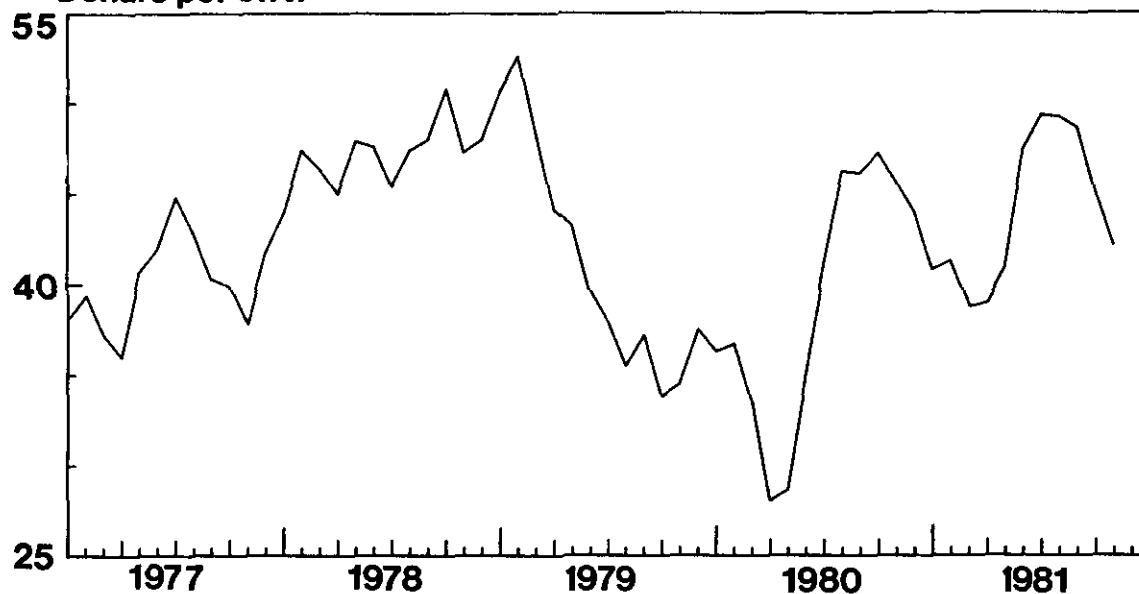
