PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 1 POINT  
PRICES PAID INDEX UP 1 POINT

The June Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 1 point (.7 percent) from May to 138 percent of its January - December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the decrease since May were lower prices for wheat, cotton, soybeans, hay, and eggs. Higher prices for tomatoes, potatoes, oranges, hogs, and apples were partially offsetting. The index was 4 points (2.8 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates for June was 156 (1977=100), up 1 point (.6 percent) from May. Price increases during the month for fuel and family living items along with farm equipment price changes since March were partially offset by lower prices for feed and replacement livestock. The June index was 6 points (4.0 percent) higher than a year earlier.

## PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received by Farmers for June decreased 1 point (.7 percent) from the previous month to 138 percent of its 1977 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was down 4 points (2.8 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

VEGETABLES: At 135, the index for commercial vegetables was 14 points (12 percent) above last month. Higher prices for tomatoes contributed most to the increase while price decreases for onions and lettuce were partially offsetting. The index was 15 points (13 percent) above a year ago.

POTATOES, SWEETPOTATOES, AND DRY BEANS: The June index increased 32 points (21 percent) from the previous month to 184 percent of its 1977 average. Potatoes, showing a sharp seasonal increase averaged \$8.01 per cwt, up \$1.75 from May. Prices for sweetpotatoes were also up, but dry bean prices declined. Compared to a year ago, the index was down 48 points (21 percent).

FOOD GRAINS: The index of prices received by farmers for food grains at 142 was 8 points (5.3 percent) below the previous month. Wheat averaged \$3.41 per bushel, down 23 cents from May, while rice was 30 cents lower at \$8.25 per cwt. The index was 18 points (11 percent) below a year earlier.

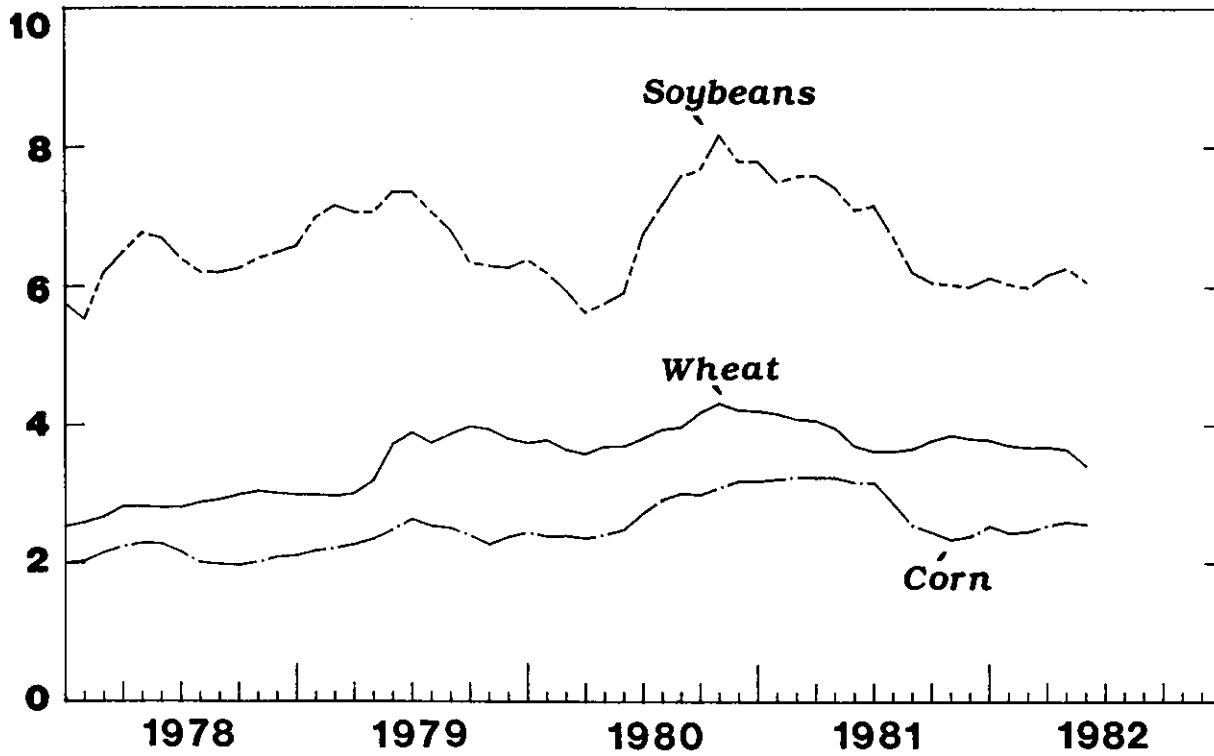
FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The June index for feed grains and hay was 129, down 3 points (2.3 percent) from May. Corn at \$2.56 per bushel was 4 cents less than the previous month and barley averaged \$2.48 per bushel, down 8 cents. Oats were down 7 cents at \$1.92 per bushel; sorghum increased 1 cent to \$4.36 per cwt. Hay was \$70.90 per ton, down \$7.90 from May. The index was 22 points (15 percent) lower than June 1981.

COTTON: The index of prices received for cotton at 79 was 11 points (12 percent) below May. Upland Cotton prices decreased 6.3 cents per pound to average 47.9 cents in June. The index was 39 points (33 percent) below June 1981.

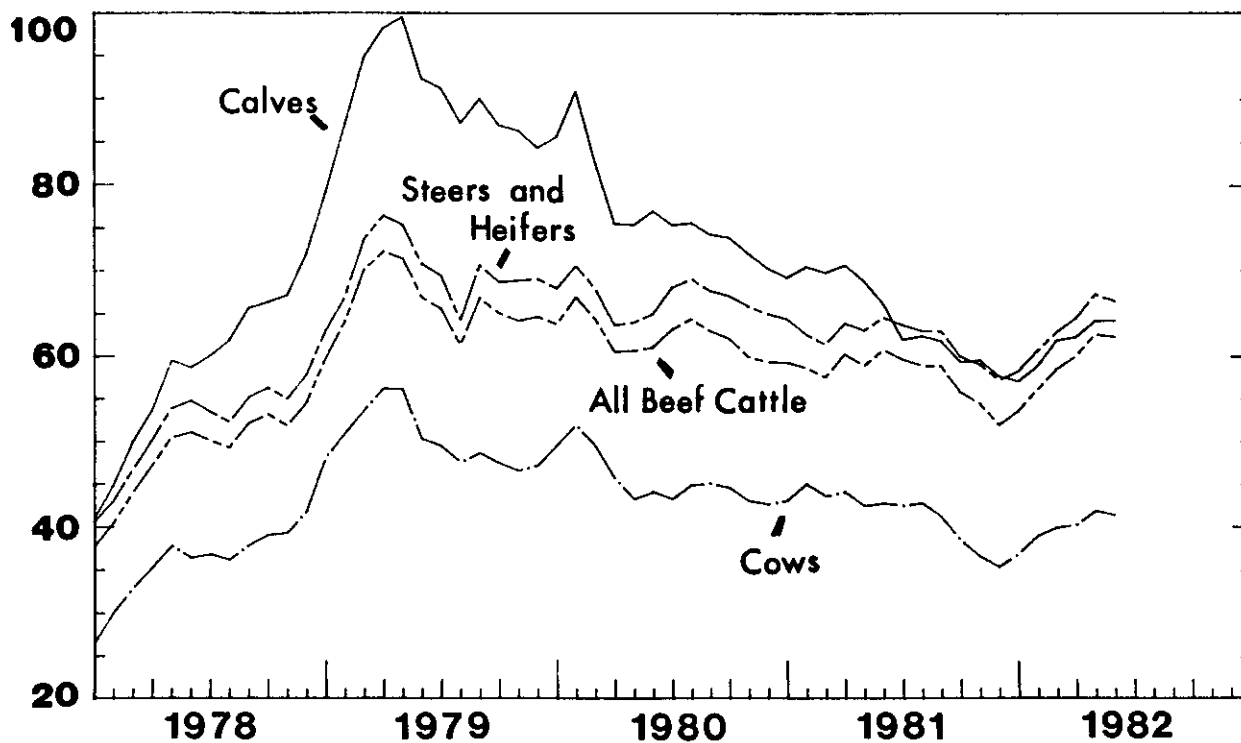
FRUIT: The all fruit index at 166 was 9 points (5.7 percent) above May. Higher prices for oranges, apples and lemons contributed most to the increase. Lower prices for grapefruit were partially offsetting. Compared to a year ago, the fruit index was up 38 points (30 percent).

### PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The June Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates was 156 percent of its 1977 base. This was 1 point (.6 percent) above May and 6 points (4.0 percent) higher than a year earlier.

### PRODUCTION INDEX UP

The index of prices paid for production goods and services for June was 151 percent of its 1977 base. A major contributor to the 1 point (.7 percent) increase from May was the sharply higher gasoline and diesel fuel prices that pushed the fuels and energy component up 5 percent. Farm machinery indexes were higher as prices increased for all items surveyed in June. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 1 point (.7 percent).

FEED: At 126, the June feed index was down 2 points (1.6 percent) from a month earlier. Major contributors to the decrease were lower prices for hay and corn. The index was 13 points (9.4 percent) below a year ago.

REPLACEMENT LIVESTOCK: The replacement livestock index at 166 was down 1.8 percent from last month. Feeder cattle and calves averaged \$62.00, down 50 cents per cwt. and feeder pigs dropped \$15.00 per cwt. to \$106.00. Compared to a year ago, the index was up .6 percent.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The fuels and energy index at 210 was up 10 points (5.0 percent) from May. The price of regular gasoline increased 8 cents per gallon, unleaded gasoline increased 9 cents and diesel fuel was up 4 cents. Compared to a year ago the index was down 2.3 percent.

TRACTORS AND SELF-PROPELLED MACHINERY: At 167, the June index of prices paid for tractors and self-propelled machinery was 6 points (3.7 percent) above March. The index was 7.7 percent above a year earlier.

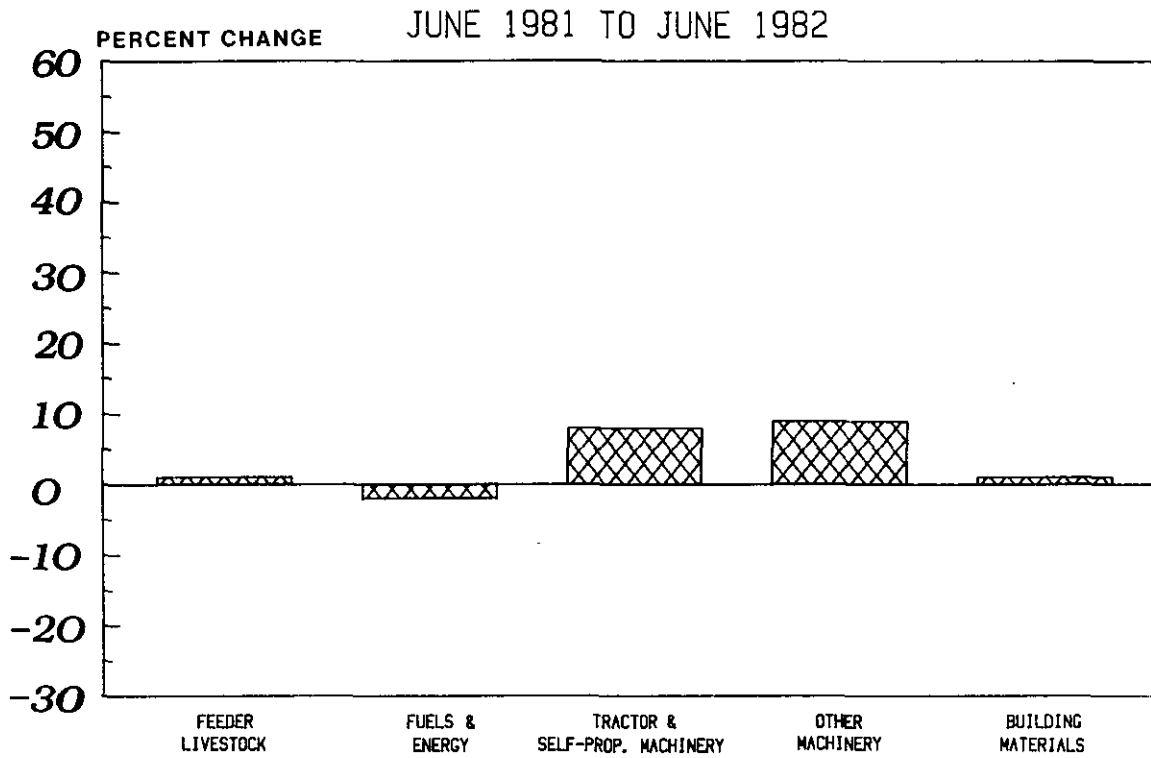
OTHER MACHINERY: The all other farm machinery index for June was 162, up 6 points (3.8 percent) from March. The index was up 9.5 percent from June last year.

BUILDING AND FENCING MATERIALS: The prices paid index for building and fencing materials was 135, up 1 point (.7 percent) from April. Price declines for rough boards and shingles were more than offset by increases in other commodities. The index was also .7 percent higher than a year earlier.

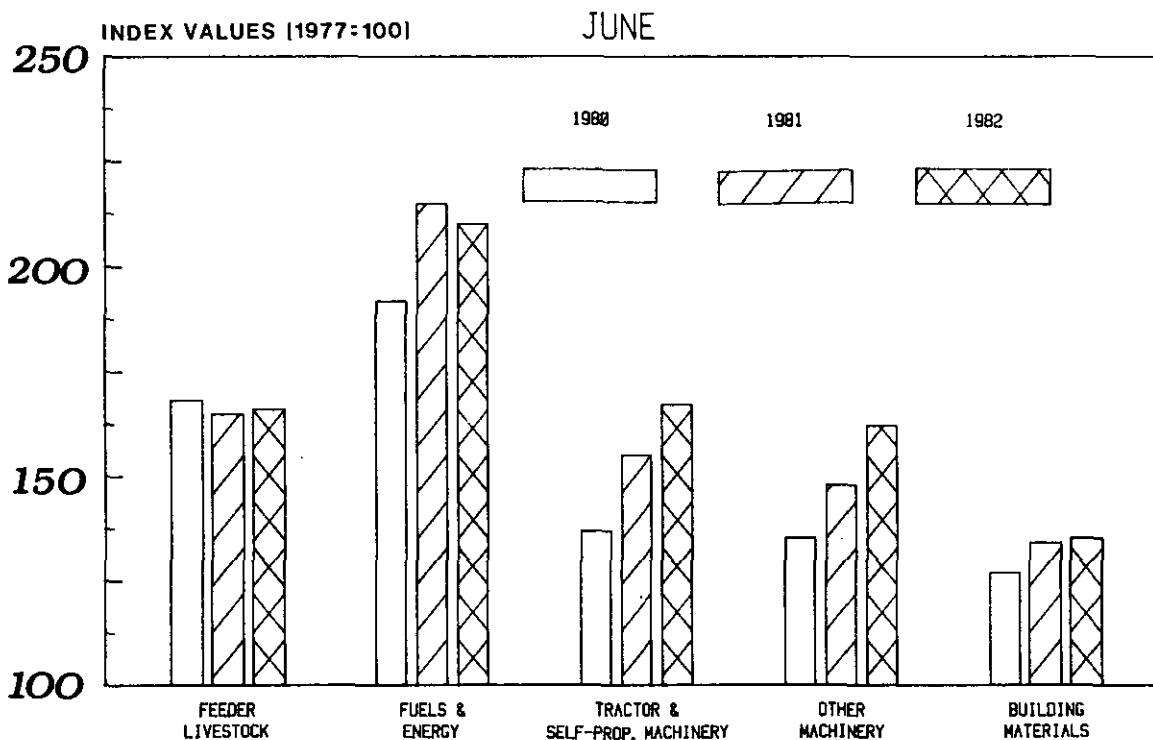
### CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The May unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) was 287.1 (1967=100), up 1.0 percent from April and 6.7 percent higher than May 1981. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U increased 1.0 percent in May. The housing index led the way with a 1.4 percent increase followed by the medical care index with a .9 percent increase. The food and beverages index and the other goods and services index rose .8 and .7 percent, respectively. The transportation index increased .4 percent while the apparel and upkeep index decreased .1 percent.

## PRICES PAID INDEX COMPARISONS

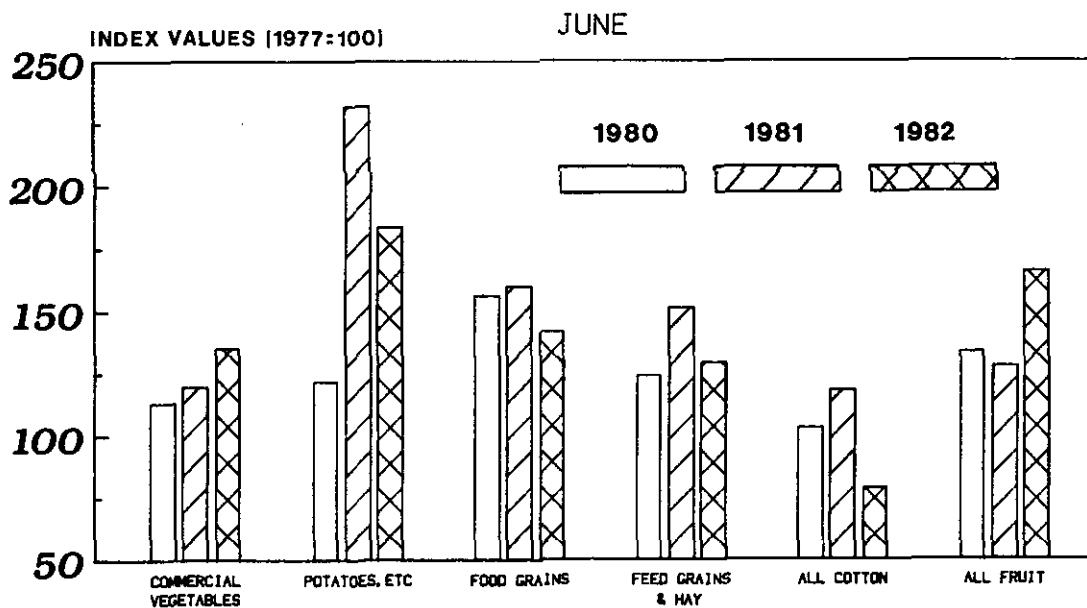

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX COMPARISONS



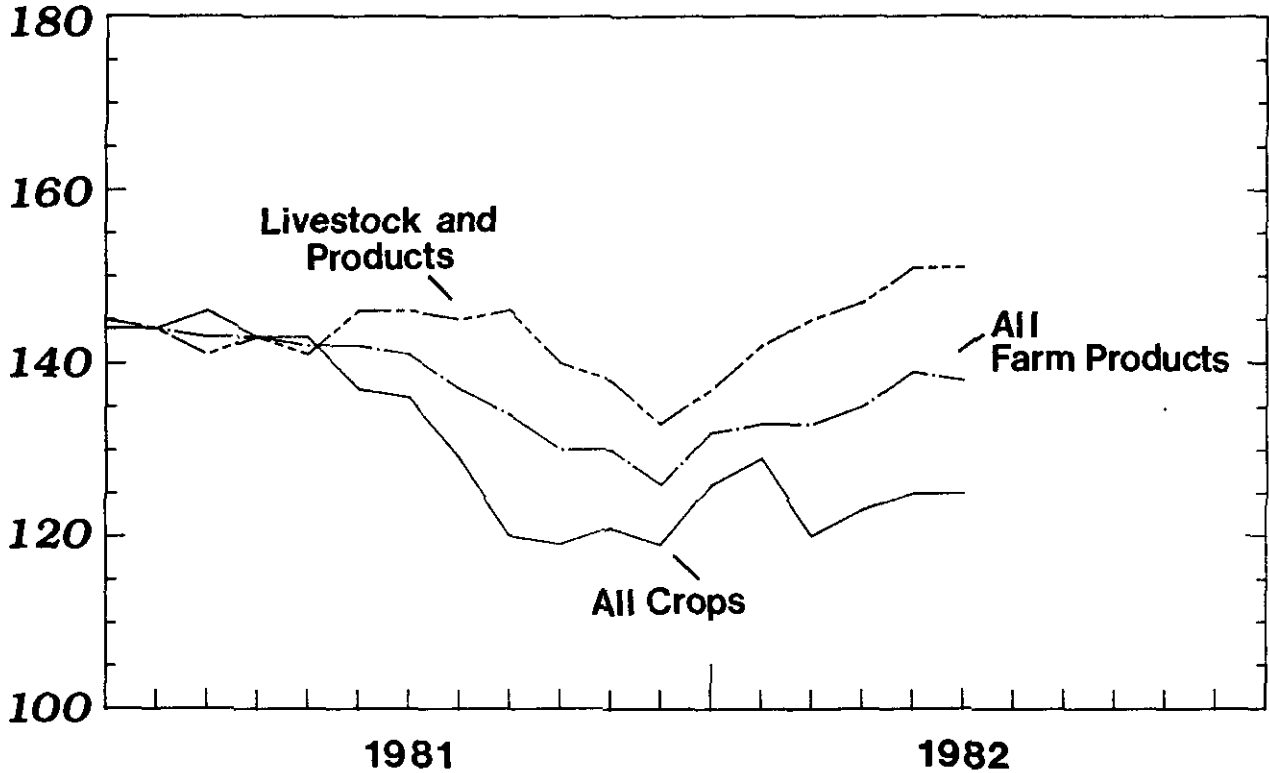

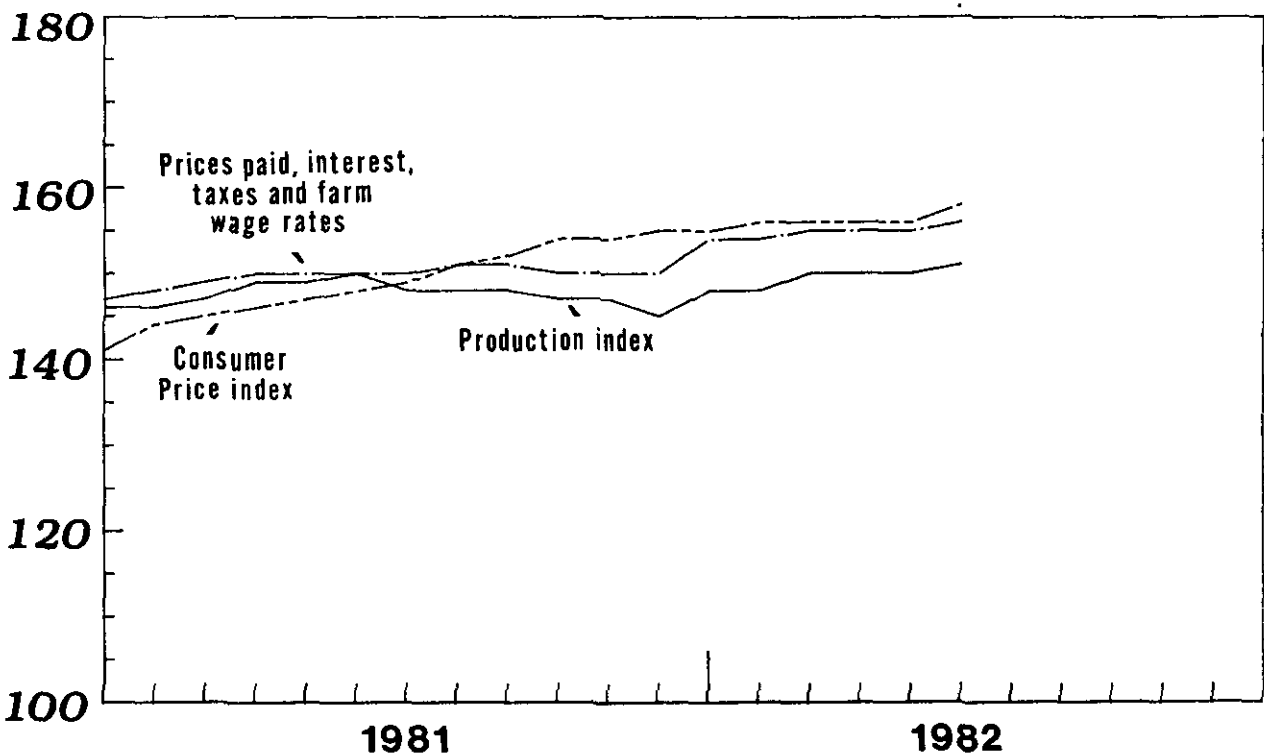
## Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

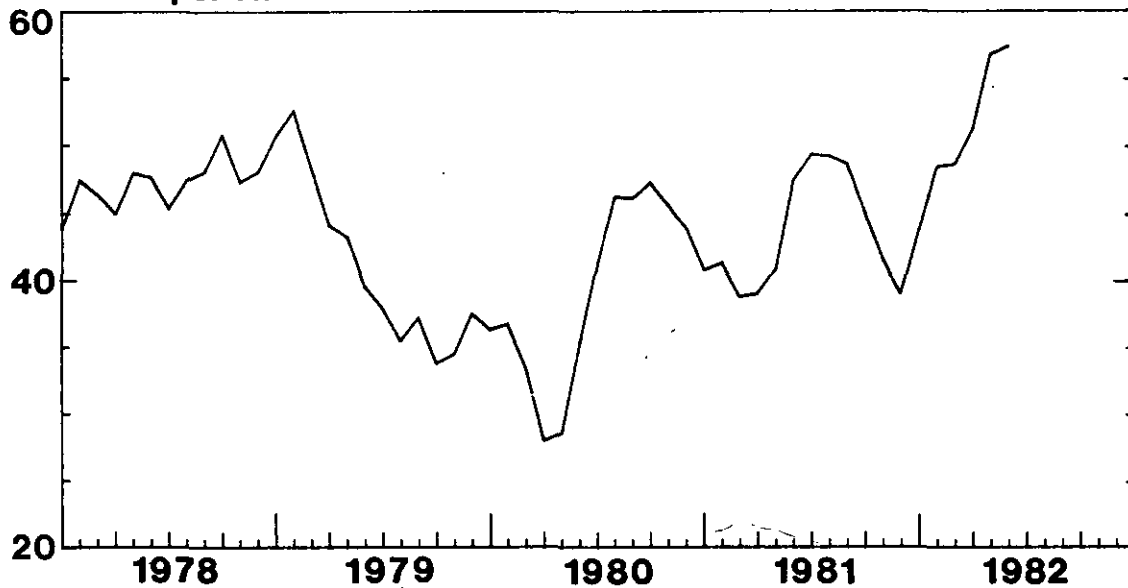
