PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 1 POINT
PRICES PAID INDEX UP 1 POINT

The November Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 1 point (.8 percent) from October to 129 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the increase since October were higher prices for corn, strawberries, tomatoes, soybeans and milk. Lower prices for oranges, hogs, cattle, grapefruit and broilers were partially offsetting. The index was 1 point (.8 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates for November was 156 percent of its 1977 base. The index was up 1 point (.6 percent) from October. Higher prices for feed, fuel and family living items were partially offset by a decline in feeder livestock prices. Compared to November 1981 the Prices Paid Index was up 6 points (4.0 percent).

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The Index of Prices Received Received by Farmers for November increased 1 point (.8 percent) from the previous month to 129 percent of its 1977 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was down 1 point (.8 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: The November index for meat animals at 146 was down 5 points (3.3 percent) from October. Hog prices declined \$3.70 to \$52.20 per cwt, and cattle prices, averaging \$52.90 per cwt, were off \$.80 from last month. The index was 5 points (3.5 percent) above a year ago.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The index of prices received for feed grains and hay for November at 112 was 8 points (7.7 percent) above the previous month. Corn averaged \$2.20 per bushel, up 22 cents. Sorghum at \$3.92 per cwt also increased 22 cents. Oats at \$1.44 per bushel increased 12 cents from October. Hay averaged \$68.10 per ton, up 50 cents. The index was 6 points (5.1 percent) below a year earlier.

FRUIT: The November index for all fruit at 183 was 13 points (6.6 percent) below October. Lower prices for oranges were primarily responsible for most of the decrease. Compared to a year ago, the index was up 33 points (22 percent).

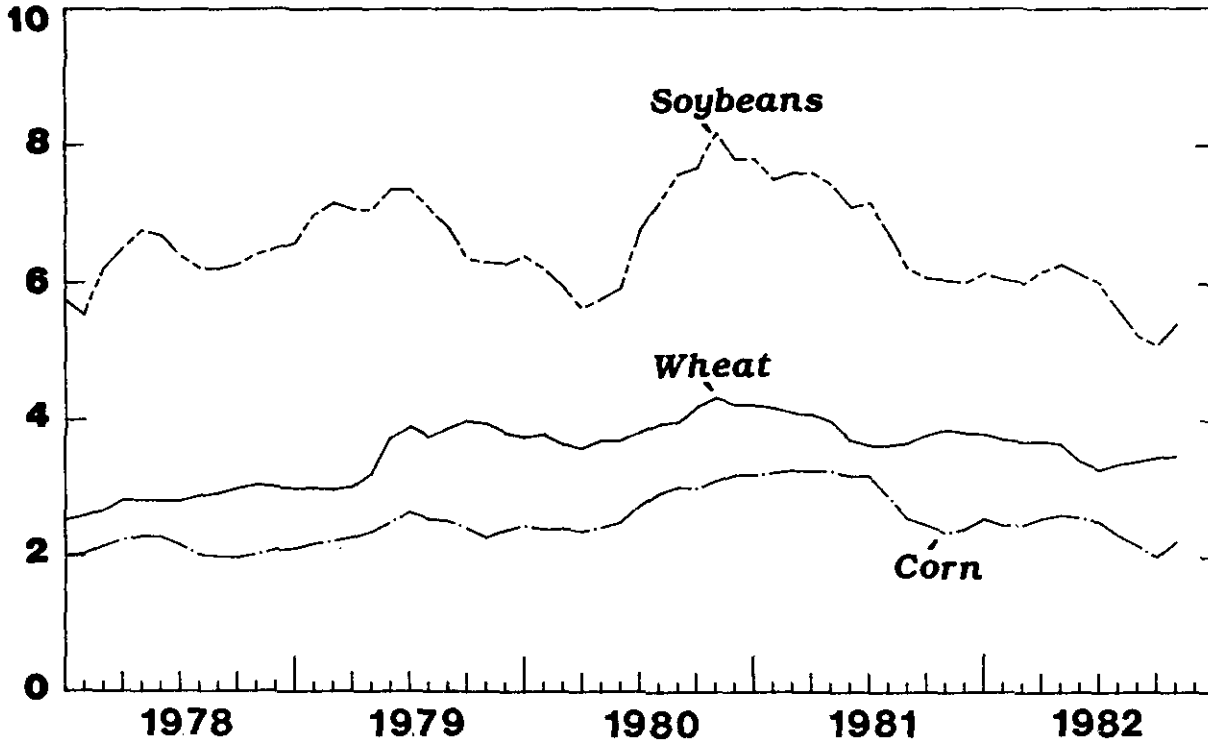
VEGETABLES: The commercial vegetable index at 119 was 13 points (12 percent) above October. Most of the increase resulted from higher prices for tomatoes. The index was 6 points (4.8 percent) below a year earlier.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index of prices received for oil-bearing crops was 83, up 5 points (6.4 percent) from October. Soybeans at \$5.39 per bushel were 32 cents above the previous month. Cottonseed brought \$81.00 per ton, up \$14.00. Peanuts were up .4 cent per pound to average 25.6 cents. The index was 9 points (9.8 percent) below a year earlier.

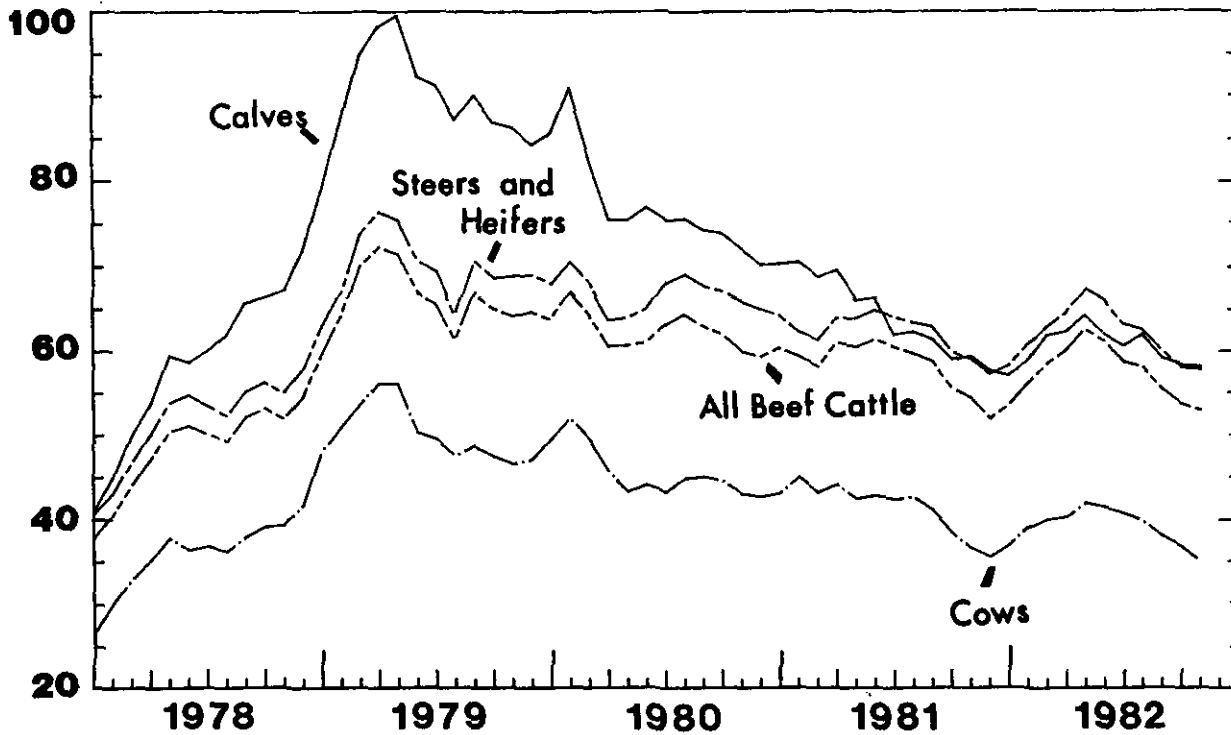
POULTRY AND EGGS: At 107 the poultry and egg index was 2 points (1.8 percent) below October and 11 points (9.3 percent) less than November a year ago. Egg prices averaged 57.0 cents per dozen, a decrease of 1.1 cents from October. Broiler prices at 24.5 cents per pound were down .6 cent, but turkey prices were up .1 cent to average 42.8 cents per pound.

PRICES PAID INCLUDING INTEREST, TAXES, AND WAGE RATES (PPITW)

The November Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 156 percent of its 1977 base. The index was up 1 point (.6 percent) from October and 6 points (4.0 percent) above a year earlier. Slightly higher prices for feeds, fuels and family living items were partially offset by lower prices for replacement livestock.

PRODUCTION INDEX UNCHANGED

The prices paid index for production goods and services for November was 149 (1977=100) unchanged from October but 2 points (1.4 percent) above a year earlier.

Feed: At 116, the November feed index was up 2 points (1.8 percent) from a month earlier. Major contributors to the increase were higher prices for corn, beef cattle concentrate and oats. Partially offsetting the increase were lower prices for poultry feeds. The index was down 4.9 percent from a year earlier.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The fuels and energy index at 213 was up 1 point (.5 percent) from October. The price of bulk delivered regular and service station unleaded gasoline each decreased 1 cent per gallon. Diesel fuel increased 3 cents per gallon. Compared to a year ago, the index was down .5 percent.

AUTOS AND TRUCKS: At 165, the November prices paid index for autos and trucks was up 6 points (3.8 percent) from May 1982 when new autos and trucks were last priced. New motor vehicle prices are surveyed twice yearly. The index was 5.8 percent above November 1981.

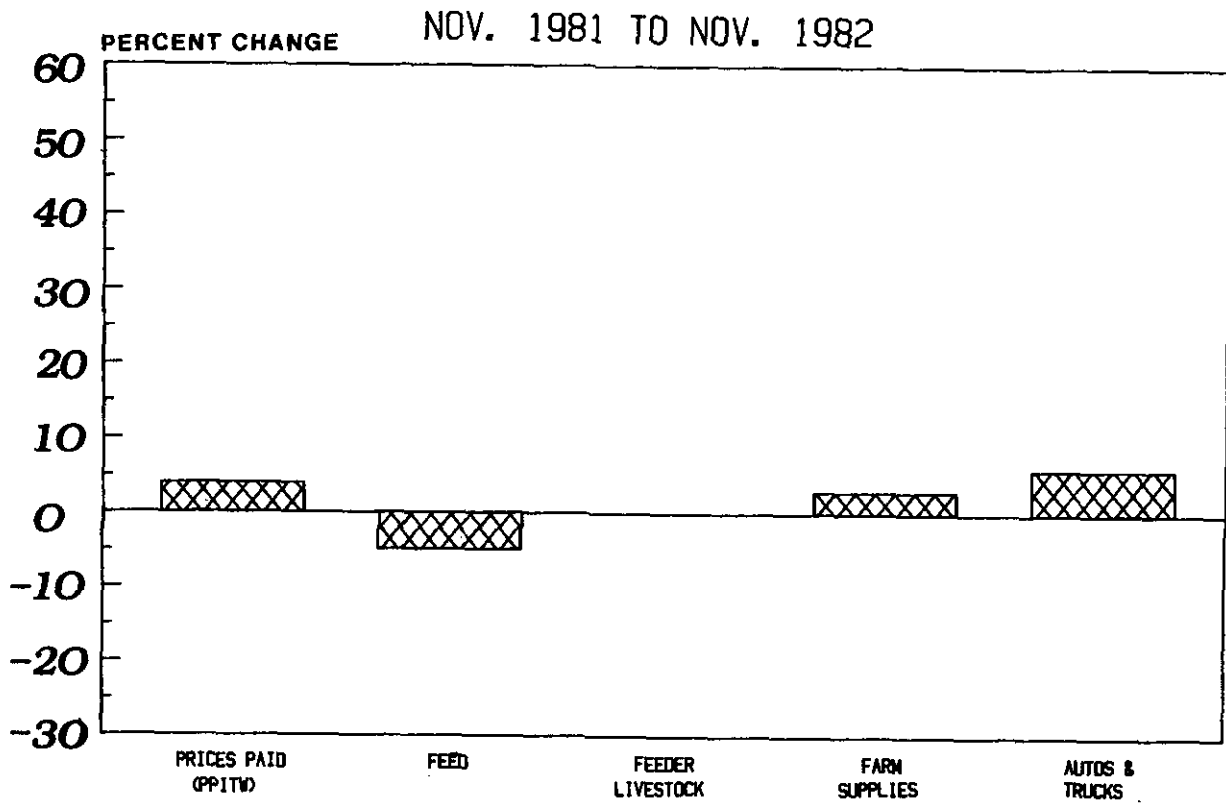
FARM AND MOTOR SUPPLIES: The November index for farm and motor supplies was 154, unchanged from August. Compared to November 1981, the index was up 2.7 percent.

REPLACEMENT LIVESTOCK: The replacement livestock index at 160 was down 3.0 percent from last month. Feeder cattle and calves averaged \$59.50 per cwt, down \$1.50 and feeder pigs dropped \$14.00 per cwt to \$101.00. The index was unchanged from a year ago.

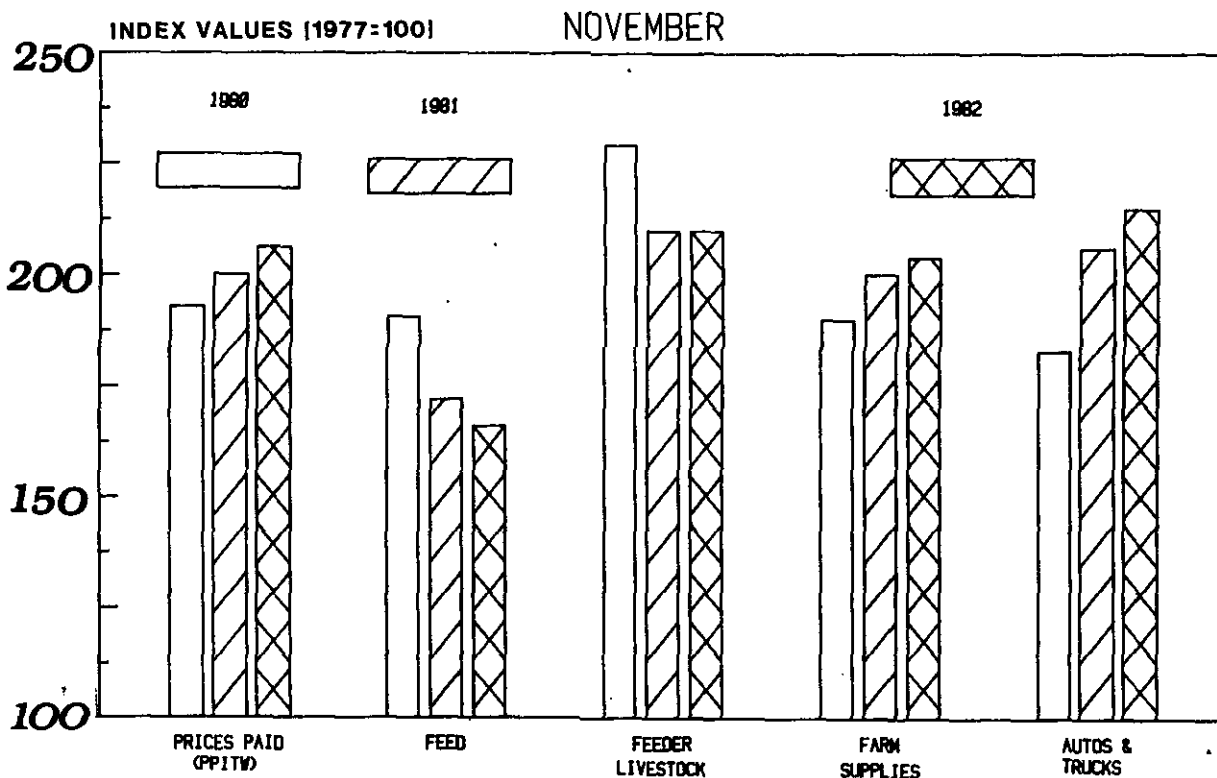
CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

The October unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) was 294.1, up .3 percent from September and 5.1 percent above October 1981. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U increased .5 percent in October. The housing component which rose .4 percent was largely responsible for the increase in the overall index. The other goods and services and entertainment indexes rose 1.9 and 1.0 percent respectively. Medical care increased .8 percent while the transportation index rose .6 percent. The food and beverages index and apparel and upkeep index each increased .2 percent.

PRICES PAID INDEX COMPARISONS

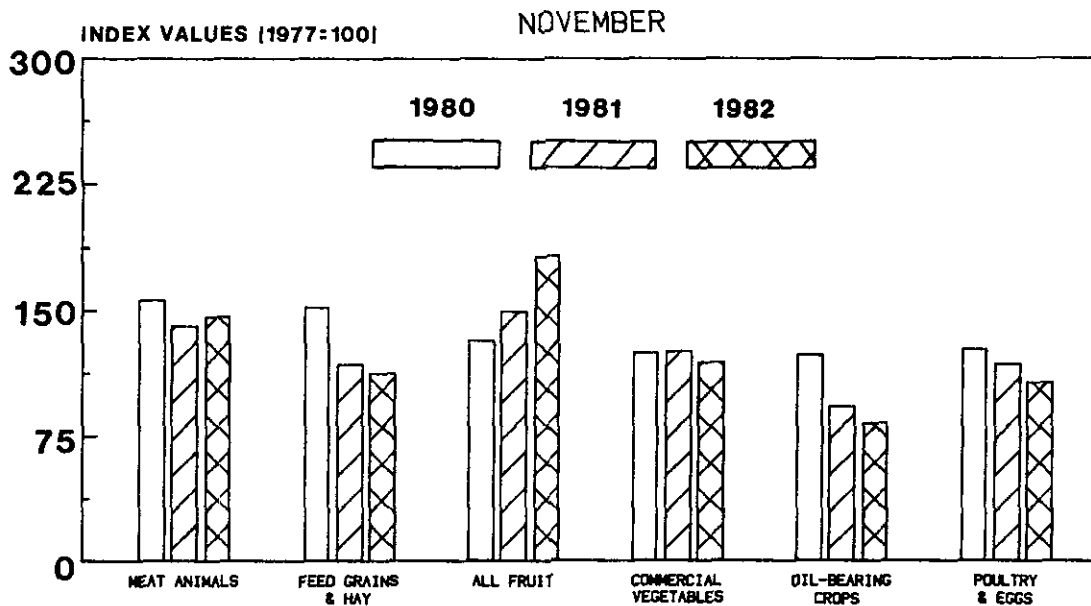

PRICES RECEIVED INDEX COMPARISONS



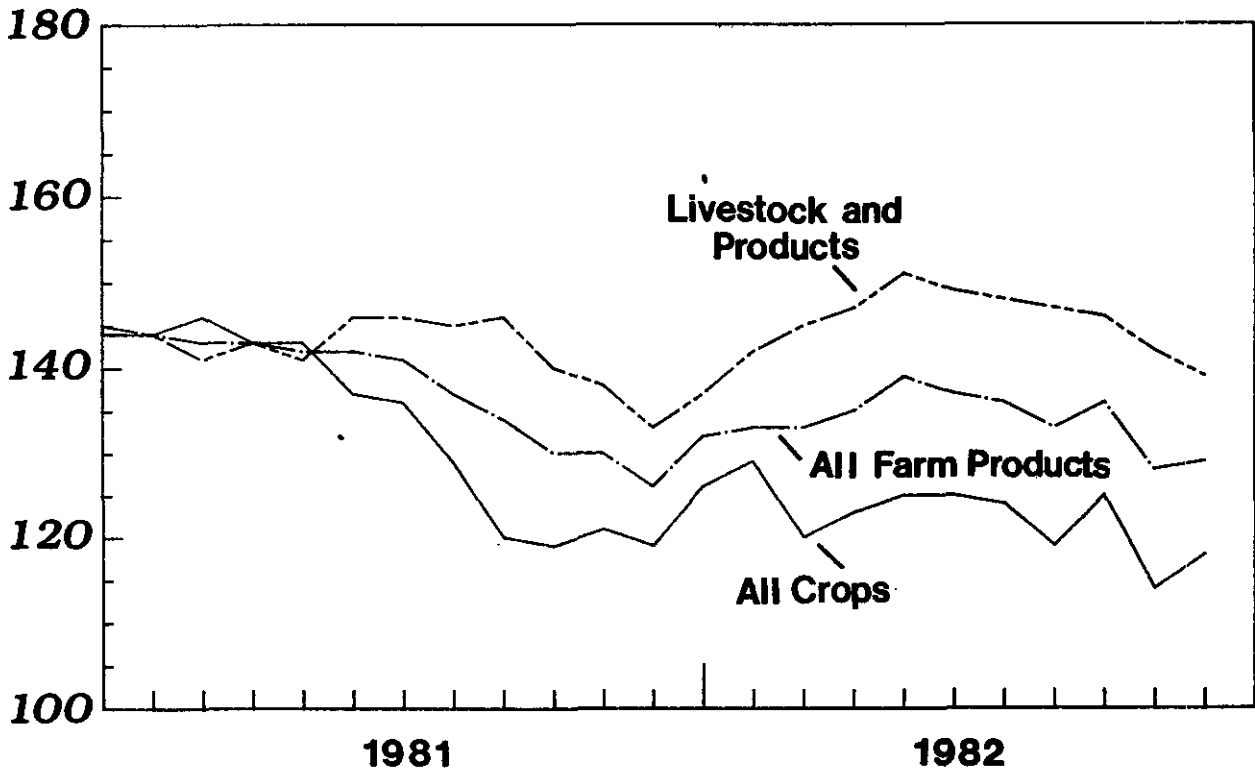

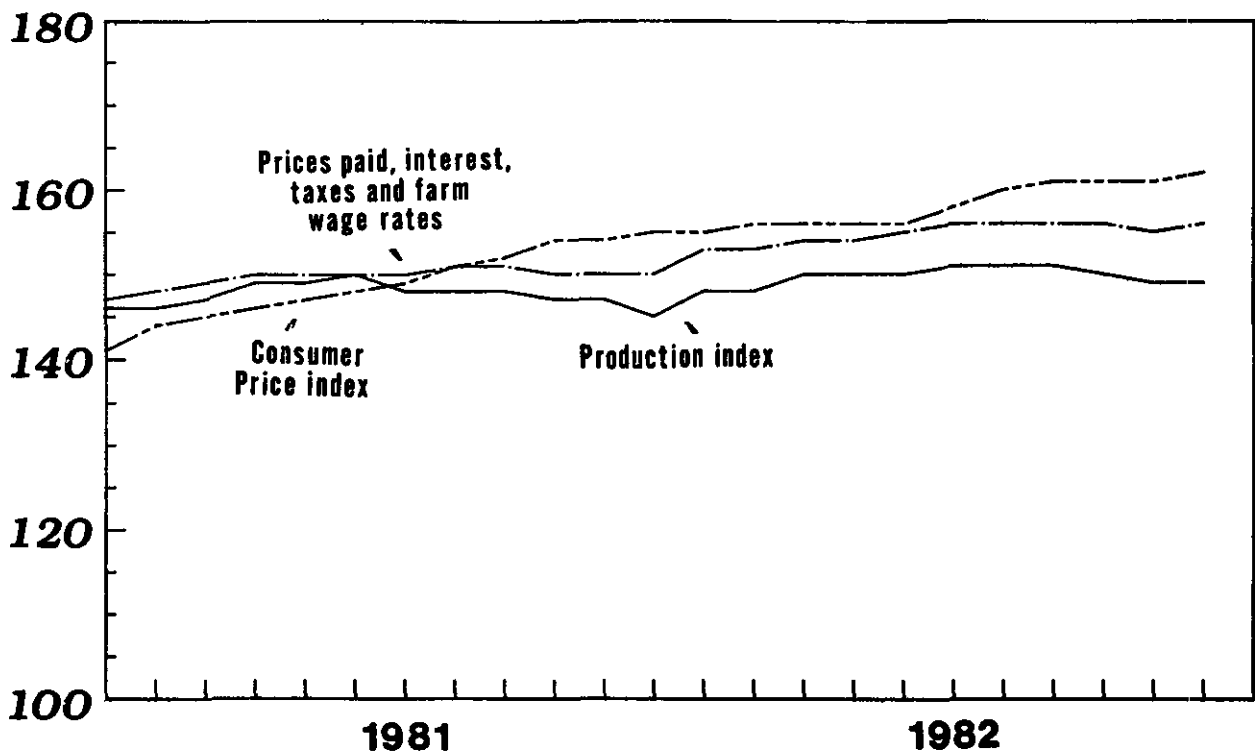
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

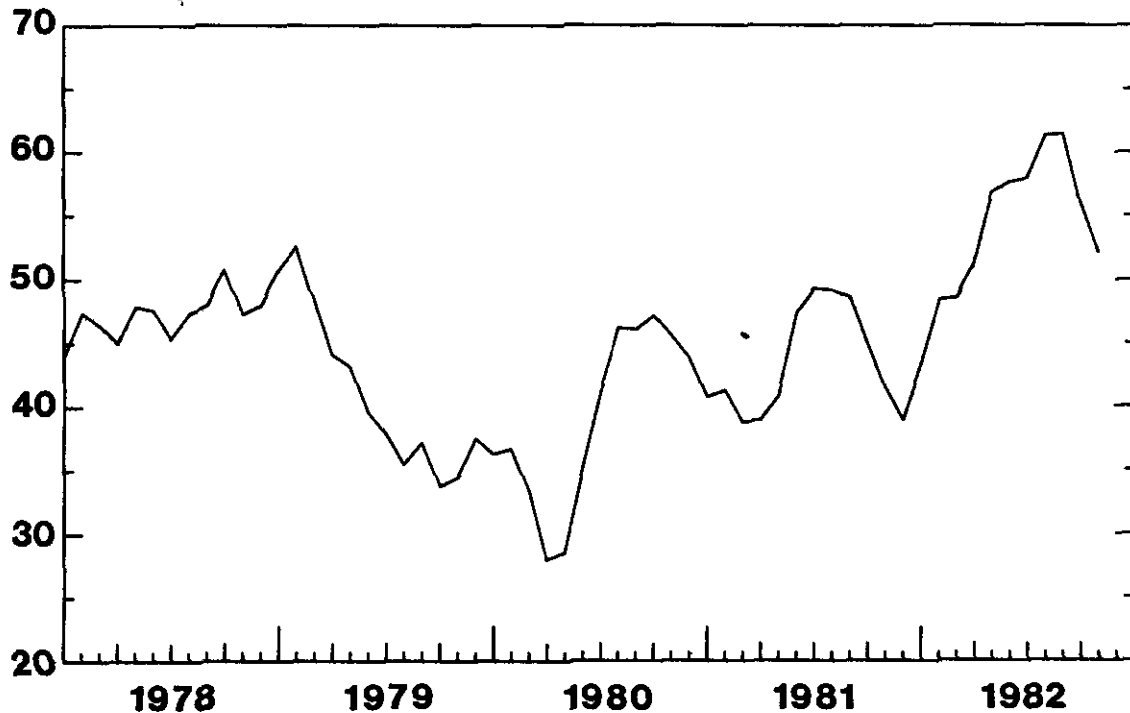
