PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 3 POINTS PRICES PAID INDEX UNCHANGED

The June All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (2.2 percent) from May to 134 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Contributing most to the decrease since May were lower prices for wheat, cattle, hogs, soybeans and tomatoes. Higher prices for lettuce, broilers, corn, cotton and barley were partially offsetting. The index was 4 points (2.9 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates for June was 160 percent of its 1977 base. Lower prices for feed and replacement livestock were offset by higher prices for fuels, farm machinery and family living items. Compared to June 1982, the index was up 4 points (2.6 percent).

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PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for June decreased 3 points (2.2 percent) from the previous month to 134 percent of its 1977 average. Compared to a year earlier the index was down 4 points (2.9 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the net change from a month earlier.

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: At 142 percent of its 1977 average, the June livestock and products index was down 2 points (1.4 percent) from the preceding month. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 8 points (5.3 percent).

MEAT ANIMALS: At 152, the meat animal index was down 3 points (1.9 percent) from May. Cattle prices declined \$1.00 to \$58.80 per cwt and hog prices at \$44.50 per cwt, were down \$1.40. The index was 14 points (8.4 percent) below a year ago.

ALL CROPS: The All Crops Index for June at 126 was down 3 points (2.3 percent) from a month earlier but was 1 point (.8 percent) above June 1982.

FOOD GRAINS: The food grain index at 144 was 11 points (7.1 percent) below the previous month. Wheat averaged \$3.48 per bushel, down 29 cents from May, but rice was up 5 cents at \$8.28 per cwt. The index was 3 points (2.1 percent) above a year earlier.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index for oil-bearing crops was 89, down 3 points (3.3 percent) from May. Soybeans at \$5.83 per bushel were down 22 cents, however, flaxseed increased 25 cents to \$4.91 per bushel. The index was 4 points (4.3 percent) below June 1982.

FRUIT: The June index for all fruit at 121 was 5 points (4.0 percent) below the previous month. Orange prices were responsible for most of the decrease. Grapefruit, pear, and apple prices were also down. Compared to a year ago, the index was down 45 points (27 percent).

VEGETABLES: At 136, the commercial vegetable index was 5 points (3.5 percent) below May. Tomatoes and celery accounted for most of the decrease. The index was up 7 points (5.4 percent) from a year earlier.

COTTON: The cotton index at 106 was 4 points (3.9 percent) above last month. Upland cotton prices increased 2.7 cents per pound to average 64.4 cents in June. The index was 10 points (10 percent) above June 1982.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 147, the feed grains and hay index was unchanged from a month earlier. Higher corn and barley prices were offset by seasonally lower hay prices. Corn averaged \$3.08 per bushel up 5 cents and barley at \$2.47 was 20 cents higher. Hay prices declined \$7.40 per ton to \$75.90. The index was 19 points (15 percent) above a year ago.

PRICES PAID BY FARMERS

The June Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes and Farm Wage Rates was 160 percent of the 1977=100 base. This index was unchanged from a month ago but 4 points (2.6 percent) above a year earlier.

PRODUCTION INDEX: The June index of prices paid for farm production goods and services was 154, unchanged from May. Compared to a year earlier, the index was up 3 points (2.0 percent).

FEEDER LIVESTOCK: The feeder livestock index at 162 was 3.0 percent below a month ago. Feeder cattle and calves at \$62.50 per cwt were down \$1.50 and feeder pigs at \$70.00 per cwt were \$17.00 lower. Compared to a year earlier, the index was down 2.4 percent.

FEED: At 132, the June index of prices paid for feed was down 2 points (1.5 percent) from a month earlier. Compared to June 1982, the index was up 4.8 percent.

BUILDING AND FENCING MATERIAL: At 139, the index of prices paid for building and fencing material was up 1 point (.7 percent) from April. The index was 3.0 percent higher than June 1982.

FUELS AND ENERGY: The fuels and energy index at 207 was up 2 points (1.0 percent) from May. The price of service station unleaded gasoline was unchanged at \$1.25 per gallon but bulk delivered regular gasoline was up 2 cents to \$1.21. The average price for diesel fuel at 98.7 cents per gallon was .7 cents higher than in May. The index was 2.4 percent below June 1982.

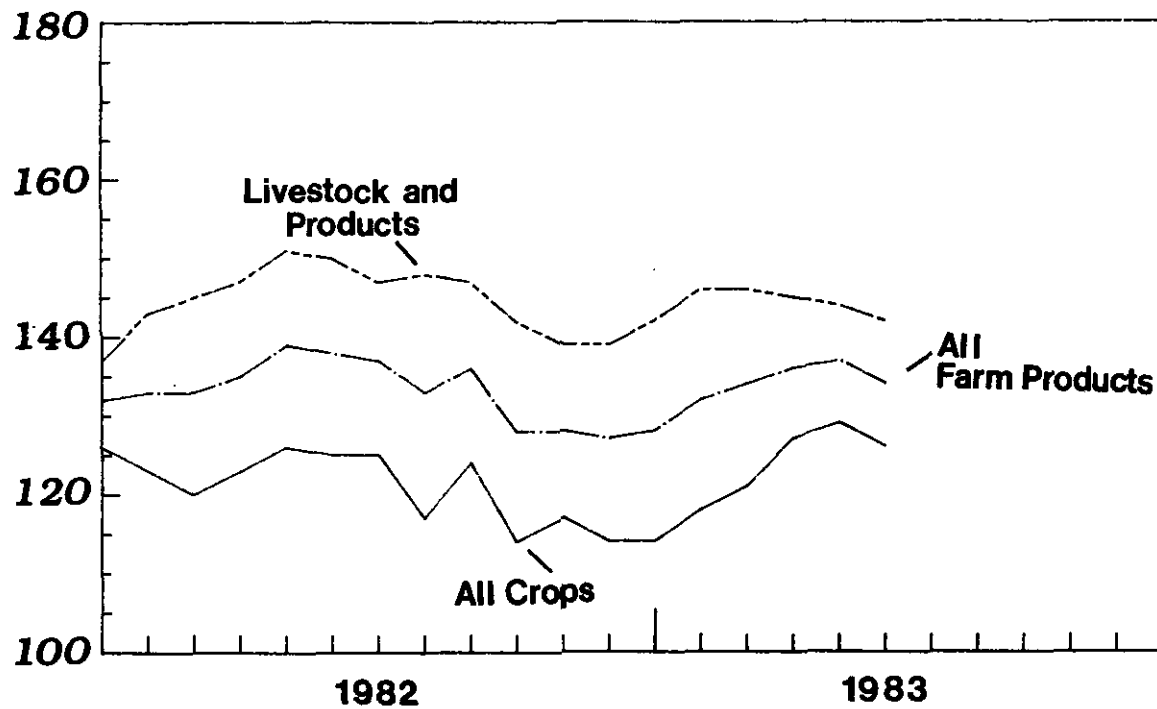
TRACTOR AND SELF-PROPELLED MACHINERY: At 176, the June index of prices paid for tractors and self-propelled machinery was 4 points (2.3 percent) above March 1983. The Index was 5.4 percent above a year earlier.

OTHER MACHINERY: The all other farm machinery index for June was 173, up 5 points (3.0 percent) from March 1983 and 6.8 percent from June last year.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX: The May unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) at 297.1 (1967=100) was up .5 percent from April and 3.5 percent above May 1982. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U was .5 percent above April. The transportation index increased 1.3 percent followed by the apparel and upkeep index with a .7 percent increase. The medical care, and other goods and services indexes each rose .4 percent. A .3 percent rise was recorded for both the food and beverages, and housing indexes. The entertainment index increased .2 percent.

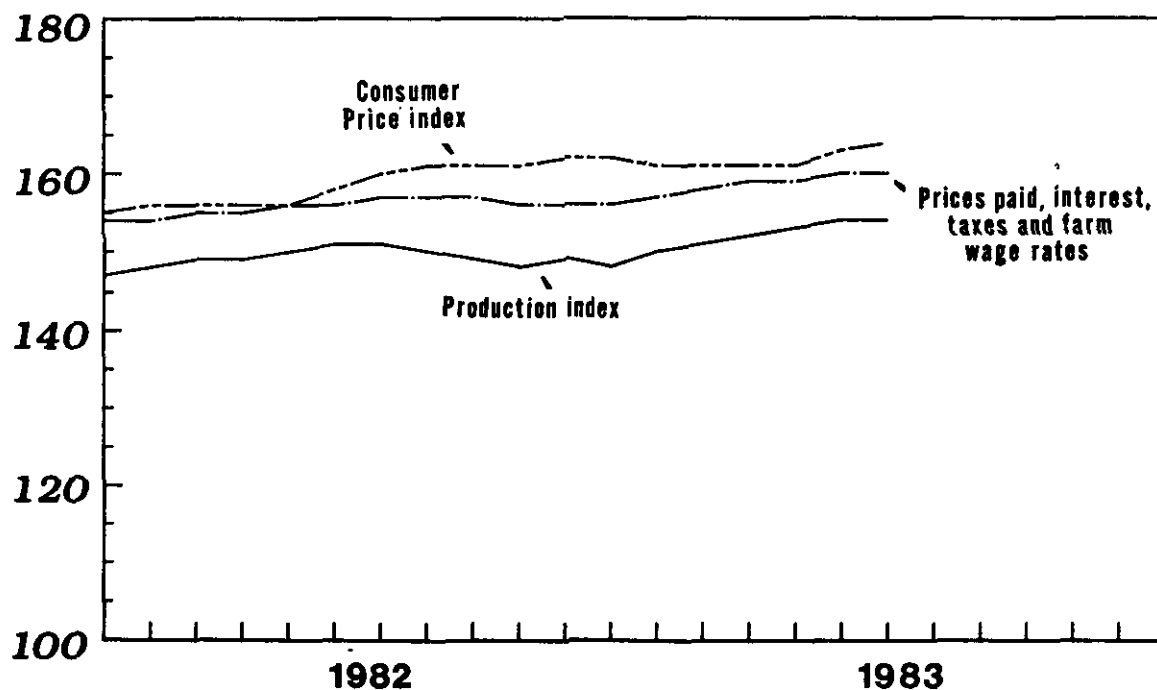
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

% of 1977

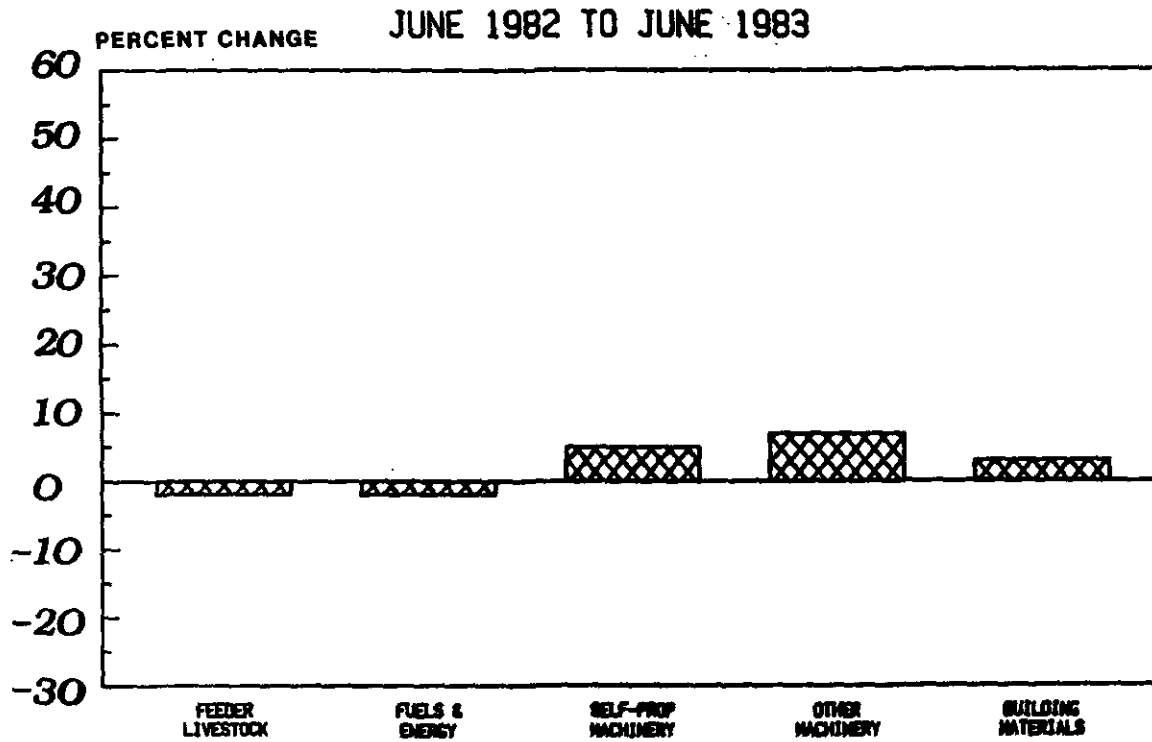


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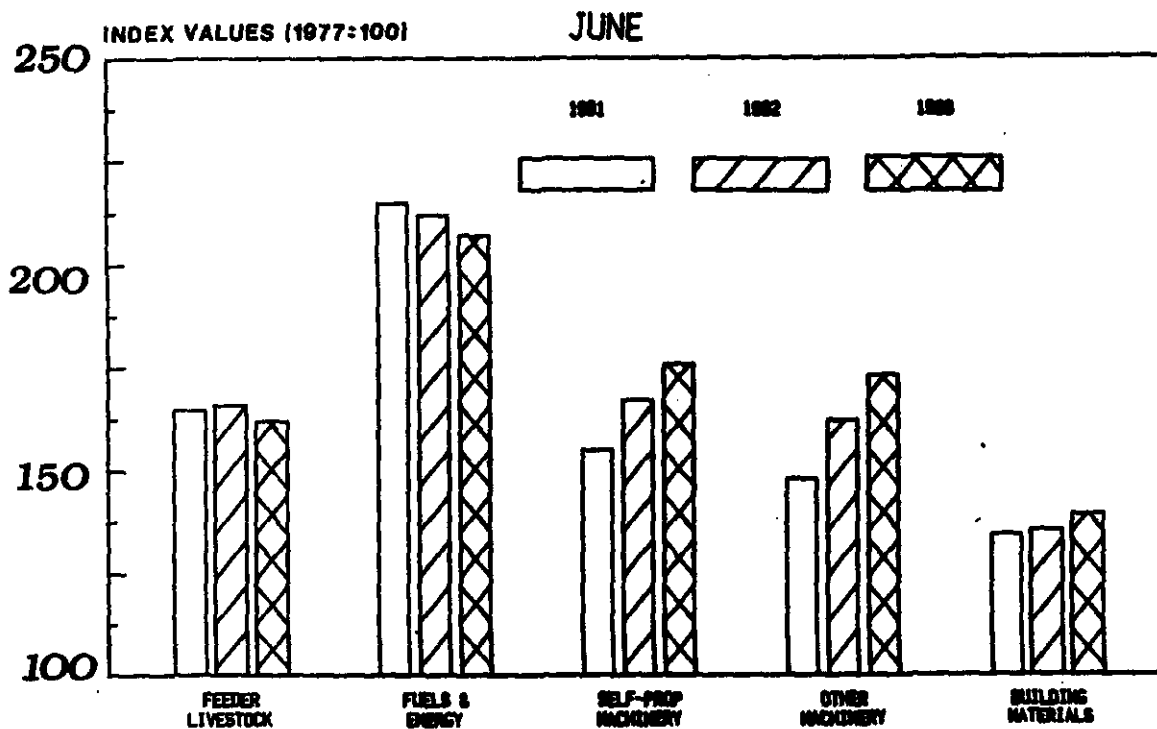
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PERCENT CHANGE IN PRICES PAID COMMODITY INDEX



PRICES PAID INDEX COMPARISONS

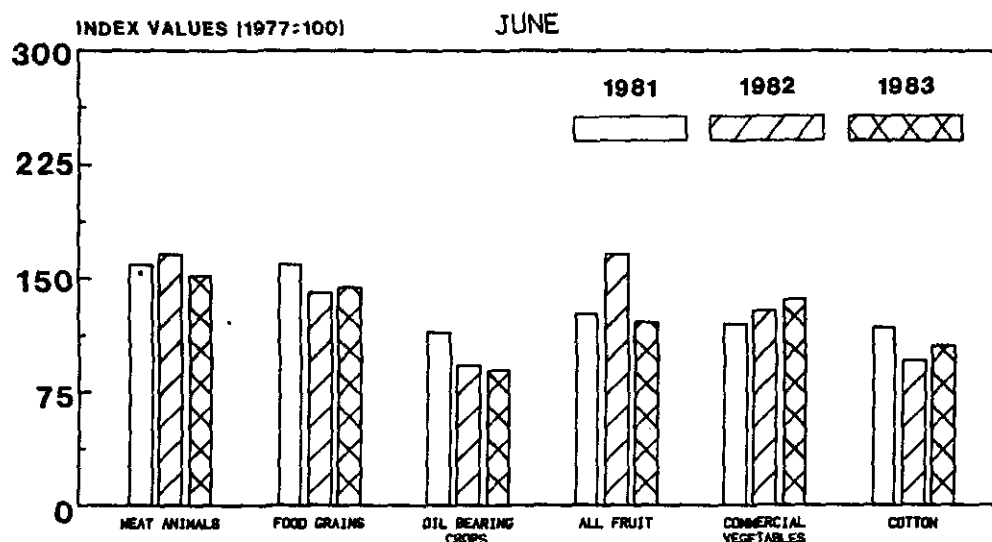

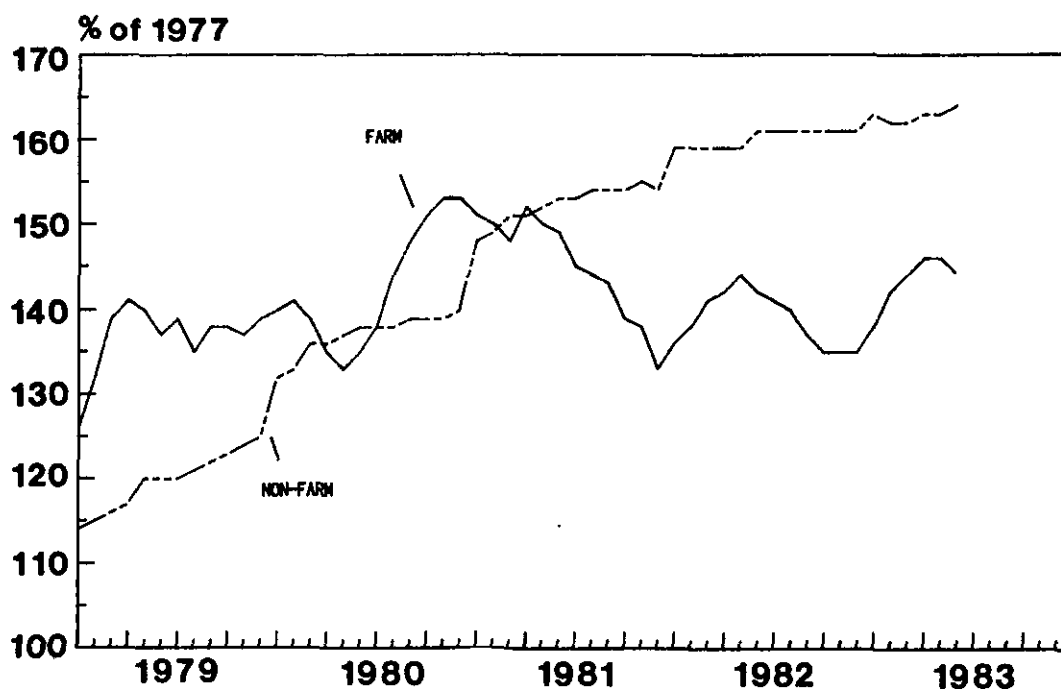
