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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 3 POINTS  
PRICES PAID INDEX UP 1 POINT

The November Index of Prices Received by Farmers for All Farm Products increased 3 points (2.4 percent) from October to 126 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Crop Reporting Board. Higher prices for cattle, broilers, corn, strawberries, and oranges were partially offset by lower prices for lemons, hogs, and grapefruit. The index was 10 points (7.4 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates for November was 163 percent of its 1977 average. The index was 1 point (0.6 percent) higher than October but 1 point (0.6 percent) lower than November 1984. Contributing most to the increase from last month were the feed and feeder livestock components.

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## PRICES RECEIVED

The November All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 3 points (2.4 percent) from the previous month to 126 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 10 points (7.4 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 6, the following contributed most to the changes from a month earlier.

**LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS:** The November index, at 138, was up 4 points (3.0 percent) from the preceding month but was 5 points (3.5 percent) below November 1984.

**MEAT ANIMALS:** At 143, the index increased 5 points (3.6 percent) from the previous month but was 3 points (2.1 percent) below a year ago. Cattle prices in November were up \$2.90 from a month earlier to \$55.00 per cwt and calf prices, at \$61.10, increased 90 cents. Hog prices were 70 cents lower at \$42.40 per cwt.

**POULTRY AND EGGS:** The November index, at 133, was up 10 points (8.1 percent) from a month earlier and 6 points (4.7 percent) above a year ago. Broiler prices increased 4.1 cents to average 31.8 cents per pound. Egg prices were up 2.7 cents, at 66.2 cents per dozen, and turkeys, at 58.4 cents per pound, were 1.4 cents above a month earlier.

**DAIRY PRODUCTS:** At 131, the index was up 1 point (0.8 percent) from October 1985 but was 16 points (11 percent) below a year ago. All milk sold to plants and dealers averaged \$12.70 per cwt, 10 cents above last month.

**ALL CROPS:** At 114, the index for November was up 3 points (2.7 percent) from a month earlier but was 15 points (12 percent) below a year ago.

**VEGETABLES:** The commercial vegetable index, at 123, was up 12 points (11 percent) from October and was 17 points (16 percent) higher than a year earlier. Higher prices for tomatoes, lettuce, and celery contributed most to the increase.

**FEED GRAINS AND HAY:** At 110, the index was 5 points (4.8 percent) above the previous month but 16 points (13 percent) below a year earlier. Corn was \$2.22 per bushel, up 10 cents from October, and sorghum grain at \$3.51 per cwt was up 21 cents. Oats were up 2 cents to \$1.10 per bushel and barley averaged 1 cent higher at \$1.97 per bushel. Hay was unchanged at \$66.00 per ton.

**OIL-BEARING CROPS:** The index, at 75, was 1 point (1.4 percent) above October but 18 points (19 percent) below November 1984. Soybeans averaged \$4.92 per bushel, up 7 cents from the previous month. Cottonseed was \$15.00 higher at \$67.00 per ton. Peanuts were 0.6 cent lower at 22.5 cents per pound and flaxseed declined 25 cents to \$4.76 per bushel.

## PRICES PAID

The November Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates was 1 point (0.6 percent) higher than October. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 1 point (0.6 percent). Of the indexes shown on page 7, the following had the greatest influence.

**PRODUCTION INDEX:** The farm production goods and services index for November, at 149, was 1 point (0.7 percent) higher than a month earlier. The index was 4 points (2.6 percent) less than the same month a year ago.

**FEEDER LIVESTOCK:** The November index, at 151, was up 3 points (2.0 percent) from October but was down 3 points (1.9 percent) from November a year ago. Feeder cattle and calves averaged \$59.00 per cwt in November, up \$1.50 from October accounting for the index increase from last month. Feeder pigs, at \$76.00, were \$4.50 per cwt lower.

**FUELS AND ENERGY:** At 205, the index was up 3 points (1.5 percent) from October and was 5 points (2.5 percent) higher than November 1984. The price of bulk delivered fuels increased from last month with regular gasoline at \$1.17, up 1 cent per gallon and diesel fuel at \$1.02, up 4.6 cents per gallon. Service station unleaded gasoline, at \$1.21 per gallon, remained unchanged.

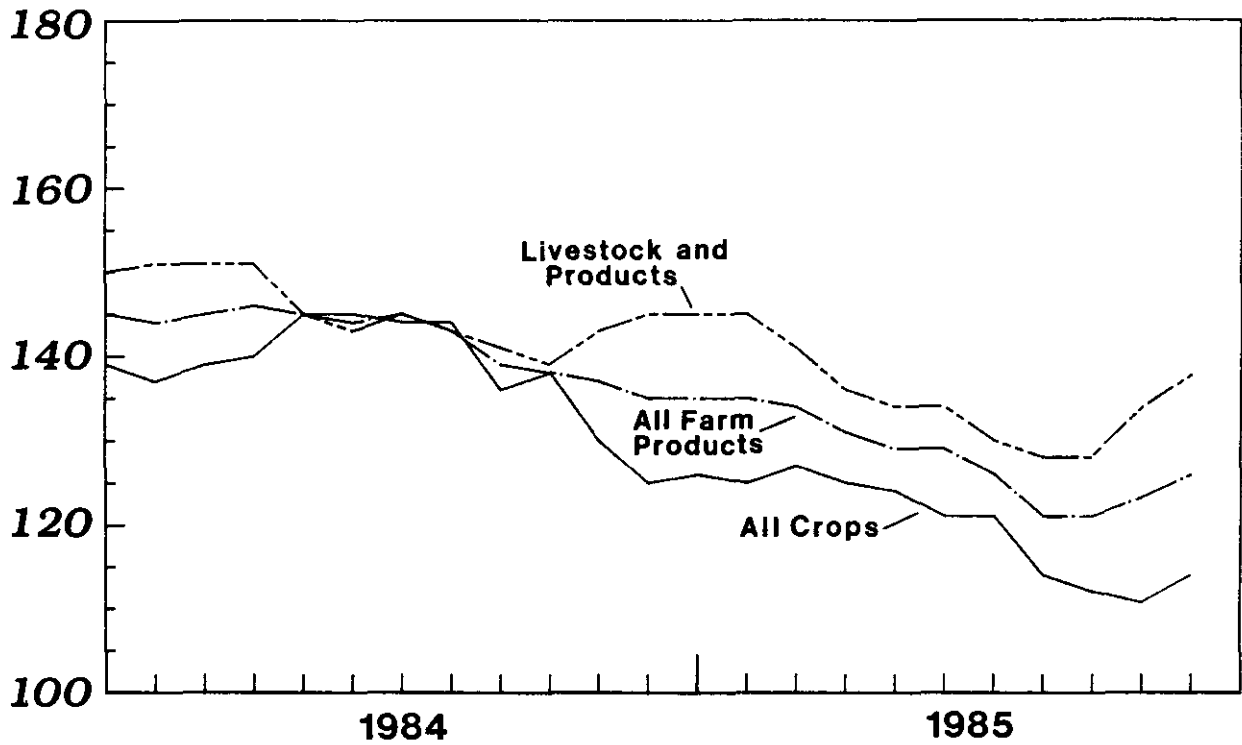
**FEED:** The index, at 110, was up 2 points (1.9 percent) from a month ago but was 13 points (11 percent) below a year earlier. Contributing most to the increase were higher prices for feed grains and prepared livestock and poultry feeds. November was the first time in 10 months that the feed price index has increased from the previous month.

**AUTOS AND TRUCKS:** At 199, the November index was up 6 points (3.1 percent) from May 1985. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 5.3 percent. Prices paid for new cars and trucks are surveyed in May and November.

**CONSUMER PRICE INDEX:** The October unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) increased 0.3 percent from September to 325.5 (1967=100). The index was 3.2 percent above October 1984. On a seasonally adjusted basis, the CPI-U was 0.3 percent above September. All components increased. The transportation index was up 0.2 percent, the first increase since April. Increases of 0.6 percent were recorded for apparel & upkeep and entertainment indexes. The medical care index rose 0.5 percent. The food & beverages and other goods & services indexes increased 0.4 percent. The housing index was 0.3 percent higher.

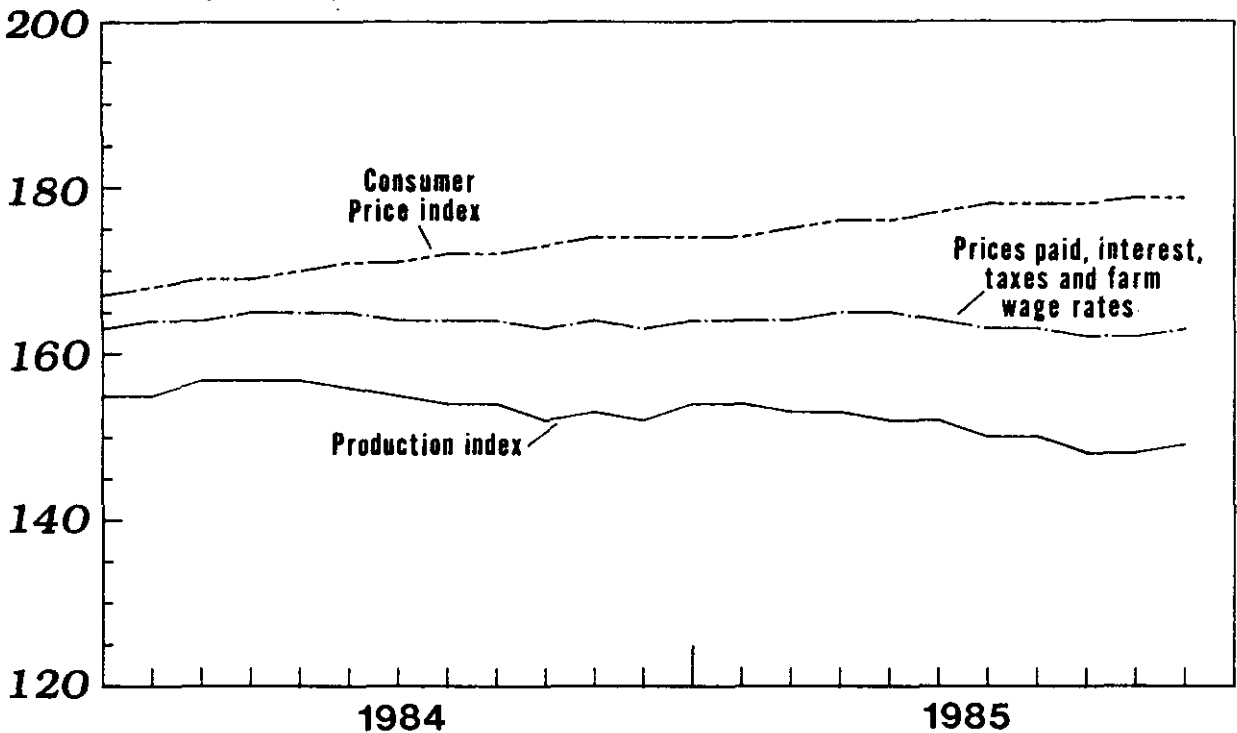
## Index of Prices Received by Farmers, U S

INDEX VALUES (1977=100)

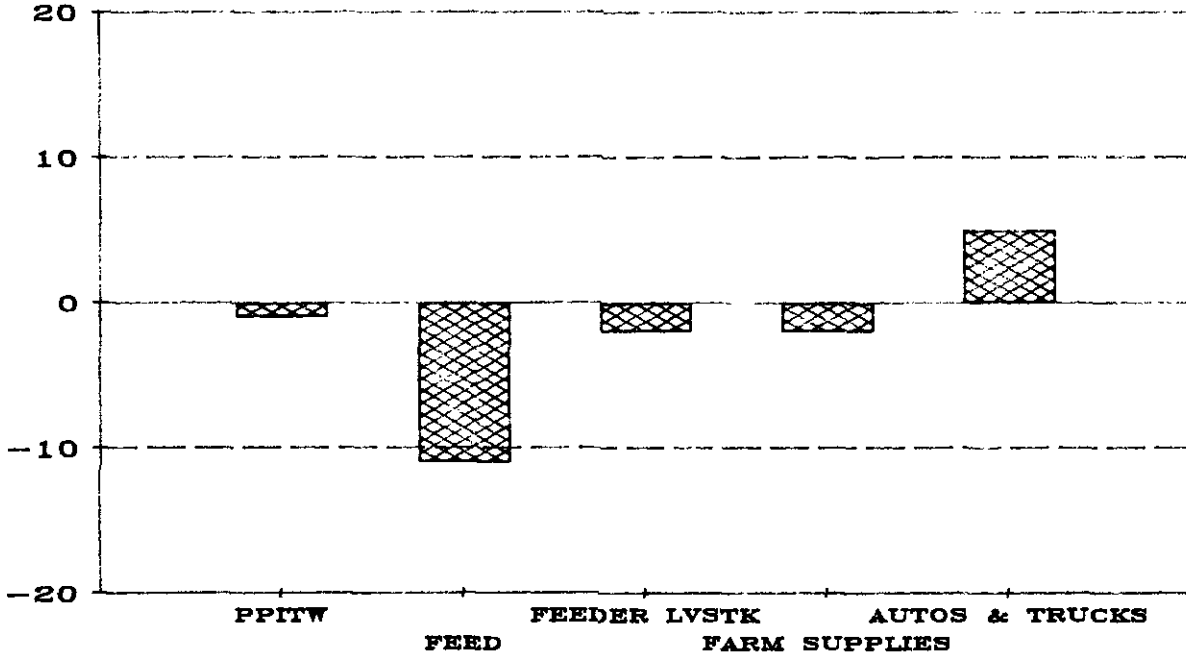


## Index of Prices Paid by Farmers, U S

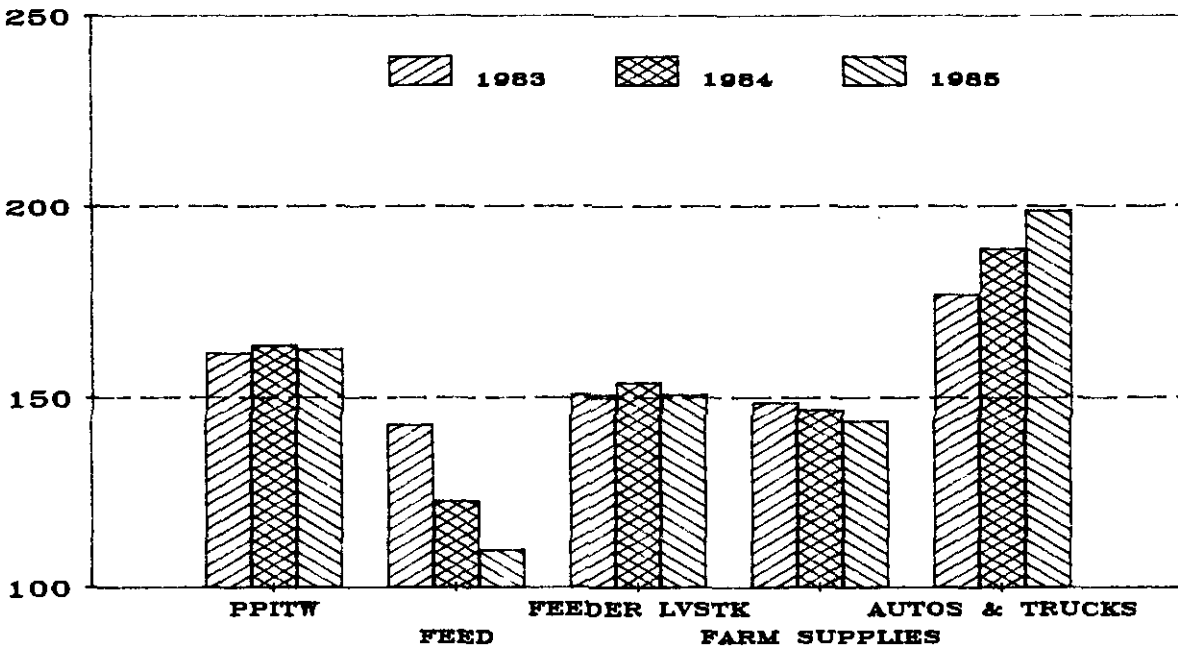
INDEX VALUES (1977=100)

INDEX VALUES (1977 = 100) NOVEMBER**



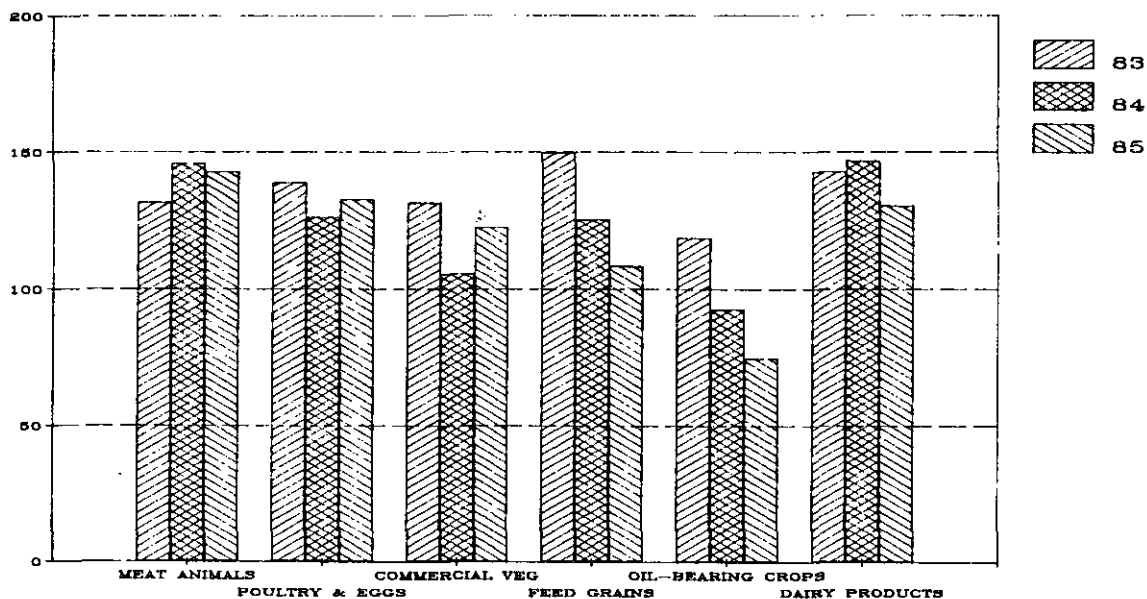

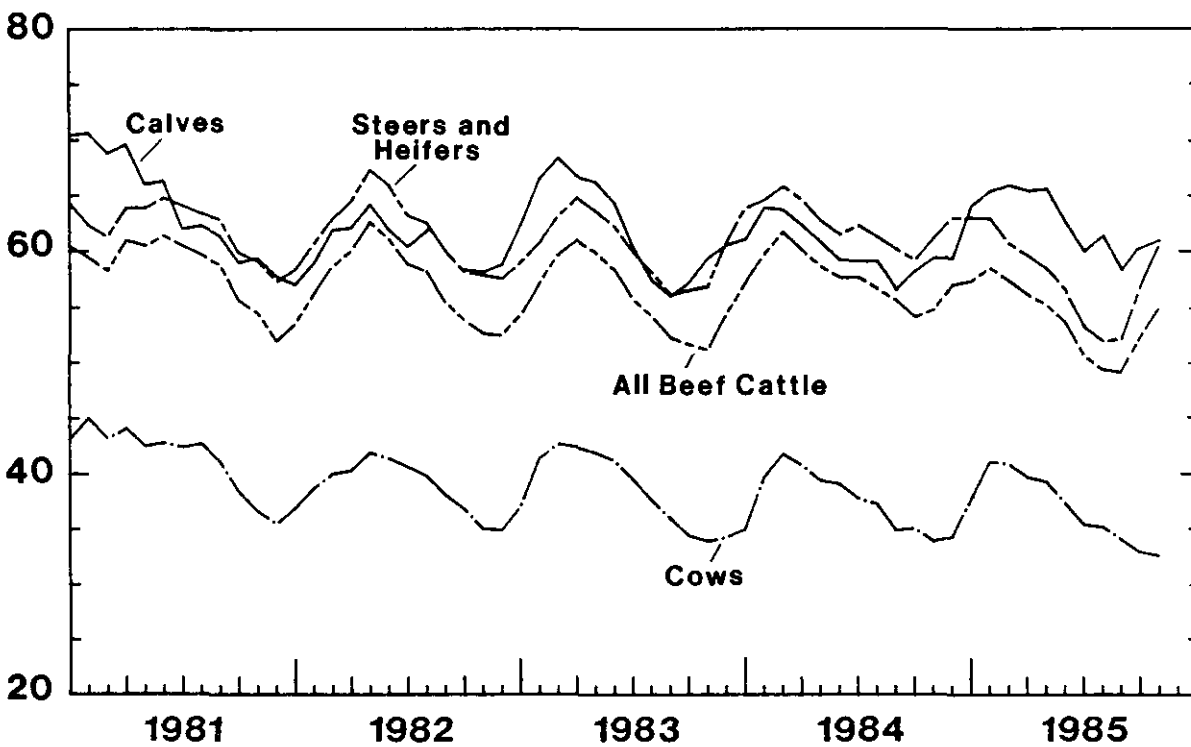

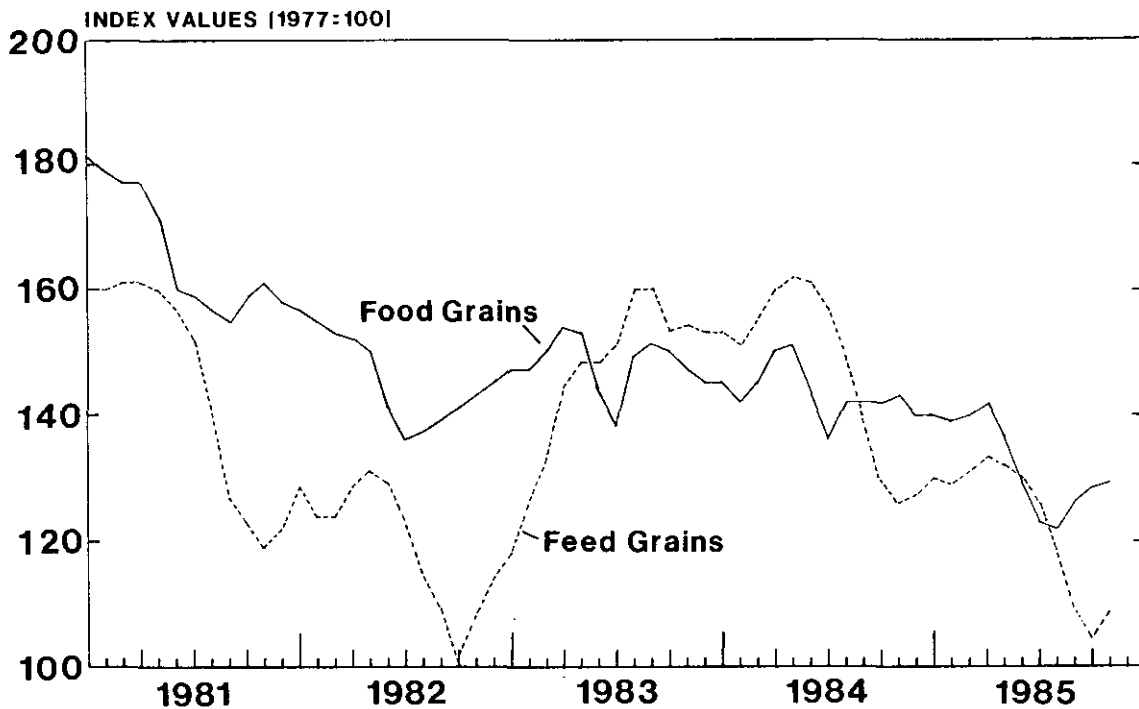
