PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UNCHANGED FROM A MONTH EARLIER

The August All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers, at 125 percent of its January-December 1977 average, was unchanged from July, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Cattle, hog, broiler, and egg prices moved higher while corn, cotton, potato and soybean prices were lower. The index was 4 points (3.3 percent) above a year earlier.

In August, hog and broiler prices were at record highs. The previous record high for all hogs of \$61.30 was recorded in September of 1982 while the previous record for broilers was set last month. The August corn price of \$1.70 per bushel was the lowest level since October 1977.

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PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for August was 125, unchanged from a month earlier. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 4 points (3.3 percent). Of the subgroups shown on page 4, the following contributed most to the changes from a month earlier.

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The August index was up 5 points (3.5 percent) from a month earlier and 20 points (16 percent) from a year earlier.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 157, the index was up 5 points (3.3 percent) from last month and 24 points (18 percent) above a year ago. August beef cattle prices increased \$1.60 to average \$54.50 per cwt. Hog prices increased \$2.80 from July to \$61.80 per cwt. The August hog price was the highest since records began in 1909.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The August index, at 151, was up 10 points (7.1 percent) from a month earlier and was 33 points (28 percent) above August 1985. Broiler prices increased 3.5 cents to 45.9 cents per pound and egg prices averaged 62.6 cents, up 4 cents per dozen. Turkey prices increased 1.5 cents per pound to 50.8 cents. For the second consecutive month, the broiler price moved to a new record high.

ALL CROPS: The all crops index for August was down 5 percentage points (4.8 percent) from a month earlier and 14 points (12 percent) below a year earlier.

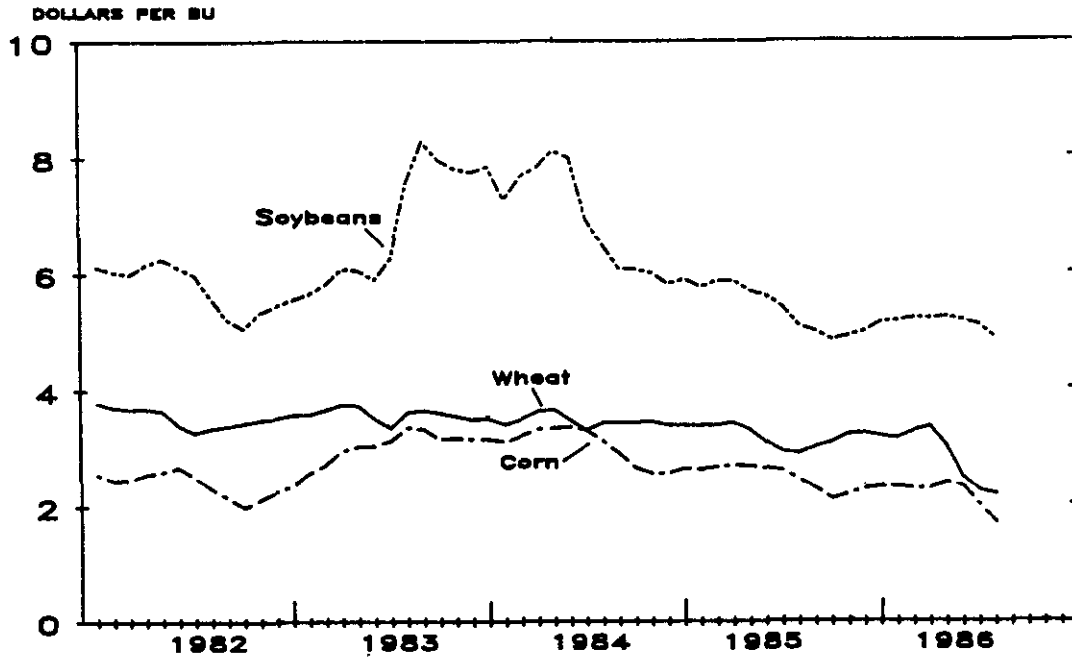
FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 86, the index was 11 points (11 percent) below July and 32 points (27 percent) below a year earlier. Corn, at \$1.70 per bushel, was down 30 cents and barley averaged \$1.48 per bushel, down 19 cents. Sorghum grain brought \$2.86 per cwt, 14 cents less than in July and oats, at 84 cents per bushel, were 6.3 cents lower. Hay was \$58.30 per ton, down 40 cents from July.

COTTON: The cotton index, at 87, was down 10 points (10 percent) from July and 6 points (6.5 percent) from August 1985. Preliminary August prices for upland cotton decreased 6.3 cents to 52.3 cents per pound.

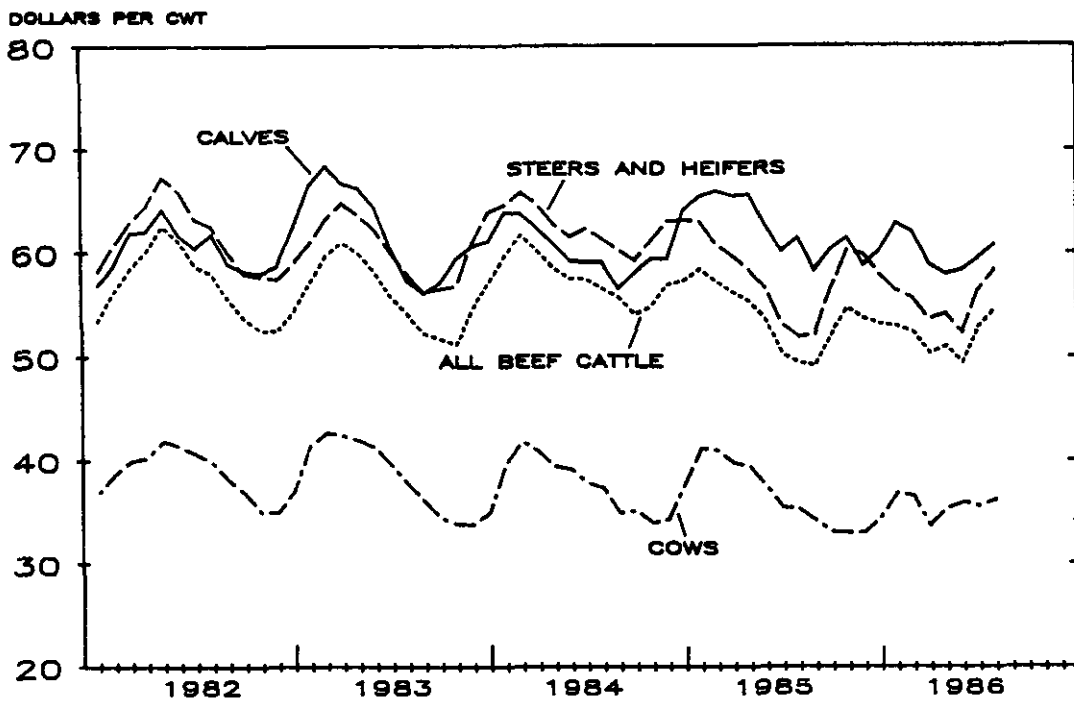
FRUIT: At 174, the all fruit index was up 9 points (5.5 percent) from July and 3 points (1.8 percent) from last year. The increase from last month was primarily due to higher prices for strawberries, oranges, and apples. The increase was offset slightly by lower prices for peaches and lemons.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index was 73, 4 points (5.2 percent) lower than July and 5 points (6.4 percent) less than August 1985. Soybeans were \$4.88 per bushel, down 23 cents.

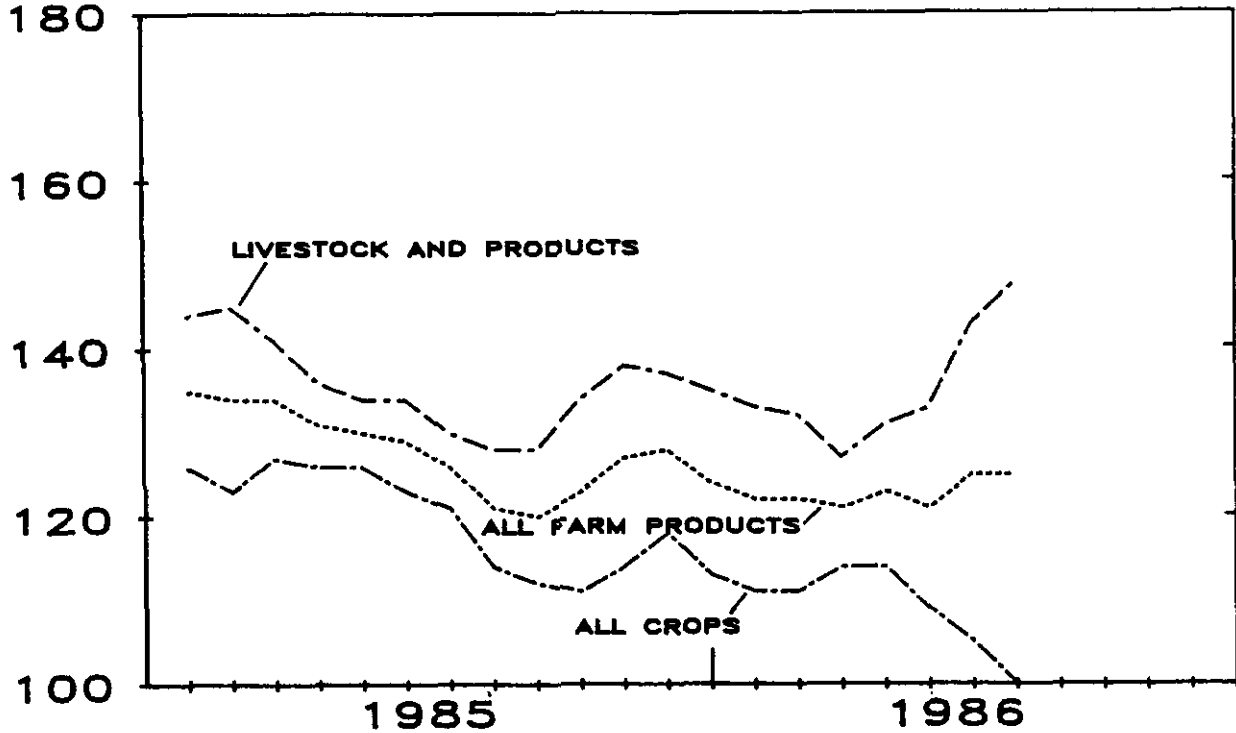

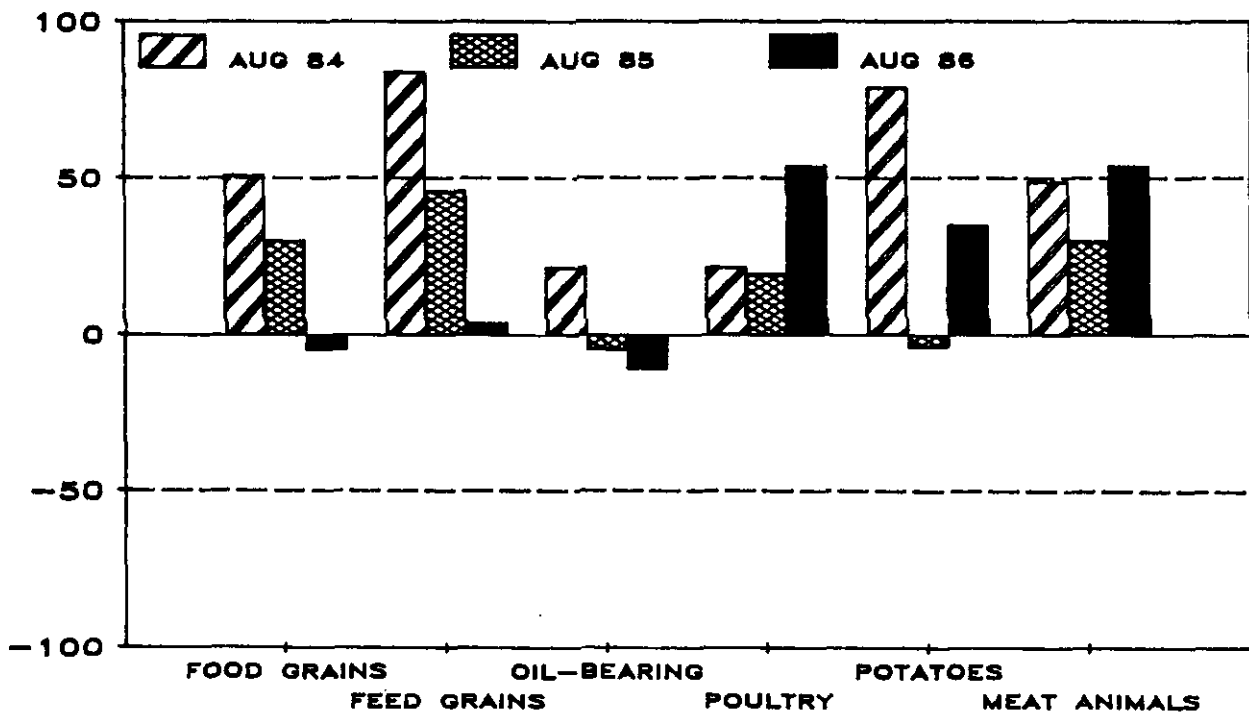

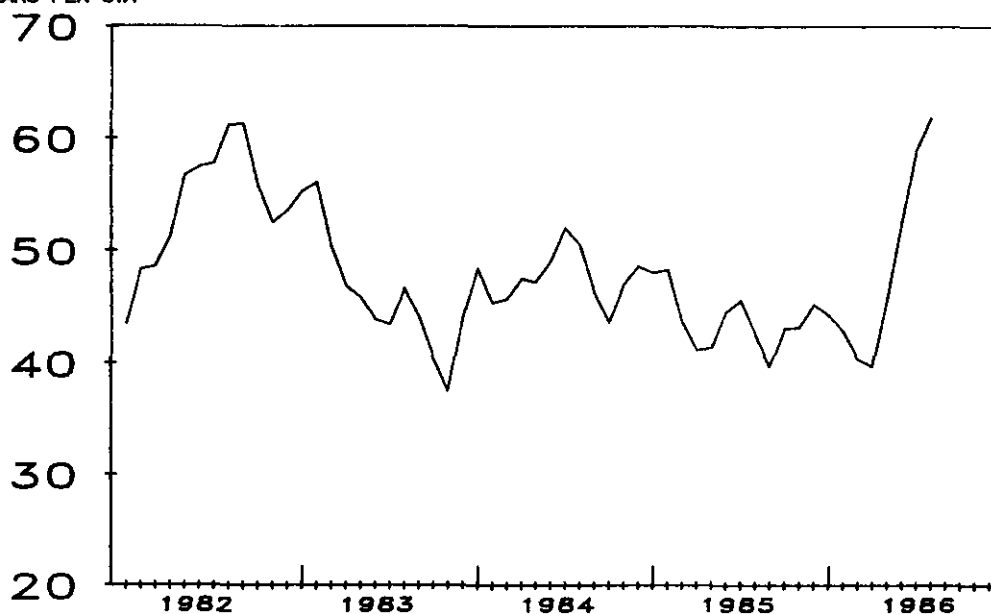
