## PRICES RECEIVED AND PRICES PAID INDEXES DOWN 1 POINT

The October All Farm Products Index of Prices Received By Farmers, at 121 percent of its January-December 1977 average, decreased 1 point (0.8 percent) from September, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Lower prices for hogs, corn, soybeans, eggs, and lettuce were partially offset by higher prices for tomatoes, strawberries, milk, broilers, and most small grains. The index was 2 points (1.6 percent) below a year ago.

The Index of Prices Paid by Farmers for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates for October was 160 percent of its 1977 average. The index dropped 1 point (0.6 percent) from July and 2 points (1.2 percent) from last year. Lower feed and fertilizer prices for the quarter more than offset the increase in feeder livestock prices. The index for feed was the lowest since October 1978.

## PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received By Farmers for October decreased 1 point (0.8 percent) from the previous month to 121 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 2 points (1.6 percent).

**LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS:** The October index, at 145, was down 1 point (0.7 percent) from a month earlier, but 11 points (8.2 percent) above a year ago.

**MEAT ANIMALS:** The index, at 151, was 4 points (2.6 percent) below last month, but 13 points (9.4 percent) above last year. October hog prices decreased \$4.90 from September to average \$53.40 per cwt. Cattle prices were unchanged from September at \$54.60 per cwt.

**DAIRY PRODUCTS:** The dairy products index, at 134, was up 3 points (2.3 percent) from September and 4 points (3.1 percent) above October last year. All milk sold to plants and dealers averaged \$13.00 per cwt, up 30 cents from last month and 40 cents above October a year ago.

**ALL CROPS:** The all crops index for October was 96, down 1 point (1.0 percent) from a month earlier and 15 points (14 percent) below a year earlier.

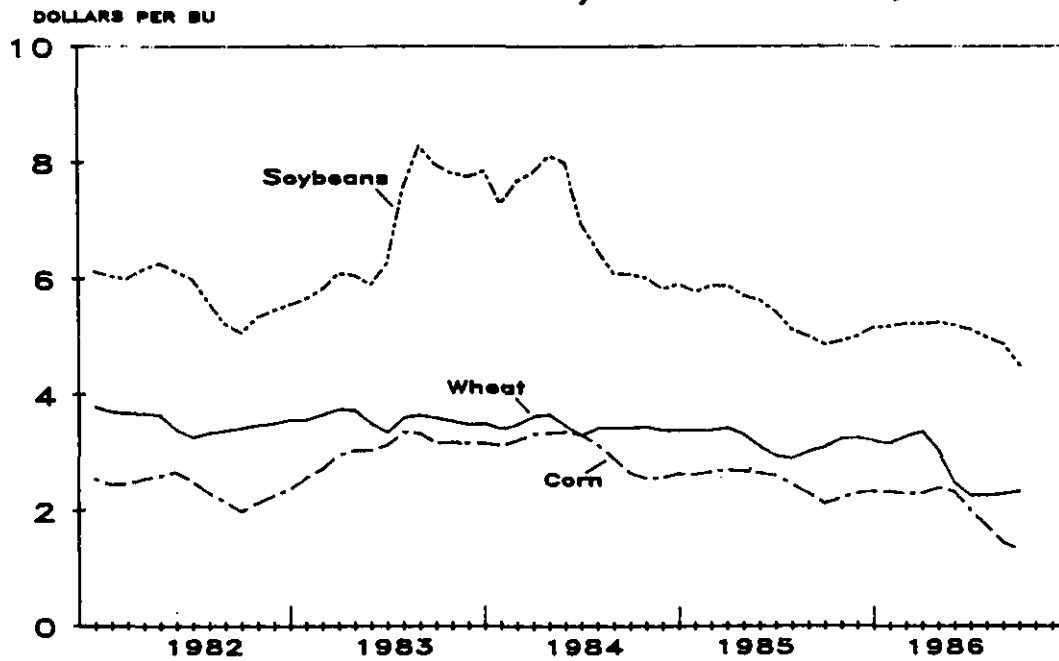
**FEED GRAINS AND HAY:** At 73, the index was 4 points (5.2 percent) below September and 32 points (30 percent) below October 1985. Corn was \$1.31 per bushel in October, down 13 cents from September. Barley averaged \$1.53 per bushel, up 8 cents from the previous month while oats increased 4.8 cents to \$1.04 per bushel. Sorghum was unchanged at \$2.36 per cwt. Hay averaged \$57.40 per ton, down \$1.00 from September.

**OIL-BEARING CROPS:** The index was 71, down 4 points (5.3 percent) from the previous month and October 1985. Soybeans, at \$4.50 per bushel, were down 36 cents. Cottonseed increased \$8.00 to \$64.00 per ton. Peanuts were 27.1 cents per pound in October, up 1.0 cent. Flaxseed was 6 cents lower at \$3.62 per bushel.

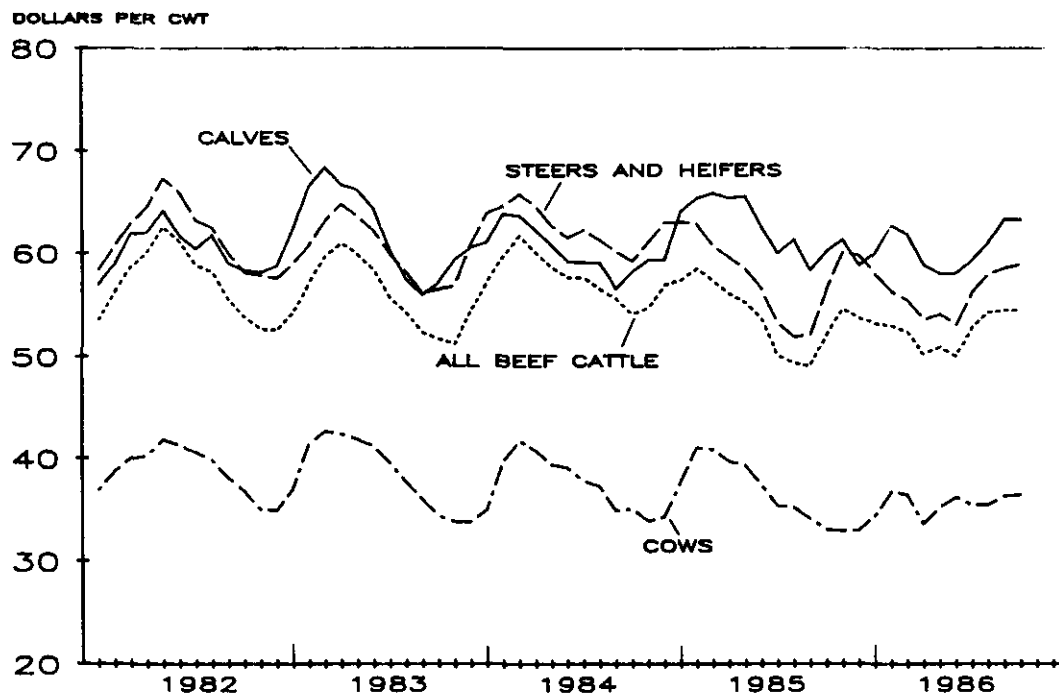
**FRUIT:** At 178, the all fruit index was up 5 points (2.9 percent) from September, but down 8 points (4.3 percent) from last year. The increase from last month was primarily due to higher prices for strawberries, oranges, and pears. Partially offsetting were lower prices for apples, grapefruit, and lemons.

**COMMERCIAL VEGETABLES:** The commercial vegetable index was 133 -- up 4 points (3.1 percent) from a month earlier and 21 points (19 percent) above last October. A higher price for tomatoes was the major contributor to the increase with lower lettuce prices partially offsetting.

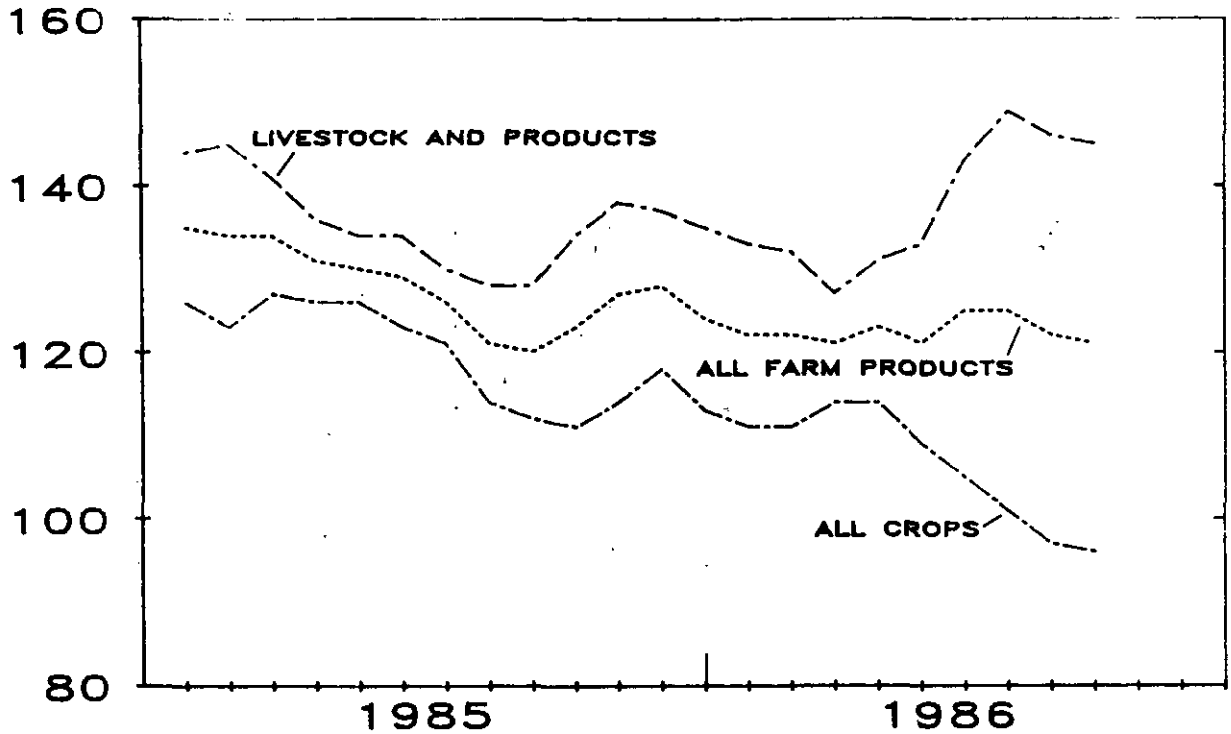

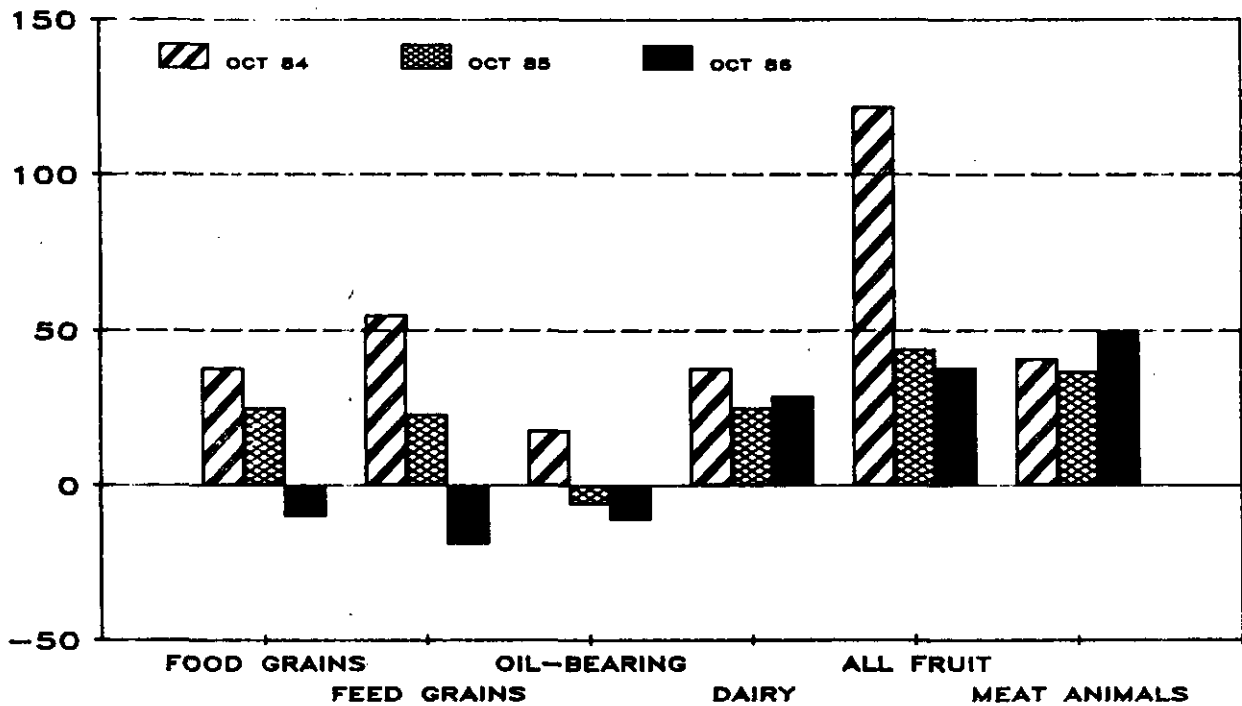

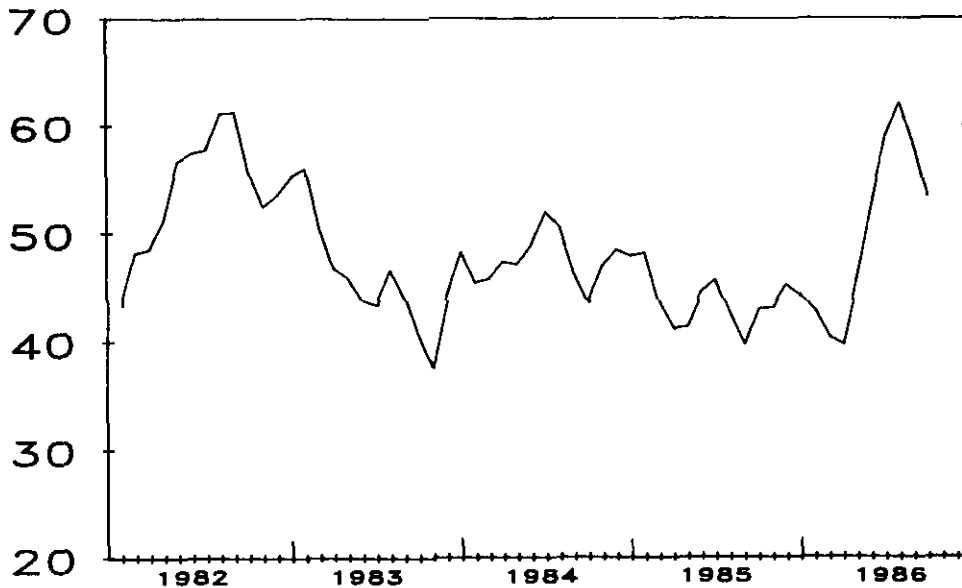

## PRICES PAID

The October Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates was 160 (1977=100), down 1 point (0.6 percent) from July 1986. This level was 2 points (1.2 percent) lower than a year earlier. Of the indexes shown on page 23, the following had the greatest influence.

**PRODUCTION INDEX:** The Farm Production Goods and Services Index for October was 143, down 2 points (1.4 percent) from July. Compared to a year earlier, the index was down 5 points (3.4 percent). Lower prices for feed and fertilizer contributed most to the decline from last quarter. Higher prices for feeder livestock were partially offsetting.

**FEED:** The index, at 98, was 9 points (8.4 percent) below July 1986 and 10 points (9.3 percent) below a year ago. This is the lowest feed index level since October 1978. Lower prices for feed grains, hay, and mixed feeds accounted for the decrease from July. Corn was the major commodity contributing to the index decline.

**FEEDER LIVESTOCK:** At 160, the index was 6 points (3.9 percent) above July and 12 points (8.1 percent) higher than a year ago. Prices for both feeder pigs and feeder cattle and calves were \$3.00 higher than July, at \$115.00 and \$61.00 per cwt, respectively.

**FERTILIZER:** The index was 116, 9 points (7.2 percent) below July and 14 points (11 percent) below a year ago. Lower prices were reported for all fertilizers.

**FUELS AND ENERGY:** The index, at 154, was down 1 point (0.7 percent) from July and was 48 points (24 percent) below a year ago. The October index was the lowest since September 1979. Prices for service station unleaded gasoline averaged 83.7 cents per gallon, down 3.7 cents since July. Bulk delivered regular gasoline prices were down 2.5 cents per gallon, averaging 81.6 cents. Diesel fuel prices were up 3.1 cents at 62.0 cents per gallon.

**TRACTORS AND SELF-PROPELLED MACHINERY:** The October index, at 172, was 3 points (1.7 percent) below July and 2 points (1.1 percent) below October 1985. Lower prices for 110-240 horsepower wheel-type tractors were largely responsible for the lower index.

**CONSUMER PRICE INDEX:** The September unadjusted Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) was 330.2 (1967=100), up 0.5 percent from August. The CPI-U increased 1.8 percent for the 12-month period ending in September. The August unadjusted CPI-U was 328.6 compared to a July index of 328.0. Price changes in the energy and food components continued to dominate the index movement. Gasoline prices rose 2.0 percent in September following a two month decline. Food prices were higher for the second straight month.

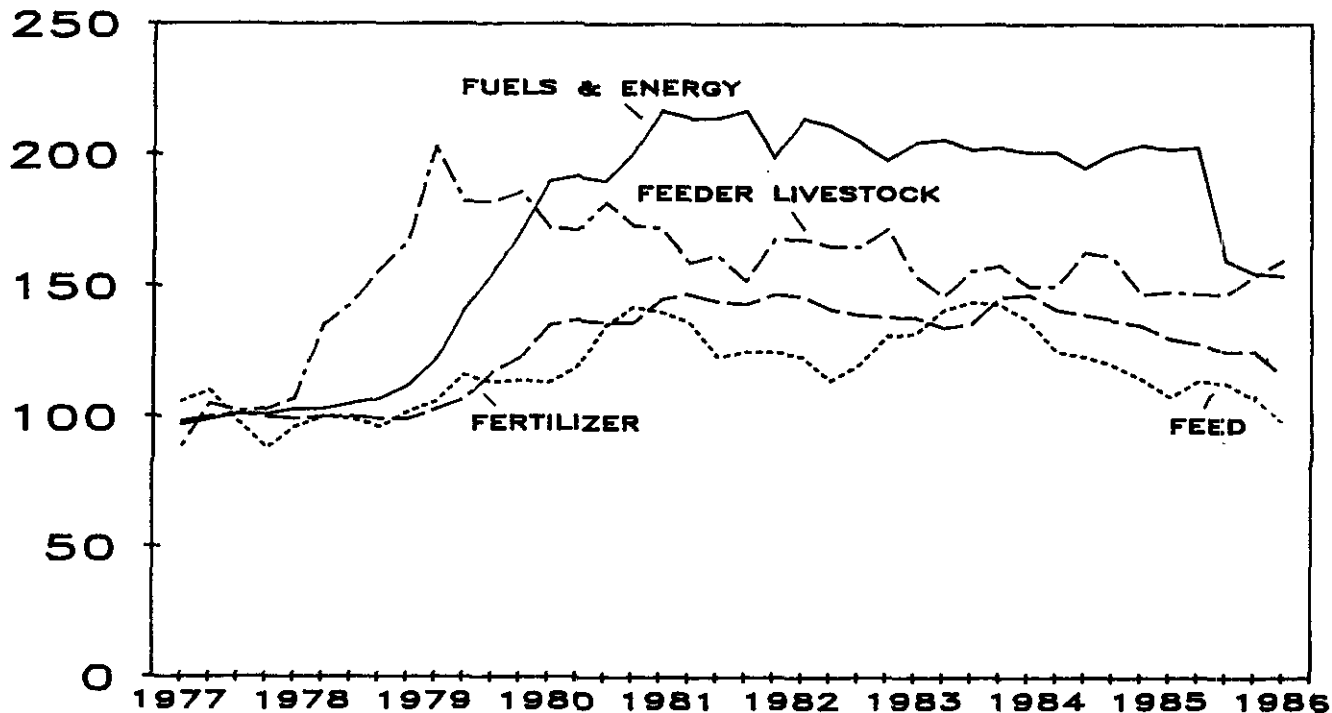

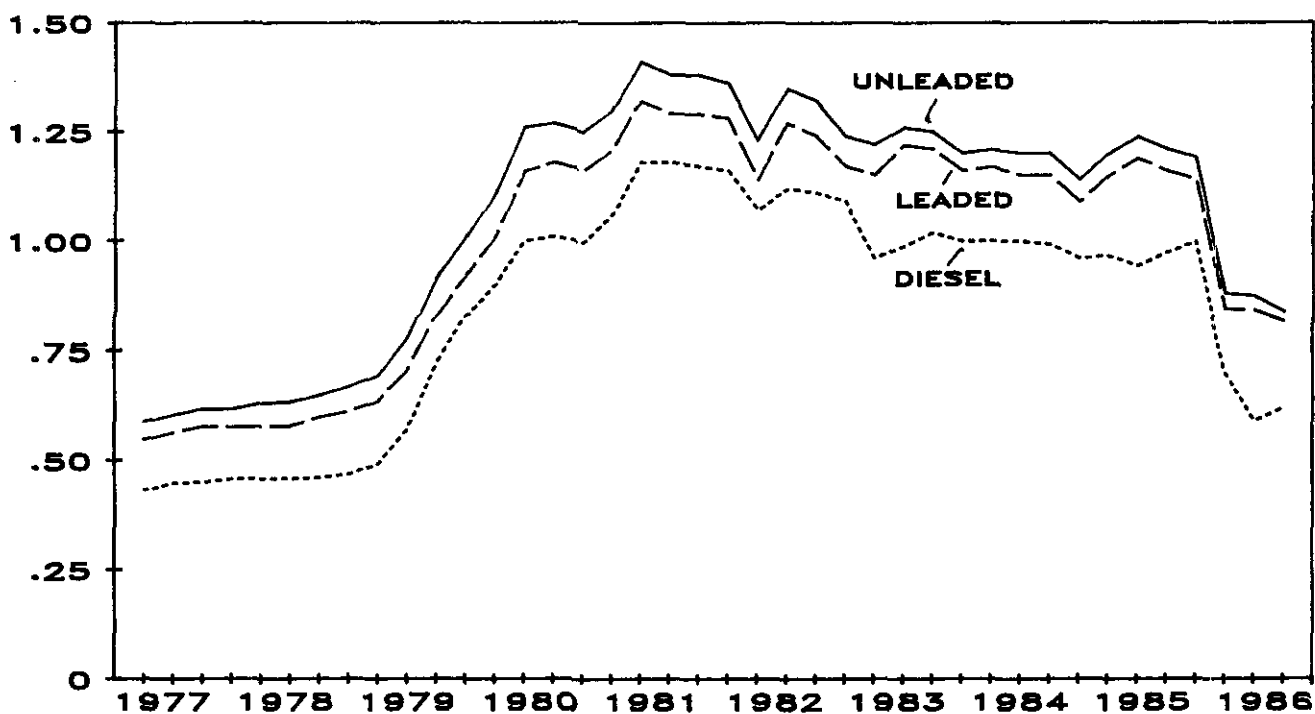
