PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 3 POINTS

The December All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (2.4 percent) from November to 121 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Lower prices for oranges, tomatoes, broilers, cattle, hogs, and turkeys were partially offset by higher prices for cotton, strawberries, corn, and lettuce. The index was 7 points (5.5 percent) below a year ago.

Month to month changes in grain prices were mixed. The all beef cattle and all hog prices were down, but calf prices were higher. Average lamb prices were up sharply, but broiler and egg prices were down. The all milk price was unchanged. Sharply lower prices for oranges and tomatoes were important factors in the month to month decrease of the commercial vegetable and all fruit indexes.

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PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for December decreased 3 points (2.4 percent) from the previous month to 121 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 7 points (5.5 percent).

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The December index was 141 -- down 4 points (2.8 percent) from a month earlier, but up 4 points (2.9 percent) from December a year ago.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and eggs index, at 124, was down 12 points (8.8 percent) from November, and 6 points (4.6 percent) below December last year. Broiler prices averaged 30.6 cents per pound in December, down 4.3 cents from November. Turkey prices decreased 10.0 cents from November to 41.5 cents per pound. The market egg price was 58.3 cents per dozen for December, down 1.5 cents from the previous month.

MEAT ANIMALS: The index was 147 -- 3 points (2.0 percent) below November, but 5 points (3.5 percent) above December last year. Hog prices in December averaged \$51.30 per cwt, a decrease of \$1.50 from the previous month. Cattle prices declined \$1.00 to \$53.60 per cwt.

ALL CROPS: At 99, the all crops index for December was down 3 points (2.9 percent) from last month and down 19 points (16 percent) from a year earlier.

ALL FRUIT: The all fruit index, at 170, was down 20 points (11 percent) from November and 4 points (2.3 percent) below last year. The decrease from last month was primarily due to a sharp decline in orange prices. Higher prices for strawberries and grapefruit were slightly offsetting.

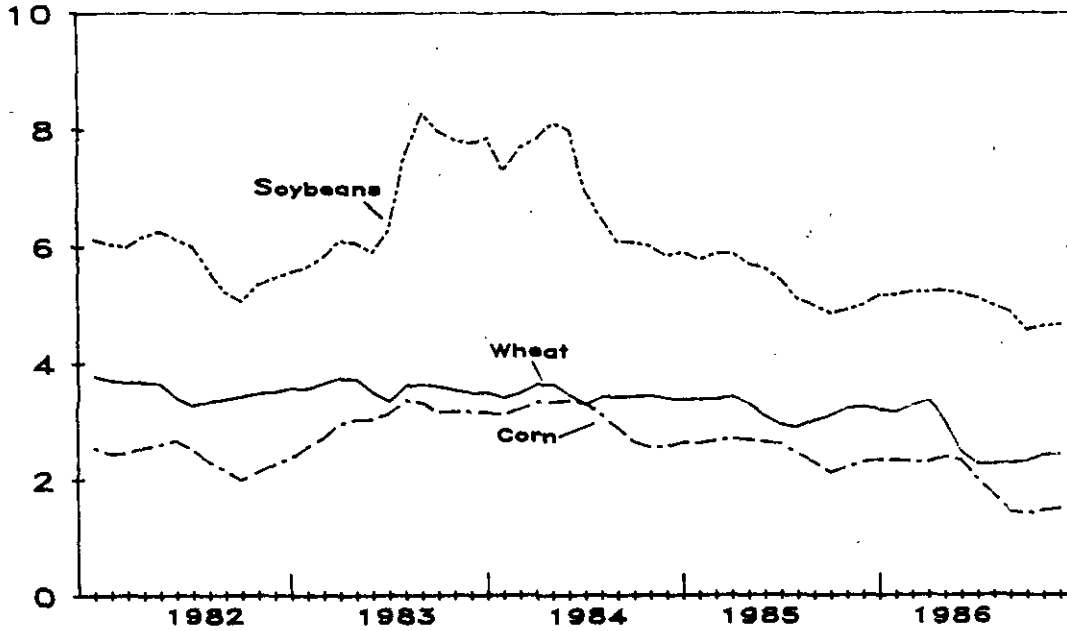
COMMERCIAL VEGETABLES: The commercial vegetable index was 125 -- down 20 points (14 percent) from November and 49 points (28 percent) from last year. Lower prices for tomatoes were the dominant reason for the decrease. Prices for sweet corn, onions, celery, and carrots declined while lettuce prices increased slightly.

COTTON: At 92, the cotton index was up 4 points (4.5 percent) from both last month and last year. The preliminary December price for upland cotton increased 2.5 cents to 55.4 cents per pound.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The index moved up to 80, one point (1.3 percent) above the previous month, but 33 points (29 percent) below a year earlier. Corn was \$1.50 per bushel -- up 3 cents from November, while barley averaged 17 cents lower or \$1.52 per bushel. Sorghum grain increased 5 cents to \$2.43 per cwt and the oat price was up 5 cents at \$1.37 per bushel. Hay brought \$57.20 per ton, up 70 cents.

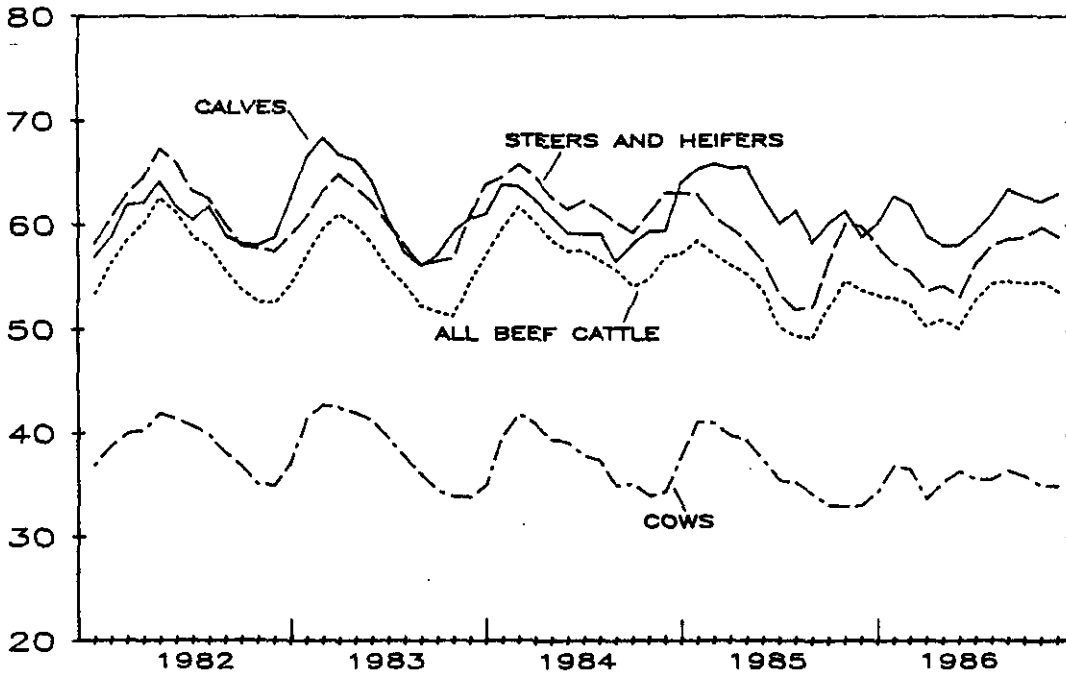
Prices Received by Farmers, US

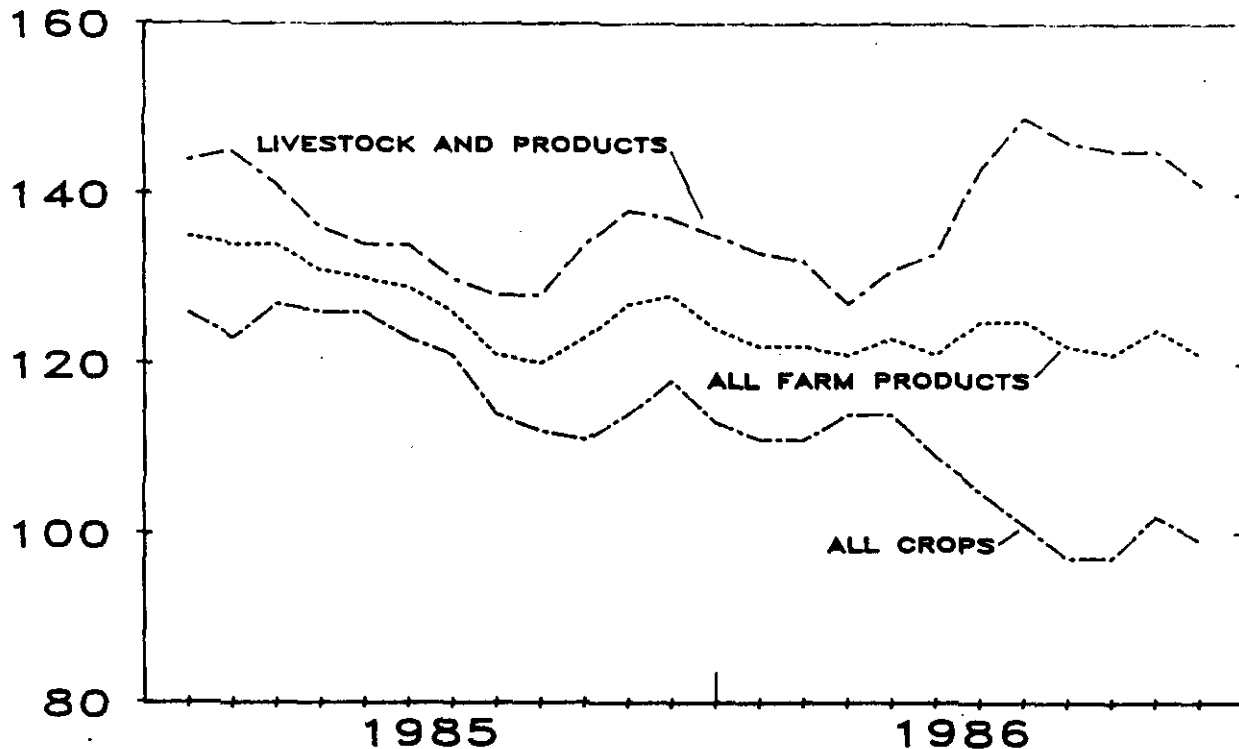

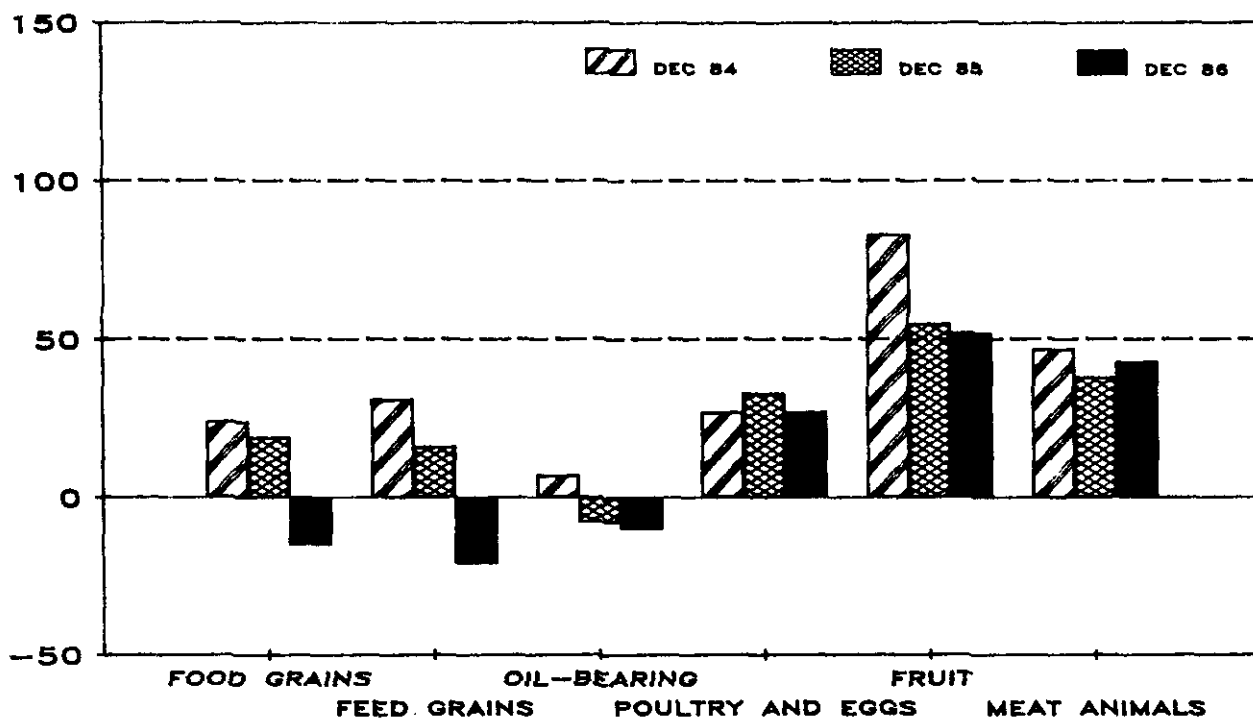
INDEX OF PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

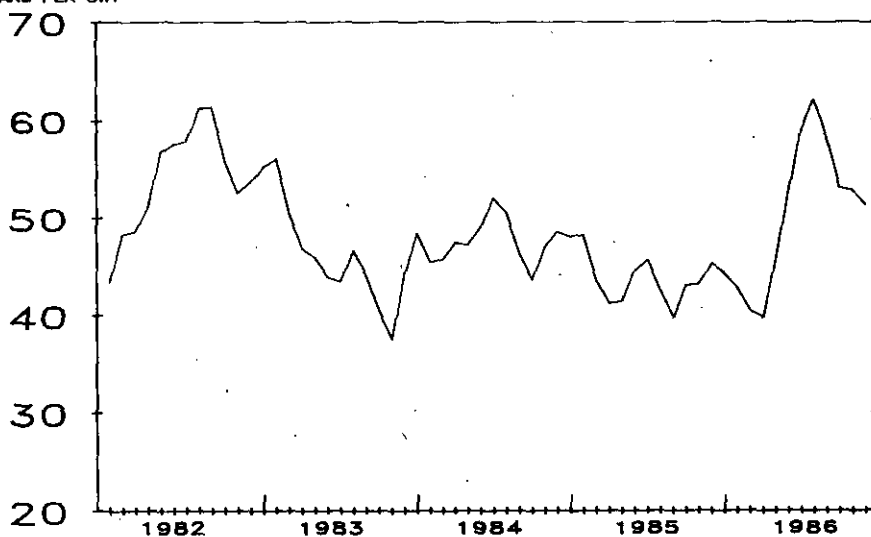
