PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 2 POINTS

The June All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers increased 2 points (1.6 percent) from May to 131 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Higher prices for hogs, cotton, oranges, apples, and soybeans were partially offset by lower prices for wheat, hay, onions, broilers, and milk. The index was 10 points (8.3 percent) above a year ago.

June cotton prices were up sharply from a month earlier and were the highest since May 1984. The strong upward movement of June hog prices continued the trend of recent months, placing the average hog price at the highest level since August 1986. Average calf prices were up 80 cents from May, but beef cattle prices remained unchanged. The calf and cattle prices were at their highest levels since March and September of 1980, respectively. Decreases in prices of rice and wheat caused a 9 point drop in the food grain index. Most fruit prices were up from the previous month.

PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for June increased 2 points (1.6 percent) from the previous month to 131 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 10 points (8.3 percent).

ALL CROPS: The June index was 112, up 3 points (2.8 percent) from both last month and June 1986.

ALL FRUIT: The all fruit index, at 199, was up 29 points (17 percent) from last month and 27 points (16 percent) from last year. Most fruit prices were up from last month. Apples and oranges were the major contributors to the sharp jump in the index.

COTTON: At 119, the cotton index was up 12 points (11 percent) from last month and 22 points (23 percent) from June 1986. The June cotton price increased 7.4 cents from May to 72.2 cents per pound.

FOOD GRAINS: The June index was 96, down 9 points (8.6 percent) from the previous month and 2 points (2.0 percent) below a year earlier. Wheat averaged \$2.44 per bushel, down 22 cents from May, while rice was 8 cents lower at \$3.66 per cwt.

OIL BEARING CROPS: At 81, the index was 3 points (3.8 percent) above both the previous month and June 1986. Soybeans, at \$5.45 per bushel, were up 25 cents from May. Flaxseed brought \$3.41 per bushel, up 7 cents from the previous month.

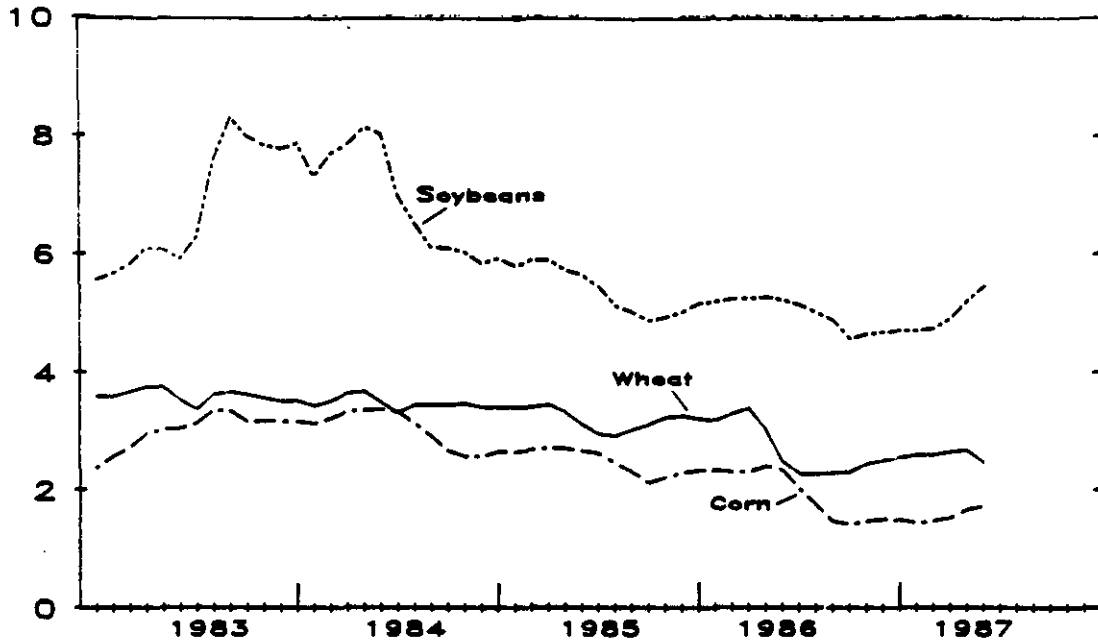
LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The June index was 150, up 2 points (1.4 percent) from last month and 16 points (12 percent) from a year ago.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 173, the index was up 4 points (2.4 percent) from May. Hog prices averaged \$59.70 per cwt in June, an increase of \$5.30 per cwt from May and the highest price since August 1986. Calf prices increased \$.80 per cwt to \$78.10, the highest since March 1980. The all beef cattle price in June, at \$63.00 per cwt, was unchanged from May. Prices for the past two months were at the highest level since September 1980.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and eggs index, at 104, was down 3 points (2.8 percent) from May and 17 points (14 percent) below June last year. Broiler prices averaged 27.6 cents per pound, down 2.4 cents from May. Turkey prices decreased a half cent per pound to 34.5 cents in June. Market egg prices averaged 41.2 cents per dozen for June, up 1.1 cents from May.

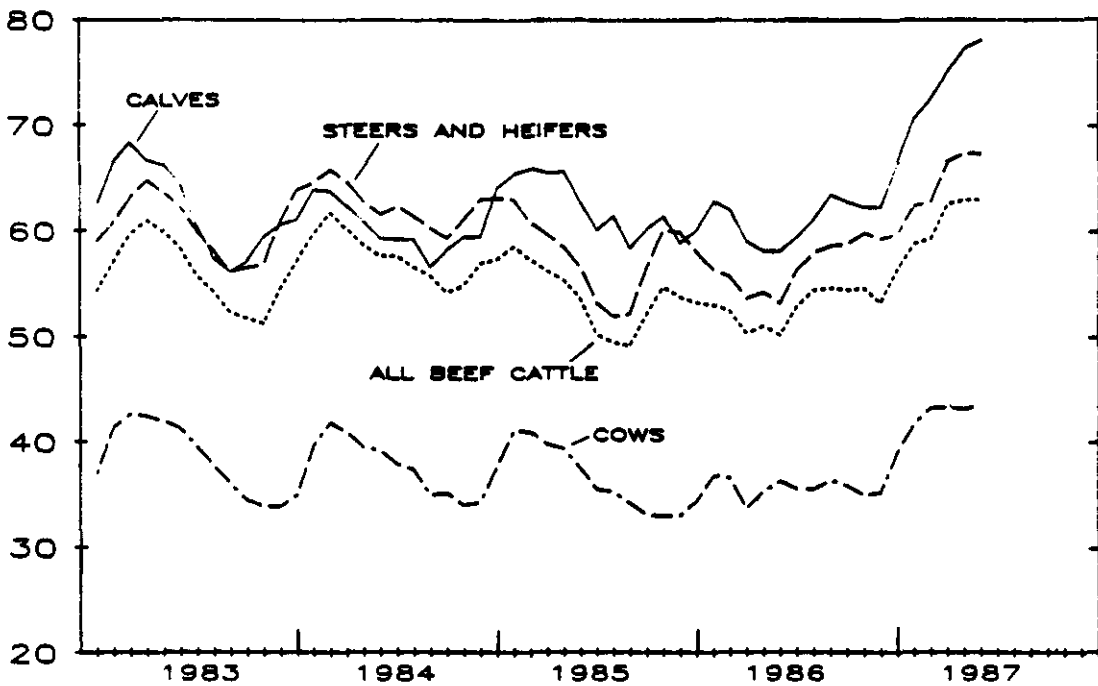
Prices Received by Farmers, US

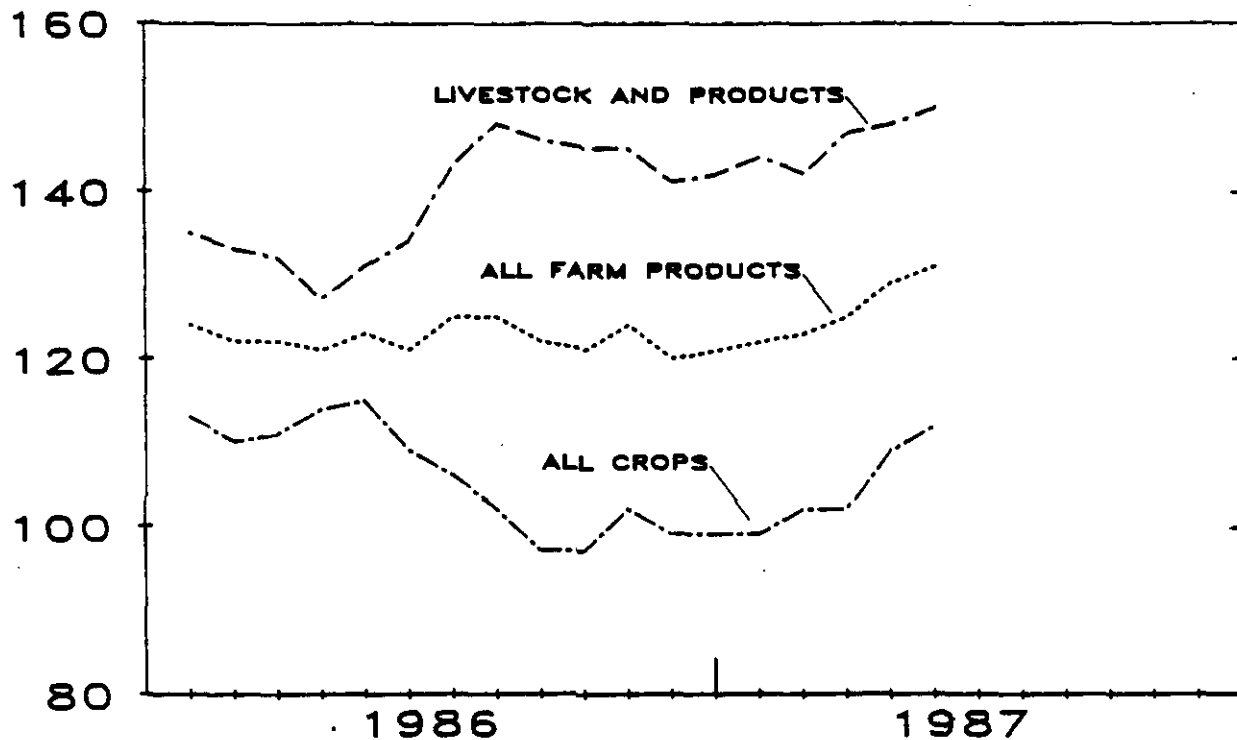

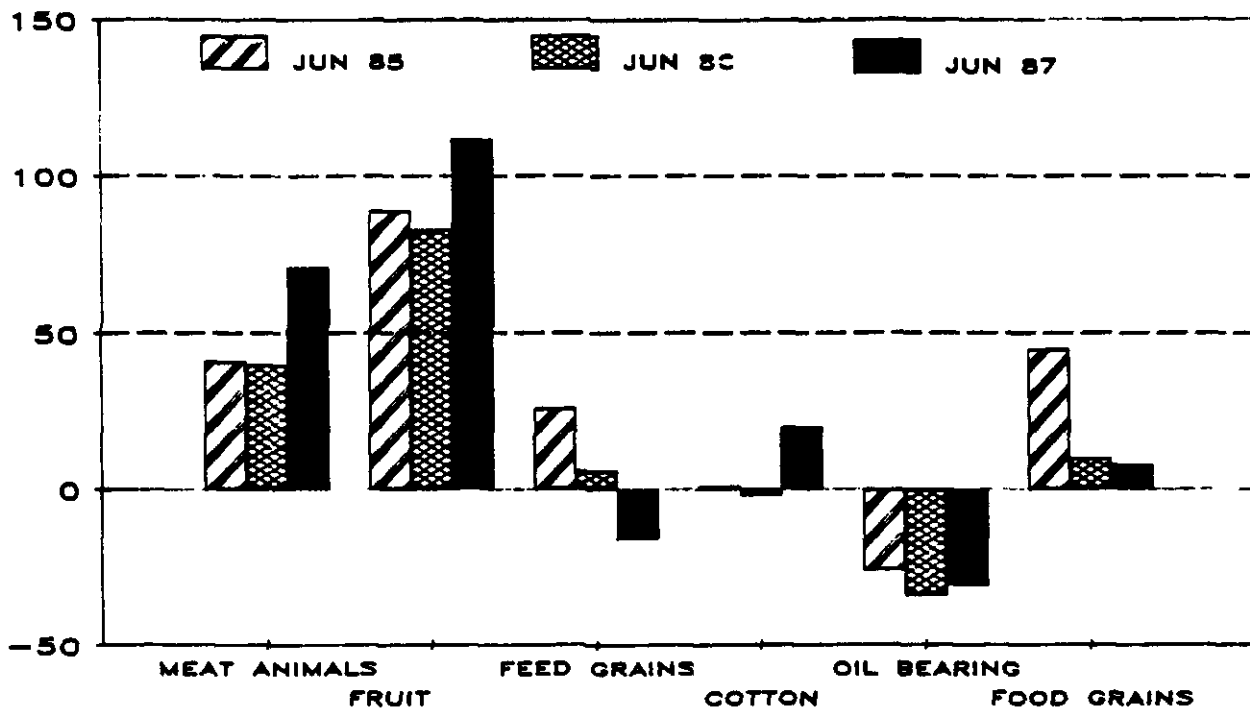

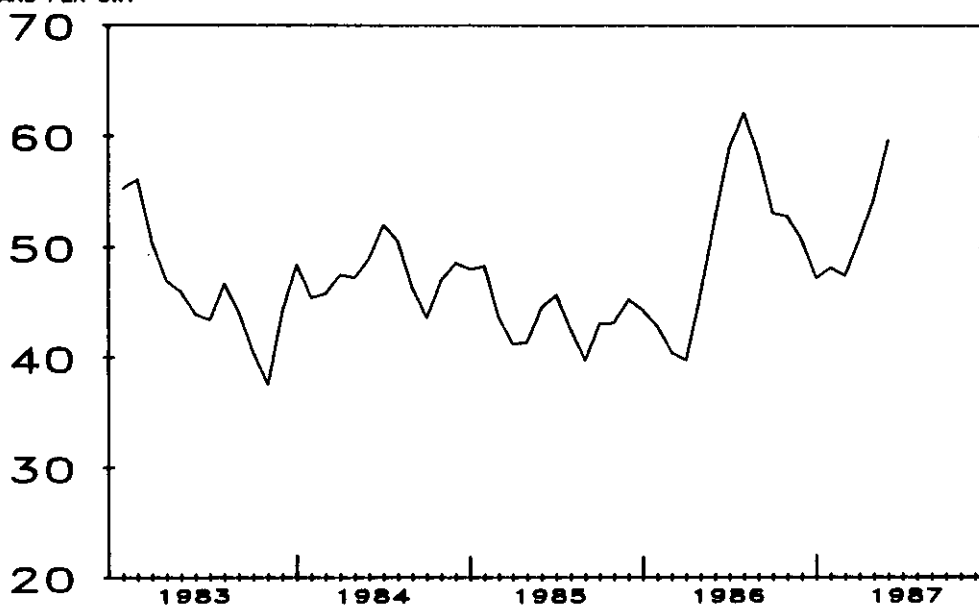
