PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 3 POINTS

The August All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (2.3 percent) from July to 125 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Lower prices for cotton, apples, potatoes, corn, and soybeans were partially offset by higher prices for broilers, cattle, and milk. The August index was the same as a year earlier.

The decrease in the average price of cotton was due mainly to a shift in cotton marketings from the normally higher priced western areas to the southwestern areas where the new crop harvest has begun. Most feed grain and oilseed prices dropped from a month earlier while rice and all wheat continued unchanged. Calf prices increased to \$81.60 per cwt, the highest since March 1980. The beef cattle price increased from July while average hog prices were lower.

PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for August decreased 3 points (2.3 percent) from the previous month to 125 percent of its 1977 average. The August index was the same as a year earlier.

ALL CROPS: The August index was 98, down 8 points (7.5 percent) from last month and 4 points (3.9 percent) from a year ago.

COTTON: At 98, the cotton index was down 20 points (17 percent) from last month but up 21 points (27 percent) from August 1986.

ALL FRUIT: The all fruit index, at 147, was down 20 points (12 percent) from last month and 41 points (22 percent) from last year. The largest contributor by far to the index decrease was apples followed by oranges. The increase in the average lemon price was partially offsetting.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 81, the index was 5 points (5.8 percent) below the previous month and 6 points (6.9 percent) below a year earlier. Corn was \$1.47 per bushel, down 13 cents from July and barley averaged 19 cents lower at \$1.65 per bushel. Sorghum grain declined 12 cents to \$2.56 per cwt. Oats were 7 cents higher than July, averaging \$1.36 per bushel. Hay brought \$61.80 per ton, up 20 cents.

POTATOES AND DRY BEANS: The August index, at 132, decreased 30 points (19 percent) from July and was 6 points (4.3 percent) below August 1986. Potato prices fell from \$6.89 per cwt in July to \$5.38 in August. The dry bean price for August was \$17.70 per cwt, a 10 cent increase from July.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index for August was 75, down 4 points (5.1 percent) from July and 3 points (3.8 percent) less than August 1986. Soybeans were 30 cents lower than a month earlier at \$4.95 per bushel. Flaxseed was \$3.20 per bushel, down 27 cents.

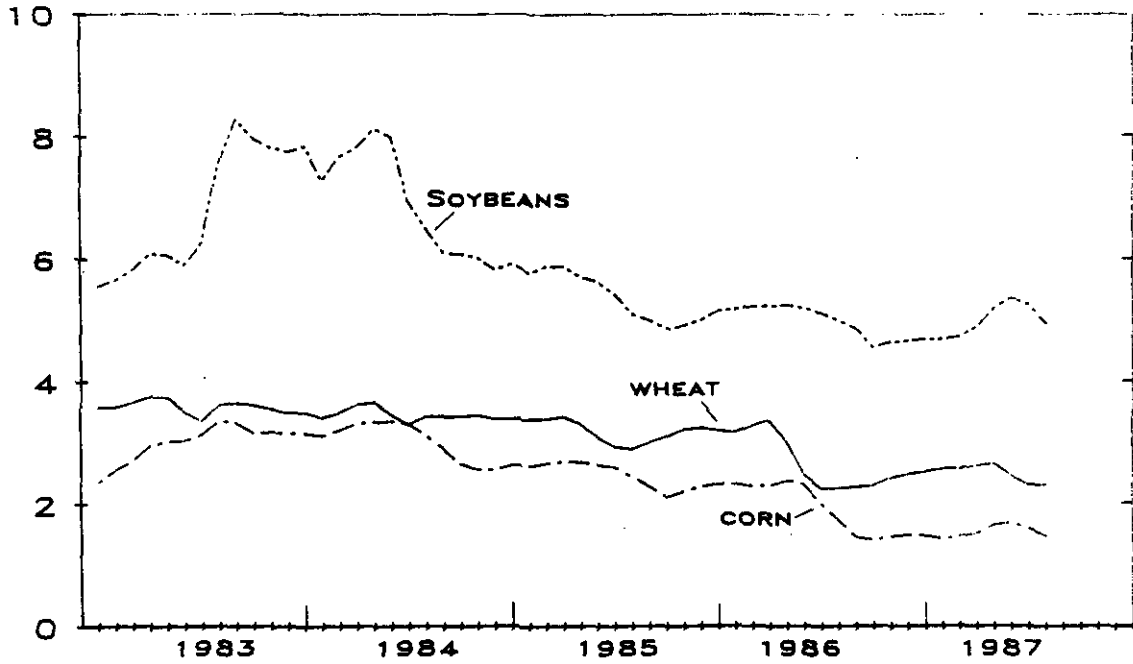
VEGETABLES: The commercial vegetable index was 127 -- down 7 points (5.2 percent) from July and up 5 points (4.1 percent) from last year. Lower prices for onions and tomatoes were slightly offset by higher prices for lettuce.

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The August index was 150, up 1 point (0.7 percent) from last month and 2 points (1.4 percent) from a year ago.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and eggs index, at 110, was up 5 points (4.8 percent) from July but 38 points (26 percent) below August last year. Broiler prices averaged 31.6 cents per pound, up 3.5 cents from July. Turkey prices decreased 1.7 cents per pound to 31.4 cents in August. Market eggs averaged 40.9 cents per dozen for August, down 0.9 cent from July.

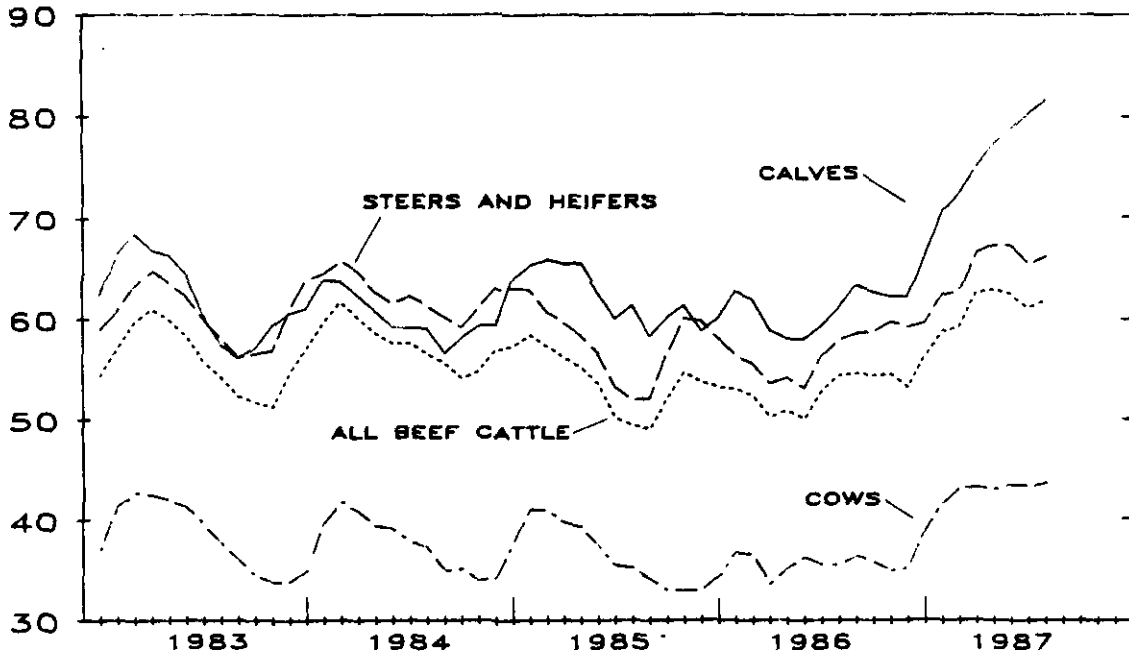
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

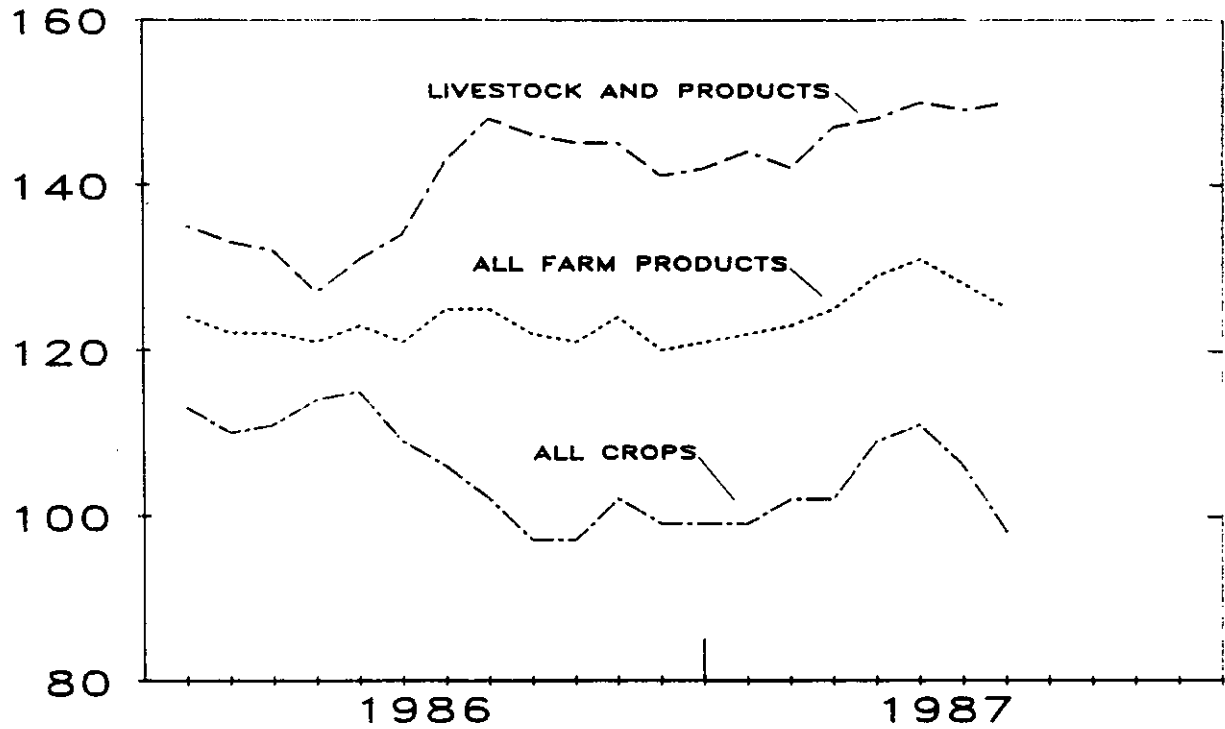

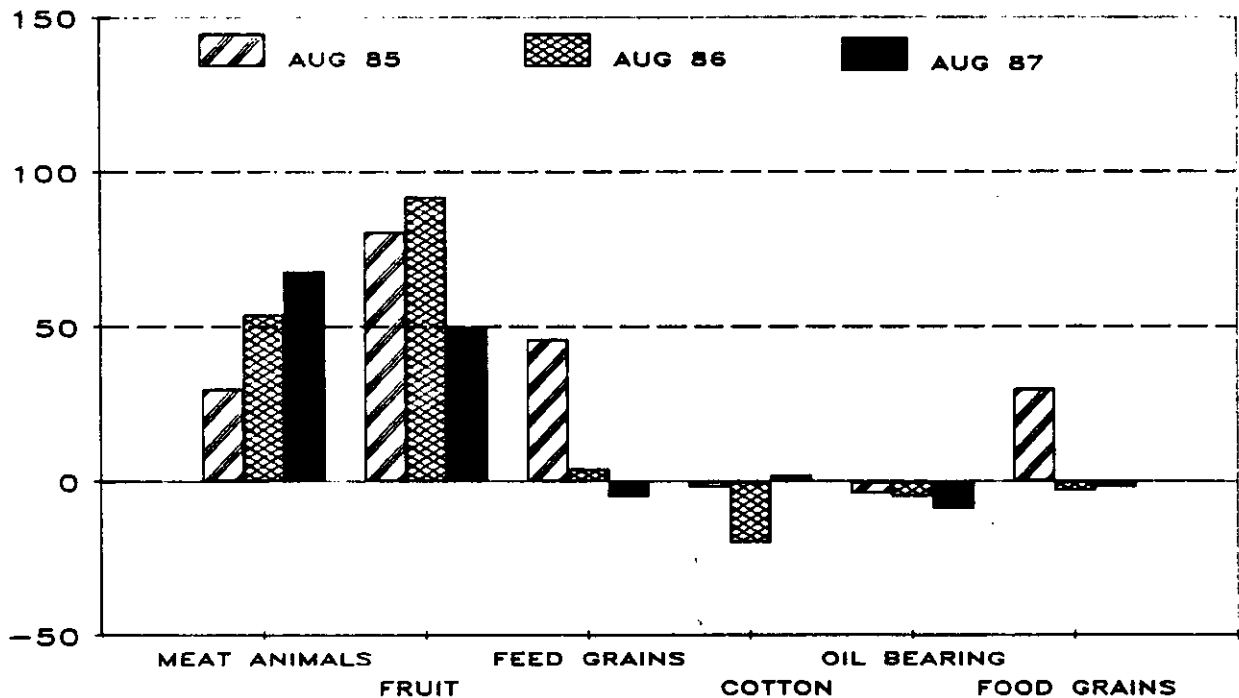
