PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 3 POINTS

The June All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers decreased 3 points (2.0 percent) from May to 146 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Decreases in the prices of tomatoes, cattle, wheat, and corn were partially offset by higher prices for lettuce, hogs, lemons, and strawberries. The index was 7 points (5.0 percent) above a year ago.

The June hog price was at the highest level since August last year. Most of the increase over last month was caused by strong barrow and gilt prices. Cattle and calf prices were mixed. All feed grain and oil seed prices decreased from May. Wheat prices were down while the rice price increased slightly. Lower broiler prices more than offset slight increases for eggs and turkeys.

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PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for June decreased 3 points (2.0 percent) from the previous month to 146 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 7 points (5.0 percent).

ALL CROPS: The June all crops index was 137, down 2.8 percent from last month but 6.2 percent above a year earlier.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 130, the feed grains and hay index was down 5.8 percent from the previous month, but 2.4 percent above a year earlier. Corn at \$2.46 per bushel was 12 cents lower than in May. Barley averaged \$2.22 per bushel, down 41 cents, and oats was down 30 cents to \$1.84 per bushel. Sorghum grain was \$3.98 per cwt, down 4 cents from a month earlier. Hay declined \$9.20 to \$94.80 per ton.

FOOD GRAINS: The food grains index was 152, 5.0 percent lower than May, but 9.4 percent higher than June 1988. Wheat averaged \$3.78 per bushel, down 23 cents from May. Rice was up 9 cents to \$6.85 per cwt.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The index, at 106, was 2.8 percent lower than the previous month and 12 percent lower than June 1988. Soybeans at mid-June were \$7.00 per bushel, 21 cents lower than May while flaxseed was down \$1.55 at \$6.01 per bushel.

ALL FRUIT: At 197, the all fruit index was down 2.0 percent from last month, but 4.8 percent above a year ago. The decrease from last month was due to lower prices for apples, peaches, and oranges. Prices of other fruit in the index were up from May.

POTATOES AND DRY BEANS: The index decreased 4.5 percent from May to 213 percent of the 1977 base, but was 85 percent above June last year. Potatoes averaged \$8.44 per cwt, down 50 cents from a month ago. Dry beans were up 80 cents to \$32.80 per cwt.

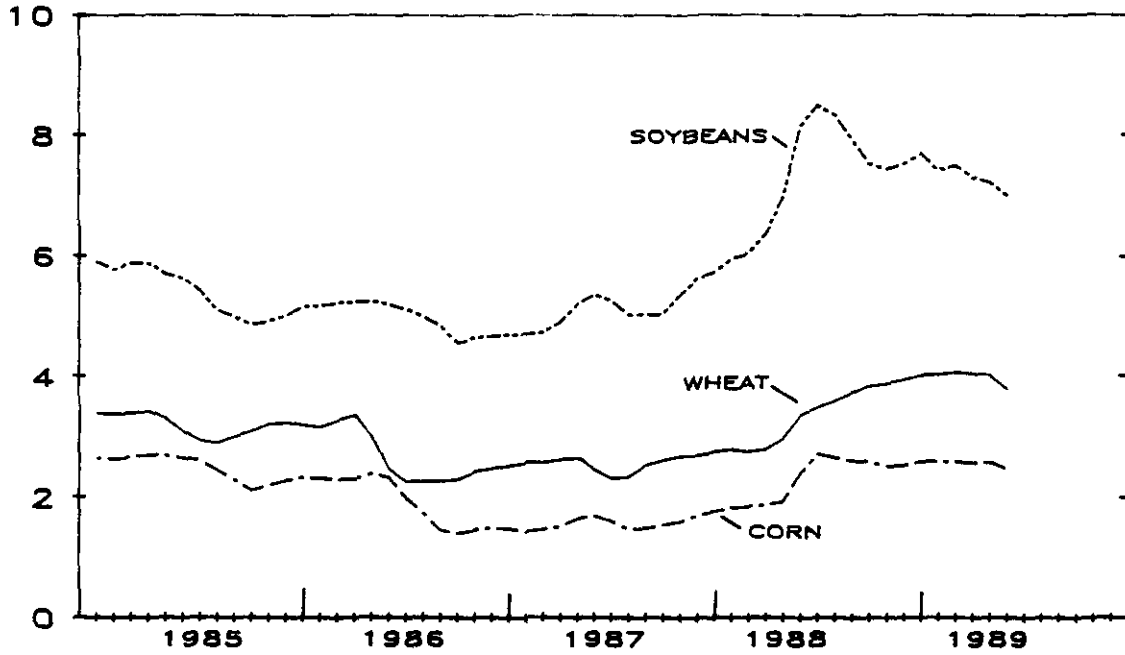
LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY: The June index, at 155, was down 0.6 percent from May but 5.4 percent above June a year ago. Lower prices for cattle and broilers more than offset higher prices for hogs and eggs.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The poultry and eggs index was 144, down 2.0 percent from May but 24 percent above June last year. Broiler prices averaged 42.6 cents per pound in June, down 2.6 cents from last month. Market egg prices averaged 55.6 cents per dozen for June, an increase of 1.3 cents from May. Turkey prices increased 0.6 cents per pound to 44.0 cents.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 171, the June index was unchanged from May, but 1.8 percent above June last year. Barrow and gilt prices increased \$2.60 per cwt from May to \$45.20. Sow prices averaged \$33.00 per cwt in June, an increase of 30 cents from last month. All beef cattle prices averaged \$67.60 per cwt in June, down \$1.20 from May. Calf prices were up \$1.50 from last month to \$92.70 per cwt.

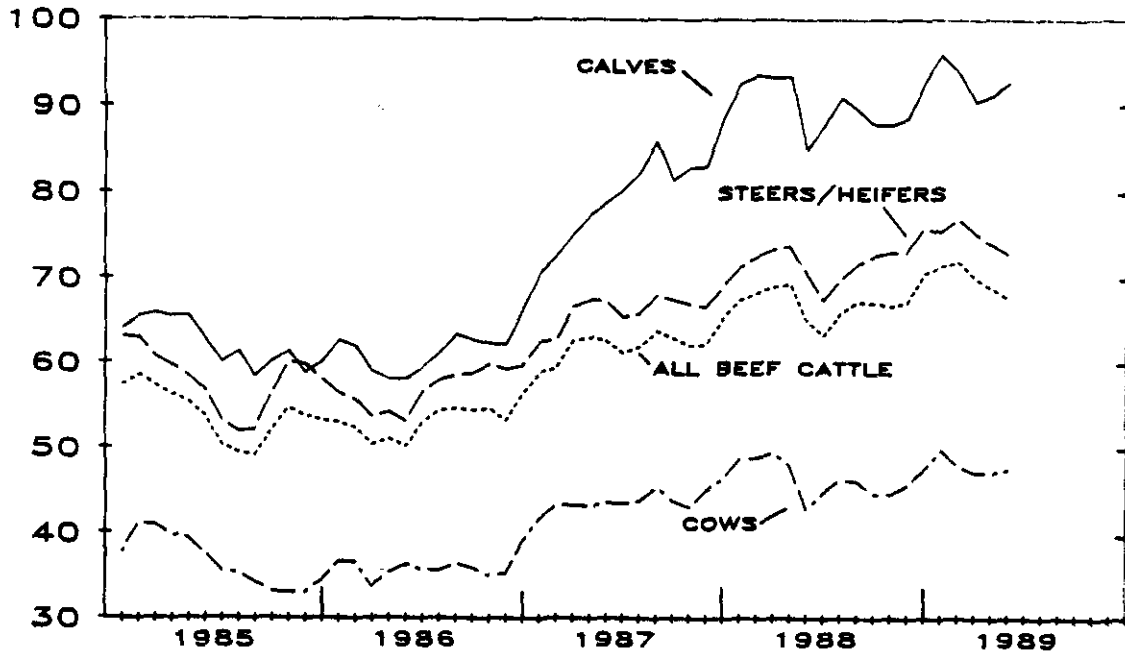
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

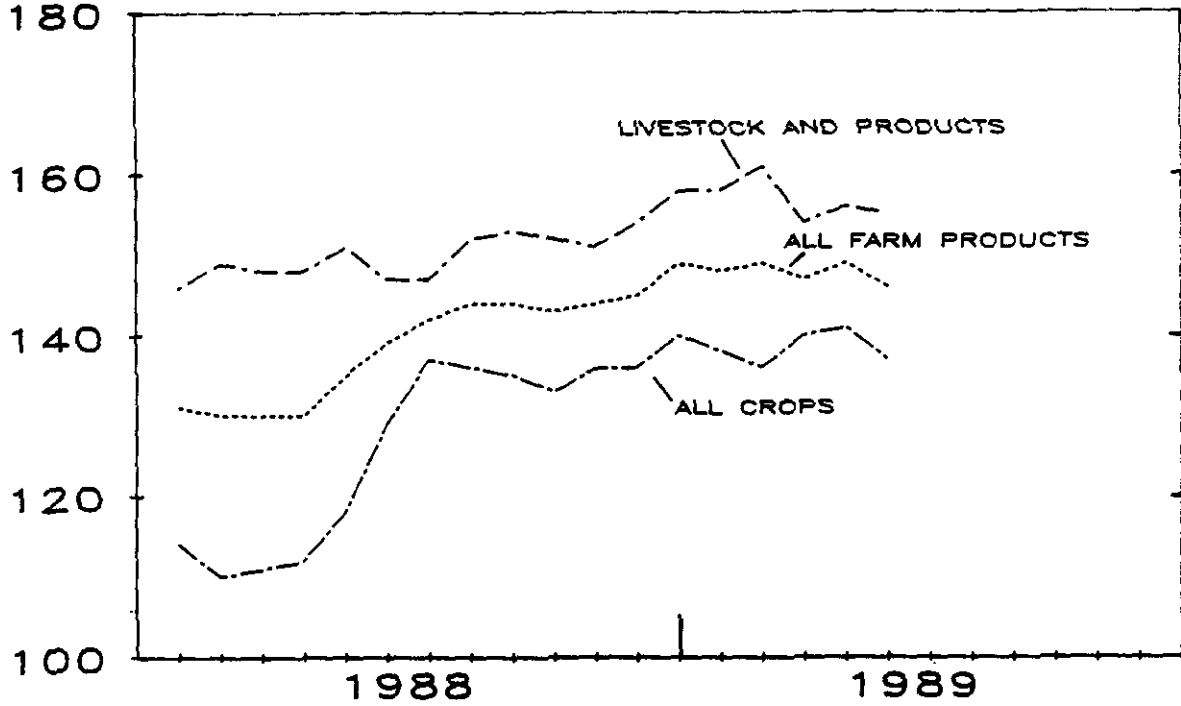

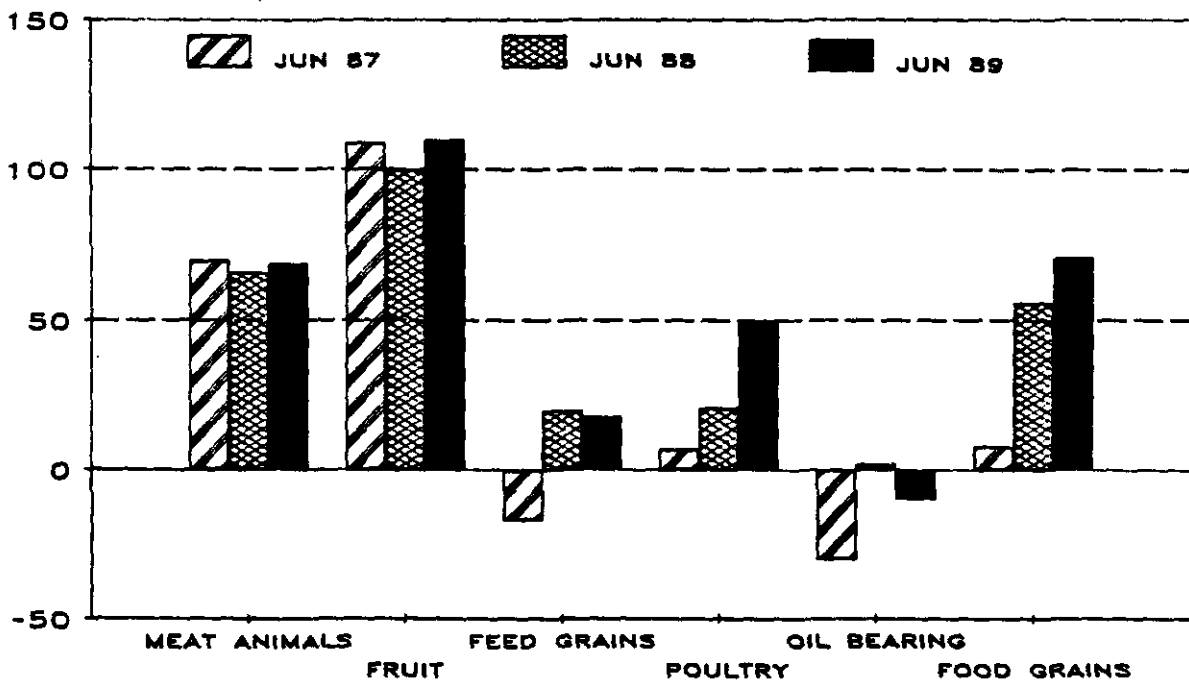

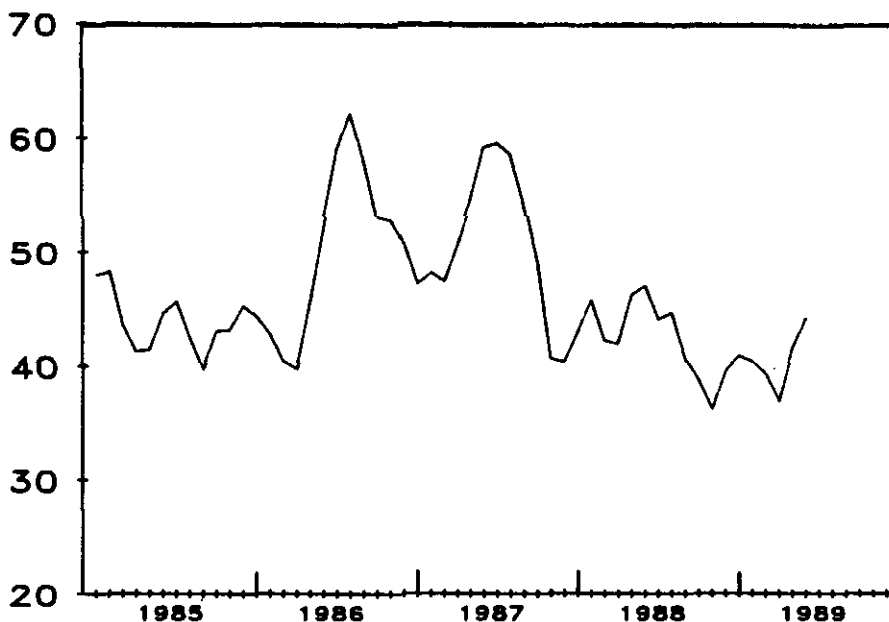
