Prices Received Index Up 2 Points

The November All Farm Products Index of Prices Received increased 2 points (1.4 percent) from October to 147 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Increases in the prices of strawberries, milk, eggs, and celery were partially offset by lower prices for hogs, grapefruit, apples, and lemons. The Index was 3 points (2.1 percent) above a year ago. Prices for milk, hogs, cattle, and eggs were the major contributors to the increase over a year earlier, but lower prices for soybeans, corn, and broilers were partially offsetting.

Feed grain prices, except oats, increased slightly from October. Wheat, rice and soybeans also showed small gains. Hogs prices decreased from October, steers and heifers were up, but prices for cows and calves were down.

PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for November increased 2 points (1.4 percent) from the previous month to 147 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 3 points (2.1 percent).

ALL CROPS: The November index was 129, up 0.8 percent from a month earlier but 5.1 percent below a year earlier.

POTATOES AND DRY BEANS: The index increased 13 percent from October to 160 percent of the 1977 base, and was up 3.9 percent from a year earlier. Potatoes prices in November averaged \$6.14 per cwt, up 84 cents from a month earlier, while dry bean prices advanced \$1.60 to \$27.60 per cwt.

COMMERCIAL VEGETABLES: The commercial vegetable index, at 149, was up 4.9 percent from last month and 1.4 percent higher than last November. The upward change in the index was due mainly to celery prices which more than doubled. Celery harvest is later than normal which is causing a short supply and, therefore, higher prices. The net effect was moderated somewhat by lower prices for onions, carrots, and lettuce.

OIL BEARING CROPS: At 88, the index for oil-bearing crops was 1.1 percent above October, but 21 percent below a year earlier. Soybeans were \$5.62 per bushel, up 7 cents from October. Peanuts declined 1.2 cents to 25.5 cents per pound, but cottonseed, at \$111.00 per ton, increased \$17.00 from the previous month.

LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY: The November index, at 163, was up 0.6 percent from October and 7.9 percent above November a year ago. Compared with October, higher prices for milk, eggs, cattle, and turkeys more than offset lower prices for hogs, broilers, and calves.

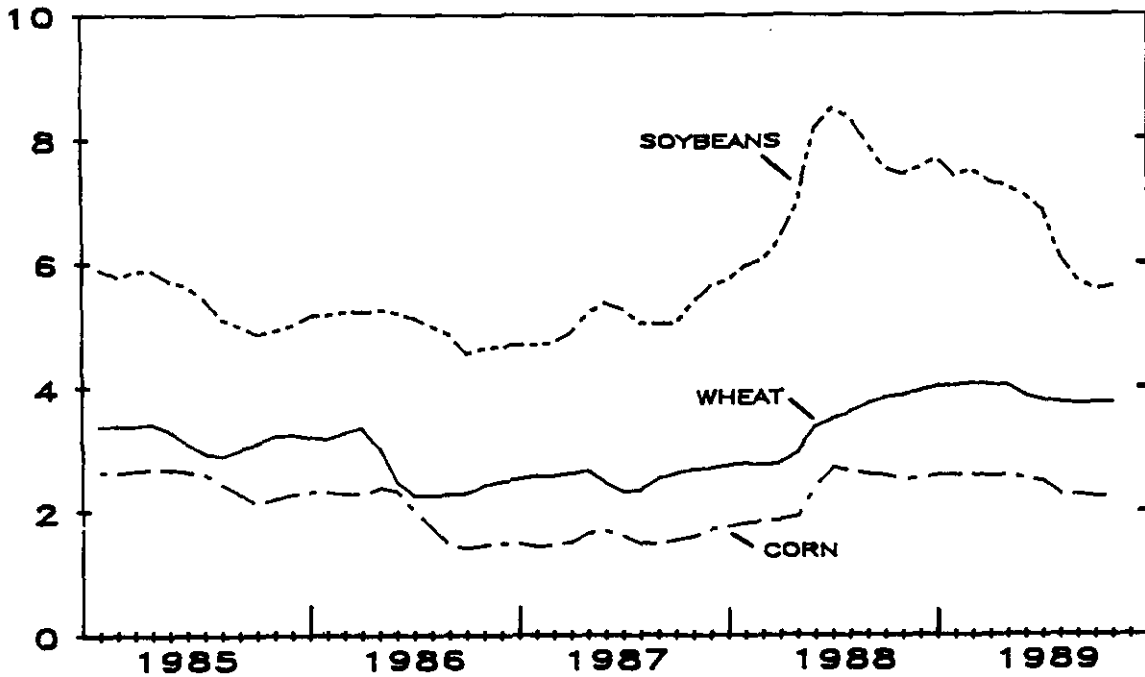
DAIRY PRODUCTS: The dairy products index was 157, up 4.0 percent from October and 14 percent above November a year ago. All milk sold to plants and dealers averaged \$15.20 per cwt in November, up 50 cents from last month and \$1.80 above November 1988.

POULTRY AND EGGS: At 134, the poultry and eggs index was 3.9 percent above both last month and November a year ago. Turkey prices increased 2.4 cents per pound in November to 40.9 cents. Broiler prices averaged 29.8 cents per pound, down 0.8 cents from October. Market egg prices averaged 72.8 cents per dozen for November, an increase of 8.6 cents from October.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 174, the November index was unchanged from October with lower hog and calf prices offsetting higher prices for cattle. The November index was 6.7 percent above the same month last year. Barrow and gilt prices decreased \$2.30 per cwt from October to \$45.00 while sows decreased \$3.60 per cwt. November beef cattle prices averaged \$69.40 per cwt up 70 cents from October, while calf prices decreased 80 cents to \$87.30 per cwt.

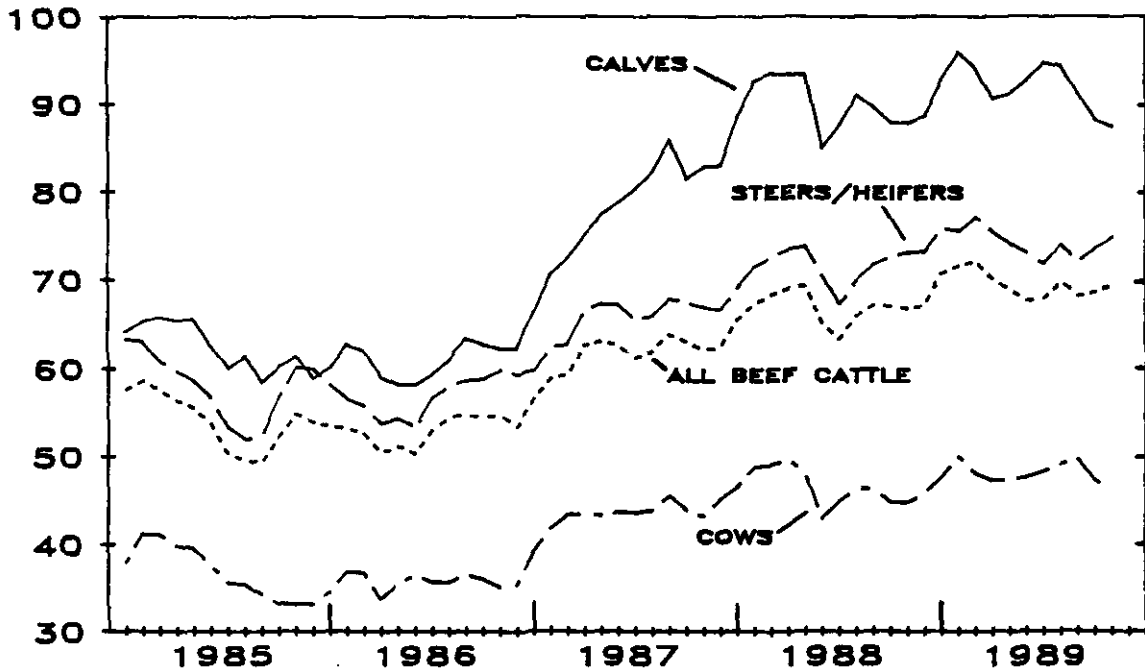
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

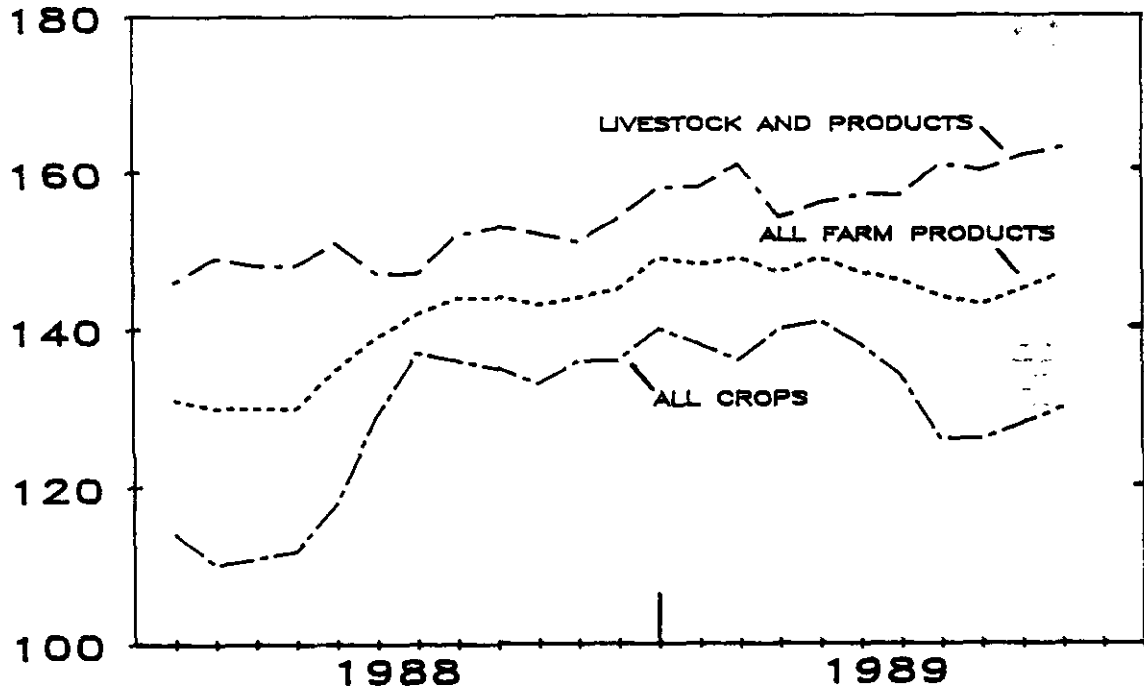

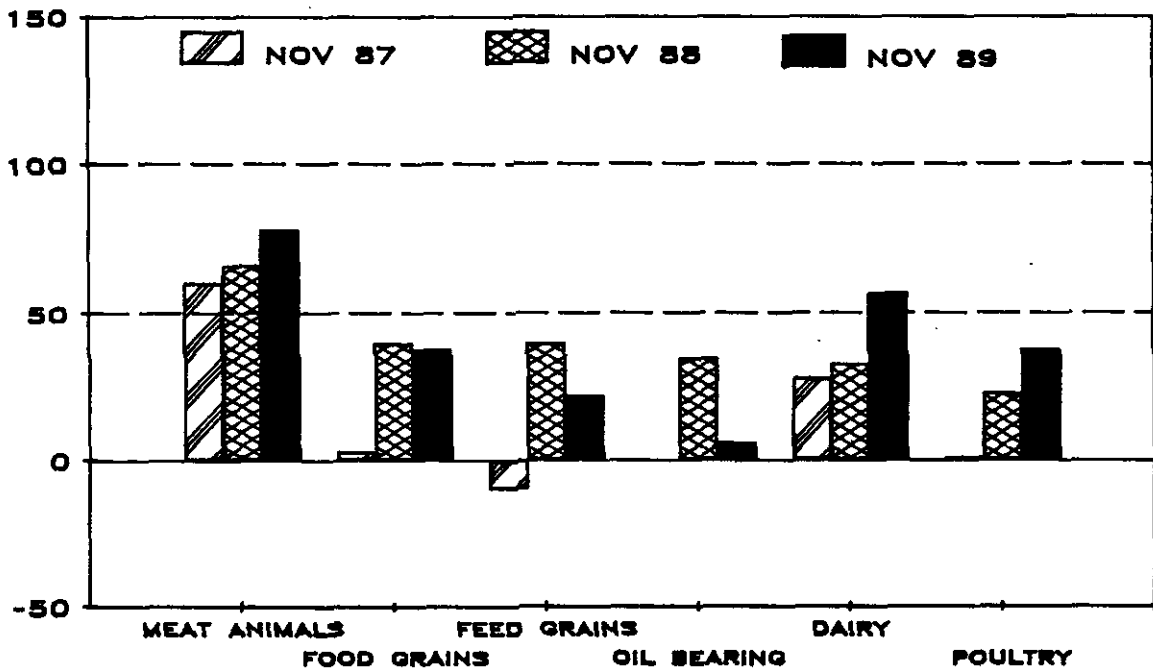

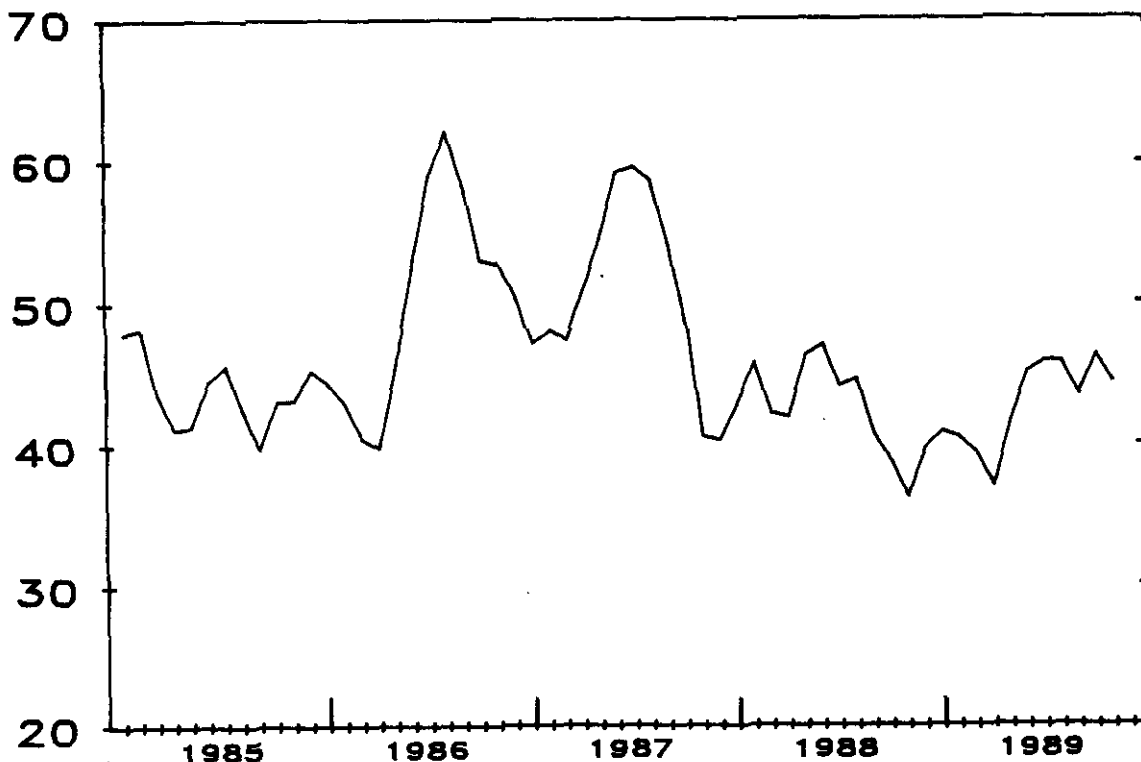
