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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 2 POINTS

The June All Farm Products Index of Prices Received decreased 2 points (1.3 percent) from May to 152 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Decreases in the prices of oranges, wheat, hay, and soybeans were partially offset by higher prices for tomatoes, corn, eggs, and grapefruit.

Cattle, calf, hog, and lamb prices were lower than a month earlier but eggs and milk were higher. Wheat, oilseeds, and barley were lower while corn and sorghum increased in price from May.

The Index was 4 points (2.7 percent) above a year ago. Higher hog, cattle, milk, and grapefruit prices were the major contributors to the increase over 1989. Soybeans, wheat, oranges, and broilers were lower.

Prices Received

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for June decreased 2 points (1.3 percent) from the previous month to 152 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was up 4 points (2.7 percent).

ALL CROPS: The June index was 130, down 3.0 percent from May and 5.8 percent below a year earlier.

FOOD GRAINS: At 130, the food grains index declined 6.5 percent from May and was down 16 percent from a year earlier. Wheat averaged \$3.15 per bushel, down 25 cents from the previous month. Rice was 18 cents lower at \$7.03 per cwt.

ALL FRUIT: At 194, the all fruit index was down 4.9 percent from last month and 4.0 percent below a year ago. The largest contributor to the monthly decrease in the index was oranges which was partially offset by higher prices for grapefruit and strawberries.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: The June index was 92, down 3.2 percent from the previous month and 15 percent below June 1989. Soybeans, at \$5.75 per bushel, decreased 21 cents from the previous month. Flaxseed, at \$8.20, was down 3 cents per bushel from May.

COTTON: At 103, the cotton index was down 4.6 percent from last month but up 8.4 percent from last June. Cotton was 62.4 cents per pound compared with 65.4 cents in May and 57.2 cents last June. Lower U.S. prices can probably be attributed to relatively small sales in Arizona and California for the first half of June.

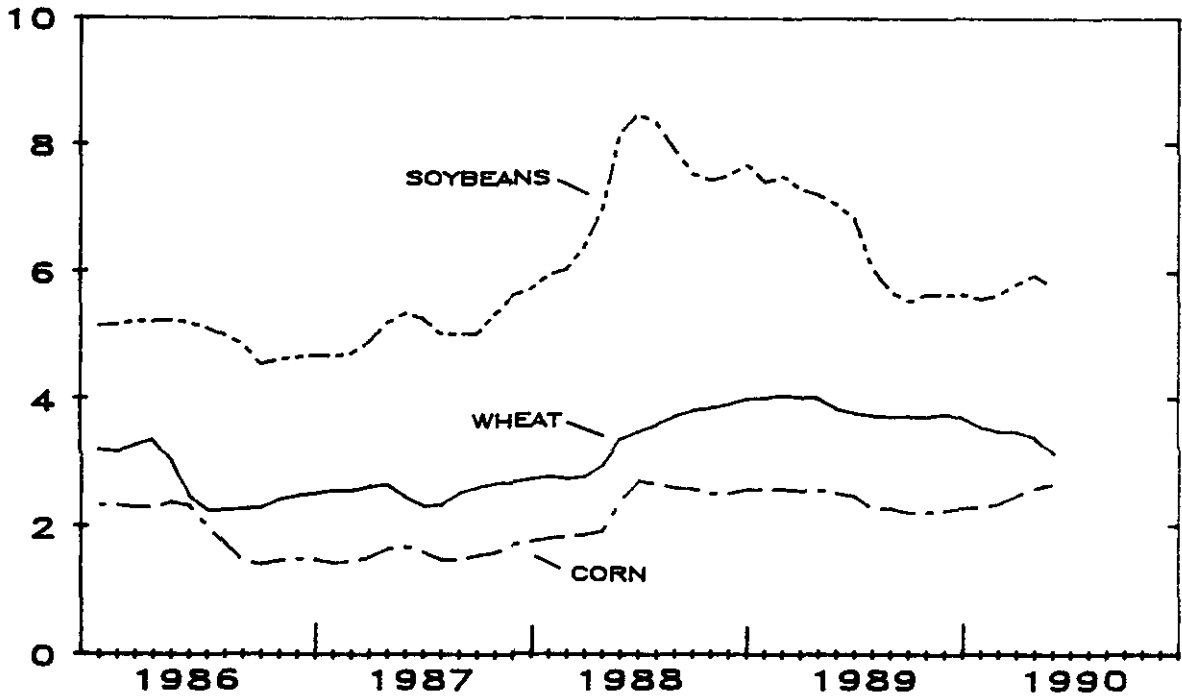
FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 134, the index for feed grains and hay was 1.5 percent lower than May, but 2.3 percent above the June 1989 level. Hay brought \$87.80 per ton in June, down \$13.20 from May. Barley, at \$2.22 per bushel, and oats, at \$1.37 per bushel, were down 16 cents and 9 cents, respectively, from the previous month. Corn increased 7 cents per bushel to \$2.69 while sorghum grain was up 15 cents at \$4.19 per cwt.

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The June index, at 172, was down 0.6 percent from May but was up 9.6 percent from June 1989. Compared with May, lower prices for hogs, cattle, calves, and broilers more than offset higher prices for milk and eggs.

MEAT ANIMALS: The June index was 197, down 1.0 percent from May but was up 15 percent from a year earlier. Hog prices averaged \$60.20 per cwt in June, down \$1.00 from May but were \$15.10 above last year. Barrows and gilts averaged \$61.10 per cwt in June while sows averaged \$51.00 per cwt. Beef cattle for June, at \$74.20 per cwt, declined 20 cents from May but were \$6.60 above the previous year. Steers and heifers declined 20 cents to \$78.10 per cwt while cow prices advanced 30 cents to \$53.80 per cwt.

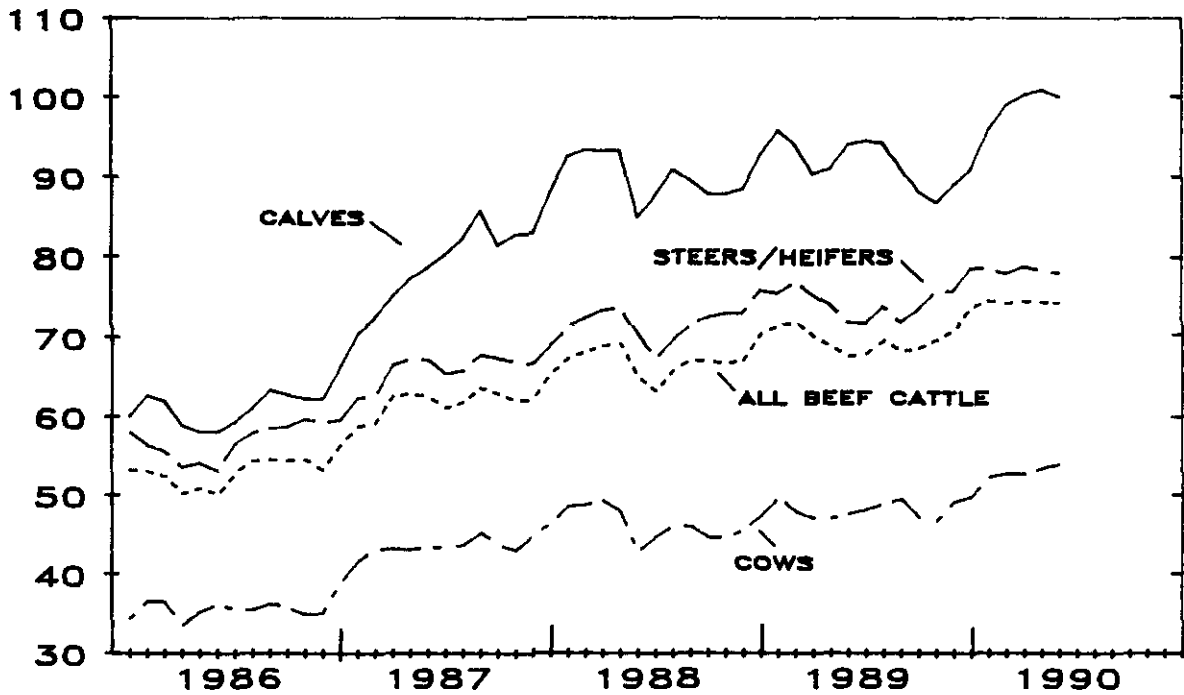
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

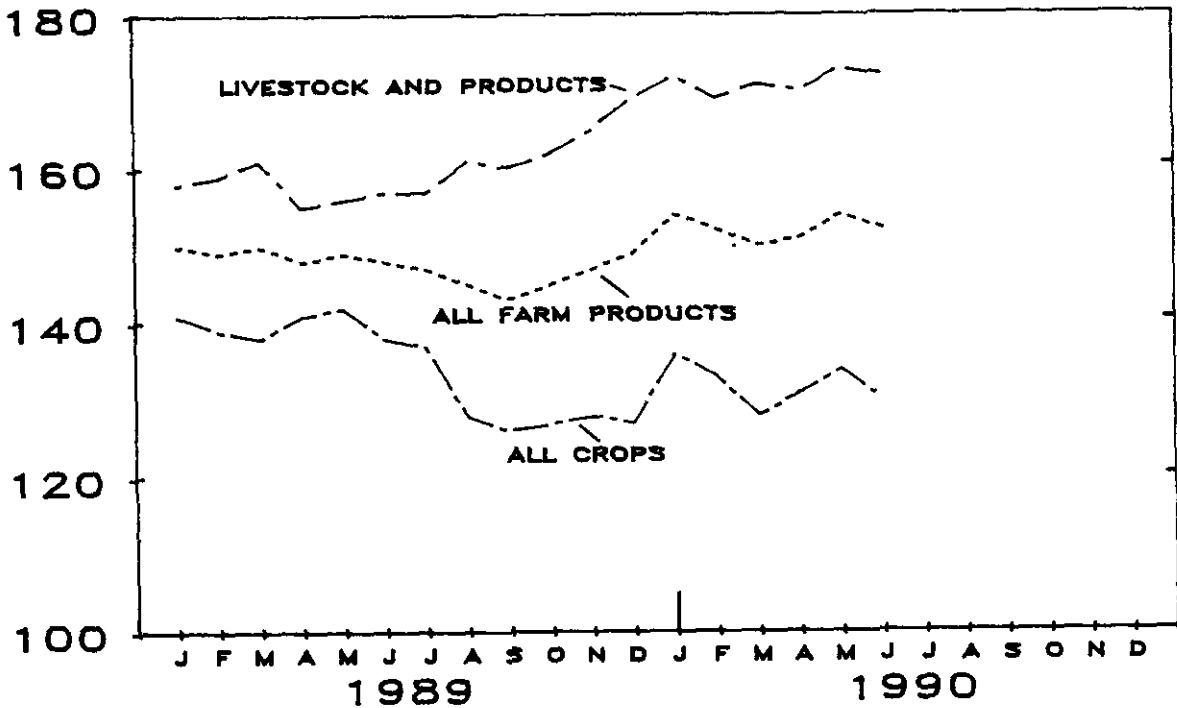

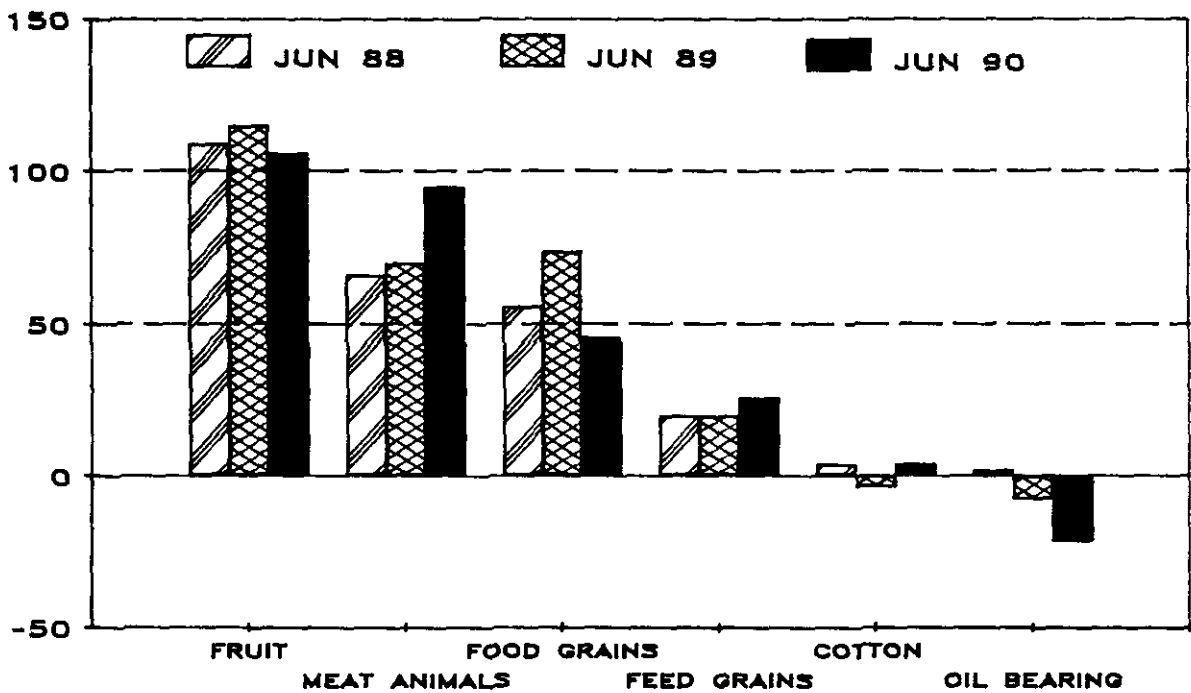
