PRICES RECEIVED INDEX DOWN 1 POINT

The November All Farm Products Index of Prices Received decreased 1 point (0.7 percent) from October to 145 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Decreases in the prices of hogs, milk, soybeans, and corn were partially offset by higher prices for oranges, lettuce, and strawberries.

Steer and heifer prices were at an all time record high, up 1 percent from the previous record of \$80.20 a month earlier. Peanut prices were at the highest level since January 1981. Hog prices moved up in October but dropped off sharply in November. Wool was at the lowest price level since January of 1986. Milk moved to the lowest level since July of 1989. The November soybean price was at the lowest level since November of 1987 while the all wheat price was the lowest since August of 1987. The corn price continued a downward trend which began in July.

The All Farm Products Index was 2 points (1.4 percent) below a year ago. Lower milk, wheat, and corn prices were the major contributors to the decline from November 1989. Higher prices for cattle, lettuce, and hogs were partially offsetting.

PRICES RECEIVED

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for November decreased 1 point (0.7 percent) from the previous month to 145 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 2 points (1.4 percent).

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The November index, at 166, was down 2.9 percent from October but 0.6 percent above November a year earlier. Compared with the previous month, the meat animals, dairy products, and poultry and egg groups were all down.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 191, the November index was down 2.6 percent from the previous month but was 9.1 percent above November 1989. Hog prices averaged \$49.70 per cwt. in November, down \$7.10 from October but up \$4.70 from last year. Average beef cattle prices increased 20 cents in November to \$75.70 per cwt. This was \$5.90 above the average price a year ago.

DAIRY PRODUCTS: The November index was 132, down 2.9 percent from October and 18.0 percent below November 1989. Milk prices average \$12.80 per cwt. in November, down 40 cents from October and \$2.80 below a year earlier.

ALL CROPS: The November index was 123, up 1.7 percent from a month earlier, but 3.9 percent below a year earlier. Most fruit, most commercial vegetables, potatoes, cotton, peanuts, rice, and dry beans were up while wheat, feed grains, hay, and oilseed crops were down from last month.

ALL FRUIT: At 209, the November all fruit index was up 12 percent from last month and unchanged from a year ago. The largest contributors to the increase in the index from last month were oranges and strawberries, which were offset somewhat by lower prices for lemons and grapefruit.

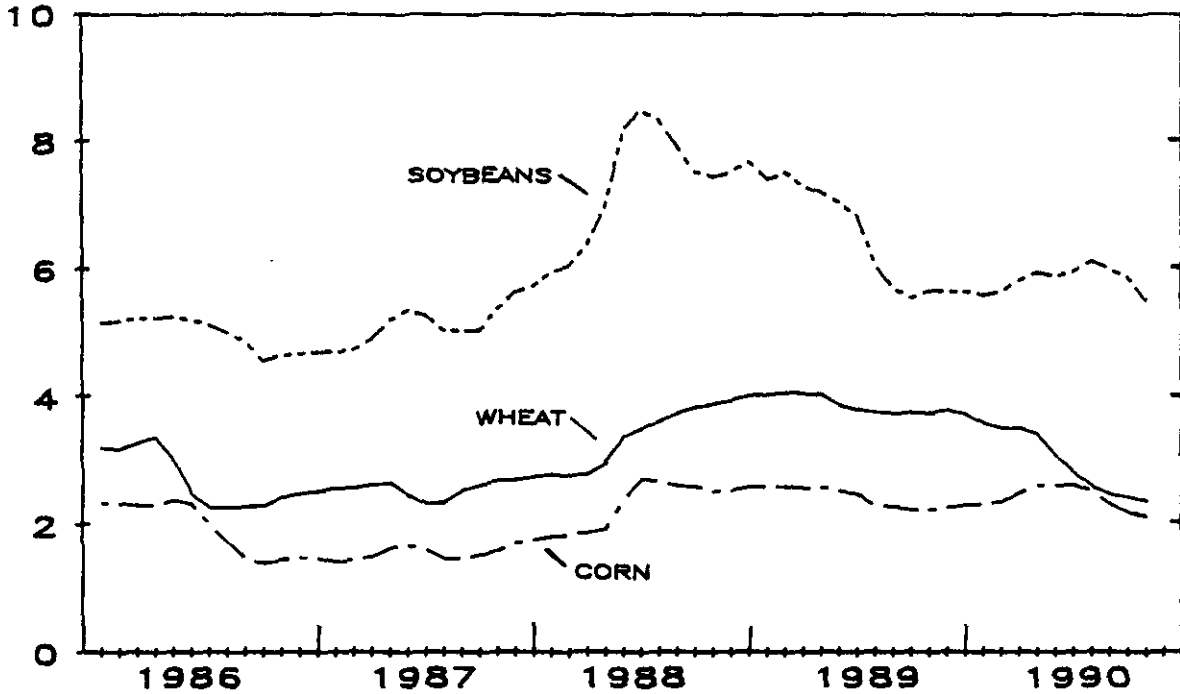
COMMERCIAL VEGETABLES: The November commercial vegetable index, at 177, was up 13 percent from last month and up 32 percent from last year. Prices for lettuce, sweetcorn, carrots, and celery were up from October while prices for tomatoes and onions were down.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: The November feed grains and hay index, at 111, was down 2.6 percent from the previous month and 5.9 percent below a year earlier. Corn, at \$2.10 per bushel, was down 9 cents per bushel from October. Barley averaged \$2.11 per bushel, up 7 cents from the previous month. Sorghum grain increased 3 cents to \$3.58 per cwt. Oats were down 3 cents to \$1.11 per bushel. Hay was \$81.50 per ton in November, down \$4.50 from October.

OIL-BEARING CROPS: At 92, the November index was 2.1 percent lower than the previous month, but 3.4 percent higher than November 1989. Soybeans brought \$5.51 per bushel in November, down 36 cents from the previous month. Flaxseed was 21 cents lower at \$4.95 per bushel. Peanuts were up 4.5 cents from October to 38.5 cents per pound. Cottonseed, at \$126.00 per ton, was \$13.00 higher than October.

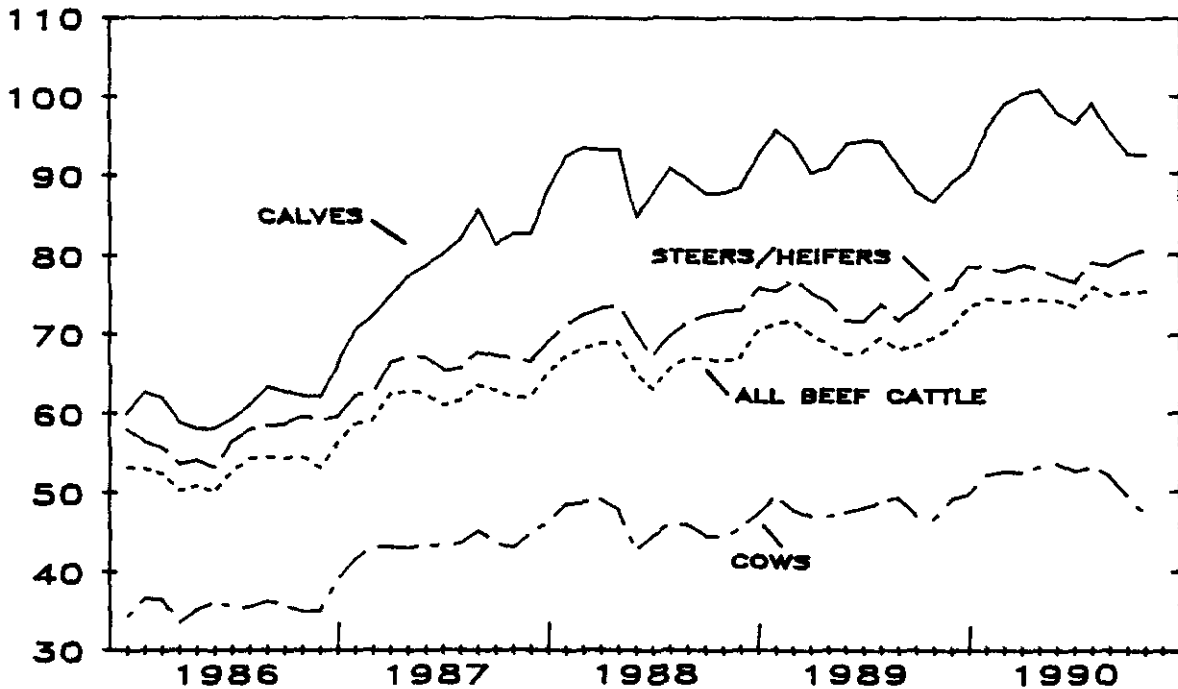
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

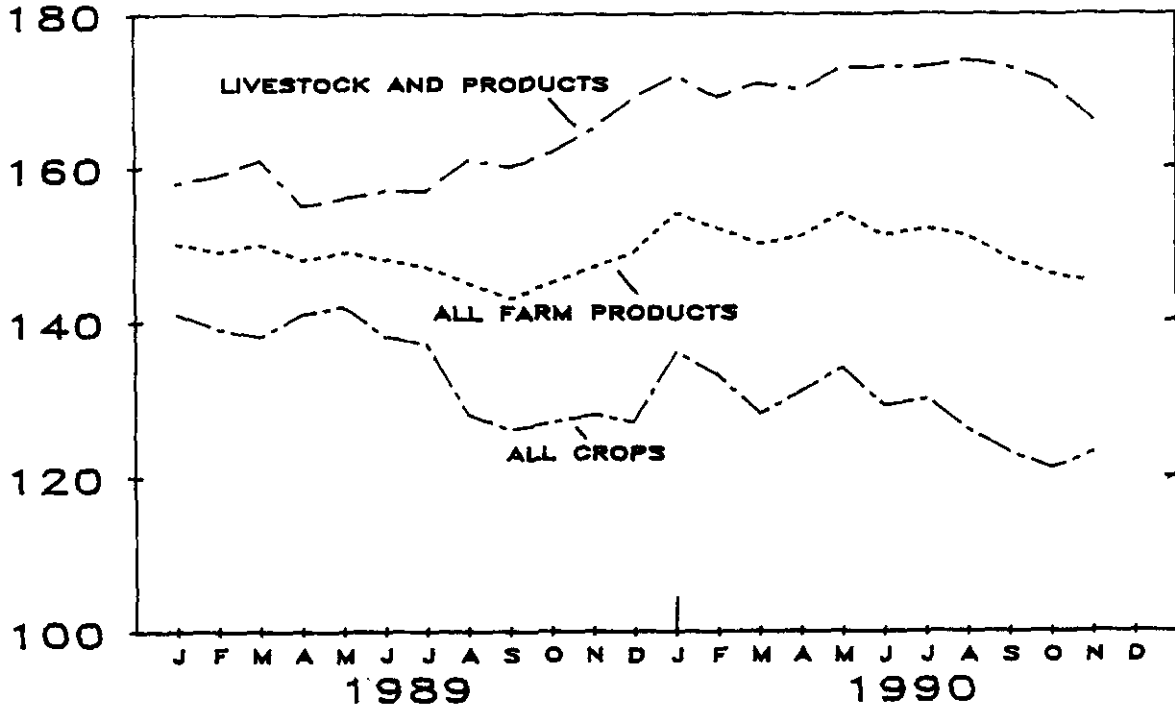

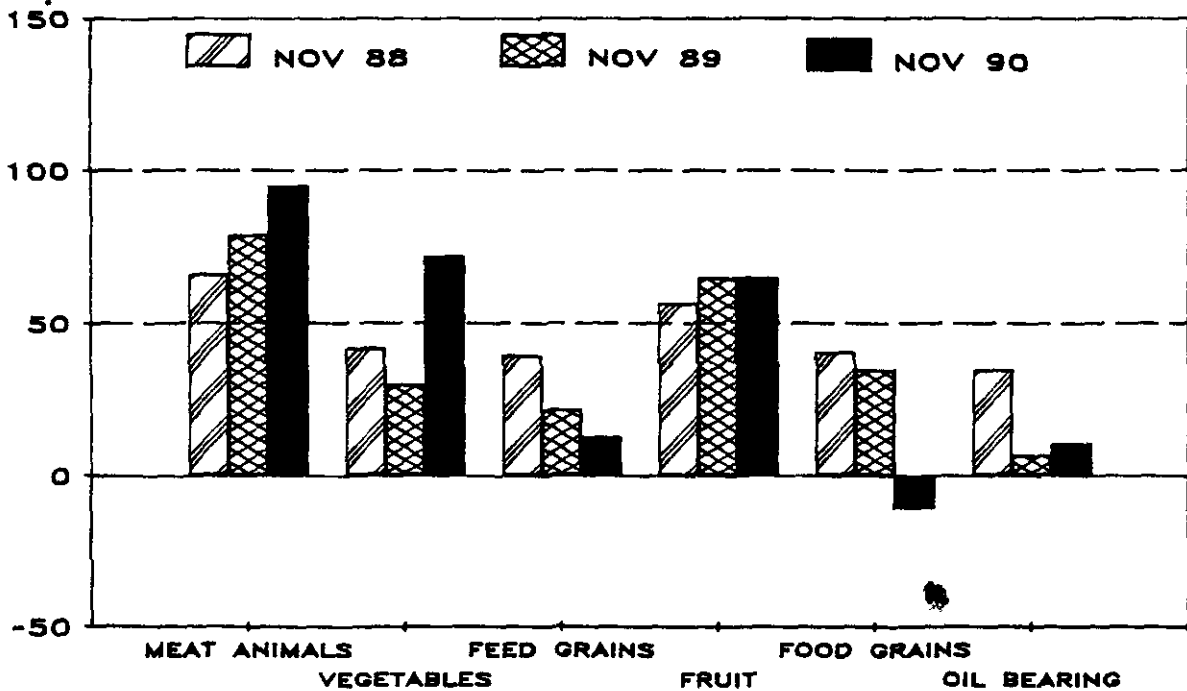

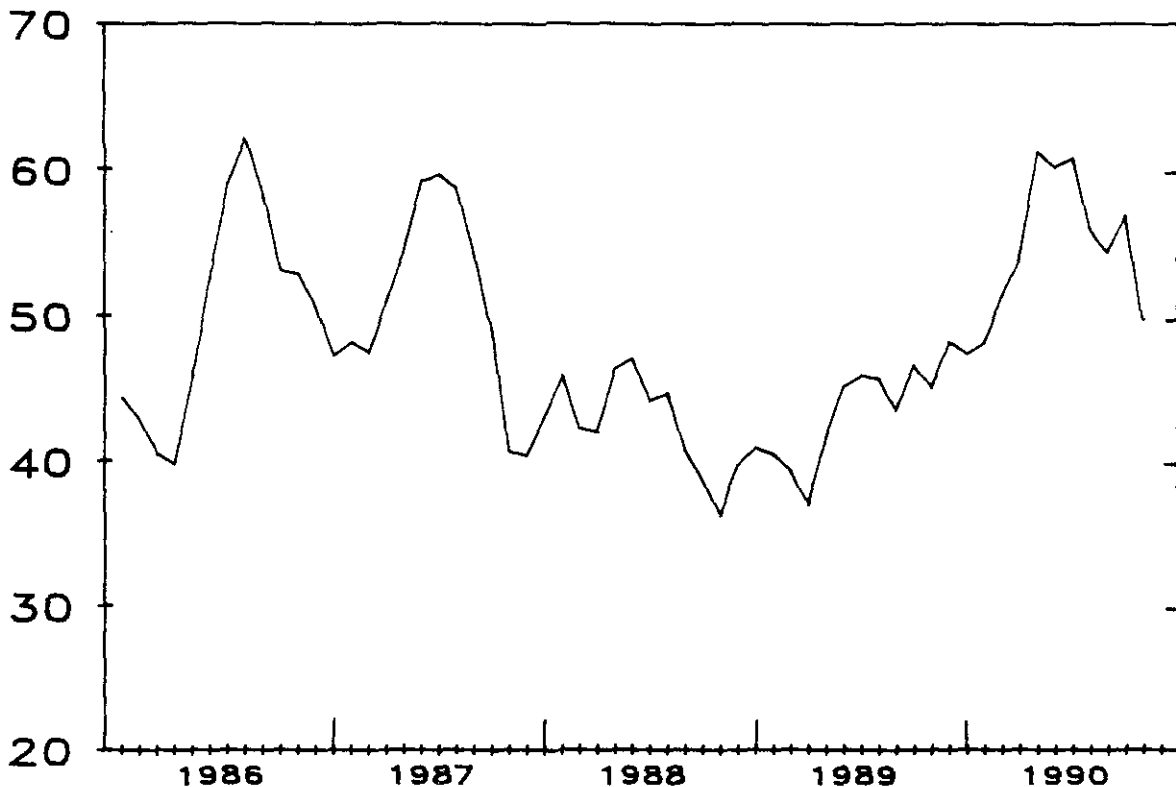
