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PRICES RECEIVED INDEX UP 3 POINTS

The March All Farm Products Index of Prices Received increased 3 points (2.1 percent) from February to 148 percent of its January-December 1977 average, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. Increases in the prices of eggs, oranges, cattle, and upland cotton were partially offset by lower prices for milk, sweet corn, celery, and strawberries. The index was 2 points (1.3 percent) below a year ago.

The March cattle price and March calf price were each at record high levels. The cattle price exceeded the previous record in February 1991 by \$1.00 while the calf price exceeds its previous record, also set in February, by \$2.00. Higher citrus prices reflected shorter supplies caused by the December freeze in California and also higher quality valencia oranges moving to market. Egg prices reflected a strong seasonal demand. The cotton price was at the highest level since January 1981. Corn, oats, and sorghum prices increased slightly. Rice and wheat prices were also up but soybeans were lower than last month.

PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for March increased 3 points (2.1 percent) from the previous month to 148 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 2 points (1.3 percent).

LIVESTOCK AND PRODUCTS: The March index was 169, up 1.8 percent from last month but 1.2 percent below March 1990.

POULTRY AND EGGS: The March index was 136, up 11 percent from February but 6.2 percent below March a year ago. March market eggs were up 14.8 cents from the previous month, averaging 74.9 cents per dozen. March broilers averaged 30.6 cents per pound, up 0.7 cent from February. Turkey prices increased 3.2 cents per pound in March to 37.6 cents.

MEAT ANIMALS: At 199, the March Index was up 1.5 percent from the previous month and 4.7 percent above March 1990. Beef cattle prices averaged \$78.00 per cwt., up \$1.00 from February and up \$3.70 from March 1990. Steer and heifer prices for March averaged \$81.70 per cwt. and cows were \$52.80 per cwt. March hog prices averaged \$52.20 per cwt., up 10 cents from February, and up 90 cents from the previous year. Barrows and gilts were \$52.70 per cwt. and sows averaged \$45.60 per cwt.

DAIRY PRODUCTS: The March dairy products index was 119, down 1.7 percent from February and 16 percent below March 1990. All milk sold to plants and dealers averaged \$11.50 per cwt. in March, down 20 cents from February and \$2.40 below a year earlier. The all milk price was at the lowest level since July 1988.

ALL CROPS: The March all crops index was 126, up 3.3 percent from February but 2.3 percent below March 1990.

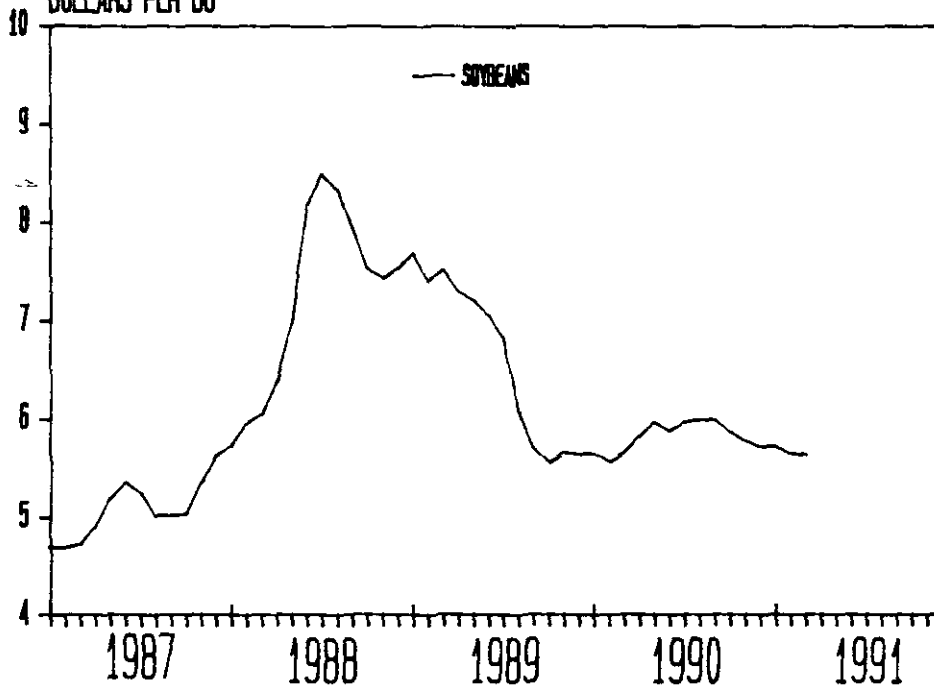
ALL FRUIT: At 217, the March all fruit index was up 10 percent from last month and 17 percent above a year ago. The largest contributors to the increase in the index were oranges, lemons, and grapefruit. The large increase in the orange price can be attributed to the increased volume of higher quality valencias and the winding down of the naval and other orange harvest.

COTTON: At 121, the March cotton index was up 8.0 percent from last month and 14 percent from a year ago. March cotton was 73.0 cents per pound compared with 67.9 cents in February and 63.9 cents last March.

FEED GRAINS AND HAY: At 121, the index of prices received for feed grains and hay increased 2.5 percent from February but was 0.8 percent below March 1990. Corn was 5 cents higher at \$2.37 per bushel and sorghum grain increased 8 cents to \$3.95 per cwt. Oats were up 2 cents from February to \$1.15 per bushel but barley was 6 cents lower in March at \$2.07 per bushel. Hay averaged \$84.50 per ton in March, an increase of \$4.10 per ton from February.

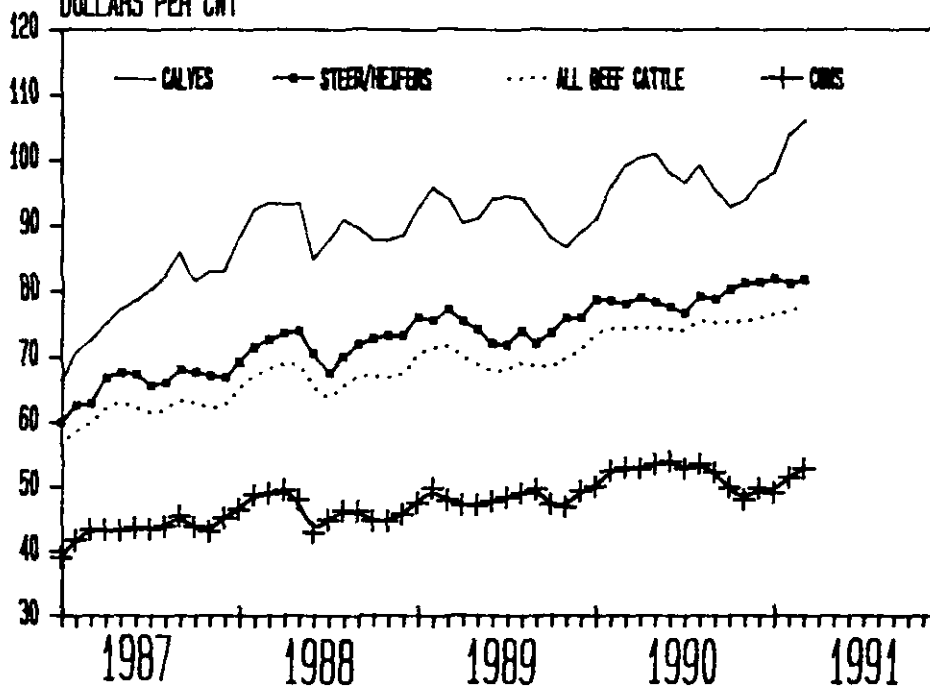
PRICES RECEIVED BY FARMERS, US

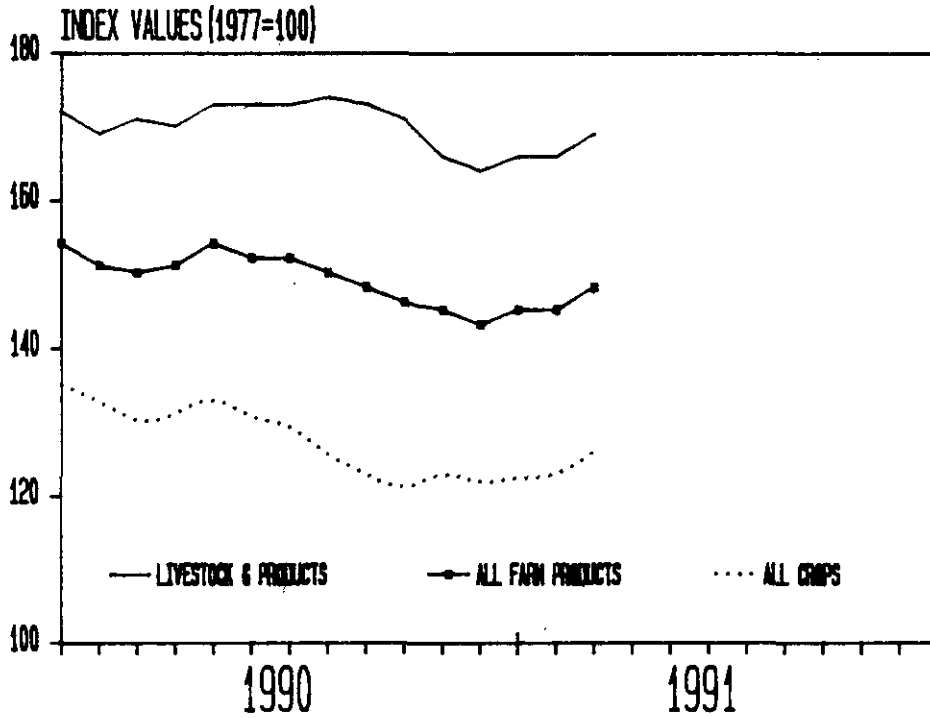

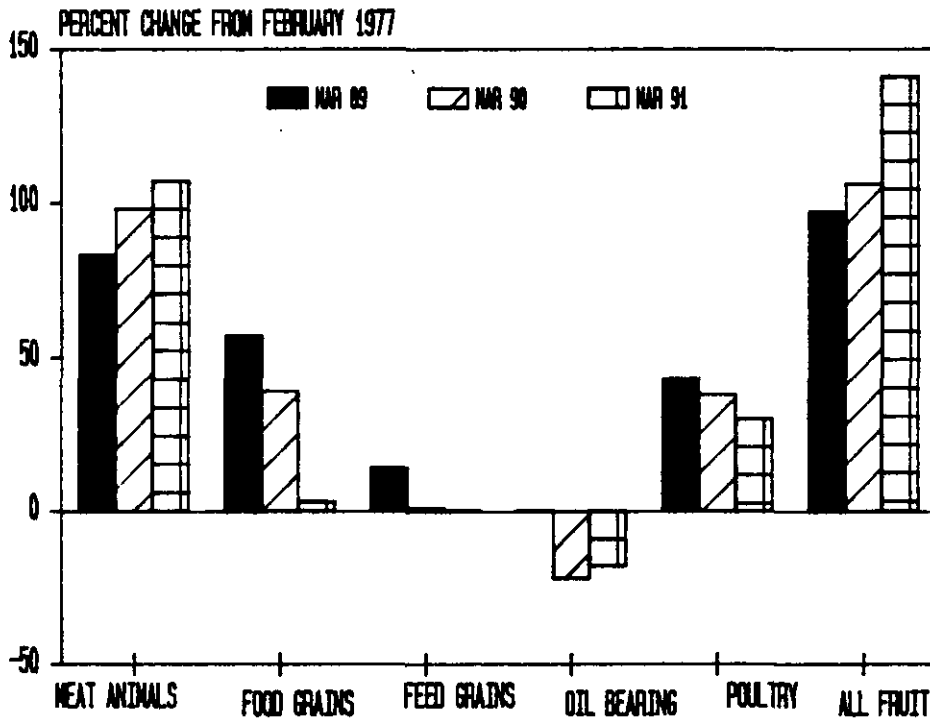

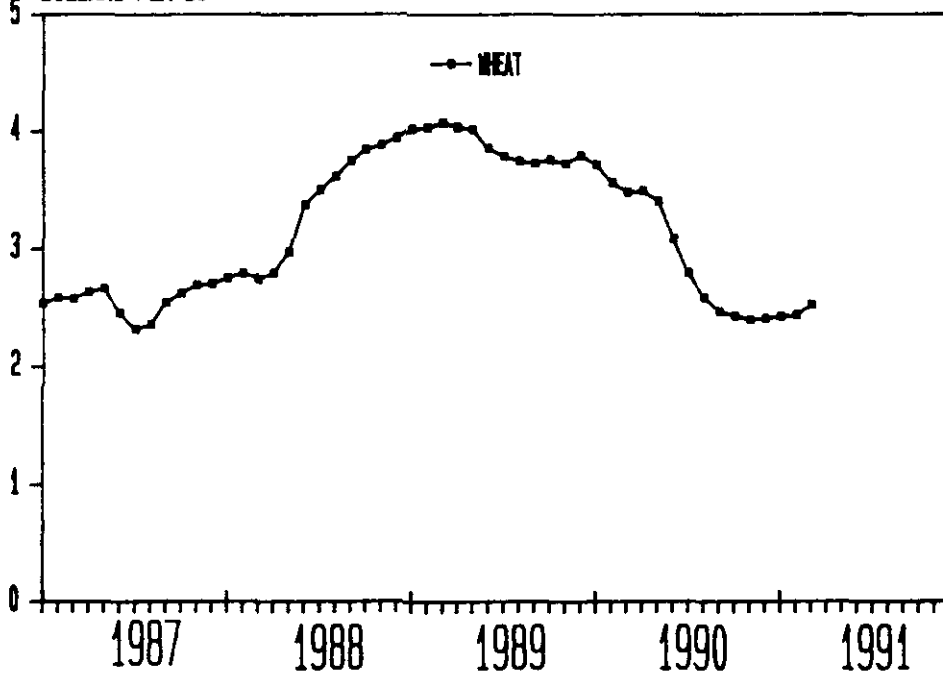
