Prices Received Index Down 2 Points

The November All Farm Products Index of Prices Received decreased 2 points (1.4 percent) from October to 141 percent of its January-December 1977 average. Decreases in the prices of oranges, hogs, and cattle were partially offset by higher prices for lettuce, tomatoes, and strawberries.

Compared with last month, prices of grains and oilseeds were mixed. Wheat continued to increase in price while the average price of rice was unchanged. The corn price was slightly lower but sorghum grain and barley prices posted moderate gains. Hay prices increased. Prices for soybeans and peanuts were lower than a month earlier. Prices of most fruits declined while most vegetables were up sharply. Hog prices dropped off sharply from October and cattle and calf prices were down moderately.

The Index was 6 points (4.1 percent) below a year ago. Lower cattle, hog, and egg prices were responsible for most of the decline from last year. Higher prices for wheat, milk, and lettuce were partially offsetting.

Prices Received

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for November decreased 2 points (1.4 percent) from the previous month to 141 percent of its 1977 average. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 6 points (4.1 percent).

All Crops: The November index was 127, the same as a month earlier but 2.4 percent above a year earlier.

All Fruit: At 217, the all fruit index was down 21 percent from last month but up 5.9 percent from a year ago. Orange prices dropped to more seasonal levels in November as a larger volume of the new crop came to market. Increases in strawberry and apple prices were slightly offsetting to the overall drop in the index.

Commercial Vegetables: The commercial vegetable index, at 184, was up 48 percent from last month and up 11 percent from last year. Whitefly infestations in California have resulted in large price increases for lettuce. This combined with seasonal price increases for tomatoes, carrots, and celery have caused the index to surge from the October level.

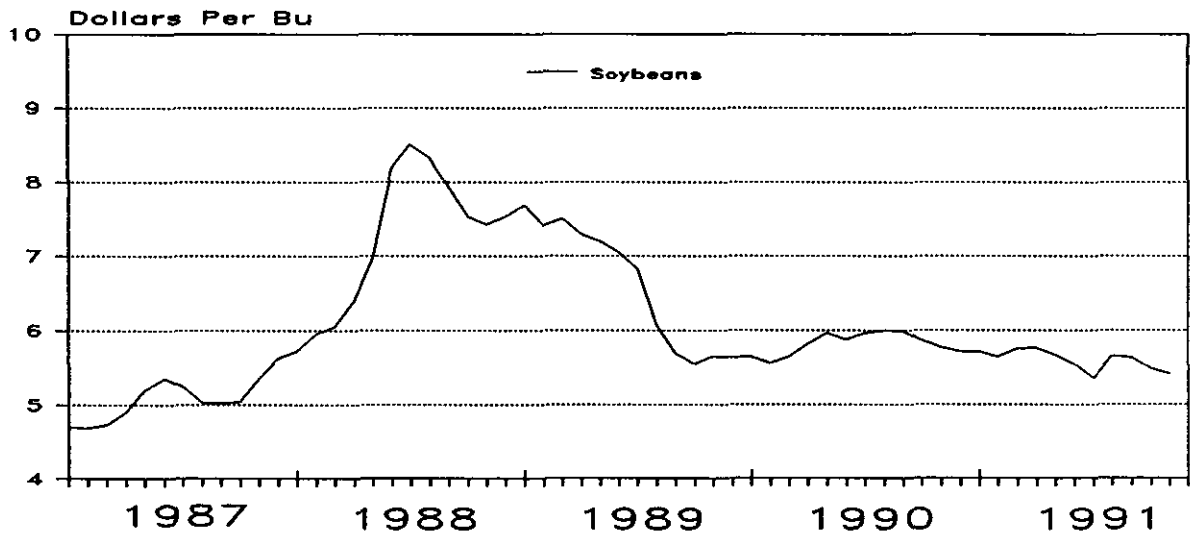
Food Grains: The food grain index, at 133, was up 3.9 percent from last month. This continues the trend started in August. Wheat increased 12 cents a bushel over October to \$3.21. The average rice price was unchanged from last month at \$7.58 per cwt.

Livestock and Products: The November index was 155, 1.9 percent below a month ago and 8.3 percent below November 1990.

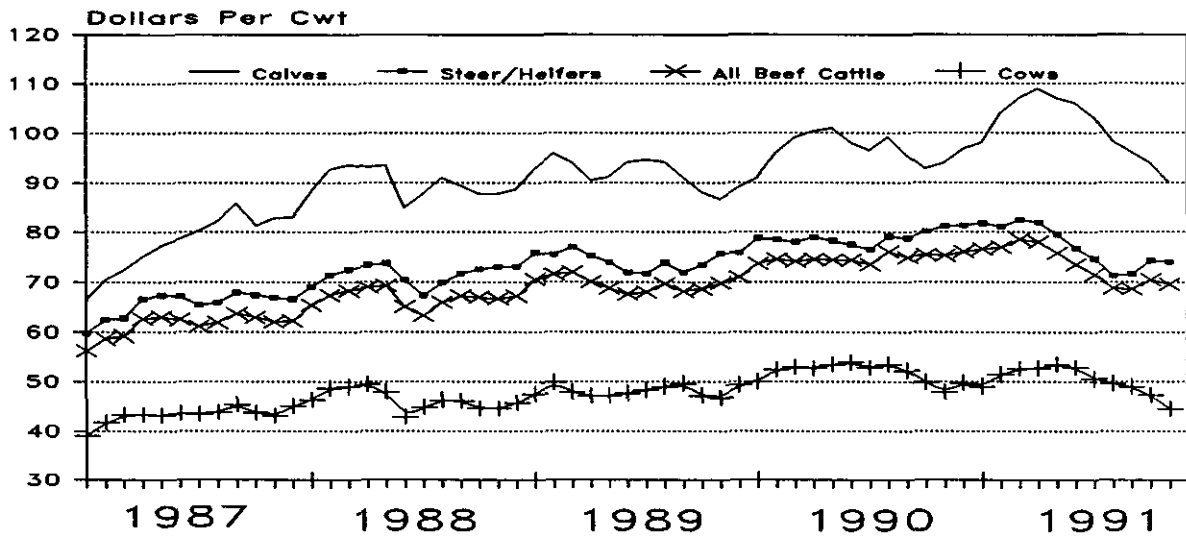
Meat Animals: The meat animals index was 170, down 3.4 percent from last month and 13 percent below a year ago. Beef cattle prices averaged \$69.60 per cwt in November, down 80 cents from October. The November steer and heifer prices declined 30 cents, averaging \$74.00 per cwt while cow prices declined \$2.90. Calf prices averaged \$90.00 per cwt, down \$3.90 from October. The November hog price was down \$5.40, averaging \$38.20 per cwt. Sows, at \$30.00 per cwt, were down \$5.80, while barrows and gilts were down \$5.30 to average \$38.90.

Dairy Products: At 141, the November dairy products index increased 2.2 percent from last month and was 7.6 percent above November 1990. Milk prices averaged \$13.70 per cwt in November, up 30 cents from October and \$1.00 above a year earlier.

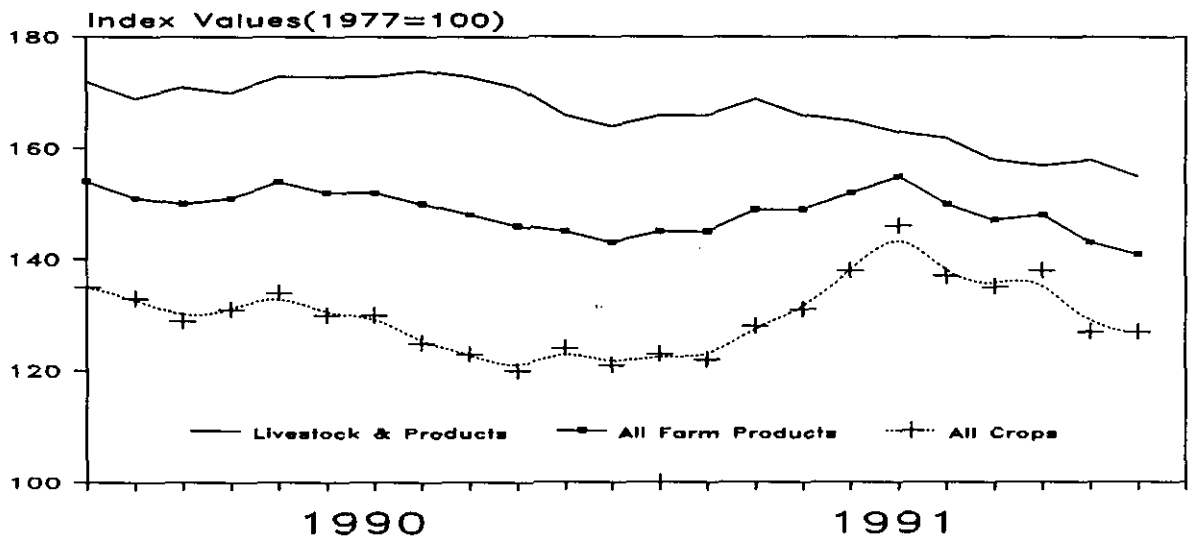

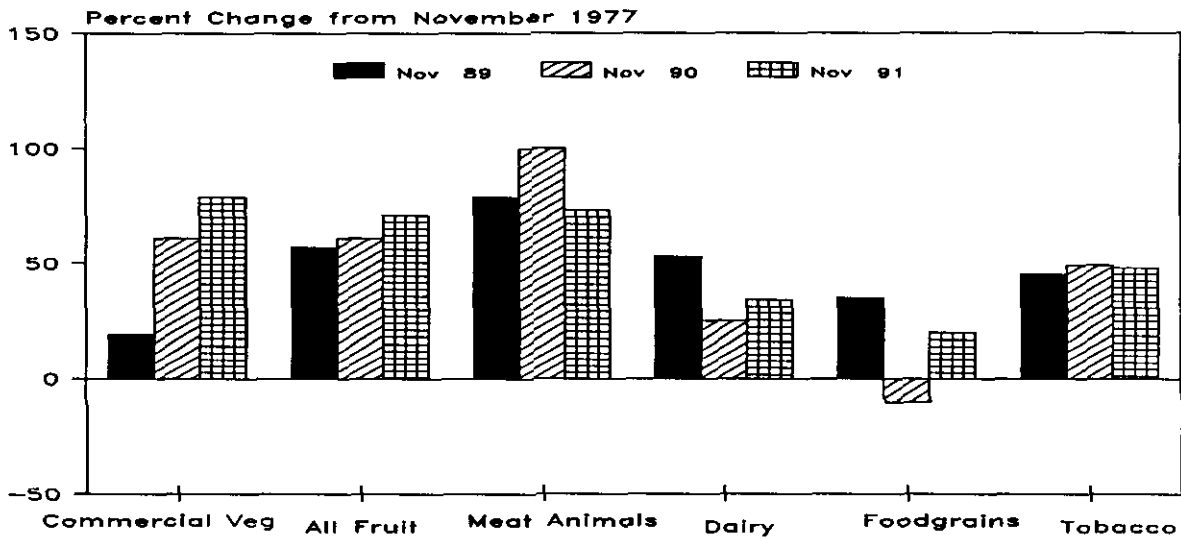

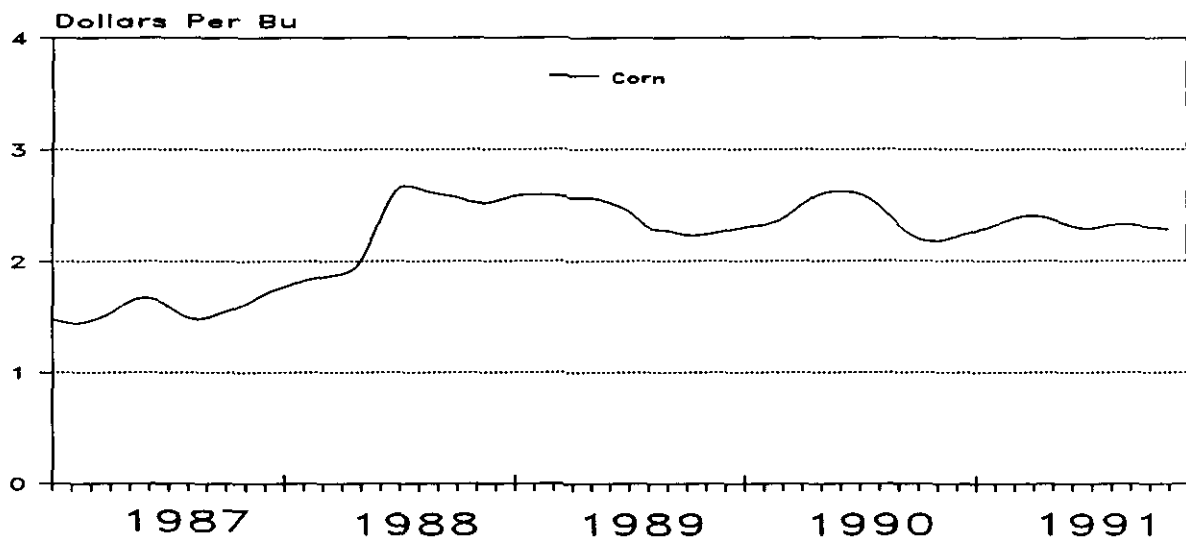
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, US



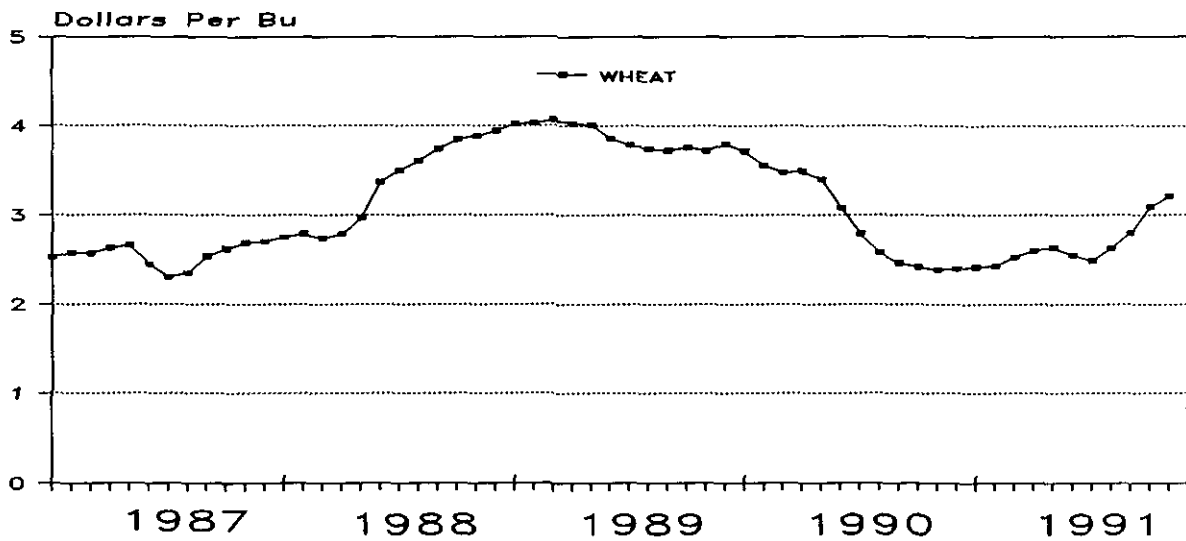
Prices Received Index Comparisons

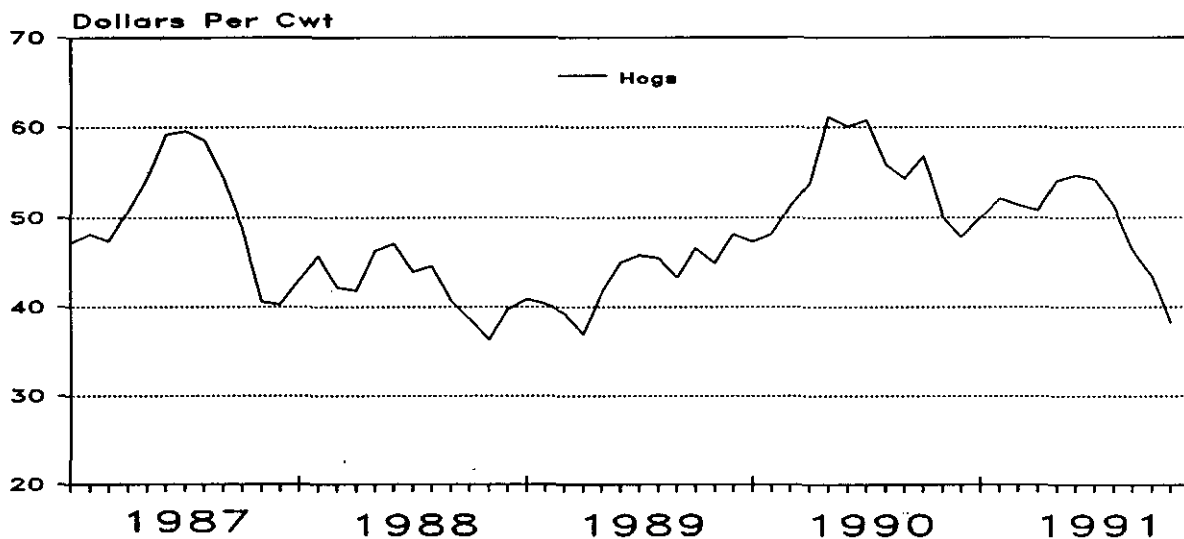
