Prices Received Index Up 1 Point

The March All Farm Products Index of Prices Received increased 1 point (0.7 percent) from February to 143 based on 1977=100. Increases in the prices of lettuce, tobacco, cattle, and corn were partially offset by lower prices for oranges, milk, wheat, and hogs.

After 7 consecutive months of price increases, March wheat prices declined from a month earlier. Corn and sorghum prices were up moderately from February while hay prices were down. The average soybean price also increased from a month earlier. Cattle prices increased from February but hog prices were down. Milk continued its downward trend which began in January this year.

The index was 5 points, 3.4 percent, below a year ago. Lower prices for hogs, cattle, and eggs were responsible for most of the decline from last year. Increases in the prices of wheat, milk, and corn were partially offsetting.

Prices Received by Farmers

The All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers for March increased 1 point (0.7 percent) from the previous month to 143 percent based on 1977=100. Compared with a year earlier, the index was down 5 points (3.4 percent).

All Crops: The March index was 130, up 1.6 percent from last month and 2.4 percent above a year ago.

Commercial Vegetables: The commercial vegetable index, at 188, was up 13 percent from last month and up 28 percent from a year ago. Increases in lettuce and sweet corn prices were the main contributors to the monthly index increase. Both crops made large price increases on good demand and seasonal lulls in supply. Tomato prices continued to be very high compared to a year ago as reduced shipments from Mexico have stretched domestic supplies and created a premium market for U.S. tomatoes.

Tobacco: The tobacco index, at 175, was up 11 percent from both last month and a year ago. The March all tobacco price was higher than the February price because the March price reflected fire-cured tobacco sales only, while the February price included sales of lower priced burley. Compared to a year ago, fire-cured prices were up 20 cents per pound.

Food Grains: The food grain index, at 149, was down 3.2 percent from last month but still up 39 percent from a year earlier. This is the first food grain index decline since monthly increases began in August of 1991. March wheat decreased 13 cents a bushel from a month earlier to \$3.65. The average price received for rough rice declined to \$7.61 for March, 30 cents per hundredweight (cwt) below February. However, this remains the highest March price for rough rice since 1988.

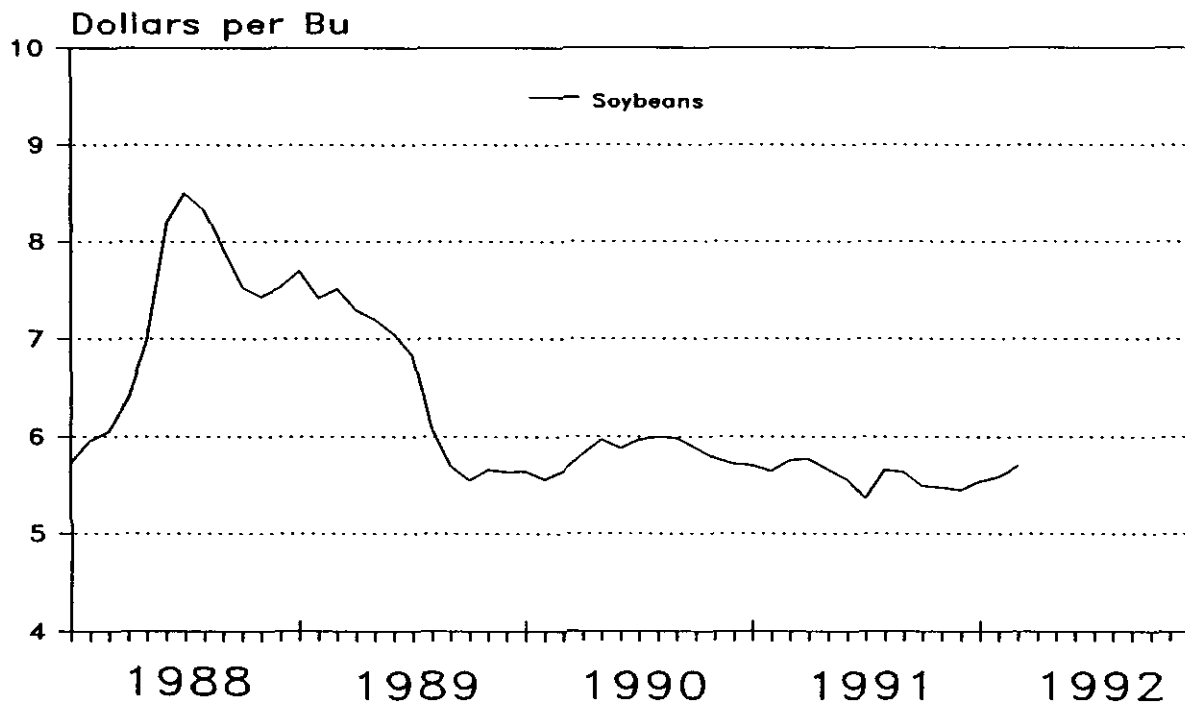
Feed Grains and Hay: At 125, the February feed grain and hay index was up 1.6 percent over last month and 3.3 percent over a year earlier. Corn, at \$2.53 per bushel, was up 6 cents from February. Sorghum moved 12 cents higher to \$4.32 per cwt. Barley was down 7 cents to \$2.11 per bushel, and the all hay price declined marginally to \$70.10 per ton.

All Fruit: The all fruit index, at 205, was down 2.4 percent from last month and down 5.5 percent from a year ago. Larger seasonal shipments of California navel oranges and Florida strawberries brought prices down for these two commodities. These decreases offset increased prices for grapefruit and lemons in March.

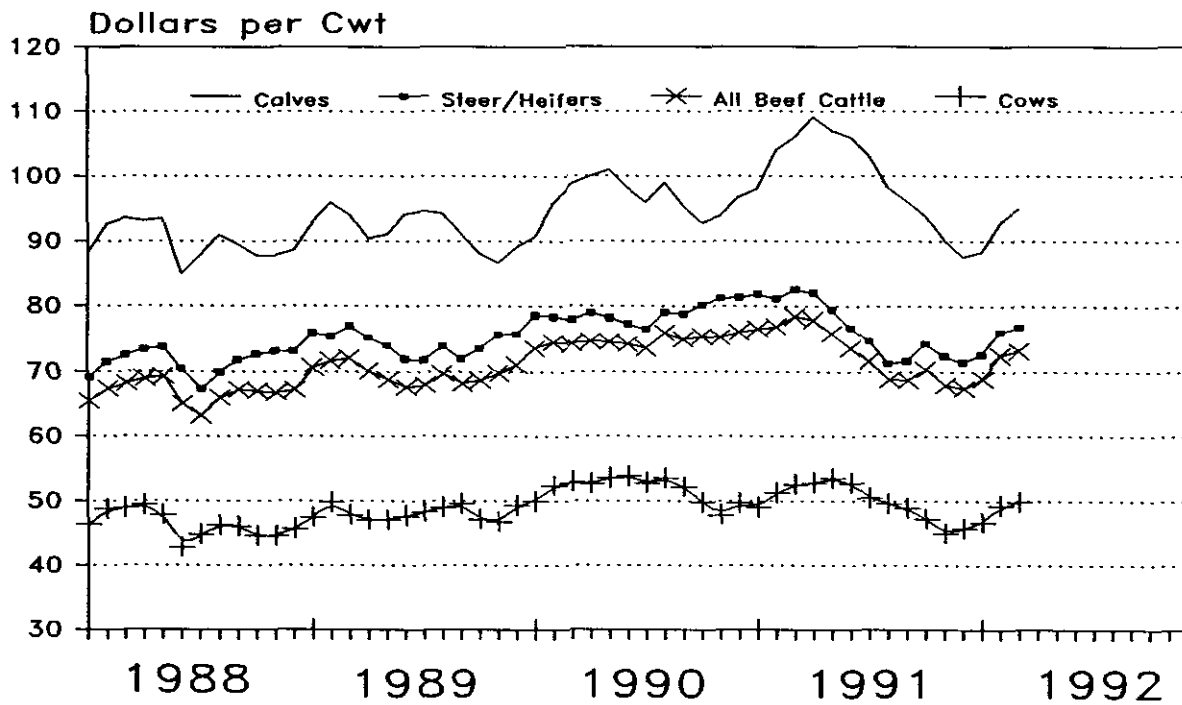
Livestock and Products: The March index was 155, down 0.6 percent from a month earlier and 8.3 percent below March 1991.

Dairy Products: The dairy products index for March was 130, down 2.3 percent from last month but 11 percent above March 1991. Milk prices averaged \$12.60 per cwt in March, down 30 cents from February but \$1.20 above a year earlier.

with Comparisons

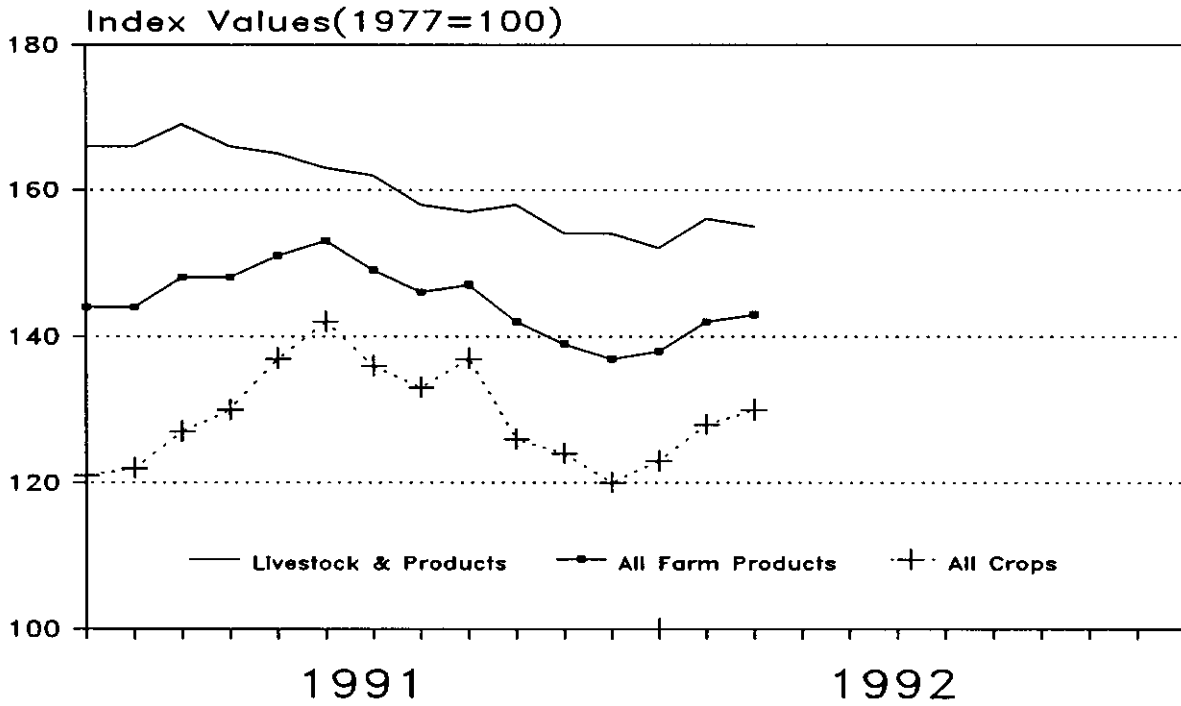

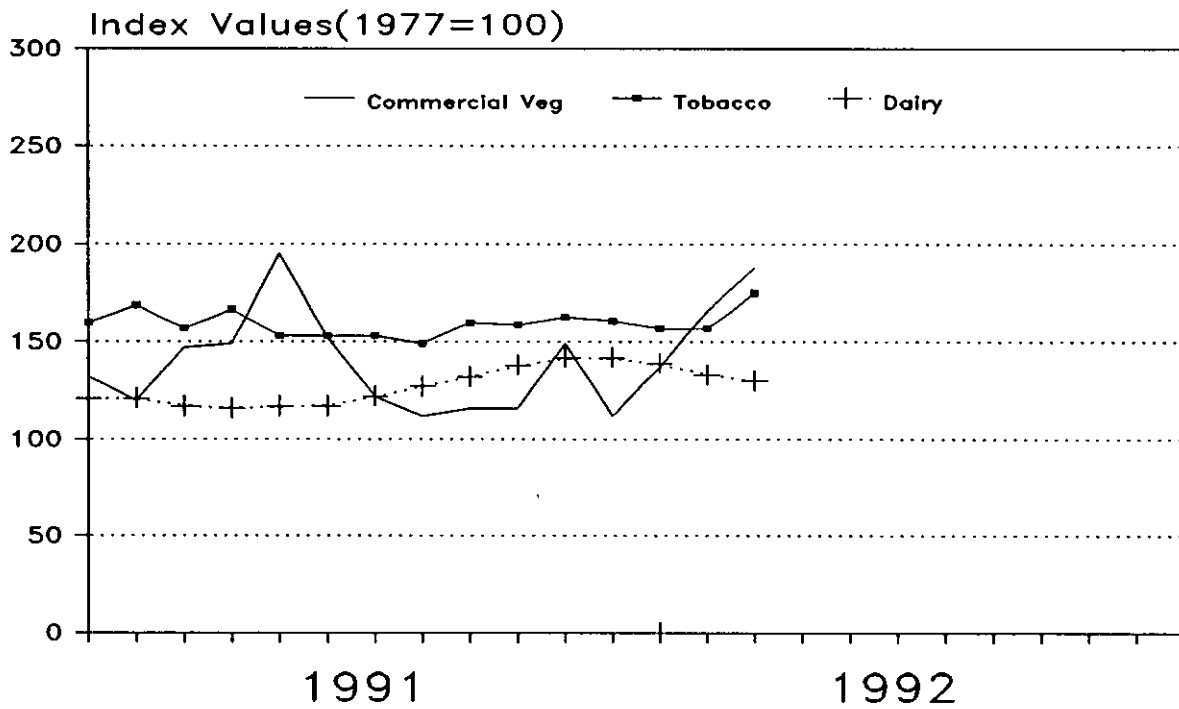

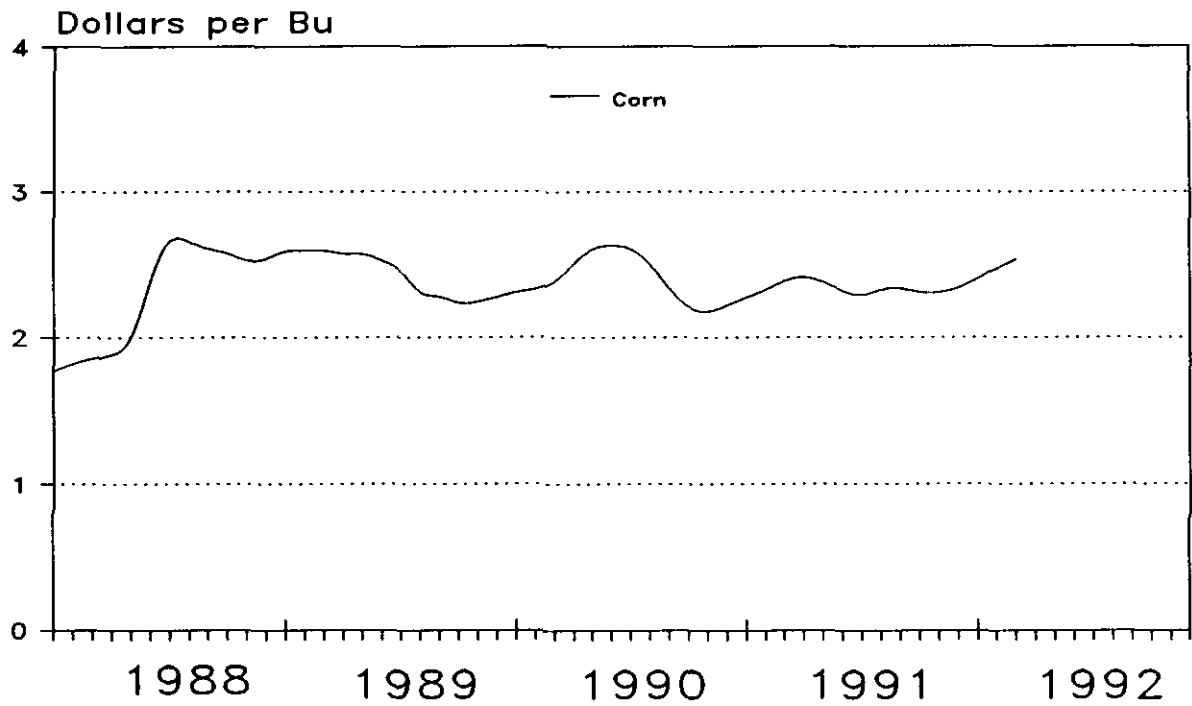
Index of Prices Received by Farmers, US



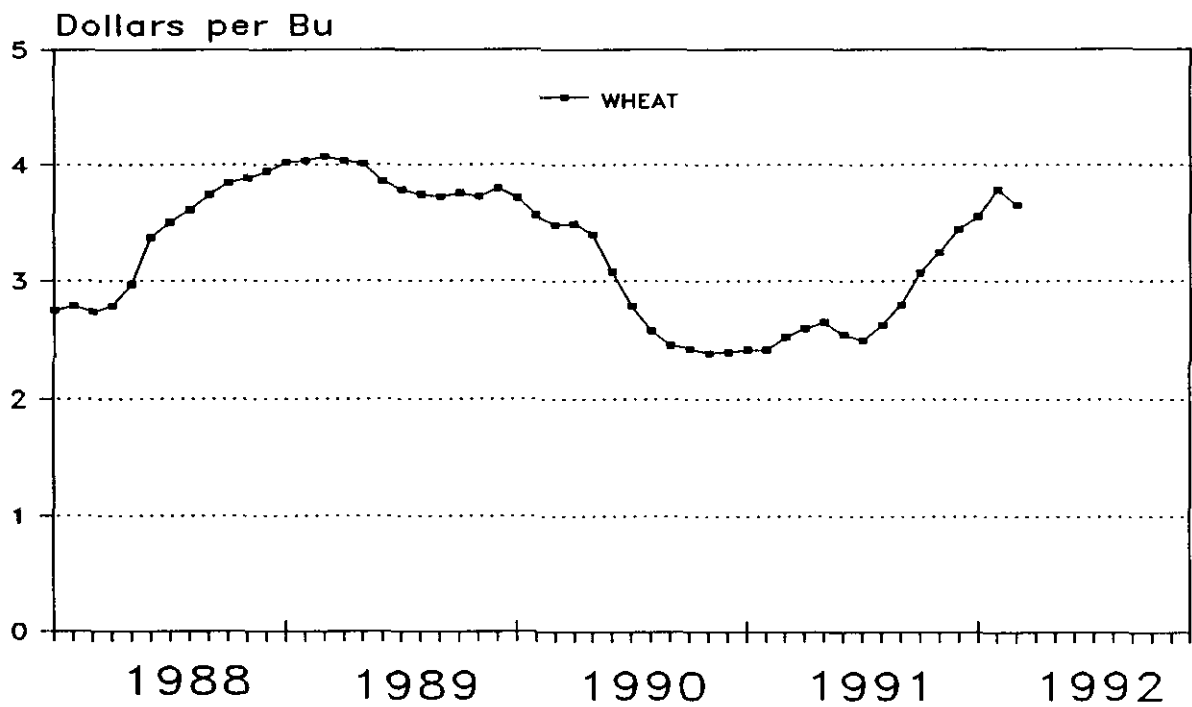
Prices Received Selected Indexes

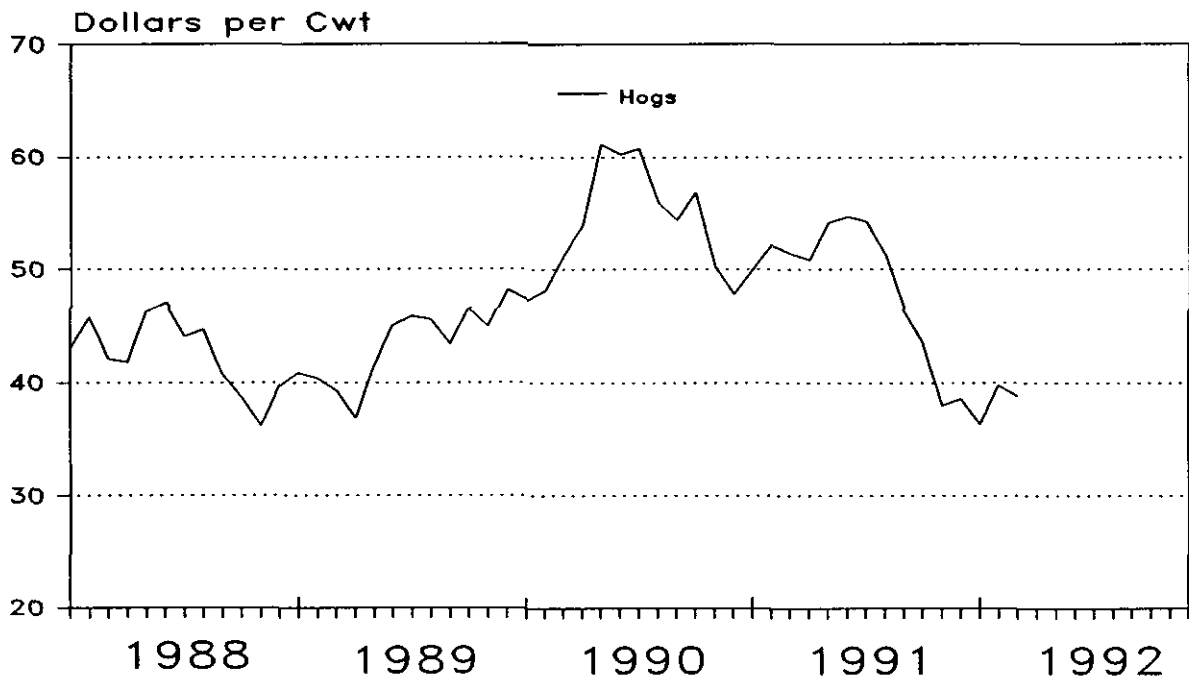

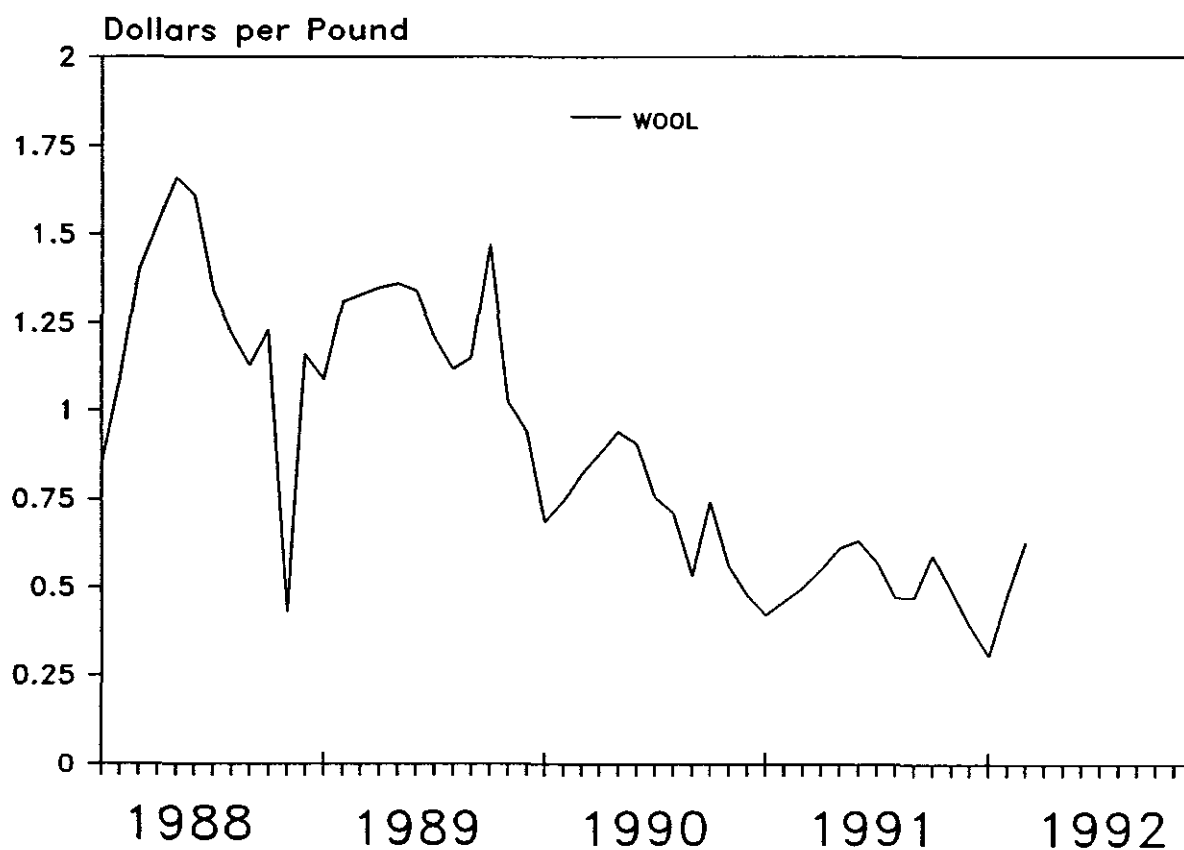
