February Farm Prices Received Index Unchanged From Last Month

The preliminary All Farm Products Index of Prices Received by Farmers in February is 99, based on 1990-92=100, unchanged from the January index. Higher prices for cattle, hogs, corn, and soybeans offset lower prices for tomatoes, broilers, wheat, and eggs. The seasonal change in the mix of commodities farmers sell also affects the overall index. Increased marketings of cattle, broilers, eggs, and strawberries offset decreased marketings of corn, soybeans, wheat, and oranges.

The preliminary All Farm Products Index is also unchanged from February 2002. Higher prices for corn, soybeans, cattle, and cotton more than offset lower prices for lettuce, hogs, broccoli, and potatoes.

The Food Commodities Index decreased 1 point (1.0 percent) from last month to 97, but is 3 points (3.0 percent) below January last year.

Prices Paid Index Unchanged

The February Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates (PPITW) is 127 percent of the 1990-92 average. The index is unchanged from January but 4 points (3.3 percent) above February 2002. Lower prices in February for feeder cattle, feeder pigs, feed supplements, and hay and forages are offset by higher prices for diesel fuel, nitrogen fertilizers, gasoline, and LP gas.

Prices Received by Farmers

The February All Farm Products Index is 99 percent of its 1990-92 base, unchanged from the January index and February 2002 index.

ALL CROPS: The February index is 103, unchanged from January but 1 percent above February 2002. From February, index increases for feed grains and hay, cotton, oil-bearing crops, and fruits and nuts offset decreases for food grains, tobacco, and commercial vegetables. The index remains unchanged for potatoes and dry beans and other crops.

Food Grains: The February index, at 106, is down 8.6 percent from the previous month but 25 percent above February 2002. The February all wheat price, at \$3.71 per bushel, is down 18 cents from January but 88 cents above February 2002.

Feed Grains & Hay: The February index is 107, up 1.9 percent from last month and 18 percent above February 2002. The corn price, at \$2.35 per bushel, is up 2 cents from January and 42 cents above February 2002. The all hay price, at \$91.80 per ton, is \$1.10 below January but 10 cents above last February. Grain sorghum, at \$4.15 per cwt, is up 3 cents from January and 89 cents above February last year.

Oil-Bearing Crops: The February index, at 100, is up 1.0 percent from January and 30 percent above February 2002. The soybean price, at \$5.58 per bushel, increased 6 cents from January and is \$1.36 above February 2002.

Cotton: The February index, at 74, is up 1.4 percent from January and 61 percent above February 2002. The February price, at 44.8 cents per pound, is up 0.8 cents from the previous month and 16.8 cents above last February.

Potatoes & Dry Beans: The February index, at 108, is unchanged from January but 18 percent below February 2002. The all potato price, at \$6.53 per cwt, is down 14 cents from January and 81 cents below last February. The all dry bean price, at \$16.30 per cwt, is down 10 cents from the previous month and \$9.80 below February 2002.

Fruit & Nuts: The February index, at 85, is up 2.4 percent from the previous month and unchanged from February 2002. Since January, price increases occurred for oranges and grapefruit.

Commercial Vegetables: The February index, at 111, is down 3.5 percent from last month and 42 percent below February 2002. Price decreases for asparagus, lettuce, snap beans, and tomatoes more than offset price increases for broccoli, cauliflower, celery, sweet corn, and onions.

LIVESTOCK & PRODUCTS: The February index, at 95, is down 1.0 percent from last month and down 2.1 percent from February 2002. Compared with a year ago, prices are higher for all cattle, eggs, and turkeys but lower for all milk, hogs, and calves.

Meat Animals: The February index, at 96, is up 3.2 percent from last month and 3.2 percent from last year. The February hog price of \$34.40 per cwt is up \$1.40 from January but down \$4.10 from a year ago. The February beef cattle price of \$74.60 is up \$1.40 from last month and up \$4.60 from February 2002.

Dairy Products: The February index, at 88, is down 2.2 percent from January and 12 percent below February 2002. The February all milk price of \$11.50 per cwt is down 20 cents from January and down \$1.60 from last year. The fluid grade milk price is down 30 cents from last month and the manufactured grade milk price is down 20 cents from the previous month.

Poultry & Eggs: The February index, at 103, is down 5 percent from January, but up 3 percent from a year ago. February market egg prices at 46.6 cents per dozen decreased 6.3 cents from January. The February broiler price, at 34.0 cents per pound, is down 1.0 cent from January. Broiler stocks remain high, with demand good for fast food but weak for the export and retail markets. February turkey prices, averaging 34.5 cents per pound, are down 0.1 cent from the previous month.

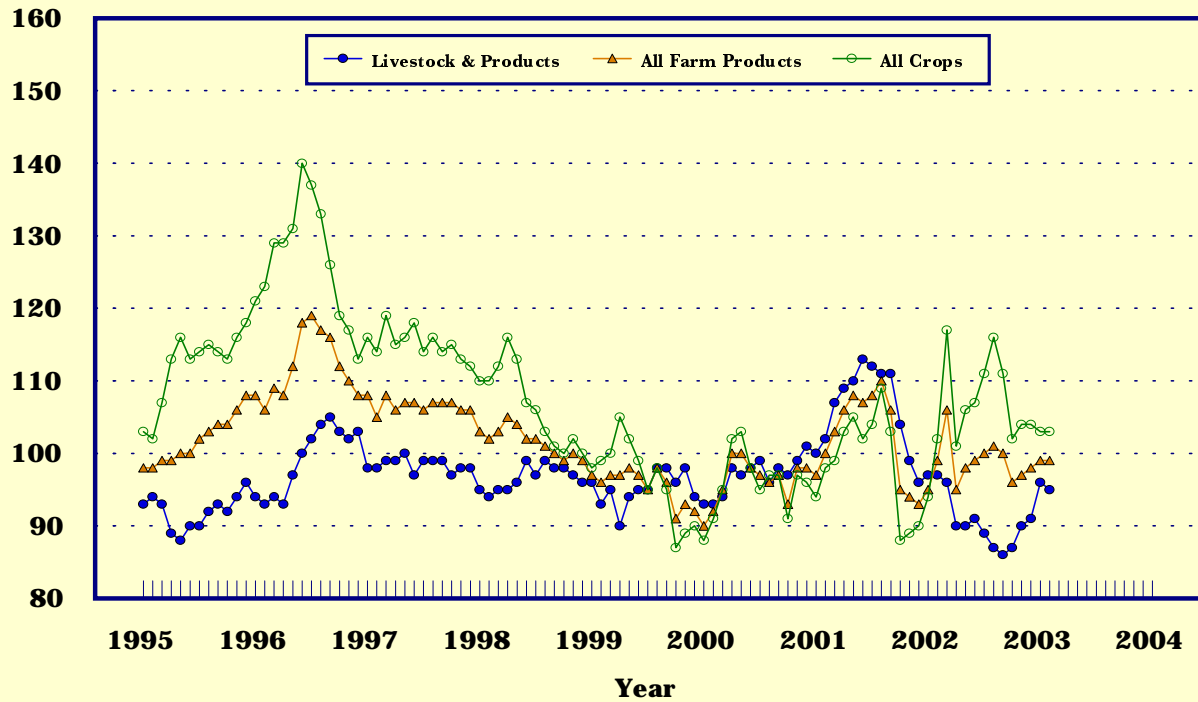

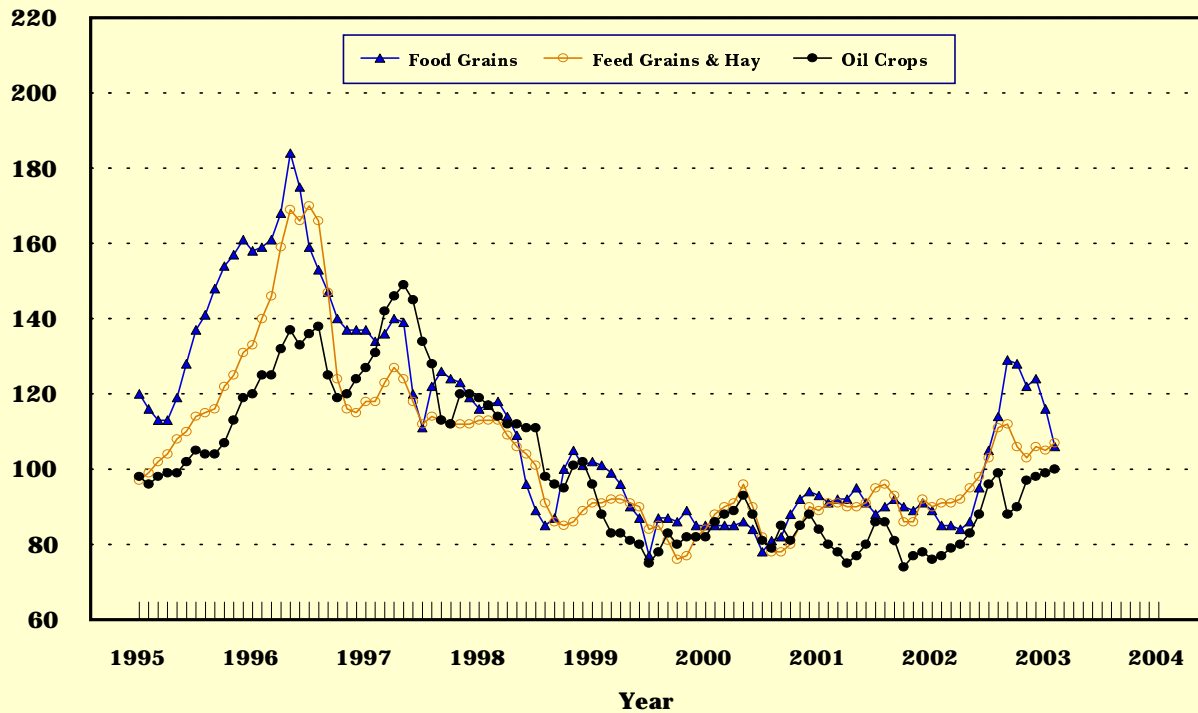

Index Values(1990-92=100)



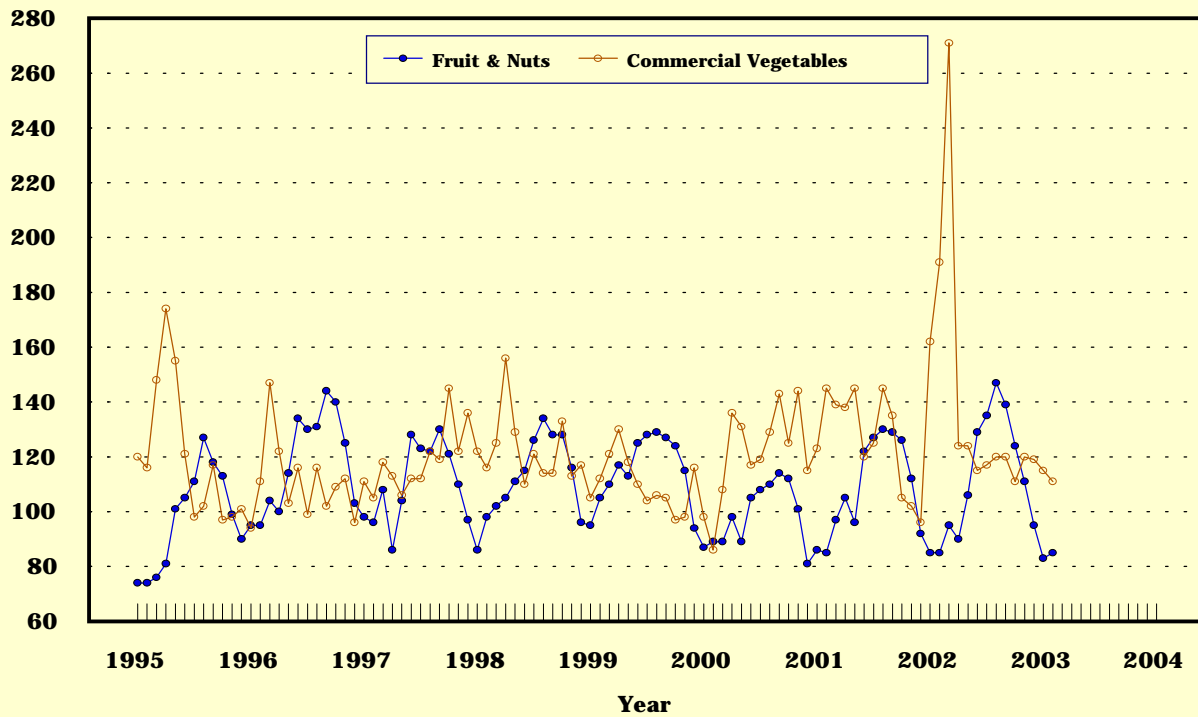
Prices Received, Food, Feed & Oil Indexes, US

Index Values(1990-92=100)



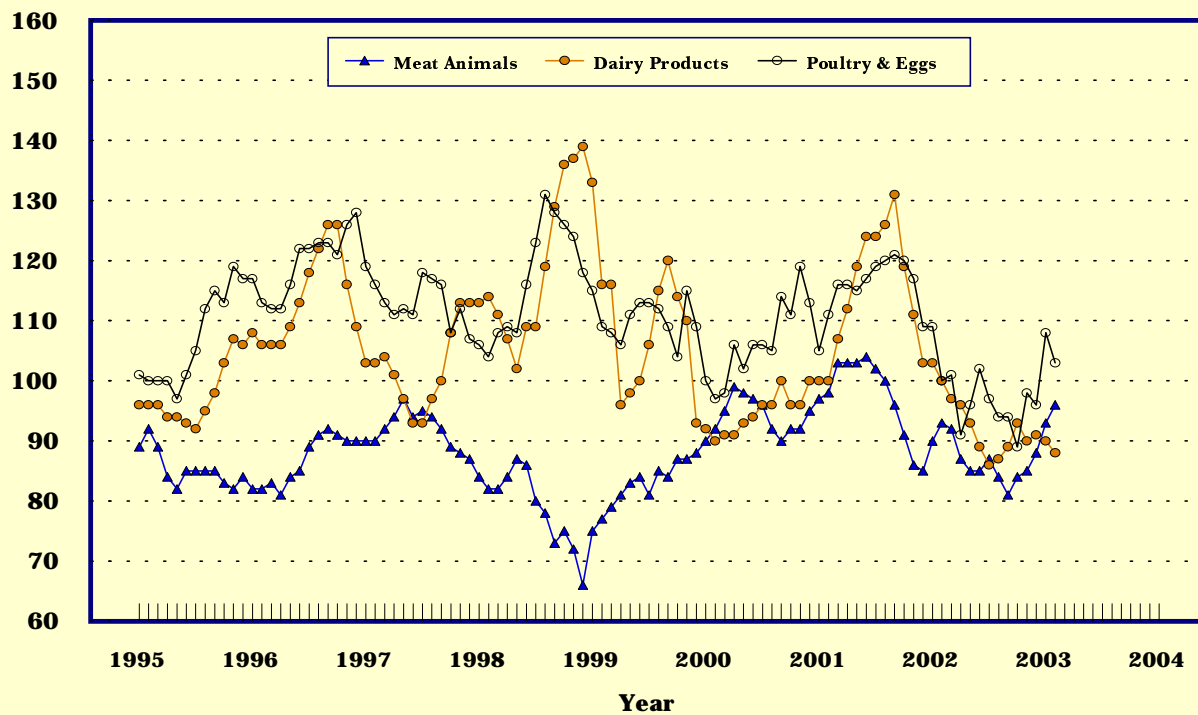
Prices Received, Fruit/Vegetable Indexes, US

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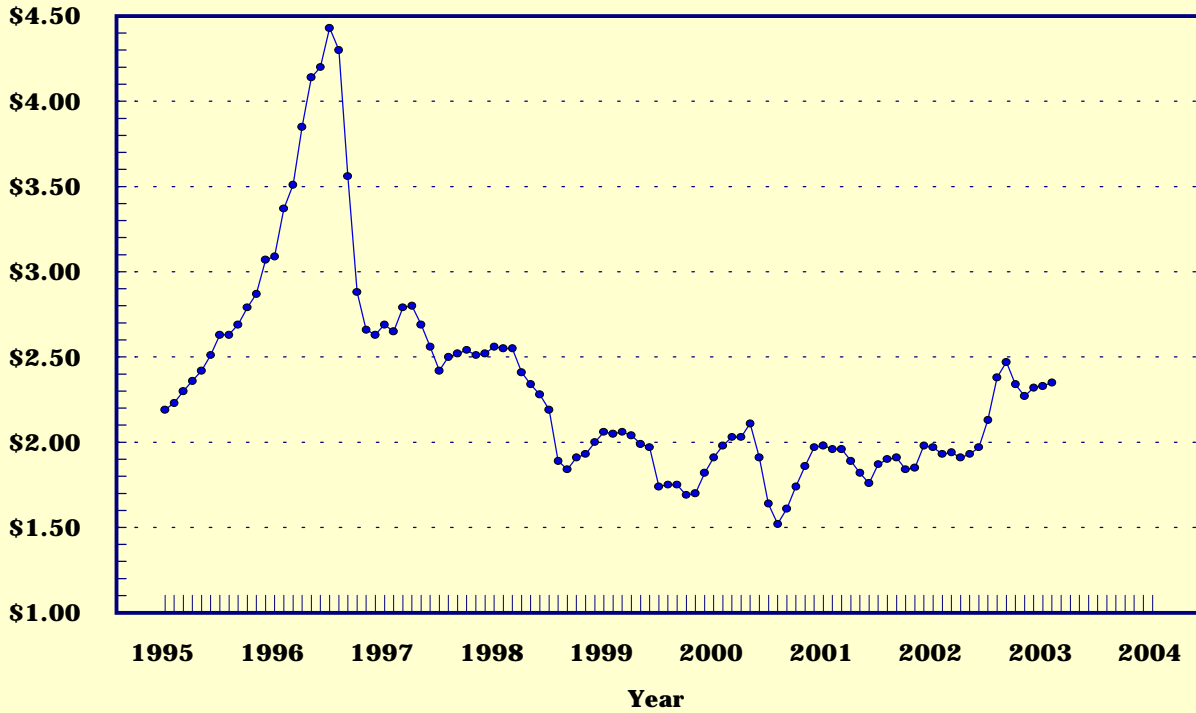

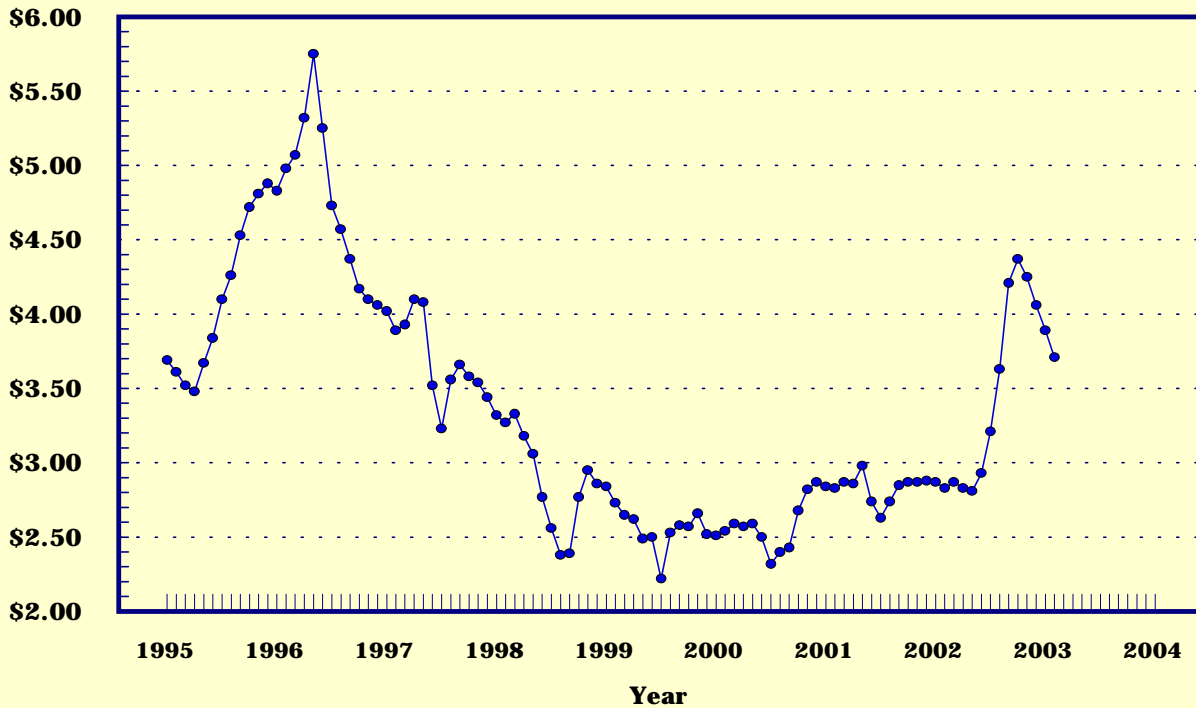
Prices Received, Corn, US

Dollars per Bu



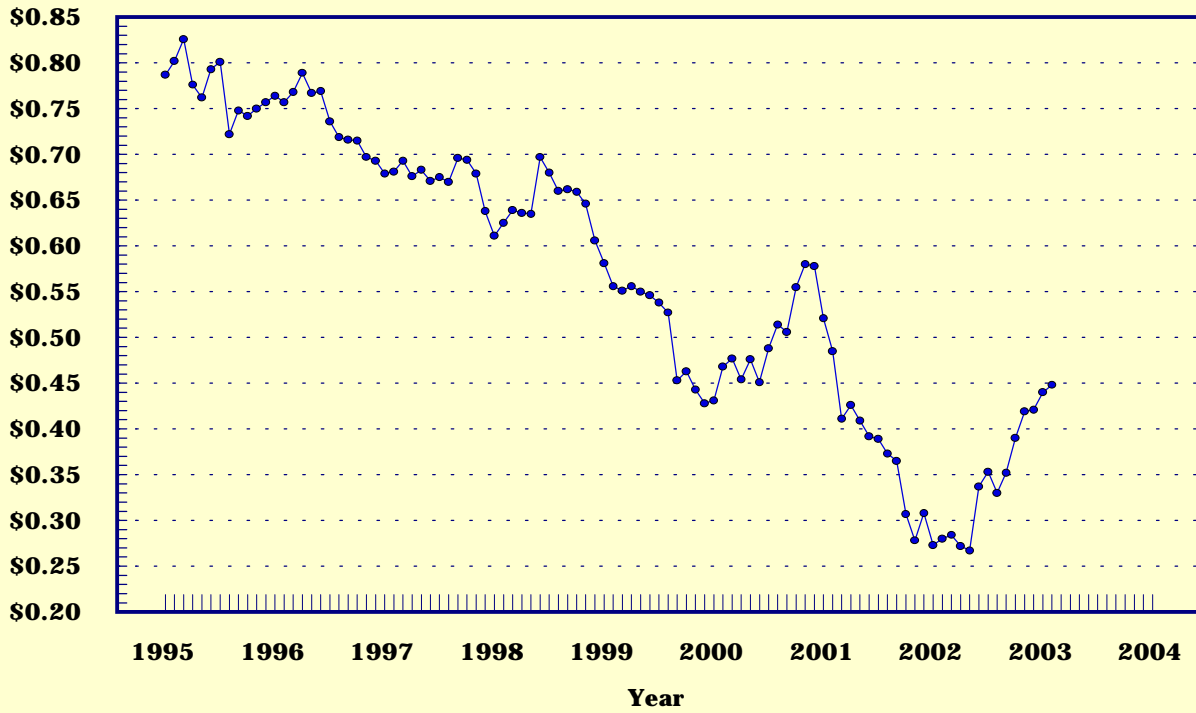
Prices Received, Wheat, US

Dollars per Bu



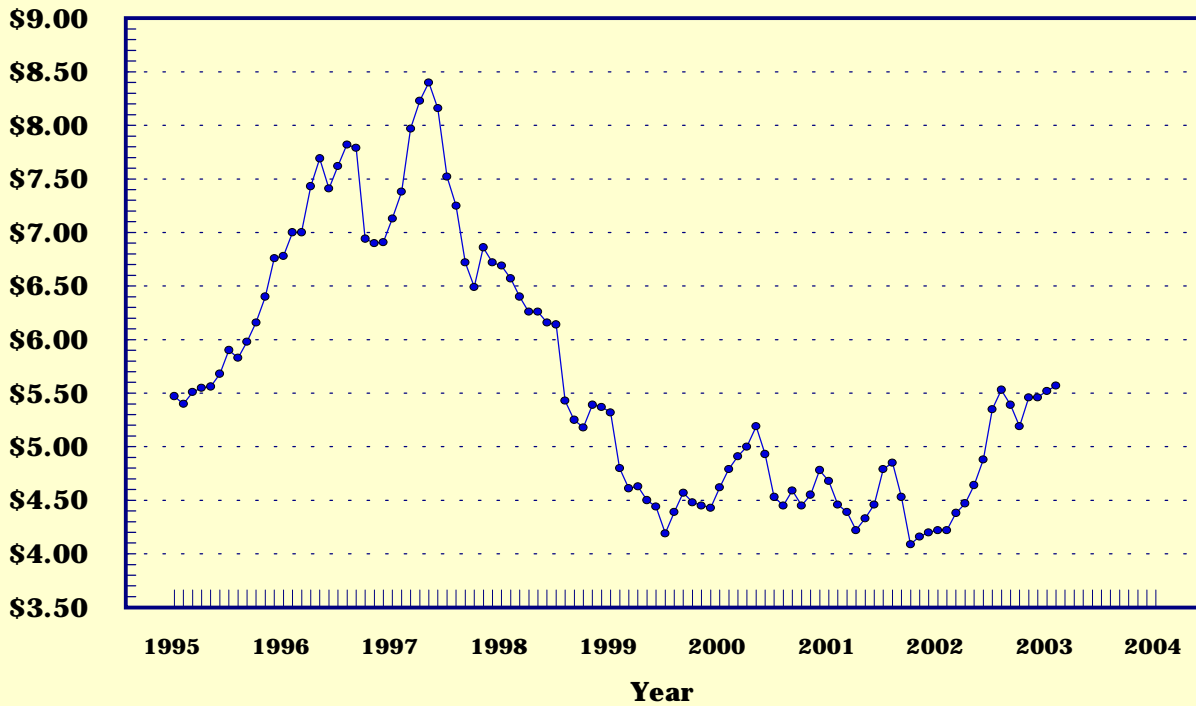
Prices Received, Cotton, US

Dollars per Lb



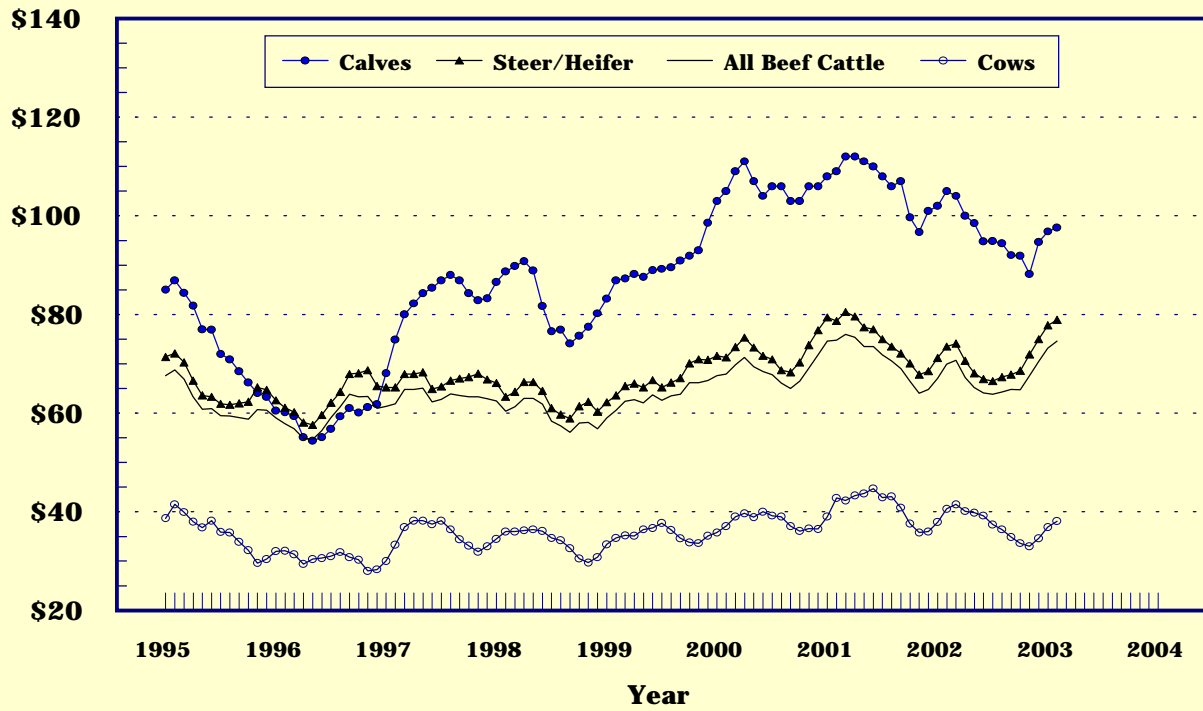
Prices Received, Soybeans, US

Dollars per Bu



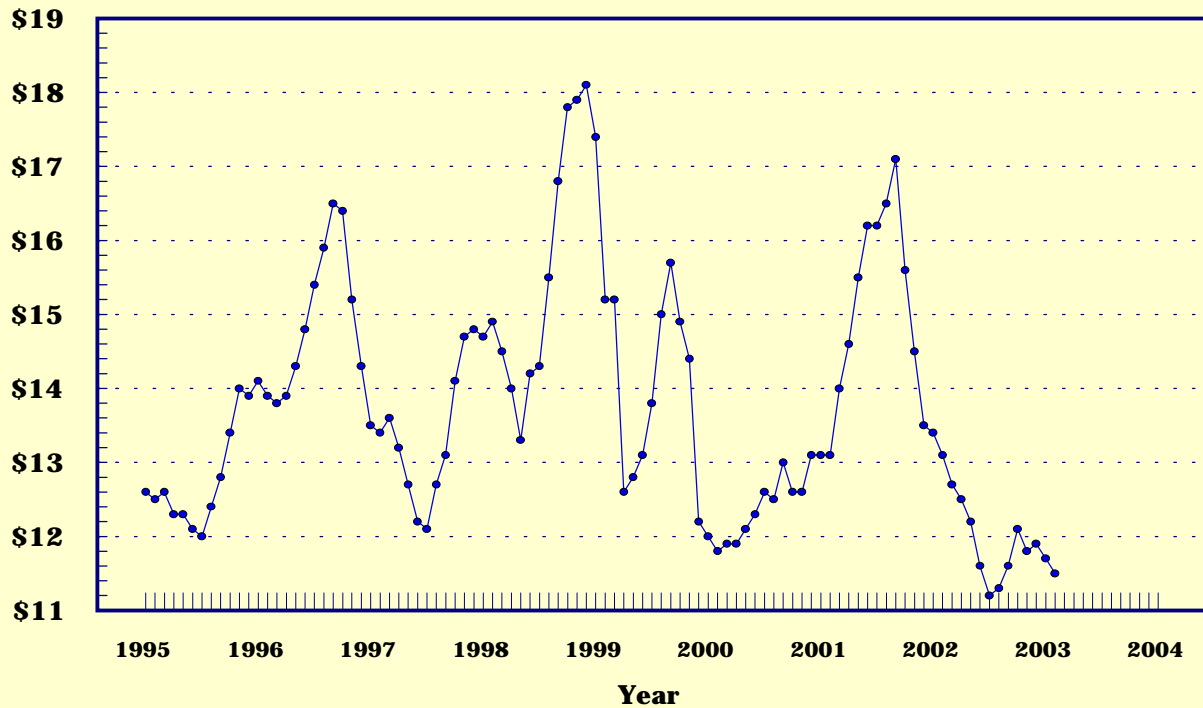
Prices Received, Cattle, US

Dollars per Cwt



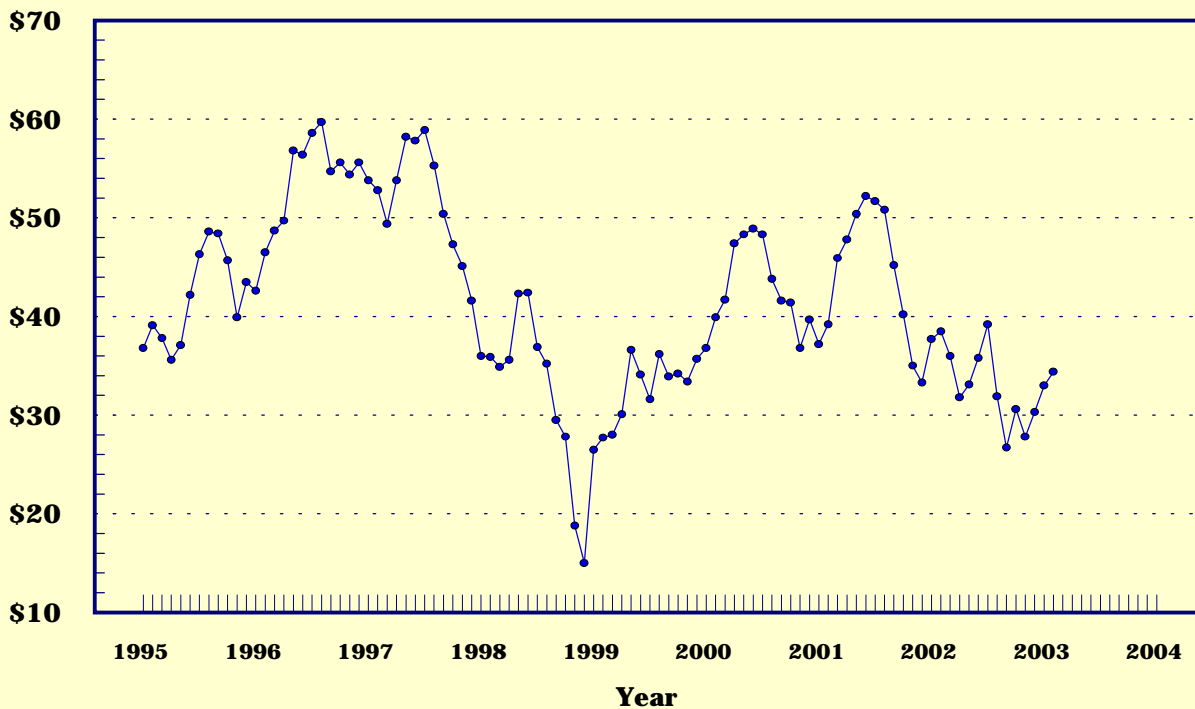

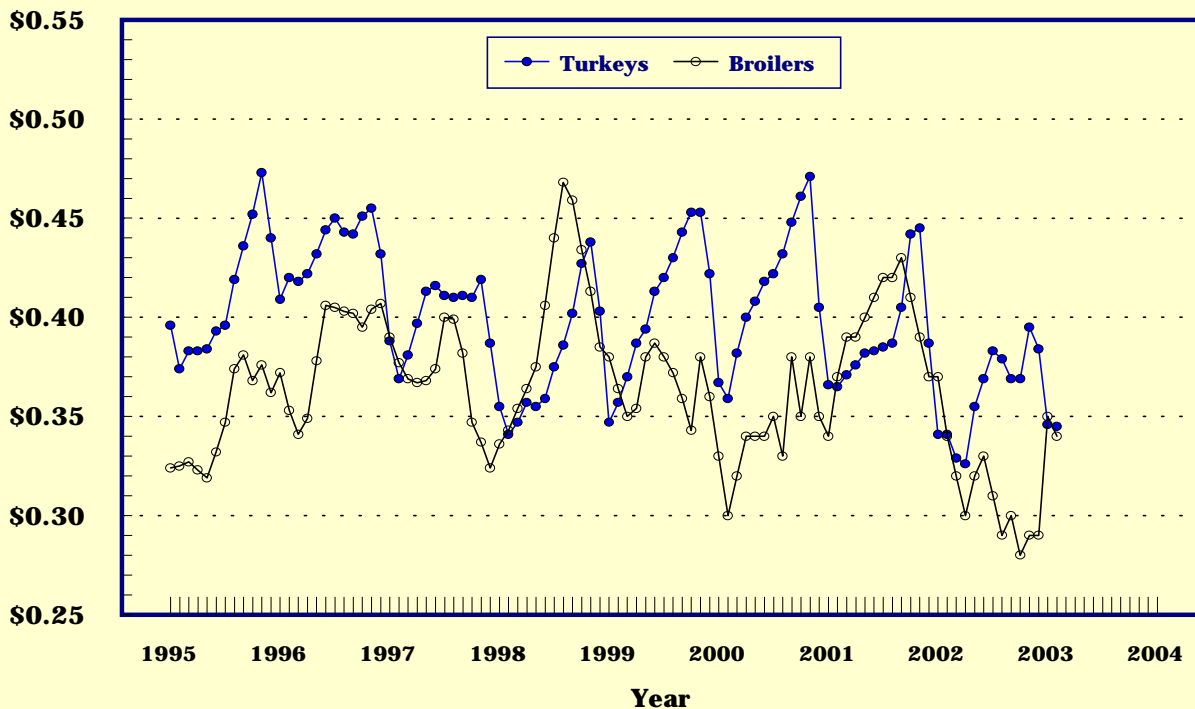

Reliability of Prices Received Estimates

Definition: Prices received represent sales from producers to first buyers. They include all grades and qualities. The average commodity price from the survey multiplied by the total quantity marketed theoretically should give the total cash receipts for the commodity.

Survey Procedures: Primary sales data used to determine grain prices were obtained from probability samples of 2600 mills and elevators. These procedures ensure that virtually all grain moving into commercial channels has a chance of being included in the survey. Generally, States surveyed account for 90 percent or more of total U.S. production. Livestock prices are obtained from packers, stockyards, auctions, dealers, and market check data from AMS-USDA, private marketing organizations, and state commodity groups and agencies. Inter-farm sales of grain and livestock are not included since they represent very small percentages of the total marketings. Grain marketed for seed is also excluded. Fruit and vegetable prices are obtained from sample surveys and market check data from AMS-USDA, private marketing organizations, state agencies, and universities.

Summary and Estimation Procedures: Survey quantities sold are expanded by strata to state levels and used to weight average strata prices to a state average. State prices are then weighted to a U.S. price based on expanded marketings. Recommendations are prepared by the State Statistical Offices and reviewed by the Agricultural Statistics Board in Washington, D.C. State recommendations are reviewed for reasonableness with survey data, other States, and recent historic estimates.

Revisions: For most items, the current month's preliminary price represents a 3-5 day period around the 15th of the month. Previous month's prices represent actual dollars received for quantities sold during the entire month. Revisions are published in monthly issues of "**Agricultural Prices**".

Reliability: U.S. price estimates based on probability surveys generally have a sampling error of less than one percent for the major commodities such as corn, wheat, soybeans, cotton, and rice. Current methods of summarization for non-probability commodities are not designed directly to calculate sampling errors. However, analytical measures approximate the U.S. relative sampling errors at around five percent. Any nonsampling errors are attributed to such things as the inability to obtain correct information, differences in interpreting questions or definitions, mistakes in coding or processing the data, etc. Efforts are made at each step in the survey process to minimize these nonsampling errors.

Prices Paid by Farmers

The February Index of Prices Paid for Commodities and Services, Interest, Taxes, and Farm Wage Rates (PPITW) is 127 (1990-92=100), unchanged from January 2003 but 3.3 percent above February 2002.

PRODUCTION INDEX: The February Farm Production, Goods, and Services Index, at 123, is up 0.8 percent from last month and 5.1 percent above last year. Higher prices in February for diesel fuel, nitrogen fertilizers, gasoline, and LP gas, more than offset lower prices for feeder cattle, feeder pigs, feed supplements, and hay and forages.

Feed: The Feed Index, at 118, is unchanged from January and 10 percent above last February. Since January, slightly lower prices for feed supplements and hay and forages offset slightly higher prices for complete feeds, feed concentrates, and feed grains.

Livestock & Poultry: The Index for Livestock and Poultry purchases, at 102, is 2.9 percent lower than last month and 7.3 percent below last year. Since January, prices are lower for feeder cattle and feeder pigs. The February feeder cattle price at, \$81.30 per cwt, is down \$2.70 per cwt from the January price.

Fertilizer: The Fertilizer Index, at 121, is up 3.4 percent from January and 12 percent more than February a year ago. Prices are higher in February for nitrogen fertilizers, mixed fertilizers, and potash and phosphate materials.

Agricultural Chemicals: The Chemical Index, at 121, is up 0.8 percent from last month and 2.5 percent above last February. Prices are higher in February for herbicides, insecticides, and other chemicals.

Fuels: The Fuels Index, at 156, is up 11 percent from a month earlier and 81 percent above February 2002. Compared to last month, prices are higher for diesel fuel, gasoline, and LP gas.

Farm Machinery: The Farm Machinery Index is 145, unchanged from January and 0.7 percent below last February.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX: The January 2003 Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers (CPI-U) rose 0.4 percent before seasonal adjustment to a level of 181.7 (1982-84=100). This compares to the December index of 180.9. For the 12-month period ending in January, the overall index increased 2.6 percent.

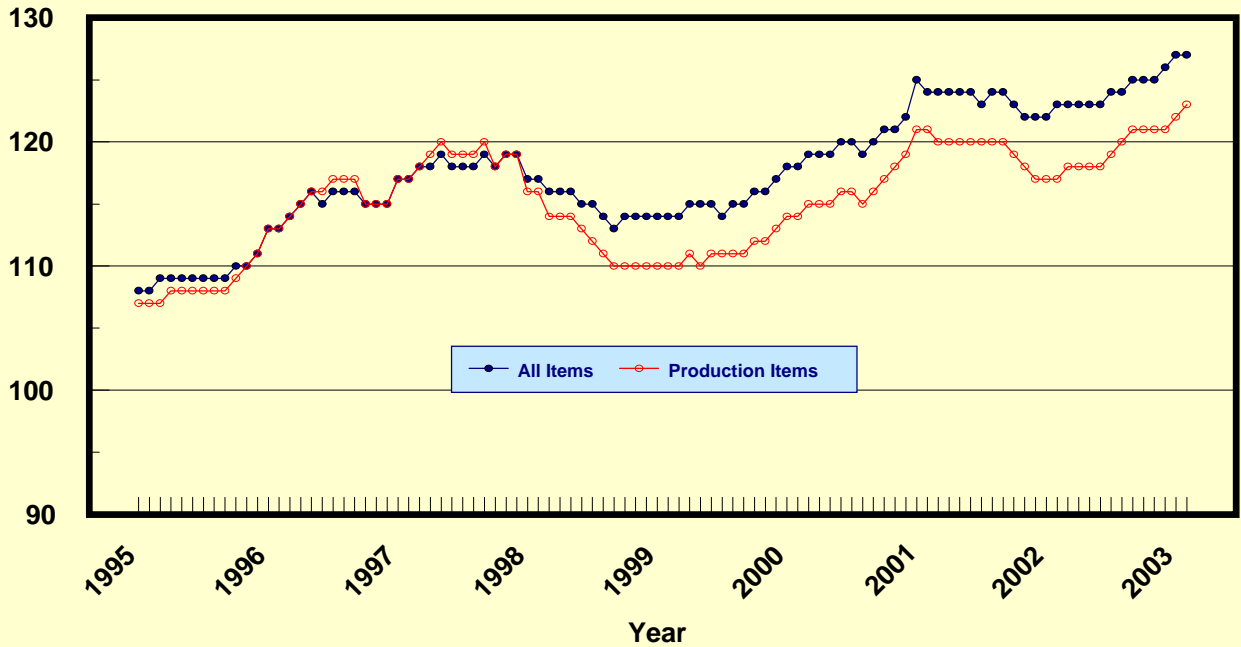

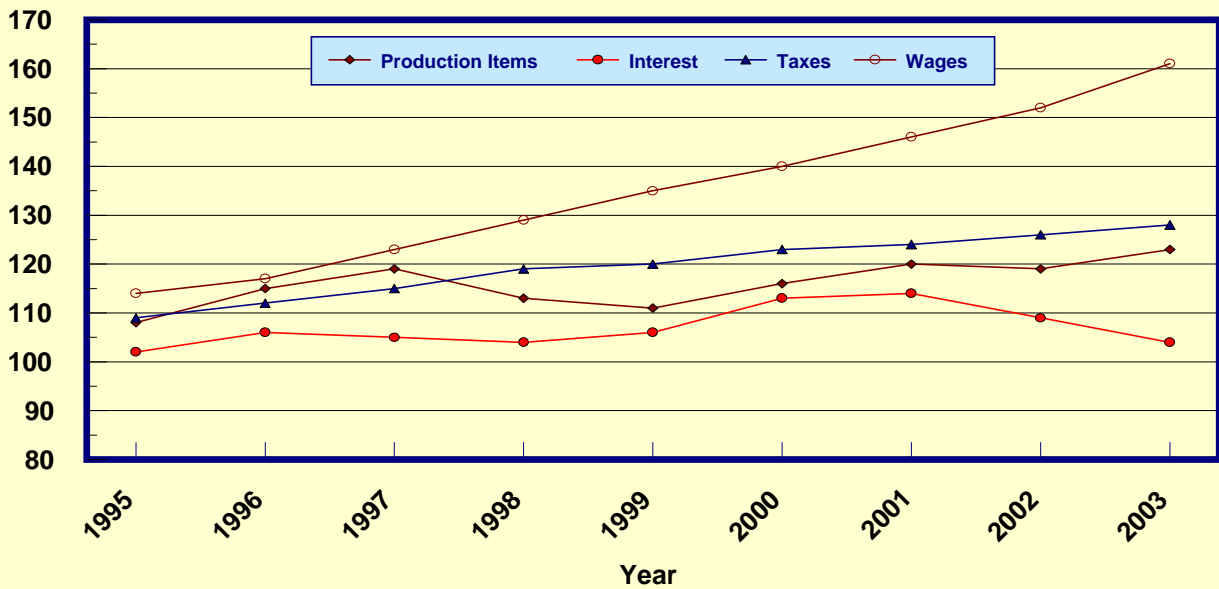
Prices Paid by Farmers, Major Indexes US, by Quarter and Month 1/

Prices Paid by Farmers, Major Indexes US, Annual Averages 1/

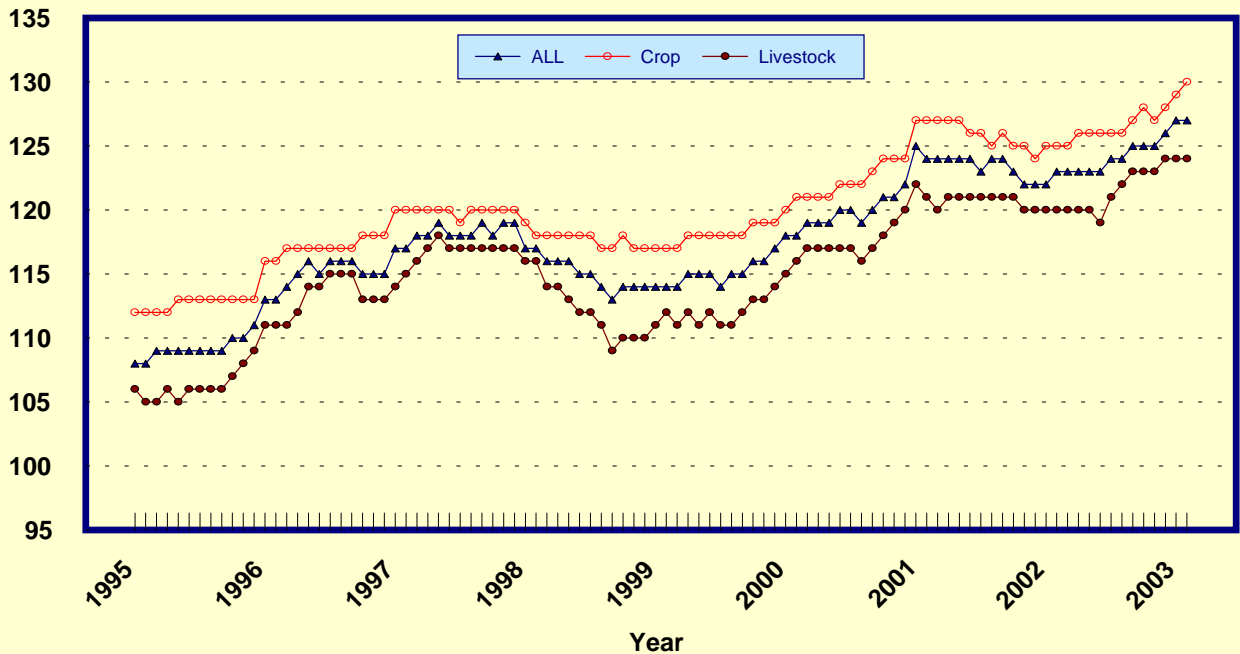

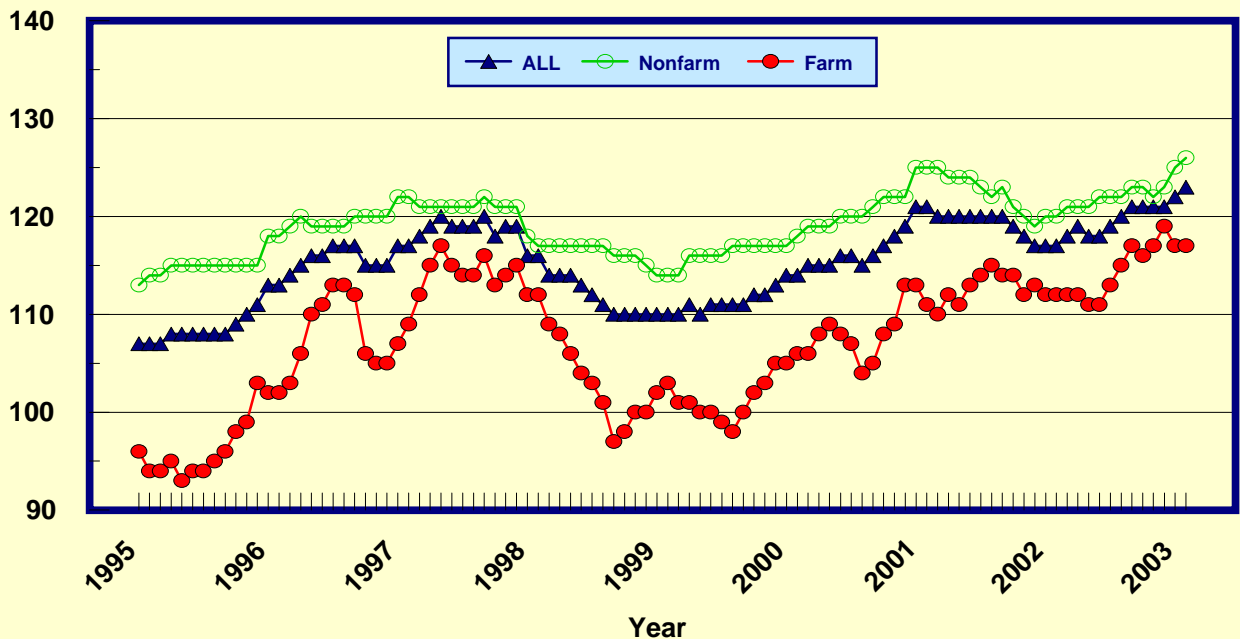
Prices Paid by Farmers, Indexes, All Items US, By Farm Type 1/

Percent (1990-92=100)



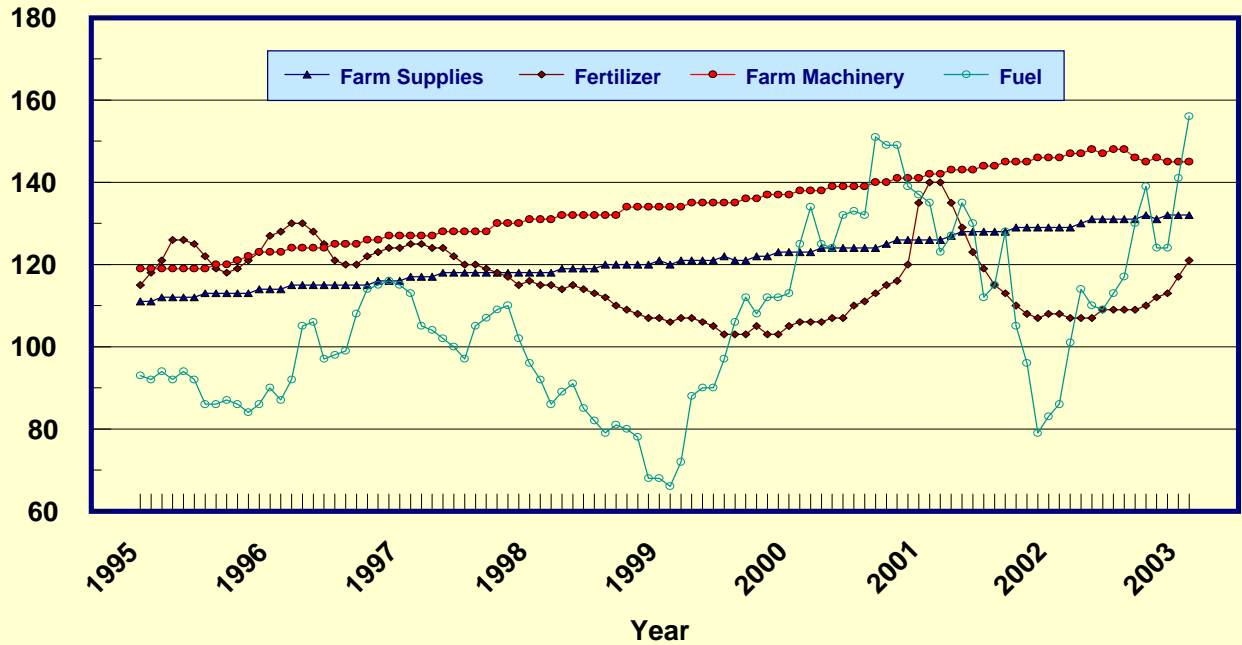
Prices Paid by Farmers, Indexes, All Production Items US, By Sector Origin 1/

Percent (1990-92=100)



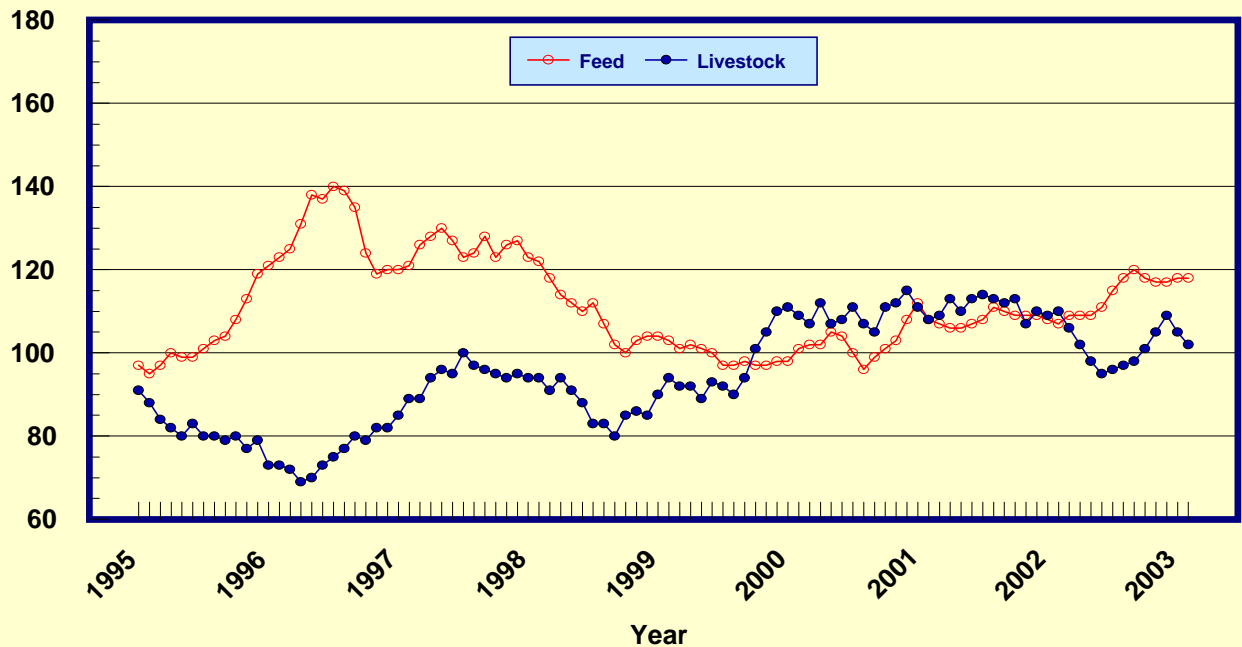
Prices Paid by Farmers, Selected Production Indexes US, By Non-Farm Sector 1/

Prices Paid by Farmers

Definition: Prices paid by farmers represent the average costs of inputs purchased by farmers and ranchers to produce agricultural commodities. Conceptually, the average price when multiplied by quantity purchased should equal total producer expenditures for the item.

Survey Procedures: The prices paid data are obtained from establishments that sell goods and services to farmers and ranchers. Annually, about 8,500 firms are randomly selected from lists by type of item sold with an average response rate in the range of 75-80 percent. Firms are asked to report the price for the specified item "most commonly bought by farmers" or that was the "volume seller". Approximately 135 items are surveyed each April to represent all production input items purchased. The survey reference period for most items is the 5 business days centered around the 15th of the month. Separate prices paid surveys are conducted for, agricultural chemicals, fuels, feed, fertilizer, machinery, and seed.

Summary and Estimation Procedures: The annual April Prices Paid Survey is summarized as a nonprobability survey. Average prices reported are aggregated to the region and U.S. level using weights available from expenditure data and other administrative sources. Price recommendations are prepared by the State Statistical Offices and Headquarters for review by the Agricultural Statistics Board in Washington, D.C. Also, the change in price level for individual items surveyed are combined to the regional and U.S. levels, and are published as prices paid indexes referenced to a specific base period. Prices paid indexes for new autos and trucks, building materials, farm supplies, motor supplies, and marketing containers are updated based on price changes measured in selected Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) indexes.

Revisions: Any revisions are published in the monthly and in annual issues of "Agricultural Prices". The basis for revision must be supported by additional data that directly affect the level of the estimate. More revisions are likely in April when separate prices paid surveys are conducted, in lieu of BLS indexes, by the USDA to measure price change.

Reliability: Current methods of summarization in April are not designed directly to calculate sampling errors. However, analytical measures approximate the U.S. relative sampling errors for major items around 10 percent. Any nonsampling errors are attributed to such things as the inability to obtain correct information, differences in interpreting questions or definitions, mistakes in coding or processing the data, etc. Efforts are made at each step in the survey process to minimize these nonsampling errors.

Program Change: Effective January 1, 1995, the National Agricultural Statistics Service updated the weights and changed the construction of its prices paid and received by farmers indexes. A Federal Register Notice dated October 28, 1994 discussed these program modifications.

A 1990-92 reference and base period replaced the 1977 reference and 1971-73 base weight period. Five-year moving average weights replaced the current fixed 1971-73 base period weights. The 1910-14=100 price indexes, required by statute for computing parity prices, were linked forward based on the changes in the new 1990-92=100 indexes. The new indexes were constructed by multiplying the ratios of the current prices to the base period prices by the moving average weights (adjusted for seasonal marketing patterns for the prices received indexes).
