ALL CATTLE AND CALVES in the United States as of January 1, 1985 totaled 110 million head, down 3 percent from the 114 million on January 1, 1984 and 5 percent below the 115 million two years ago, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This continues the recent downward trend in cattle inventories begun two years ago.

All cows and heifers that have calved, at 46.2 million, are down 5 percent from 48.6 million a year ago, and down 6 percent from 49.0 million two years ago.

--Beef cows, at 35.4 million, are 6 percent below January 1, 1984.

--Milk cows, at 10.8 million, are down 3 percent from January 1, 1984.

Other class estimates on January 1, 1985, and the changes from January 1 last year and two years ago, respectively, are as follows:

-- All heifers 500 pounds and over, 18.3 million, down 1 percent and 3 percent.

-- Beef replacement heifers, 5.54 million, down 10 percent and 13 percent.

-- Milk replacement heifers, 4.76 million, up 5 percent from both years.

-- Other heifers, 8.04 million, up 2 percent and 1 percent.

-- Steers weighing 500 pounds and over, 16.4 million, virtually unchanged and up 1 percent.

-- Bulls weighing 500 pounds and over, 2.41 million, down 5 percent and 8 percent.

-- Calves under 500 pounds, 26.5 million, down 4 percent and 7 percent.

-- All cattle and calves on feed January 1, 1985, for slaughter, 12.4 million, up 7 percent and 3 percent.

CALF CROP DOWN 3 PERCENT

The 1984 calf crop is estimated at 42.5 million, down 3 percent from 1983 and 4 percent from 1982. This calf crop is down 2 percent from the expected calf crop published last July. Most of this reduction is a result of a lower than expected calf crop in the second half of 1984. Calves born during the first half of the year were estimated at 71.5 percent of the annual total.

RELIABILITY AND ESTIMATING PROCEDURES

Primary data used in making cattle estimates in this report were obtained from a sample of farmers and ranchers across the U.S. using probability surveys. Information was collected by mail, telephone and personal interview. Since all operations with cattle were not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is less than one percent of the total cattle and calves at the national level. This means that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that the survey estimate will be within two percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers. The sampling variability of estimates for all cows and for the calf crop is slightly larger than that for total inventory.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

In setting the inventory estimates, the Crop Reporting Board used survey estimates of inventory numbers, births, and deaths. These survey estimates were combined with reliable check data from other sources on slaughter, imports and exports to construct a national balance sheet (on page 3), which provides an additional check on survey inventory estimates.
