ALL CATTLE AND CALVES in the United States as of January 1, 1986 totaled 105 million head, down 4 percent from the 110 million on January 1, 1985 and 7 percent below the 114 million two years ago, according to the Crop Reporting Board. This continued the recent downward trend in cattle inventories for the fourth consecutive year and was the lowest number on hand since 1963.

All cows and heifers that have calved, at 44.8 million, are down 3 percent from 46.2 million a year ago, down 8 percent from 48.6 million two years ago and the lowest since 1961.

- Beef cows, at 33.6 million, are 5 percent below January 1, 1985 and the lowest since 1966.
- Milk cows, at 11.2 million, are 3 percent above January 1, 1985 and the highest since 1975.

Other class estimates on January 1, 1986 and the changes from January 1 last year and two years ago, respectively, are as follows:

- All heifers 500 pounds and over, 18.0 million, down 2 percent and 3 percent.
- Beef replacement heifers, 5.15 million, down 7 percent and 17 percent.
- Milk replacement heifers, 4.76 million, virtually unchanged and up 5 percent.
- Other heifers, 8.09 million, up fractionally and up 3 percent.
- Steers weighing 500 pounds and over, 16.0 million, down 2 percent from both years.
- Bulls weighing 500 pounds and over, 2.26 million, down 6 percent and 11 percent.
- Calves under 500 pounds, 24.4 million, down 8 percent and 12 percent.
- All cattle and calves on feed for slaughter, 11.4 million, down 8 percent and 2 percent.

CALF CROP DOWN 3 PERCENT

The 1985 calf crop is estimated at 41.0 million, down 3 percent from 1984, down 7 percent from 1983 and is the lowest since 1961. The estimated calf crop is down fractionally from the expected number published last July. Calves born during the first half of the year were estimated at 71.5 percent of the annual total.


RELIABILITY AND ESTIMATING PROCEDURES

Primary data used in making cattle estimates in this report were obtained from a sample of farmers and ranchers across the U.S. using probability surveys. Information was collected by mail, telephone and personal interview. Since all operations with cattle were not included in the sample, survey estimates are subject to sampling variability. This variability, as measured by the relative standard error, is less than one percent of the total cattle and calves at the national level. This means, that chances are approximately 95 out of 100 that the survey estimate will be within two percent of the complete coverage value if the same procedures were used to survey all producers. The sampling variability of estimates for all cows and for the calf crop is slightly larger than that for total inventory.

Survey estimates are also subject to non-sampling errors such as omissions, duplications, and mistakes in reporting, recording and processing the data. These errors cannot be measured directly, but they are minimized through rigid quality controls in the data collection process and a careful review of all reported data for consistency and reasonableness.

In setting the inventory estimates, the Crop Reporting Board used survey estimates of inventory numbers, births, and deaths. These survey estimates were combined with reliable check data from other sources on slaughter, imports and exports to construct a national balance sheet (on page 3), which provides an additional check on survey inventory estimates.
