## CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES DOWN 8 PERCENT

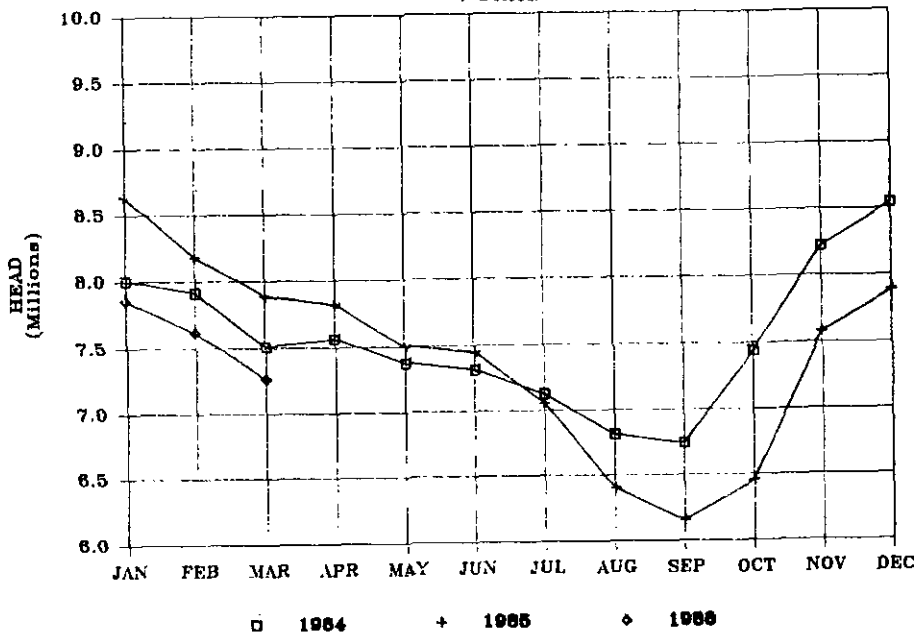
Cattle and calves on feed March 1, 1986 for the slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 7.26 million head, down 8 percent from a year ago and 3 percent below March 1, 1984, according to the Crop Reporting Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during February totaled 1.47 million, a decrease of 5 percent from last year and 9 percent below February 1984.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States were 1.21 million, a decrease of 10 percent from February 1985 and down 7 percent from two years ago. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.11 million were down 11 percent from 1985 and 9 percent below 1984.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 102 thousand compared with 94 thousand during February of 1985 and 82 thousand two years ago.
