CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES DOWN 5 PERCENT

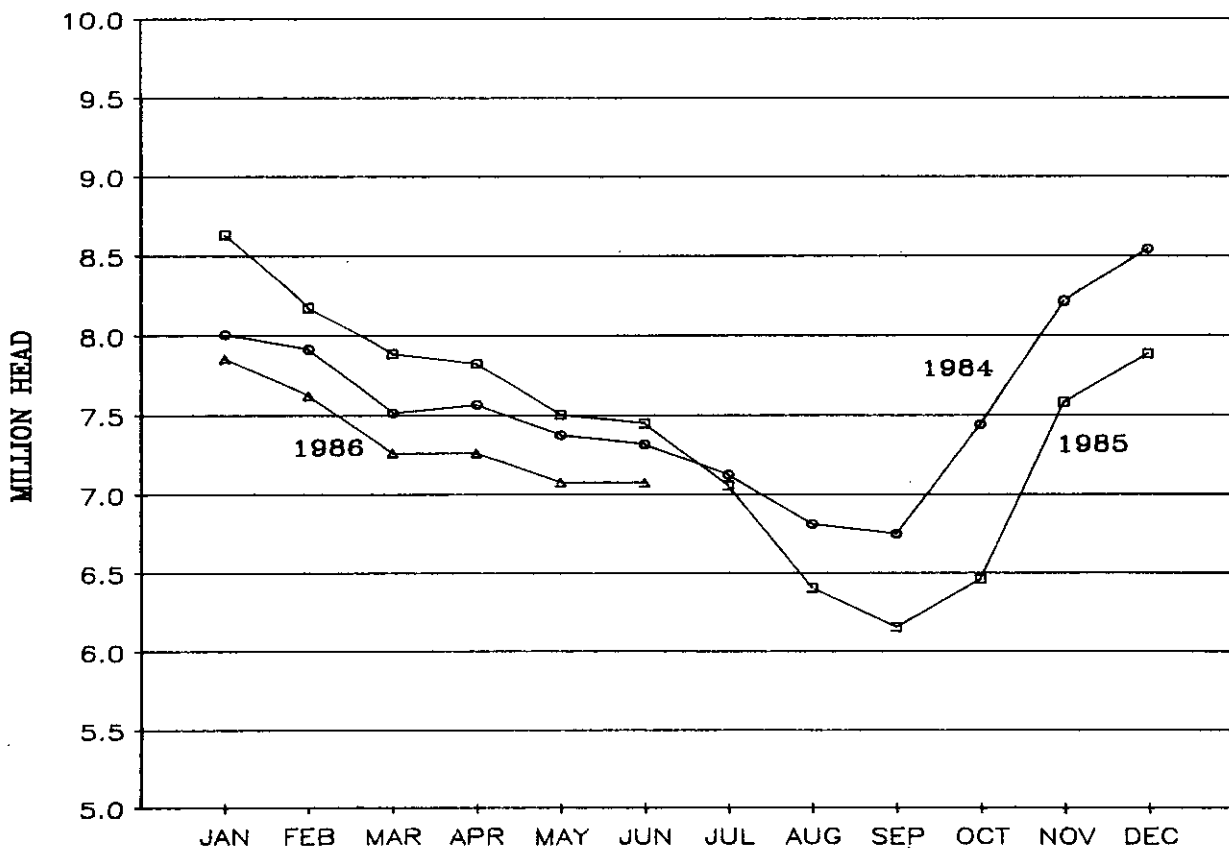
Cattle and calves on feed June 1, 1986 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 7.08 million head, down 5 percent from a year ago and 3 percent below June 1, 1984, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during May totaled 1.62 million, an increase of 1 percent from last year but 1 percent below May 1984.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States were 1.75 million, an increase of 4 percent from May 1985 but 3 percent below two years ago. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.61 million were up 4 percent from 1985 and 2 percent from 1984.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 132 thousand head compared with 128 thousand during May 1985 and 219 thousand two years ago.

 * 3 years examining virtually every aspect of its work. One phase dealt *
 * with the Agency's identity within the agricultural and statistical com- *
 * munities. As a result of this study, the name of the Statistical Re- *
 * porting Service has been changed to National Agricultural Statistics *
 * Service. This name more accurately reflects the purpose of the Agency, *
 * its broad agricultural focus, and the service aspect of its responsi- *
 * bility. In line with this change, the Agency's Crop Reporting Board *
 * has been renamed the Agricultural Statistics Board to better describe *
 * the scope of its output. *
