CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES DOWN 1 PERCENT

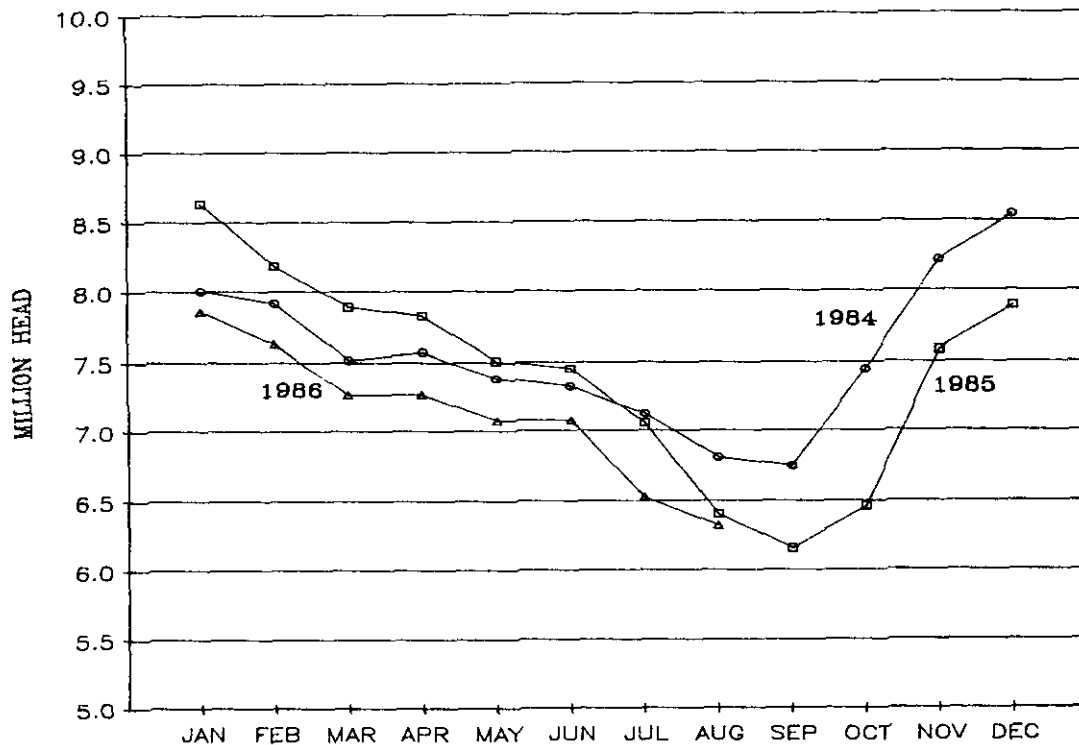
Cattle and calves on feed August 1, 1986 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 6.32 million head, down 1 percent from a year ago and 7 percent below August 1, 1984, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during July totaled 1.68 million, an increase of 1 percent from last year, 8 percent above July 1984 and the highest July total since 7 State estimates were begun in 1972.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States were 1.54 million, an increase of 43 percent from July 1985, 17 percent above two years ago and the highest July placements since 1978. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.48 million were up 46 percent from 1985 and 19 percent from 1984.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 64 thousand head compared with 61 thousand during July 1985 and 84 thousand two years ago.
