CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES UP 4 PERCENT

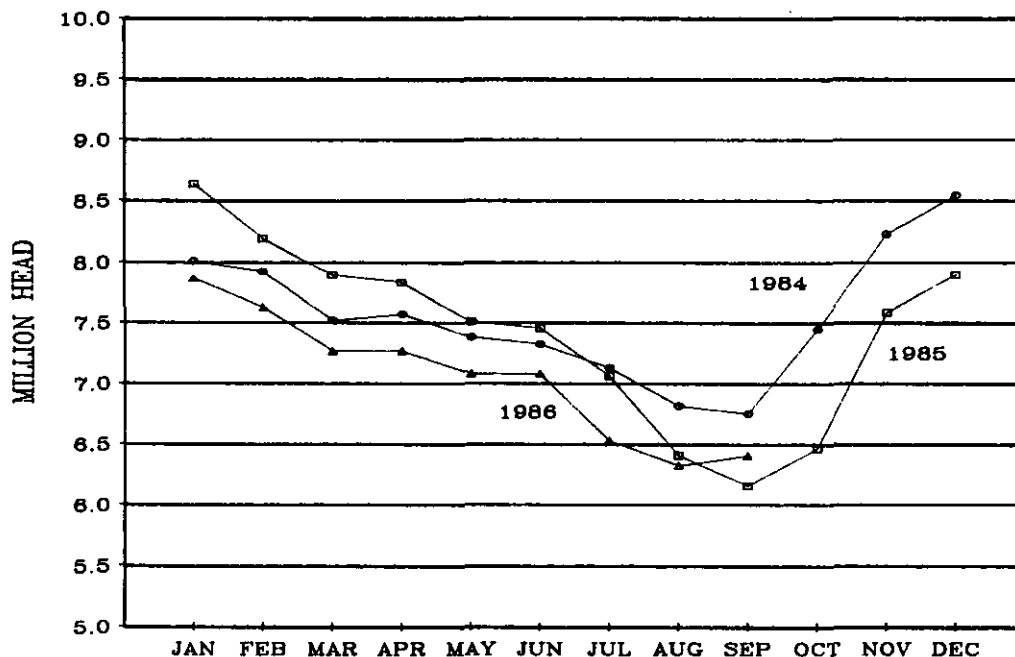
Cattle and calves on feed September 1 for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 6.40 million head, up 4 percent from a year ago but 5 percent below September 1, 1984, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during August totaled 1.66 million, 2 percent below last year and 1 percent less than August two years ago.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States during August totaled 1.81 million, up 20 percent from last year and 8 percent above August 1984. This is the highest August placement total since 7 State estimates were begun in 1971. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.74 million for August are 20 percent above last year and up 8 percent from two years ago.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 70 thousand head, compared with 62 thousand during August 1985 and 61 thousand during August 1984.
