CATTLE ON FEED IN 7 STATES UP 8 PERCENT FROM LAST YEAR

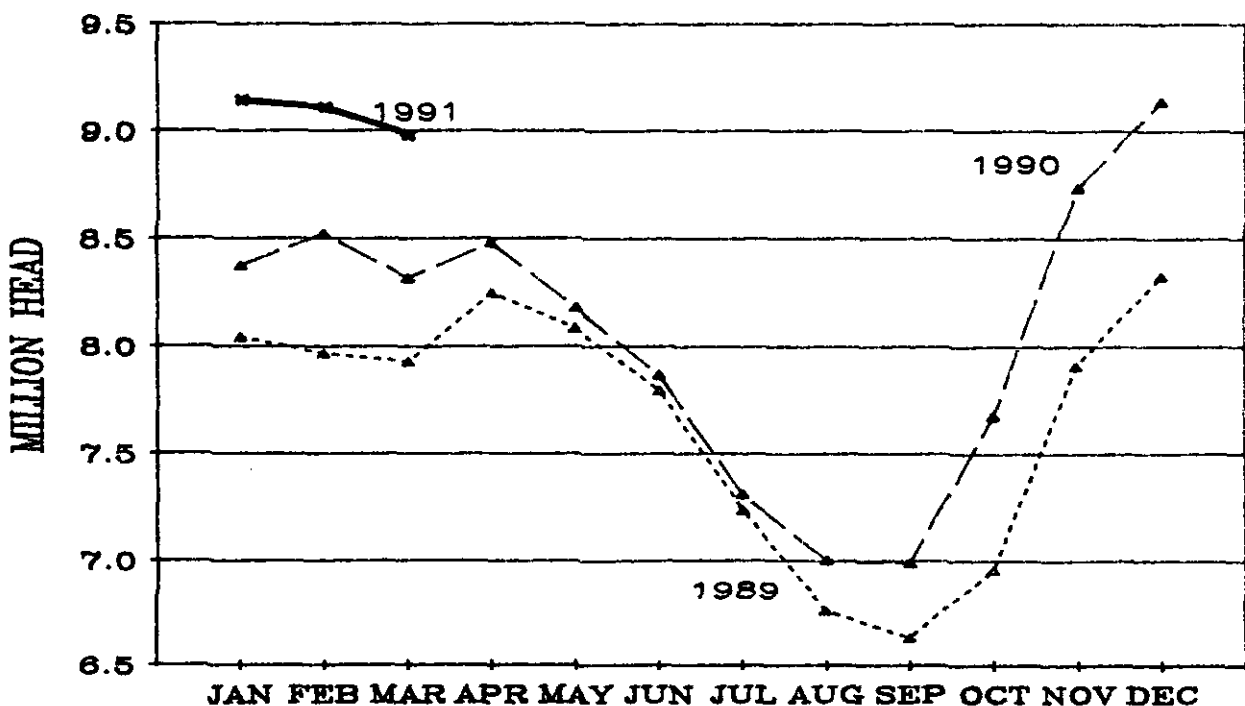
Cattle and calves on feed March 1, 1991, for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 8.97 million head, up 8 percent from a year ago and 13 percent above March 1, 1989, according to the Agricultural Statistics Board. This is the largest March number on feed since 1974.

MARKETINGS of fed cattle during February totaled 1.48 million, down 1 percent from last year and 3 percent below two years ago.

PLACEMENTS of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States during February totaled 1.47 million, up 6 percent from last year but 9 percent below February 1989. NET PLACEMENTS of 1.35 million for February were up 5 percent from last year but 10 percent below 1989.

OTHER DISAPPEARANCE totaled 113 thousand head compared to 95 thousand in February 1990 and 115 thousand in February 1989.
