## Cattle on Feed Down 5 Percent in 7 Monthly States

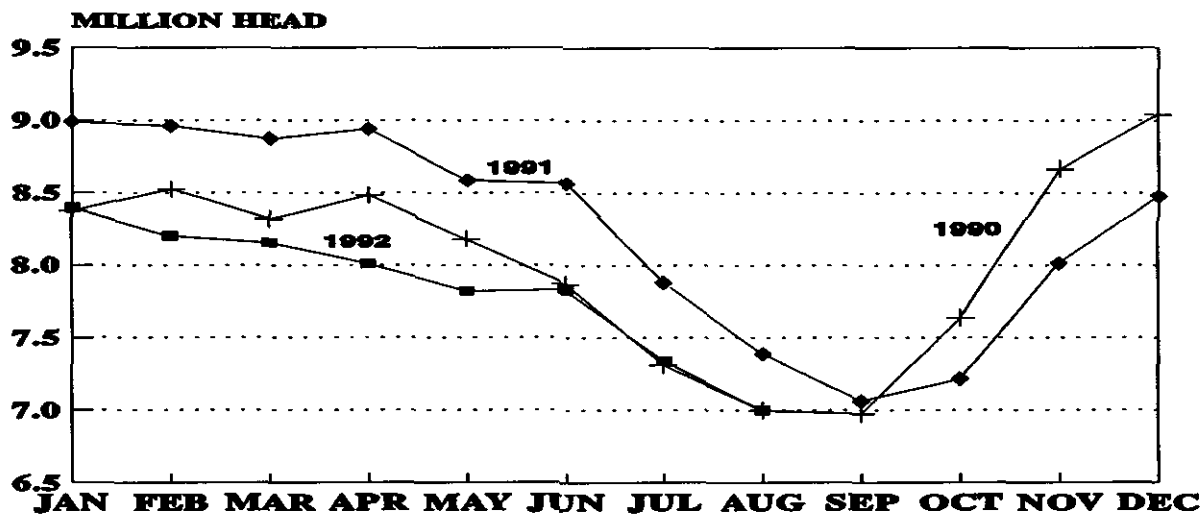
Cattle and calves on feed on August 1, 1992, for slaughter market in the 7 States preparing monthly estimates totaled 7.00 million head, down 5 percent from a year ago but up fractionally from August 1, 1990.

Placements of cattle and calves on feed in the 7 States during July totaled 1.43 million, up 8 percent from last year but 6 percent below 1990. Net placements of 1.35 million for July were up 9 percent from last year but 7 percent below 1990.

Marketings of fed cattle during July totaled 1.68 million, down 2 percent from last year and 5 percent below two years ago. This is the lowest July marketings since 1985.

Other disappearance totaled 85,000 head compared to 92,000 in July 1991, and 77,000 in July 1990.
