REGULATIONS GOVERNING DEALERS IN COLD STORAGE BUTTER

ADDITIONAL MARGINS FOR STORING

The following table indicates the method by which the dealer may calculate the maximum amounts which may be added to selling margins where a dealer holds butter in storage more than two full calendar months:

Month in which the dealer stores the butter or purchases the butter while in storage
