REPORT OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF CREAMERY BUTTER, JULY 15, 1919.

Reports from 315 cold storages show that their rooms contain 108,456,022 pounds of CREAMERY BUTTER while on July 1, 348 storages reported 88,621,347 pounds. Reports of 25 storages are not yet received. On the basis of previous reports their holdings for July 15 are estimated as 700,373 pounds. The 302 storages that reported holdings on July 15 of this year and last show a present stock of 108,352,943 pounds as compared with 68,202,712 pounds last year, an increase of 40,150,231 pounds or 58.9 per cent. The reports show that from July 1 to 15 the July 1 holdings increased 23.6 per cent, while our last report showed that during June the June 1 holdings increased 207.6 per cent. Last year the increase from July 1 to 15 was 43.8 per cent and during June the increase was 270.7 per cent. A summary of this report was released by wire on July 29. SUMMARY OF STORAGE HOLDINGS OF BUTTER AND EGGS ON JULY 15, 1919.

The Monthly report of the Bureau of Markets, Department of Agriculture, shows cold storage holdings of creamery butter and case eggs on July 15, 1919 as follows:-

The 315 storages that reported creamery butter showed total stocks of 108,486,022 pounds. The 302 storages reporting for July 15, this year and last, show present holdings of 108,352,943 pounds compared with 68,202,712 pounds last year, an increase of 58.9%.

The 383 storages that reported case eggs showed total stocks of 7,680,963 cases. The 372 storages reporting for July 15, this year and last, show present holdings of 7,670,578 cases compared with 6,292,380 cases last year, an increase of 21.9%.

REPORT OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF EGGS, JULY 15, 1919.

Reports from 324 cold storages show that their rooms contain 7,680,963 cases of eggs while on July 1, 414 storages reported 7,553,603 cases. Reports of 31 storages are not yet received. On the basis of previous reports their holdings for July 15 are estimated as 95,526 cases. The 372 storages that reported holdings on July 15 of this year and last show a present stock of 7,670,573 cases as compared with 6,292,380 cases last year, an increase of 1,378,193 cases or 21.9 per cent. The reports show that from July 1 to 15 the July 1 holdings increased 2.5 per cent while our last report showed that during June the June 1 holdings increased 24.0 per cent. Last year the decrease from July 1 to 15 was 1.6 per cent, and during June the increase was 19.2 per cent. A summary of this report was released by wire on July 29. Upon request any or all of the information contained in the cold storage reports will be telegraphed immediately upon its release. These reports are free, except for the telegrams, which are sent charges collect.
