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SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE
UNITED STATES

February 1, 1930.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on February 1, 1930:

1,316,000 barrels of apples compared with 1,678,000 barrels February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 2,355,000 barrels.

10,152,000 boxes of apples compared with 12,388,000 boxes February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 9,981,000 boxes.

4,007,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 3,204,000 bushel baskets February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 2,034,000 bushel baskets.

823,000 boxes of pears compared with 779,000 boxes February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 431,000 boxes.

5,000 barrels of pears compared with 10,000 barrels February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 15,000 barrels.

48,084,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 60,216,000 pounds February 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 43,350,000 pounds.
