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SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE

UNITED STATES

April 1, 1930.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on April 1, 1930:

481,000 barrels of apples compared with 652,000 barrels April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 958,000 barrels.

4,791,000 boxes of apples compared with 4,889,000 boxes April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 4,645,000 boxes.

1,556,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 1,308,000 bushel baskets April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 829,000 bushel baskets.

265,000 boxes of pears compared with 283,000 boxes April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 151,000 boxes.

1,000 barrels of pears compared with 5,000 barrels April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 6,000 barrels.

38,647,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 48,570,000 pounds April 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 33,668,000 pounds.
