SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE

UNITED STATES

May 1, 1930.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on May 1, 1930:

229,000 barrels of apples compared with 319,000 barrels May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 470,000 barrels.

2,436,000 boxes of apples compared with 2,224,000 boxes May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 2,424,000 boxes.

769,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 590,000 bushel baskets May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 406,000 bushel baskets.

70,000 boxes of pears compared with 120,000 boxes May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 77,000 boxes.

blank barrels of pears compared with 4,000 barrels May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 3,000 barrels.

32,477,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 41,392,000 pounds May 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 29,517,000 pounds.
