SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE
UNITED STATES

October 1, 1930.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on October 1, 1930:

496,000 barrels of apples compared with 735,000 barrels on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 641,000 barrels.

1,956,000 boxes of apples compared with 901,000 boxes on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 1,340,000 boxes.

1,800,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 1,793,000 bushel baskets on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 894,000 bushel baskets.

2,344,000 boxes of pears compared with 1,565,000 boxes on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 1,395,000 boxes.

397,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with 525,000 bushel baskets on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 279,000 bushel baskets.

80,781,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 61,348,000 pounds on October 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 57,354,000 pounds.
