## SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS

## IN THE UNITED STATES

November 1, 1930.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on November 1, 1930:

1,567,000 barrels of apples compared with 2,189,000 barrels November 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 2,794,000

14,592,000 boxes of apples compared with 11,045,000 boxes.

6,404,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 6,379,000 bushel baskets November 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 3,782,000 bushel baskets.

2,514,000 boxes of pears compared with 2,080,000 boxes November 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 1,510,000 boxes.

189,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with 84,000 bushel baskets November 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 135,900 bushel baskets.

79,913,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 61,752,000 pounds November 1, 1929 and a five-year average of 56,319,000 pounds.
