SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS

IN THE UNITED STATES
January 1, 1931.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on January 1, 1931:

1,196,000 barrels of apples compared with 1,762,000 barrels January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 2,749,000 barrels.

19,063,000 boxes of apples compared with 13,108,000 boxes January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 13,291,000 boxes.

5,912,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 5,507,000 bushel baskets January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 3,500,000 bushel baskets.

1,661,000 boxes of pears compared with 1,123,000 boxes January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 784,000 boxes.

49,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with 24,000 bushel baskets January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 54,000 bushel baskets.

74,818,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 54,942,000 pounds January 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 50,631,000 pounds.
