SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS

IN THE UNITED STATES
March 1, 1931.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on March 1, 1931:

484,000 barrels of apples compared with 897,000 barrels March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 1,462,000 barrels.

11,337,000 boxes of apples compared with 7,282,000 boxes March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 7,499,000 boxes.

2,855,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 2,805,000 bushel baskets March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 1,848,000 bushel baskets.

816,000 boxes of pears compared with 512,000 boxes March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 342,000 boxes.

24,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with 6,000 bushel baskets March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 24,000 bushel baskets.

66,514,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 41,723,000 pounds March 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 40,764,000 pounds.
