June 1, 1931.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on June 1, 1931:

38,000 barrels of apples compared with 96,000 barrels. June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 155,000 barrels.

1,428,000 boxes of apples compared with 761,000 boxes
June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 887,000 boxes.

192,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 309,000 bushel baskets June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 215,000 bushel baskets.

44,000 boxes of pears compared with 21,000 boxes June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 29,000 boxes.

1,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with blank bushels June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 6,000 bushel baskets.
