SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE
UNITED STATES
June 1, 1931.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on June 1, 1931:

38,000 barrels of apples compared with 96,000 barrels June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 155,000 barrels.

1,428,000 boxes of apples compared with 761,000 boxes June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 887,000 boxes.

192,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 309,000 bushel baskets June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 215,000 bushel baskets.

44,000 boxes of pears compared with 21,000 boxes June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 29,000 boxes.

1,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with blank bushels June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 6,000 bushel baskets.

66,366,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 35,854,000 pounds June 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 36,187,000 pounds.
