SUMMARY OF COLD STORAGE HOLDINGS OF FRUITS IN THE  
UNITED STATES

DECEMBER 1, 1931.

The monthly report of the Bureau of Agricultural Economics, United States Department of Agriculture, shows the following cold storage holdings of fruits on December 1, 1931:

2,173,000 barrels of apples compared with 1,456,000 barrels December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 2,610,000 barrels.

16,861,000 boxes of apples compared with 21,267,000 boxes December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 16,492,000 boxes.

10,798,000 bushel baskets of apples compared with 6,946,000 bushel baskets December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 5,047,000 bushel baskets.

1,205,000 boxes of pears compared with 2,338,000 boxes December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 1,411,000 boxes.

129,000 bushel baskets of pears compared with 80,000 bushel baskets December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 74,000 bushel baskets.

96,092,000 pounds of frozen and preserved fruits compared with 76,737,000 pounds December 1, 1930 and a five-year average of 63,790,000 pounds.
