2/ While the Bureau feels assured of the completeness and accuracy of the total amount of poultry reported, it cannot vouch for the accuracy and classification of the various sizes of chickens. There are a number of concerns whose holdings are exceedingly heavy, who find it impracticable to make segregation on their reports. Consequently, there will be fryers contained in the figures shown for broilers, roasters and possibly miscellaneous poultry.
