2/ While the Bureau feels assured of the completeness and accuracy of the total amount of poultry reported, it cannot vouch for the accuracy of the classification of the various sizes of chickens. There are a number of concerns who find it impracticable to make segregation on their reports. Consequently, there will be fryers included in the figures shown for broilers roasters and possibly miscellaneous poultry.

** The above figures for August 1, 1935 do not include any butter or cheese held by either the Agricultural Adjustment Administration or the Federal Surplus Relief Administration. Under the Present policy of these agencies purchases of butter and cheese are moved into consumption as they become available for shipment.
